DAIRY CALVES.

To raise dairy calves successfully there are a number of important points beside feed to be considered.

Another point to be watched is dampness. Calves kept in cold, wet stalls and fed from dirty pails are very likely to contract scour, which if not stopped soon will kill a young calf in short order.

THE FEED.

My way of treating a calf is to take it from its mother as soon as it is dry and place it in a warm box stall with plenty of dry bedding.

I keep this skim milk and grain going until the calf is six or seven months old. When the calf is a month or six weeks old it will eat a little solid food and there is nothing better for it than a little green oat hay.
