CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be denominated "The Ontario Rifle Association."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$1 per annum, shall become a member of the Association.

3. Donors of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as life members of the Association.

4. Any Battalion or Rifle Association in the Province subscribing not less than \$10 annually to the funds of the Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, in the proportion of one to every half-dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to elect from its members the persons to hold such memberships, and return their names and addresses, when elected, to the Secretary of the Association, to be registered by him one week previous to the match.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council.

The Lieut.-Governor of the Province of Ontario, for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President.

7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents,—one for each Military District.

8. There shall be a Council, composed as follows:—

1st. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected primarily at this meeting, and hereafter at the annual meeting.

2nd. The Deputy Adjutants General of Militia.

3rd. The Brigade Majors.

4th. The Presidents of local affiliated Associations and Clubs,
being members of the Association,—

Five of whom shall form a quorum; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

9. The Council shall choose from the members elected the President of the Association.

10. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such District, and who shall be elected by the Council.

11. There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

12. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

13. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

14. The annual prize meeting shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.

15. The prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed by the Council from time to time.

16. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.

17. There shall be an annual meeting, to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

Secretaries of Rifle Associations affiliated, or desirous of affiliating with the Ontario Rifle Association, will confer a favour by forwarding the names and addresses of the office-bearers of their Associations, as soon after their election as possible, in order that they may be published in the annual report.

BY-LAWS.

The next annual meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto, on the third Tuesday in June, 1874.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council; the first of which shall be held on the day after the annual meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of any members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

REGULATIONS

FOR THE

GOVERNMENT OF THE ONTARIO RIFLE RANGES, TORONTO.

Approved by the Adjutant-General of Militia, under 31 Vic. cap. 40, sec. 58.

1. The season for rifle practice shall be from 1st of May until the 1st October in each year.
2. The ranges shall be open for practice from 5 to 7 a.m., and from 2 till 7 p.m., daily, weather permitting, Sundays excepted.
3. The following ranges shall be permanently established: For the 2nd Battalion Queen's Own Rifles, 1 range; for the 10th Battalion Royals, 1 range; for the 2nd Brigade Grand Trunk Artillery, Battery of Garrison Artillery, Field Battery, Governor-General's Body Guard, 1 range; Toronto Rifle Club and other Clubs, 1 range.
4. The afternoon practice on Mondays and Wednesdays shall be devoted to practice at long ranges (500 yards and over), and shall be confined to the centre ranges. On other days the firing shall not be over 600 yards.
5. No person shall be permitted to fire over the ranges unless in possession of an affiliated membership ticket of the Ontario Rifle Association, except Militiamen in uniform at company and battalion matches, or in the event of any corps being ordered to carry out the annual drill and target practice of the corps at Toronto, when the use of the ground and rifle ranges would be claimed by the Militia Department for the period of time required, and be then under the entire control of that Department.
6. The affiliated membership ticket shall cost 50 cents per annum to each Militiaman joining as a certified member of an existing corps of active service militia; to each person not in the active militia, it shall cost \$1. Such ticket to entitle the holder to the privileges of entry at the Ontario Rifle Association matches, and to the use of the ranges for practice during the season.
7. Should more than one range be required for a company, battalion or club match, the Secretary shall be notified in writing at least three days before the ranges are required, that he may give notification (if necessary) that practice on the ranges shall be stopped

during the continuance of such match. Upon no other consideration shall a battalion, corps, or club be entitled to the use of more than one range, or take possession of, or fire over, any other than the ranges assigned to their use.

8. For company or battalion matches Militiamen may supply their own markers, or, if so desirous, have them supplied by the Association, at the rate of \$1 each per day.

9. All individuals belonging to a battalion, corps or club, attending for practice, shall be accompanied by an officer, or office-bearer of such corps or club, who shall be held responsible that the regulations of the Association are complied with.

10. The officer, non-commissioned officer or office-bearer accompanying each corps or club, shall insert in a book provided at the signal office, the date, corps, number of men present, time of practice and complaints (if any) against the employés of the Association, signing his name and rank in full. He shall be responsible that each man firing is a "bona fide" ticket-holder, and entitled to fire over the ranges. Any person knowingly violating this rule shall be guilty of misconduct, and shall be debarred from further competition over the ranges, or at matches of the Association.

12. Should it be desired by any number of qualified persons, not less than ten, to fire over the ranges before the 1st of May, or after the 1st October, they shall be entitled to do so, by giving one day's notice in writing to the Secretary, at the Ontario Rifle Association's stores, Block House, Old Fort, and on payment of markers' wages in advance. No such notice to be sufficient unless received by the Secretary twenty-four hours before such range is required. Special arrangements will be made, on receiving notice as above, for any number of qualified persons, not less than five, to practice over their respective ranges between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon, daily, during the season, at the rate of 50c. per hour.

REPORT OF COUNCIL
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION,
1873.

Your Council beg to submit their Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st December, 1873.

The Annual Matches took place on the Association Ranges, in September, at which the attendance was about equal with the preceding year; the firing, however, was of a higher standard, shewing that Canadian marksmen are fast attaining that perfection in the use of the rifle exhibited at the Wimbledon competitions.

In order to shorten the time usually taken up by the matches, the Battalion, Sir Peter Tait, and Company competitions were fired simultaneously, the same score answering for all three. This was found to work satisfactorily, and to accomplish the desired end, which was to complete the competition in four days.

The number of matches was also reduced to five, with prizes given for highest scores at each range.

The number of prizes offered was 159, divided as follows:

Your Council have again to record, with thanks, the liberal annual grants of the Dominion and Provincial Governments, the Canada Company Prize, and the annual donation of Lieut.-Col. Gzowski; also a Remington Match Rifle, presented by Remington & Co., and prizes by the Gardner Sewing Machine Company, Quetton St. George & Co., Ewing & Co., Copp, Clark & Co., and Messrs. Edwards and Matthews.

From the prize list given in the appendix, it will be seen that the "Ladies," "Merchants," "Sir Peter Tait," "Elkington," and "Brassey" Cups still figure conspicuously among the principal prizes awarded. The latter cup was again (the second time) won by No. 2 Battery, Second Battalion Grand Trunk Brigade, thus entitling them to its permanent possession; but your Council, desiring to perpetuate the munificent donation of £100 given by the late Thomas Brassey, Esq., at a time when the Association greatly needed aid, and of which the cup forms a part, purchased it from the winners, and will again offer it for competition under new regulations.

A list of cups presented to the Association since its formation will be found at page 19.

In connection with their last match, the thanks of the Association are due to Lieut.-Col. Powell, Acting Adjutant-General, and Lieut.-Col. French, Commandant of Ontario School of Gunnery, for their courtesy in permitting the Association to obtain the services, as markers, of non-commissioned officers and men from A Battery, Dominion Artillery; and to Captain Holmes and Lieut. Cotton of that corps, who kindly took charge of them, and of the police.

Thanks are also due to the Executive Committee, consisting of Lieut.-Colonels Gzowski, Denison and Skinner, for their prompt and just decisions upon the several points referred to them during the match; and commendation, with thanks, is deservedly earned by Lieut.-Col. Dartnell, Major Jarvis, Major Arthurs and Capt. Gray, for their zeal and efficiency in carrying out the details of the match; also Surgeons Thorburn, Richardson and Diamond, for regular and constant attendance in case of illness or accident.

To the Managers of the several Railway Companies the Association is particularly indebted for the assistance rendered in carrying competitors to and from Toronto at reduced fares; and to the reporters of the *Globe*, *Mail* and *Leader* for the full and accurate reports of the several matches.

Your Council have to note the loss of nine affiliated Associations since last year. Those making returns are, however, in greater proportion in 1873 than the previous year.

In consequence of the reduction of the affiliated Associations, the affiliated membership has also fallen off; the increase in ordinary membership has been very slight, and it continues to be a source of regret that more interest is not manifested by the country at large

in the encouragement and support of rifle shooting, as a means of national defence.

Your Council regret having to record the decease of one of its life members, the Hon. W. B. Robinson, who, from the inception of the Association, had used every means to further its interests.

The lease of the Garrison Common from the Dominion Government has not as yet been of pecuniary benefit, owing to the large outlay necessary to put the ranges in good order, but it is hoped that in the future material advantages will be derived from its use.

Regarding the selection of marksmen for the Canadian Wimbledon Team, your Council are of opinion that the terms of competition should be uniform and strictly defined, in the whole Dominion, and that such competition should be thrown open to all duly qualified active Militia men.

Your Council have decided to vote again the bonus of \$20 to affiliating Associations for 1874, on the following conditions, viz:—The amount, together with a special badge provided by the Association, to be awarded to the highest aggregate score made at the annual match of the affiliating Association during the year 1874, upon the condition that the holder of the badge shall present himself at the Ontario Rifle Association Matches for 1875, to compete in a match provided for the purpose; and upon the further condition, that an authorized copy of the winning scores at such match be furnished to the Secretary of the Ontario Rifle Association, on or before the 1st November, 1874, for publication with the Annual Report of the Association.

At the meeting of the Council held on the conclusion of the Prize Meeting in September, Lieut.-Col. Gzowski resigned the office of President, and Lieut.-Col. Scoble that of Secretary. The President, on tendering his resignation, offered to continue to discharge the duties until his successor was chosen, provided this was done within a period of six months. Your Council have to advert to these resignations with sincere regret.

In Lieut.-Col. Scoble was found the embodiment of zeal, knowledge, and untiring energy in the discharge of the arduous duties devolving upon him. To him is due the present efficient working of our Annual Matches, in the details of which he was continually found working late and early,—suggesting, adopting and improving, until the time and labour thus enthusiastically devoted in advancing the interest of the Association trespassed upon his other avocations so as

Major Otter, Queen's Own Rifles, has taken up the duties of the Secretary.

In alluding to Lieut.-Col. Gzowski's services, we feel assured that we have the consent of every marksman in the Dominion in denominating him the "Father of rifle-shooting" on this Continent.

One of the very first to come forward and assist and almost found the Ontario Rifle Association, and subsequently the Dominion Rifle Association, of which he continues to be the President, he has, by constant and never-failing consistency, inspired both volunteers and civilians with a portion at least of his own ardour and spirit, and of establishing on a firm basis means of defence which Canada may yet have reason to be grateful for.

To him we are indebted for many handsome and costly prizes which have been yearly offered for competition, and obtained either by his personal expenditure or solicitation to the various donors.

To Lieut.-Col. Gzowski we are also greatly indebted for sending the first team of Canadians, as well as the more recent ones, to Wimbledon, whereby Canadians have been enabled to contend creditably and successfully with the first marksmen of the world, and to prove that they are anxious and willing to perpetuate the honour and glory of the British Empire.

In seeking a successor to Lieut.-Col. Gzowski, your Council have been guided by his advice, which was, to select a gentleman from the ranks of the leading merchants of the Province, hoping thus to bind and strengthen the ties which should exist between the business citizen and the soldier.

The Council are pleased to be able to report that they have obtained the assent of Mr. John Gordon, of Toronto, to accept the office of President of the Association. The Council believe that Mr. Gordon's position, as one of the principal merchants of the Dominion, will enable him to exercise an important and useful influence in behalf of the Association.
