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CONSTITUTION AND BYE-LAWS

OF THE

NEW BRUNSWICK

PROVINCIAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION.

- 1. This Association shall be called "The New Brunswick Provincal Rifle Association."
- 2. Any person being a British subject, subscribing two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be a member thereof for the year in which such subscription shall be made.
- 3. A contribution of twenty dollars, or of the value thereof, to the Association shall constitute the donor a life member.
- 4. County and Regimental Associations subscribing ten dollars and upwards per annum towards the funds of the Association shall be considered as being in connection therewith, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships in the proportion of one to every dollar so subscribed. The subscribing Association to elect from among its members the persons to hold such memberships. In Counties where County or Regimental Associations are not formed, Volunteer Companies, Troops or Batteries, upon payment of five dollars and upwards to the Association, to be allowed five or more memberships in like manner. Members not to be eligible by virtue of such membership to participate in the management of the affairs of the Association, nor shall commissioned Officers be entitled to such memberships.
- 5. On payment of any subscription or contribution, tickets of membership shall be issued by the Secretary, which shall contain the name of the member, and shall not be transferable.
- 6. No Officer, Non-commissioned Officer or private of the Militia of New Brunswick, not being a member or an affiliated member of the Association, shall be allowed to compete for any prizes except "All Comers," under its control.

7. The Annual Meeting of the members of the Association for the election of a President and Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held on the first Wednesday in October in each year, at such hour and place as the Council shall appoint.

A special general meeting of the members of the Association may be called at any time by the President, upon the written requisition of any three members.

- 8. A Patron and Vice-Patron, who shall also be members of the Council, may be named by the Council.
- 9. The members shall, at each Annual General Meeting of the Association choose from among their number a President who shall be President of the Association. Also a Vice-President, who shall act in the absence of the President.
- 10. The Adjutant-General of Canada, Deputy Adjutant-General, the Assistant Inspector of Artillery for New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, and all Field Officers on the Militia Staff in New Brunswick; the Brigade Major, the senior Field-Officer of the Eighth Regiment of Cavalry, of the New Brunswick Brigade of Artillery, of the New Brunswick Engineers, and of each Volunteer Battalion throughout the Province, and the President of any County Association, affiliated with the Provincial Association, respectively being members, shall be ex officio Vice-Presidents of the Provincial Association.
- 11. The Gouncil shall annually appoint a Secretary-Treasurer of the Association.
- 12. The Council shall consist of the Vice-Presidents and Secretary-Treasurer, ex officio; and also of not more than twenty members, who shall be elected annually by a majority of votes taken by ballot at the general meeting. Five members of the Council shall form a quorum for the transaction of business. Any member elected to the Council at the general meeting of the Association may qualify by payment of his subscription at any time prior to the next meeting of the Council, and if the same shall not be then paid, the place of such member shall be considered vacated, and may be filled by the Council.
- 13. The Council shall conduct and control the business of the Association, and may grant such salary as they shall see fit to any Officer of the Association, and shall meet twice during the year, or oftener if required by the President or any two of its members.

The Council shall, at its first meeting, elect five of its members to form, with the President and Secretary, an Executive Committee, which, subject to such instructions as may be given by the Council, shall transact the business of the Association, and shall arrange for and conduct the Annual Prize Competitions.

15. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy which may exist in the number of its members, or of the Office Bearers of the Association; and to enact Bye-Laws for the regulation of the Competitions for the prizes of the Association, and of all other matters committed to its charge.

16. The Secretary-Treasurer shall conduct all correspondence, keep the minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the Association and of the Council; and shall also keep the accounts of the Association, which shall be annually audited and reported upon to the General Meeting by three members appointed by the Council for that purpose.

17. A general meeting of members and competitors shall be held on the second evening during the Annual Prize Matches for the discussion of matters relating to the prize list and shooting regulations.

18. No alterations in this Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Meeting of the Association by a vote of a majority of the members present and entitled to vote at such meeting.

BYE-LAWS.

- 1. The election of all officers and of the Council shall be by ballot, upon nomination duly made and seconded, and no vote shall count for any person not so nominated.
- 2. At least fourteen days notice of the time and place appointed for the Annual Meeting shall be given by the Secretary, in one or more newspapers published in the city of Saint John, and by notification to each member of the Council.
- 3. The regular meetings of the Council shall be held on the first Thursday in November, and on the day of the Annual Meeting, at such time and place as the President shall appoint.
- 4. Special meetings of the Council may be called at any time by the President, and shall be called by him on the written request of any

two members of the Council; such request to contain the nature of the business for which the meeting is asked.

- 5. Notice of the time and place of every regular and special meeting of the Council shall be issued by the Secretary to each member thereof, at least seven days before the day appointed for the meeting, and such notices must state the object or objects for which such meeting is called.
- 6. Meetings of the Council may be adjourned from day to day, as may be found necessary.
- 7. If at any regular or special meeting a quorum be not present, three members of the Council (an officer of the Association being one,) shall have power—after waiting half an hour, to adjourn the meeting, to another time, and it shall not be necessary to issue notices for such adjourned meeting.
- 8. The Council shall appoint three of its members a Committee of Audit, to whom the Sccretary-Treasurer shall submit his books and accounts at least one week before the Annual meeting, and the Committee shall audit the same and report thereon at said Annual meeting.
- 9. The annual prize meetings of the Association shall be held at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Council.
- 10. Notice of the time and place of the Annual Competition shall be given by the Secretary by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in the city of Saint John, and elsewhere in the Province, as the Council may direct, at least *fourteen* days before the first of the days appointed for the meeting, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to forward to the Officers commanding Corps in the Province, at least six copies of the programme of such Annual Competition.
- 11. A Silver Medal will be given to each County or other Rifle Association within the Province which affiliates with the Provincial Association, on or before the first day of August in each year; which medals shall be competed for at the Queen's ranges, and a certificate of the same together with the scores, shall be required from the Secretary of each affiliated Association, before the delivery of the Medal.

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FIFTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

On behalf of the Council of the Provincial Rifle Association it is now my duty to present a report of the proceedings of the past year.

The usual grant of \$1300 was received from the Dominion Government, and was devoted to the Prize List of the Annual Competition and the expenses connected therewith. The Provincial Government has again kindly granted \$300, to enable this Association to send a representative Team to Ottawa to compete for places on the Wimbledon Team.

The Annual Competition took place at the Sussex range, commencing on Tuesday, August 23rd, and lasting till Friday afternoon. The sum of \$1099 was devoted to the Prize List, beside the several Cups and Medals which are the property of the Association, and also a number of valuable prizes given by individuals. The competition was, we feel justified in saying, satisfactory to the competitors and to the Council of the Association. The attendance was larger than it had been for many years past. There were over thirty competitors on the ground who had never before attended a Provincial competition, and many of these men were highly successful and are likely to take a front rank in rifle shooting.

The Council are of opinion that the changes suggested at the last Annual meeting, and adopted at this competition, have had much to do with the increased attendance, and hope that, by keeping down the cost of attendance to the lowest possible amount, the number of competitors will be still further increased.

The Council would again draw attention to the benefit which has resulted to the St. John County Association from the system of monthly matches which it has adopted, and it would strongly urge upon other County Associations to adopt the same practice.

The Association was represented at the competition of the Dominion Association at Ottawa by a team of fourteen men. This team won a large number of prizes and sustained the credit of the Province fully as well as could be expected considering the long distance they had to travel and the difficult range on which they had to shoot. The report of the Captain of the team will be laid before you.

The Council would ask the Assocation to consider whether it would be advisable to recommend to the Dominion Association the adoption of a range that would be perfectly neutral, as the use of the present range (though equally fair to all those who are not in the habit of using it), must certainly give an advantage to those who practice upon it constantly.

The Council have much pleasure in saying that after providing almost as large a prize list as last year and paying all expenses of the year, there is still a balance on hand, as will appear from the report of the Treasurer which is now placed before you duly audited.

The Council wish to express their thanks to the managers of the different lines of railways and steamboats in the Province for the facilities offered by them to competitors going to Sussex.



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The opinion rule requirin now no furt much less the SAINT JOHN, Oct. 3, 1881.

Sir,-

Having, at a meeting of the New Brunswick riflemen held at Ottawa, been chosen Captain of the Team, it becomes my duty to submit to you the following report for the information of the members of the Association.

Of those holding places on the team, but fourteen reported themselves, and among these was divided the allowance of \$300. I found that entrances had been made for twenty competitors in all the principal matches; however, on making application, we were refunded the amount of the entries thus unfilled.

The team again met with but apparently slight success, though proportionately it was more fortunate than the representative teams of other Provincial Associations. The prizes won amounted to \$160, of which sum \$147 was divided equally among the members. Col. Sergt. Smith and Sapper Langstroth were of the fifty who competed for the Governor General's prizes, and the former, by his continued good shooting, gained a place on the Wimbledon Team for 1882. Sapper Langstroth, in a match at 200 yards, won the leading prize, a Remington Match Rifle. I would mention that every member of the team succeeded in becoming a prize winner.

The eight to represent New Brunswick in the Provincial Match was selected according to the scores made in the previous competitions. Five Provinces took part. The match was this year, happily made purely an inter Provincial contest, none but the members of teams competing, and it was consequently of more than usual interest.

Ontario won, with an aggregate score of 412 points, Nova Scotia second with 385, New Brunswick third with 383. Quebec and P. E. Island fourth and fifth.

The meeting throughout was admirably conducted,—a new feature that occasioned much satisfaction to all competitors. It was a meeting well worth attending, repaying even for the trying journey necessarily taken by the riflemen from this province.

The opinion was generally entertained by the team that the present rule requiring a division of winnings should be rescinded, for there is now no further occasion for it, the expense of competing being so much less than in former years.

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
I have to recommend that teams to represent this Province in the affiliated and Provincial Matches be no longer selected from the scores previously made, but that the first few aggregates have the right to choose the remainder, each one so chosen to have a voice in the selection of the others.

At a general meeting of the competitors, held on the range, the rule excluding from the Canadian Team those who may have been at Wimbledon twice in five years was sustained, and a motion authorizing the use of any position at the Dominion Matches so long as it is allowed by the National Association was adopted.




