Ontario Finances.

The following brief synopsis of the state of the finances of Ontario which is given in the Dundas Banner, will be of interest and benefit to our numerous readers in West Wellington, who are at present in the throes of an election contest. As such we commend it to their careful consideration, and feel satisfied that if they do so in an unbiassed and fair manner, no other conclusion can be arrived at than that the utmost carefulness and good judgment has characterized the management of this department, which is in charge of Mr. Crooks. When the Reform Government took office in December, 1871, the financial position exhibited a surplus in invested funds of \$3,637,979, which was chargeable with the 'amount of Sandfield Macdonald's Railway Aid Fund, \$1,600,000, and with the large sum of \$764,594 representing unexpended appropriations, of which \$348,991 was for public works and buildings and finishing the Central Prison. 
