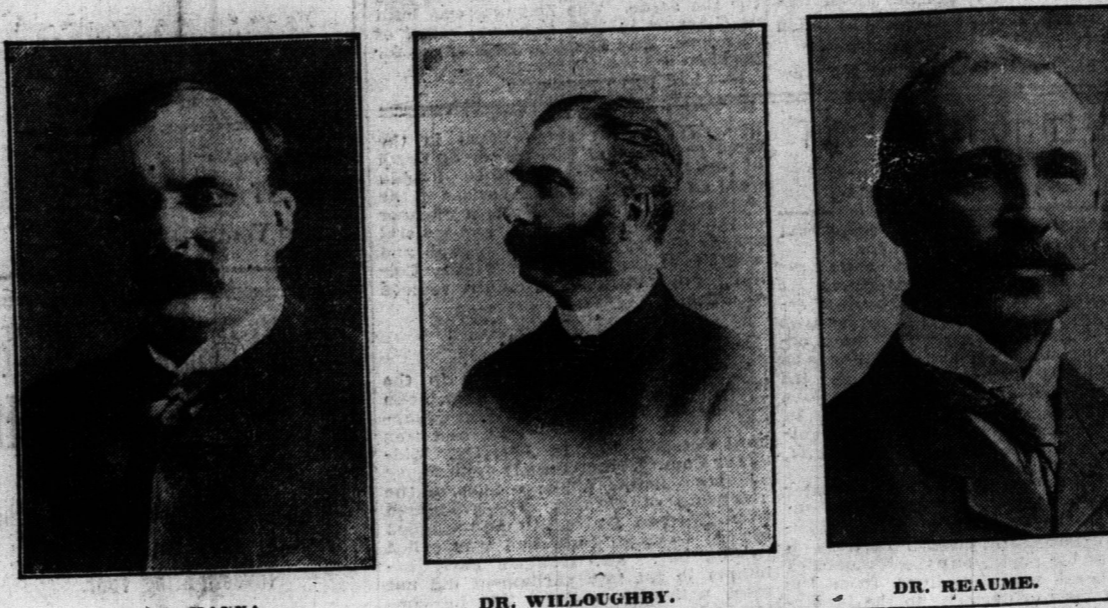
Premier-Elect Whitney Undertakes to Form a Government

Members of Legislature Invited by Wire From Morrisburg to Meet New Premier in Toronto These Seem To Be the Likely Men Whom Mr. Whitney Has Seen Fit to Choose as Colleagues

Mr. Whitney, K.C., M.L.A., is premier of the Province of Ontario to all intents and purposes. For the 24 hours following 1.30 yesterday afternoon there has been no government in Ontario save the authority of the representative of the crown vested in William Mortimer Clark, lieutenant-governor.

The old premier George William Ross, handed his resignation to the lieutenant-governor, yesterday afternoon, and the new premier, James P. Whitney, called on the lieutenant-governor, but only in an informal way, as usage does not decree that any but the premier should resign. Mr. Whitney returned at government house until 3.15.

The late premier drove to government house, accompanied by his messenger, Charles Chase. He handed in his resignation at once and lunched with the representatives of the crowd. About 2.30 a group of his late cabinet, A. G. Mackay, William A. Charlton, George E. Graham and John Dryden, called on the lieutenant-governor, but only in an informal way, as usage does not decree that any but the premier should resign. Mr. Whitney returned at government house until 3.15.

WILL NOT MAKE IT AN ISSUE CALGARY DEPUTY DECLARES

Autonomy Terms to Be Discussed With Irritating Question Eliminated by Deputation.

WHERE'S THE MAN?

Goldwin Smith in Weekly Sun: The debate on the extension of provincial autonomy to the Northwest, when it comes on, cannot fail to raise the question of the relations of the church to the state in connection with that of separate schools. Let anyone who is up to the mark move a resolution that, saving denominational rights specifically reserved by the British North America Act, the entire separation of the church from the state, and the perfect equality of all religious denominations before the law, are fundamental principles of this commonwealth. Such a resolution, if it could be carried, would morally settle separate school questions for the future. The principle was virtually affirmed in the secularization of the clergy reserves. But it was not distinctly embodied in our constitution. Anyone who could move such a resolution in placing it beyond dispute would render the commonwealth a service not likely to be forgotten.

Ottawa, Feb. 7.—(Special)—A deputation from Calgary arrived in the capital this afternoon to discuss with the government the terms upon which autonomy is to be granted to the territories. Calgary is interested in special features of the autonomy legislation. It wants to be made the capital of one of the provinces, it wants to extend the eastern boundary of Alberta 150 miles into Assiniboia, and it wants a distribution of seats on the basis of population. Calgary and Edmonton are the rival claimants for the distinction of capital of Alberta.

The new provincial legislatures will of course select their own capitals, but the federal authorities have the naming of the provincial capitals. To make either Calgary or Edmonton a provincial capital would give to the favored city a distinct advantage.

Justice Idington Will Go On Supreme Court Bench

His Appointment as Successor to Justice Killam is Announced From Ottawa.

Ottawa, Feb. 7.—(Special)—Justice Idington of Toronto has been appointed to the supreme court to fill the vacancy created by the appointment of Justice Killam to the chairmanship of the railway commission.

Justice John Idington was appointed to the high court bench in Ontario last year. He is in his 65th year, having been born near Morrison, Ont., Oct. 14, 1840. He graduated LL.B. at Toronto University in 1864, was called to the bar that same year and entered upon the practice of his profession at Stratford where he continued until called to the bench.

He was appointed a Q.C. by Sir Oliver Mowat in 1878; in 1879 was clerk of the peace, and crown attorney for Perth; and in 1885 was also made a Q.C. by the Marquis of Lansdowne. In 1884 he was president of the Western Bar Association. He has also been president of the North Perth Jefferson Association. He conducted the prosecution of the murderer Chattle in 1885. He is a Presbyterian. He married Margaret, daughter of the late George Colclough of Mount Forest.

On Jan. 28 last Justice Idington was the guest of honor at a banquet at Stratford, where he was presented with an address regretting his departure from Stratford and a handsome cabinet of silver as a token of respect from the members of a high court judge is \$3,000, of a pulse judge of the supreme court \$2,000.

Local County Lodge Takes Strong Stand at Annual Meeting, and Five Toronto Members of Parliament Will Be Requested to Oppose Planned Legislation in the West.

The County Orange Lodge at its annual business meeting last night took a strong stand against the proposed legislation at Ottawa by which separate schools are to be forced on the newly organized provinces of the north-west. A resolution was passed prohibiting strenuously against such legislation, and it was decided to ask every lodge in Ontario to act promptly in notifying its representative in the federal house of the necessity of vigorous action. The executive of the county lodge was also asked to ask the five city members and to ask them to use every possible means to prevent the passage of such legislation.

The executive was also authorized to interview the new Ontario cabinet with some suggested changes in regard to the bill concerning the clearly defined action, so as to more clearly define the position of the Catholic representatives on the board.

FURNESS LINER GOES ASHORE 18 MEN IN ONE BOAT MISSING

Crew and 30 Passengers Take to the Boats When Damara Struck in Thick Snowstorm

Hullfax, N.S., Feb. 7.—(Special.)—The Furness line steamer Damara went ashore at Pleasant Point of Musquodoboit Harbor, near Halifax, this morning, and one boat containing eighteen men is missing. The Damara, commanded by Capt. J. D. Gora, was on the voyage from Liverpool to Halifax via St. John's, Nfld., which latter port she left Sunday night. The steamer struck during a thick snowstorm. Orders were at once given to reverse the engines, but as the water was making rapidly the effort to get her afloat was given up and it was decided to abandon her.

Two boats put off containing the crew

and the passengers, thirty in all, one in charge of the captain and the other in charge of the mate. The mate, who was left on the ship, she was lost in the darkness, and the boats rowed towards what they thought was the shore. The sea was running high and the weather was down to zero.

After hours of hard work, during which much suffering was experienced, the mate's boat made a landing in a desolate place miles away from the nearest telegraph office, but up to the present nothing has been heard of the captain's boat, and grave anxiety is felt for its safety.

Wrecking steamers will leave at once for the scene. The Damara was built in Glasgow and is a vessel of 1775 tons. She has a general cargo for Halifax.

She had three passengers.
