Washington, Oct. 13.—J. Pierpont Morgan and Robert S. Bacon, one of his partners, arrived here over the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad to-night about 10 o'clock, and were driven to the Arlington Hotel. They refused to see anyone and went at once to their rooms.

It was reported that George F. Baer, president of the Reading Railroad, was also here, but he could not be found. Shortly after going to his room, Mr. Morgan came down stairs and left the hotel for the temporary White House, where he was at once shown upstairs and into the room where the President was and a conference on the strike situation began. Secretary Root joined the party a few minutes later.

Civic Fuel Well in Hand

Quiets the Anxious Crowd

Exact Date of Arrival is in Doubt, But Will Not Be Delayed Many Days—Anthracite Coal at Eight Dollars Per Ton Assured.

While the fear of a fuel famine in Toronto has somewhat subsided during the past few days, little substantial progress toward getting wood and coal supplies into the city has been made. The civic fuel trains, which the officials declared emphatically would reach Toronto Monday by noon, have failed to arrive.

Coal at \$8 a Ton. In the meantime, the purchase of 5000 tons of anthracite coal by the city from England, at \$6 per ton, at Montreal at \$6 per ton, has left a very favorable impression that the fuel famine is no longer dangerous. This coal can be laid down at Toronto at \$8, and will go a long way toward forcing the coal dealers to terms.
