

IS PHILATELY INSTRUCTIVE?

ADAPTED FROM AN ARTICLE IN AN OLD MAGAZINE.

(Concluded from last month.)

"THAT is easily done. You know, uncle, there are two sorts of collections of stamps, the maculate and the immaculate. Maculate stamps, or such as have passed through the post, are marked, to prevent their being used again. I do not claim any value for those, because you, perhaps, wil not admit that they have any value.

I nodded my perfect assent to this.

"And yet I have a Neapolitan stamp—here it is—of the late king Bomba, which I would not part with for five shillings. Besides, as each country has different postage stamps, so has each a different mode of defacing them. Just look, uncle. England does it by black bars, Hesse Darmstadt by concentric circles, France by a number of little black spots. Now, as it is possible that the rarity of certain discontinued stamps will tempt forgers to imitate them, if they commit any error in the mode of defacement, they will be caught most assuredly. Therefore, an authentic postmark on a stamp confirms its genuineness and increases its worth."

"Which I ignore."

"I must tell you a true story, which I heard a short time ago. A maid-servant, who made use of a postage stamp for the first time in her life, had noticed that all the letters she took in for her master were dotted with black over the stamp, like this head of the Republic. She supposed it was done to make the stamps stick better, and imitated it as well as she could with a pen. At the post office, it was at first suspected that some one had used an old stamp, to cheat the government. Inquiries were made, and learned experts set to work, who proved the girl's innocence of intentional wrong. She got off with an admonition, lucky enough to escape further trouble."

"Is it possible she could have been so stupid."

"There are more stupid things done than that. Among the curiosities found in letter-boxes are unstamped letters in considerable quantities, and mingled with them, though not exactly in the same proportion, single loose postage stamps. There are people ignorant enough, after they have written and directed their letter, to buy a stamp at the office and then, instead of sticking it on the letter, to throw it into the box at the same time with the letter, supposing that to be the mode of prepayment. The clerks do the best they can to distribute justice in the shape of stamps, amongst the

unprovided letters; but their utmost inpartiality may not prevent some letter-writers from reaping what they have not sown."

"Beautiful simplicity! But you were to prove that your album is

worth a shilling."

"Instantly, uncle. My collection is, for the most part, maculate, consisting of old stamps. I am not rich enough to procure unused stamps of all the countries; nevertheless I have a few. Now you must acknowledge, uncle, that unused stamps are worth their cost price. Here is a Wurtemburg stamp for six kreuzers; here, a Swiss one for forty rappen, a Belgian one for forty centimes, a Norwegian one for eight skilling, and a Prussian one for four silber groschen, all unused. Their joint value is more than a shilling English."

"I don't know," I demurred, speaking the truth.

"Again, here are French immaculates for eighty, forty, twenty, ten, five, and one centime respectively; that's more than a shilling. And here are English ones for sixpence, fourpence, threepence, twopence and one penny. Do they make a shilling? Eh uncle?"

"I suppose they do, and that you have the best of the argument."

"Yes. And I am in hopes, uncle, that I shall be able to make you entertain a higher opinion of postage stamps. They are a great discovery: and if so, their history is well worth studying. The man who invented them deserves as much honour as he who invented coin for cash transactions. By sticking a bit of paper, with a government mark, on a letter, you command its delivery, as soon as may be, at any place you choose to name. All the formalties and delays of money payments are avoided, including those connected with the money exchange of the foreign countries which the letter may have to traverse."

"That is, you mean to say that postage-stamps are a simple and conven-

ient form of paper money?"

"I beg your pardon. Postage stamps are not paper money; they are much more than, and superior to, paper money. Paper money supposes moneyed capital of the precious metals, and, to have any worth, must be backed by a bank with bullion in it sufficient to pay them off whenever required. The bullion may run short, be spent, or stolen; the bank may fail, and the paper be good for nothing but to light a cigar with. Postage stamps represent not cash to be read but a service to be rendered; the only capital they suppose is the existence of human limbs and brains and the continuance of civilized society. So long as nations endure, and people have a mutual interest in knowing what is going on in other places, a postage stamp can never fall to the level of a bank note issued by a broken bank. Perhaps even, one of these days, we shall have stamps to prepay other services I esides letter-carrying."

"Your imagination is running along my boy, faster than I can follow it"

"Not at all uncle; for the scheme is already put in action to a certain extent. Did you ever hear of a ticket for soup?"

"I think, Harry, I have. But what has that to do with it?"

"A ticket for soup (about which so many jokes have been made) is a promise, by charitable persons, of a gift to be made. The soup received is the fulfilment of the promise, is it not? Applying the same principle to

business, there are restaurants in Paris who sell you packets of tickets for dinners. Instead of paying for your board for the month (and paying for nothing whenever you are asked out to dinner), you keep the tickets in your pocket book, and, whenever you want to dine, you present one; exactly as, when you want to send a letter, you stick upon it the proper stamp, and put it into the letter-box. The restaurant's ticket is a dinner stamp; it prepays the butcher, the cook, the wine-merchant, the rent of the dining room, and the use of the dinner things, all through the agency of the head of the establishment who is always there to supply the meal contracted for whenever called upon to do so. Subscription to the opera is something of the same kind. All I say is, that we may carry the stamp system further, applying it to medical attendance."

"We will ask the Doctor what he has to say to it. Meanwhile, I begin to think that your time and money may not have been spent on mere unmeaning bits of paper. To convince me thoroughly, can you stand an

examination in the contents of your own stamp-book?"

"I believe so, uncle. Please begin wherever you like."

"How does the native Hanoverian spell the name of his country?"

"With two n's; H, a, double n."
"What does S, v, e, r, i, g, e mean?"

"Sverige is Sweden."

"What is a Freimarke?"

"A Swedish Freimarke, an Austrian Post-stemple, a Hanoverian Bestellgeld-frei, a Dutch Post-zegel, a French Timbre-post, an Italian Francobollo, a Hamburg or Lubeck Postmarke, are all and equally postage stamps."

"What is the shape of a Cape of Good Hope stamp?"

" Triangular."

"What are the stamps with a crowned lion holding a shield, marked

nine crazie and six crazie?"

"Ah, those are Tuscan, begining to be rare and valuable. A collector sets a value on a postage stamp in inverse proportion to the stability and prosperity of the state by which it is issued. Those of the overthrown Italian Duchies, Tuscany, Parma, and Modena, never were numerous, are now scarce, and will soon be priceless."

"What are—I can't make them out myself—those very pretty stamps, with oval medallions, green, red and blue, in the midst of drapery of a

different color?"

"Those are Russian, for thirty, twenty and ten copecks each. I cannot read the legend or inscription, because I have not yet been able to set myself up with a Russian alphabet, and a grammar and dictionary to follow."

"Your aunt and myself will manage that between us. Let us now go

and see whether she has finished her letter."

"You have been a long while upstairs," observed Emma, as we entered, as she handed me her letter to read.

"Harry has been showing me his correspondence. You may give him

the envelope, or he will content himself with the stamp."

I then described to Emma what I had just seen. She was astonished. When I told her of the interesting conversation I had had with Harry, she

agreed with me that the pursuit of stamp collecting is both profitable and instructive. Thereafter we both encouraged Harry, and gave him all the assistance in our power to help make his collection complete as possible.

When I compare stamp collecting of those days, with the "Philately" of the present time; when I look over the well-bound albums now issued expressly for collectors, the many pamphlets on the subject, the large number of papers devoted solely to the cause; when I think of the numerous philatelic societies and the vast number who are now interested in philately; I must admit that I feel ashamed of the way I treated Harry, when he first expressed his views on the value of stamp collecting.

THE STAMPS OF GREECE.

FROM "LA JUSTICE OU SOCRATE."

THE stamps of this country are of the most perplexing varieties in the way of printing and colors. In order to try and enlighten the young collector, we have made a translation of a Greek list of ramps, from the above named pamphlet. The author of it living in Athens, has had opportunities to get the dates and varieties more correctly than those not living there. While it is only nominally issued as a price list, it is something a great deal better. Without further apologies we will therefore start on the author's list.

In 1872 there was a set of unpaid stamps issued. The design was the numeral of value in black in centre, and border in green, unperforated. Those unperforated unpaid stamps are not included in any of the latalogues of the day. Design the same in all values. They are as follows: 1 Lepton, 2, 5, 10, 20, 40, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100 and 200 Lepta.

In 1875 they were issued of the same design and perforated. Values were 1 Lepton, 2, 5, 10, 20, 40, 60, 70, 80 and 90 Lepta, and 1 and 2 drachma.

NEWLY ISSUED STAMPS.

Austria.—The 20 kr. we hear, is to be changed to brown and the 5s. we have seen surcharged 15 para.

Colombia.—"Le Timbre Post" illustrates several new designs of the official cubiertas; we have received a 1c. black on green, of the new issue with map.

Congo Free State.—The old and new 5 fcs. are surcharged in two lines "Colio Postaux—Fr. 3.50" in dark blue.

Costa Rica.—The new 5c. is surcharged "Official."

Cuba.—Of the current type, we have two new stamps, headed "Cuba Impresos" value 2 mils and 4 mils, both black.

Denmark —On Nov. 25, the 5c. card with inscriptions in Danish and French was issued.

Egypt.—The piastre is now equal to 10 diximes and the following novelties have been issued: 1m. brown, 2m. green, 5m. red. Unpaid letter stamps, 2m. green, 5m. brown, 5 x 5m. red. Envelope, 1 piastre.

French Colonies.-We have been shown a 15c. letter card, blue on grey.

Gambiers.—The French colony stamps are now surcharged by these islands, which have been under the protectorate of France since 1844.

Hayti.—We have the new 3c. blue (c.c. 44).

Macao.—The fiscal stamps have had the top and bottom labels taken off, and have been surcharged to do duty as 5, 10, or 40, reis.

Perak.—2c. rose of Straits Settlements is surcharged in black in three lines "l-cent-Perak" in capital letters.

St. Christopher.—"Le Timbre Poste" reports cards of 1 x 1d. carmine and $l_2^1 \times l_2^1 d$, brown on buff. They are perforated at the top and have the head of Queen in circle.

Turkey.—Rumor has it that the stamps will be changed in March.

SOME CANADIAN REVENUES.

T is only within the last two or three years, that there has been any interest taken in Canadian Revenue Stamps, and even now, it does not amount to a great deal. This is unfortunate, as some day soon we will wake up for their collection and will find that we cannot get them. Even now there is more call for Canadian Revenues from collectors on the continent and in the United States in one month than there is from Canadian collectors in a year. These facts are lamentable, but still they are true. The collectors of Canada should be awake to this fact and not have the very best stamps drained from the Country to enrich the albums of foreign collectors.

The first revenues stamps were issued in Canada in 1865, and were "Bill stamps" and tobacco stamps. Of the tobacco stamps we cannot commence to write as the variety is numberless and those first issued are

some of them almost unknown.

It is hardly possible that a complete collection of the tobacco stamps of Canada and of the Dominion of Canada could now be made. The Bill stamps however are more easily secured. The design was a small head of the Queen to left, shape rectangular, color blue. Those stamps were used only for drafts and promissory notes.

The stamps of this design were surcharged N. S. for us in Nova Scotia but they do not appear to have ever been used to any great extent as they are exceedingly rare, especially any values above 10c. From 1c. to 50c. were surcharged N. S. at bottom of stamp, but the \$1, 2, & 3 were surcharged very near to the top.

Those last three values surcharged N. S. have caused some little discussion as to whether they were ever surcharged or not. The \$1 and \$2 we have seen ourselves and have no doubt but that the other value was

also surcharged. The use of Bill stamps was abolished in

When the Supreme Court was established is 1876, the Dominion Government assumed the administration of the correctness of weights and measures, and the supervision of gas. Stamps were accordingly issued for those three Departments viz. Supreme Court, Weights and Measures, and Gas Inspection. Designs as follows:

NOVA SCOTIA'S LAW STAMP.

When any of our readers, who collect revenue stamps, read this head line, we can imagine the perplexed look, the hunting over of catalogues, and the assertion, why this must be something new, or else it is a fraud. Now this stamp is neither. It has been in use in Halifax for the last nine years, and is in use yet. It, is not to be wondered at that it has not been catalogued, there are no revenue collectors in Halifax, and even if there were they are not likely to come across it. The stamp is legalized by virtue of the following Notice, and act of the Legislature of Nova Scotia.

NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that the Nova Scotia Barristers Society has provided adherive stamps, for the payment of the fees toward the support of the Law Library at Halifax, pursuant to the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of Nova Scotia, passed on the 17th of April A. D. 1879, entitled "An Act in relation to the Law Library at Halifax." After the expiation of 30 days from this date, all writs of summonses issued out of the Supreme Court and County Court at Halifax, or made returnable thereto, will be void unless stamped in accordance with the supervisions of said Act.
