REPUTATION OF THE REFERENDUM

Poor Mr. Ross has already got beyond his depth. The Globe is apologizing for the shortcomings of his bill, and it advocates a change that will make the passage of the referendum bill more difficult for the prohibitionists. If it becomes evident that the prohibitionists intend to abstain from voting for the government candidates at the general election, Premier Ross will make the figures of the general election, instead of those of 1902. Mr. Ross is bound to make the vote necessary to carry the referendum as large as will ensure its defeat. No wonder that the prohibitionists are repudiating Premier Ross and his measure. The temperance cause is divided into two well-defined groups. One of these groups is composed of men who are honestly in sympathy with prohibition, and who are working honestly and consistently to secure a prohibitory law. This party is represented by Rev. Mr. Courtice, editor of The Christian Guardian, who, thru that paper, voices the sentiments of the Methodist Conference, and that large section of the community composed of Methodists and members of other denominations who share the views of the prohibitionists. These are the only prohibitionists who are in earnest, and they are the only ones who command the respect of the community. The other group is composed of men who are professedly anti-prohibitionists, but who are really in sympathy with the cause. Among these are such men as Mr. P. S. Spence, when every body suspects of being merely a political ally of Premier Ross. There is a large following of these men, and it is they who have brought prohibition into disrepute among the general people. It is the party represented by Rev. Mr. Courtice who have taken the lead in repudiating Mr. Ross' loaded referendum. At a meeting held on Saturday, Rev. Mr. Courtice accused the Premier of having violated his promise to carry the referendum, and urged all no other course for prohibitionists to take than, to repudiate the bill and have nothing more to do with it. We do not see how Mr. Ross can stand up against such an arraignment as this, coming, as it does, from the Methodist Conference, and the other organs of the party are daily declaring in Mr. Ross' coffin. They declare that Mr. Ross has introduced a prohibitory bill, which, they say, is quite impracticable, and yet they ask the public to vote for the man who is responsible for the introduction of such a measure. Premier Grant is also questioning Mr. Ross after the same fashion. He thinks prohibition would be an awful mistake, and yet he is out shouting for Premier Ross, who is the father of the bill. The fact of the matter is that the Liberal party, in dealing with prohibition, has been smitten with a species of political insanity. They are all at sixes and sevens. They don't pretend to act logically or consistently on the question at all. The theory of government responsibility is thrown aside as of no importance. Inconsistencies are accepted as a matter of course, and a reign of topay-torveydom prevails all over. Mr. Ross' prohibitory bill, with its loaded referendum, is a house of cards, which will shortly come tumbling down on his head.

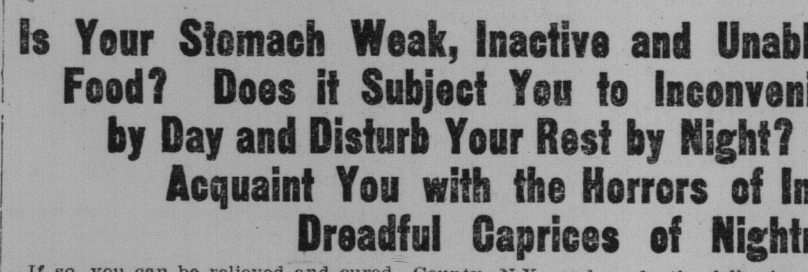
