SELLING CHILDREN BY THE DANKALI ARMS.—Many of the Dankali Bedouins do certainly sell their female children.—Garabime, as I have before observed, had thus disposed of three, and Moosa of two daughters; and on more than one occasion I had offered to me for sale, girls from ten to fourteen years old, at the price of about four or five dollars each. In merchandise the value of a really handsome slave girl appears much more trifling than when paid for in hard cash, as six or seven couple of fine souls, worth about two shillings in England, is a more than sufficient temptation to induce even a mother to part with her child. These bargains, I observed, were always transacted with the female relatives; but the returns, I was told, were generally handed over to the father or brothers. The girls were freighted to death at the idea of being sold to me, but seemed happy enough to leave their desert homes in search of fortunes elsewhere, with masters of their own colour; and both parents and children, in these business transactions, support themselves most stoically, although on the eve of their being separated forever.—*John Smith's Travels.*
