TARIFF RESOLUTIONS. That it is expedient to repeal section six of the customs tariff, 1897, and to substitute the following section therefor: 6.—The importation into Canada of any such goods imported shall thereby become forfeited to the crown, and may be destroyed or otherwise dealt with as the minister of customs may direct; and any person importing any such prohibited goods, or causing them to be imported, shall for each offence incur a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars.
