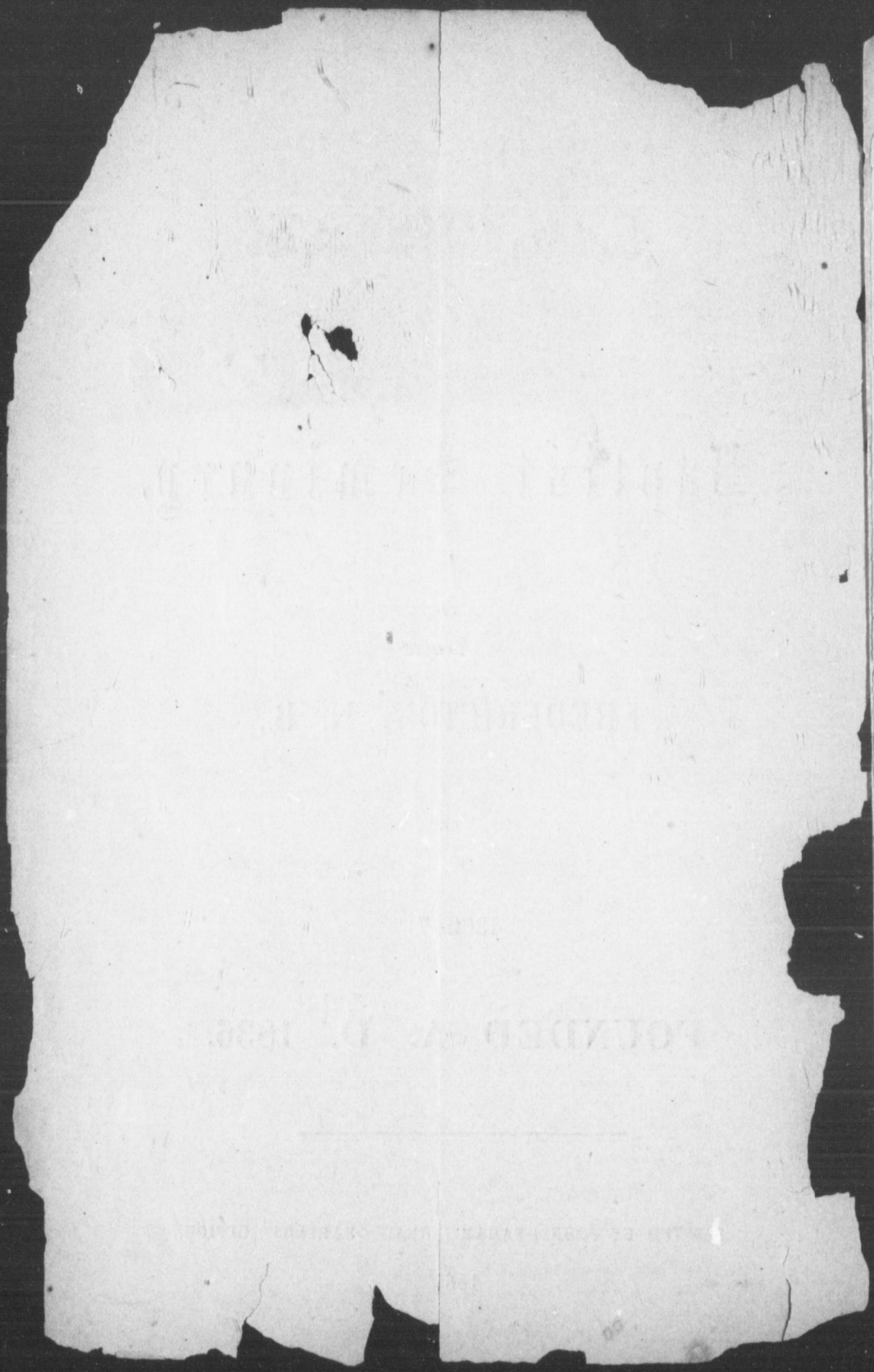

Reading and Spelling.

Senior Department.

English continued, with advanced books in English Grammar; Geography; History, English, Roman and Grecian; Composition and Declamation.

Latin—Grammar and Translation; Cæsar; Virgil; Horace; Ovid; Cicero; with Prose Composition.

Greek—Grammar and Translation; New Testament; Xenophon; Homer; Lucian; Demosthenes; with Prose Composition.

Mathematics—Arithmetic; Algebra; Geometry; Trigonometry; Mensuration; Surveying and Navigation.

French—Grammar and Translation; Charles XII.; *Littérature Française*; and Composition.

Natural Science—Natural Philosophy; Astronomy; Physical Geography; Botany; Geology; Chemistry.

EXAMINATIONS.

There are Semi-Terminal and Terminal Examinations held throughout the year, at which times each Student's standing is carefully marked and registered for the inspection of parents and visitors. At Christmas and the close of the Academic year in June, these Examinations are public, and conducted by gentlemen of the New Brunswick University and a Board of Examiners, appointed by the Education Society.

RELIGIOUS EXERCISES.

All Students are required to attend Morning and Evening Worship during the week, and Divine Service twice every Sabbath, at such places as their parents or guardians may state.

Suitable Boarding Houses are provided for Young Ladies in the town, at moderate rates.

Young men and lads may receive Board in the Institution on the following terms:—Board, Light, Fuel, Washing and Bedding, \$108 per Academic year, payable quarterly in advance.

The Academic year is divided into four Terms of ten weeks each, beginning August 30th, 1867, and continuing without vacation till the close in June, 1868.

SOCIETIES.

The Athenæum is a Literary Society, holding weekly meetings, whose object is the improvement of its members in discussion, and a knowledge of Parliamentary usage.

The Alumni Society, whose object is the advancement of Education in connection with the Seminary, the cultivation of a friendly feeling among its members, and the awarding of prizes to Students for superiority in particular departments of learning.

An annual fee of two dollars constitutes a member. The officers for the present year are
