Paris, Aug. 10—The allied forces have resumed their attacks upon the Turkish positions at the Dardanelles with great vigor, during the last two days, and have made sensible progress on the Gallipoli peninsula, according to a Haves despatch received from Athens. The Turkish losses have been heavy. Simultaneously the allied fleet bombarded the Turkish positions on the Dardaneses. nelles, inflicting severe damage upon their defense works. 




