INCORPORATED SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF HURON

THIRTY-SECOND SESSION.

(Being the Fifteenth under the Synod Act of Incorporation of 1874.)

FIRST DAY.

The Synod was convened at London, on Tuesday, June 18th, 1889.

Divine service was held in St. Paul's Cathedral Church at 10 o'clock, a. m.

The Holy Communion was administered to the Clergy and Lay Representatives by the Lord Bishop, assisted by the Very Rev. G. M. Innes, M.A., Dean of Huron; Ven. F. W. Sandys, D.D., Archdeacon of Kent; Ven. J. W. Marsh, M.A., Archdeacon of London, and Revs. Canons Hincks and Patterson.

The sermon was preached by Rev. R. G. Fowell, M.A., Principal of Huron College, from Judges, viii., 4.

The Synod assembled at 2.30 o'clock in the Chapter House for business.

The Lord Bishop in the chair.

The appointed prayers were said by Ven. Archdeacon Marsh.

The rolls of the Clergy and Lay Representatives were then called by their respective secretaries, when 89 Clergymen and 72 Lay Representatives answered to their names.

The Bishop's Address.

His Lordship then delivered his annual address to the Synod :

REVEREND BRETHERN AND BRETHERN OF THE LAITY :

As the Session of the Synod of 1888 was held as late as December last, the period which has intervened between that time and the present is only a little more than six months, or half the ordinary time ; the events, therefore, of interest to the Diocese, on which I would naturally make comment will be correspondingly less. We shall find, however, in the progress of the Diocese, and in the consideration of some of the many questions which affect our weal and welfare, abundant matter on which to occupy our time.

I desire first of all, publicly to acknowledge the goodness of God toward this Diocese throughout the past year ; and secondly, to commend that which I gratefully record, namely, the increasing zeal both of the Clergy and Laity in endeavoring to discharge their mutual obligations, and to advance the momentous interests of the Redeemer's kingdom at home and abroad. In evidence of the above, I am happy to say that there has been, with few exceptions, a marked increase in our receipts, and that the year, whatever indications to the contrary, has been one of prosperity and growth.

In computing the various sums which went to swell the general aggregate of last year, there were two items which, representing as they did, sporadic efforts of the time, could not possibly be expected to occur on the following year : I refer, in the first place, to the Queen's Jubilee offering in St. Paul's Cathedral, by which at least \$1,200 over the usual amount were generously contributed by the Diocese towards the extinction of our debt, and secondly, to the handsome sum of \$1,032 raised by the indefatigable industry of Mrs. Boomer for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund of the Diocese of Algoma. Bearing these facts in mind, let us now take a cursory glance at some of our various funds and see the position in which we stand to-day, and especially let us observe how our receipts compare with those of last year. Of these funds, the first that naturally comes before us is that of the

CLERGY MAINTENANCE AND MISSIONS FUND.

It will give you all unfeigned pleasure to hear that the whole debt on this Fund is now extinguished, and that there are at present \$2,467.33 in hand with which to commence the current year. And this is the more satisfactory when we consider that this balance represents the state of the Fund after the sum of \$1,576 has been taken from it and transferred to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund in pursuance of the law now in force in reference to this latter trust.

The total contributions for Domestic Missions were \$2,581.58, as against \$2,815.08 in the year ending April 30th, 1888. We are not, however, to be discouraged by the apparent falling off in the amount, as there are always in every year certain exceptional offerings which cause the totals to appear large or small as they are present or absent. When they are few, the totals may seem small, though some important items may shew a real and substantial increase. Thus, for an example, the Algoma annual collections for the past year were \$818.46, as against \$664.20 in the previous year. The Ascensiontide appeal of 1888 was \$751.09, while that of 1887 was only \$690.40.

In drawing your attention to these figures, I desire only to stimulate your zeal to still greater exertion, for I feel persuaded that no one, who examines the present with the past, can really imagine that the Diocese contributes even a moiety of what it might, if our resources were only properly developed by a wise and open-handed liberality.

Of the various funds we are called upon to sustain, and in whose expansion we are deeply interested, none demands more serious care and constant consideration than the Clergy Maintenance and Mission Fund. The small pittance on which many of the clergy are compelled to exist should arouse the attention and enlist the sympathy of the whole Diocese. Surely our loyal laymen will not allow any of their faithful clergy to struggle on with stipends so utterly inadequate that they preclude the possibility of their supporting themselves and their families without sinking each year more hopelessly into debt. In connection with this subject, I wish to draw the respectful attention of the Synod to a fact which is often wholly unknown to the outside public, and sometimes even to those who should be better informed, although the clergy themselves are beginning to be painfully conscious of its reality: I mean that the salaries of many of our missionaries are more fictitious than real. In using the word "fictitious," I wish to be clearly understood. All salaries are fictitious when they are based on uncertain data, and the uncertainty in this instance arises from a widespread misunderstanding as to the nature of Synod assessments. They are misunderstood in the first place by congregations, who too often regard them as an unjust and arbitrary act on the part of the Missions Committee; and in the second place, by the clergy themselves, who, from the want of competent knowledge on the subject, are apt to lay a stress and pressure upon them which the facts do not warrant or sustain.

To remove these wrong impressions, I now address myself, *first*, to the various representatives of the laity in Synod assembled, an

ask their kind indulgence while I at least endeavour to explain the principles on which the assessments are made.

First.—Congregations are assessed on the basis of their financial standing, rather than on their numerical strength. A congregation of only twenty families, yet of admitted wealth, as seen by municipal records, would be assessed at the same amount, if not more, than one of forty families, where the indications were that the church members were poor.

Secondly.—The assessments aim at producing equality. An analysis of a small congregation might shew that each family was giving at the rate of at least \$14 per annum toward church purposes, both cheerfully and liberally, while an examination of another congregation, equally well off, might demonstrate that while their numbers were vastly in excess of that first cited, their contributions do not average \$5 a family. The Mission Agents, therefore, in assessing such a congregation, would naturally desire to raise the scale of giving, not only for the general good of the Church, but for the individual benefit of the members themselves.

Thirdly.—Assessments are made on the assumption that the laity, being moved by the love of God, and as loyal and devoted members of our Church, will both cheerfully and promptly do that which is manifestly within their power. No other motive can possibly be so strong as the love of God, and this we always assume to be dwelling in their hearts. The action, therefore, of the Missions Committee, so far from being, as many suppose, harsh or arbitrary, is only an honest effort, made on certain established data, to raise the standard of giving throughout the Diocese, and confer the dignity of independence on those parishes which otherwise might be the recipients of help.

Secondly, I would point out the misconception on the part of the clergy. The grave mistake which many of the clergy make, although I admit the supposition is extremely natural, is this: They imagine that the assessment is a part of their salary, the payment of which is most certain and assured, and that as the Executive Committee has made the assessment it will assuredly see that the amount is promptly and fully met. In other words, should any parish be assessed by the Committee at the sum of \$250, and at the close of the year shall have only paid \$100, they naturally appeal to the Executive Committee to make good the missing \$150. This the Committee, however, will not do, or even entertain the proposition for a moment; so that the amount must be absolutely lost. If it be asked, then, "What purpose does the Synod assessment serve?" The answer is, "It is the official standard for the giving of each parish throughout the Diocese." Each parish now knows what it ought to give. Its matters have been gravely considered in

London by a number of competent men, and they have decided, after weighing every argument, that it can fairly give the amount at which they have assessed it, and which amount they have agreed to call an assessment, but which really means no more than an official estimation of the financial capabilities of the place. In the meantime, I admit, the clergy are the sufferers. They go to a parish thinking they will receive a certain stipend, but the expectation is far from being realised, and the consequences no doubt are painful in the extreme. May I therefore ask you, my dear brethren, both of the clergy and laity, to assist me to the uttermost in placing this most needful and beneficial fund on a stronger and healthier basis.

NEW CHURCHES AND BUILDINGS.

On the 6th of last January I open a new Church at Forest, in the County of Lambton. I have pleasure in saying that this neat and commodious structure reflects great credit on all concerned; for not only has the congregation exhibited its zeal in the erection of an excellent and commodious Church, but it has subscribed with such liberality toward it, that the fabric will soon be wholly unencumbered with debt.

SARNIA.

On Monday, January 14th, I opened a commodious new School House in connection with St. George's Church, Sarnia. The building is of brick, and was erected at a cost of about \$3,000. I cannot too highly commend the indomitable zeal and energy which the Rector and congregation of this most vigorous Church ever exhibit. May their earnestness stimulate other Churches to go and do likewise.

BRANTFORD.

On Sunday evening, February 10th, I consecrated, in the presence of a large congregation, St. Jude's Church, Brantford. As this Church has had many difficulties to struggle with, and was for a long time burdened with a heavy debt, great credit is due to the Rev. Mr. Strong and his faithful people for their zeal and assiduity in bringing it to its present prosperous position.

CONFIRMATIONS.

As I only returned from England last November, and as it has not been a year of confirmation tours, I have only a very moderate statement to make, namely, 350 confirmed, and in proportions about as follows :—Males, 117 ; females, 233 ; total, 350.

Since the last session of this Synod, the Lord has been pleased to call to His abiding rest two members of our clerical body. The first I shall mention is that of the late Alexander Sydney Falls, B.A., Rector of Amherstburg, and Honorary Canon of Trinity Cathedral, London. No man who ever labored in this Diocese rendered more self-denying or conscientious service than this devoted minister of God. Ordained Deacon by Archbishop Whately, of Dublin, he came to this Diocese in the year 1859, and was appointed to the Rectory of Adelaide. From this he subsequently removed to Berlin, and finally to Amherstburg. He fell asleep in Jesus on the 21st day of January in this present year, thus closing a long and honorable pastorate of nearly twenty-nine years. He preached the Word ; he was instant in season and out of season ; he reproved, he rebuked, he exhorted with all long-suffering and doctrine, while his own conduct in private, social and public life was continually to the praise of God's glory. " Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord : Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labours ; and their works do follow them."

The other member of our body called upward to a purer world is the late Rev. William Tibbetts, M.D., who fell asleep in Jesus on the 4th of last February. The deceased was, in many respects, a very remarkable man, clear and decided in his grasp of Divine truth, he was almost a perfect encyclopedia of scientific information and learning of every sort. He was for some time, before his superannuation, Incumbent of Port Dover, in the County of Norfolk.

The Rev. P. B. De Lom has lately left this Diocese and is now working in England under the Episcopal supervision of the Bishop of London.

The Rev. Octavius Edgelow has removed to the Diocese of Niagara, and is doing duty at Grimsby as assistant to the Rev. Dr. Read.

HURON COLLEGE.

You will be gratified to learn that, with God's blessing, this admirable institution is now rapidly progressing under the able and judicious care of the Rev. Principal Fowell and his highly esteemed assistant, the Rev. David Williams. The students are receiving great care, and no pains are spared to develop their spiritual and intellectual life. As regards material advancement, I may point to the fact that we expect, God willing, to begin our next term with about seventeen students on the roll, a far larger number than ever before attended the College.

I feel, however, that the time has now come when some measures of a very earnest character will have to be taken to increase the financial strength of the institution. If Huron College is to take its place in the comity of Church of England Theological Institutes, and no reason exists why it should not, its present financial position must be substantially and promptly improved. As Huron College is not a Diocesan Institution, and as already our Churches are burdened with a plethora of collections which we can hardly, with any propriety, augment, the best and most feasible plan to secure such a result, in my judgment, would be that the Council of Huron College should make an earnest appeal to all its numerous friends throughout the Diocese, and ask their financial support. That such an appeal would meet with a hearty response, I can hardly doubt; yet, in anticipation of such a call, I would bespeak your generous sympathies towards this deserving and most admirable Institution. In conclusion, I will only add that should the prompt and capacious assistance be given to the College which its importance absolutely demands, it will not be long before the whole Diocese may justly be proud of an Institution, not only richly furnished with all the apparatus of theological learning, but affording to its sons an open avenue to the work and ministry of the Church.

JESUIT AGGRESSION.

It were not right, however possible it might be for me, in addressing you at this juncture, to pass over in profound silence a subject which is agitating, more or less, the whole Dominion of Canada. I refer to the recent legislation concerning the Jesuit body

now incorporated within the limits of our country by an act of the Legislature of Quebec.

That the subject may have been distorted and abused for political and unjustifiable purposes, I am free to admit, and that the long continued maintenance of the subject before the public attention may have made the matter wearisome to many, may also be an undeniable truth; but I humbly ask your respectful consideration while I lay before you that aspect of the present position which calls for our most serious alarm and action.

We are met here as the representatives of the Historic Church of England; a Church which, among other qualifications, has certain characteristics of which she cannot possibly divest herself. Among these she is intensely Protestant, as protesting against the peculiar doctrines and errors of the Church of Rome. The blood of her martyrs testifies the price at which she bought her freedom and took her place as an independent witness to the truth of God. She cannot be an indifferent spectator or stand supinely by while one of the Provinces of this Dominion formally incorporates and sanctions by every legal process the Society of Jesus.

Far be it from us to ask, or even desire, that our fellow Roman Catholic subjects should be debarred of a single privilege that we ourselves enjoy, or not stand on the same position of independence as ourselves; on the contrary, we would claim as earnestly for them as for ourselves the fullest and freest exercise of all that is involved in the word liberty.

But we must view, with alarm, the entrance amongst us of a society which has been banished from time to time from almost every Roman Catholic court in Europe, and even on one occasion was disbanded by the decree of Pope Clement XIV. I would therefore urge that, in conjunction with the other Dioceses of this Ecclesiastical Province, our earnest protest be made, that thus we may exhibit our sense of the gravity of the times and our strong and fixed resolution to maintain by every legal and upright process the dignity of the Throne and the interests of freedom and of truth.

And here I must speak of one of the greatest and most dangerous evils of the day: The practice of sending Protestant children to Roman Catholic schools and convents. It would be quite unnecessary for me to allude to this painful truth, were not the evil of immense and growing dimensions. The days were when our orthodoxy would be startled at so strange an idea as that of sending our children to the Church of Rome to be educated by her and made fit, through her influence, to take their future position as members of a Protestant communion and supporters of the Reformed

Church of England. But to-day things are changed; and as moral evils, like some physical maladies, are contagious, the practice has spread until at last the whole community is quite accustomed to the sight.

May I ask, is this right? Can it be consistent? Can it be praiseworthy? Can it be anything else than a downright sin against God to take your sons and daughters, at the very age when they are most susceptible, and place them in institutions where every effort that Rome can make will be made to subvert their faith and secure their allegiance to herself. "Ah," rejoin those who advocate this policy, "we have had a most distinct promise that nothing whatever will be done to interfere with their religious opinions." Nothing will be done; no, nothing. Yet, unless you have made stipulations to the contrary, they will attend mass, and amid the smoke of incense, the ringing of bells and the adoration of the altar, it is quite possible their Protestantism may evaporate. But suppose your daughters are allowed to stay outside meekly reading their prayer-books while mass is being performed, what then? Will nothing then be done?

But what, I ask, are the secular advantages of sending your children to Roman Catholic schools and convents? "Many," I am told in reply. "The whole circle of the sciences is traversed, and everything that the polite and refined should know is freely taught, and at the least possible expense." But, I ask, in what department of human learning will not the peculiar theology of the Church of Rome be apparent? Will you trust her text books? Will you have your children learn casuistry from the school of Loyola? The histories they recommend will be peculiarly impartial. They will be particularly reliable in their accounts of the reigns of Henry VIII., Edward VI., Mary and Elizabeth. Sure to give *our* view of these tossed and troubled times. No; everything intellectual will be coloured with their peculiar modes of thought, and these dark hues will show themselves on your children all their future life.

Again, suppose no direct Romanism is taught. Suppose your children are left entirely to themselves, what then; if they are not being taught evil, are they being taught good? If they are not being taught Romanism, are they being instructed in Protestantism? Is their spiritual life being advanced; are they growing in the truth? No; you know they are not. At the very time they should be cared for most, they are neglected—left to the wayward passions of their hearts, and the cold maxims of a thoughtless world.

To conclude, I do not blame the Roman Catholic Church for using every effort to bring over your children to her pale; she

would be faithless did she not do so. But I beseech you to pause before you place those dearest to you in her power. Some may come back untouched, but others will linger in the convent until you begin to be alarmed, and when at last you urge them to leave, they will tell you they intend to be received into the Church of Rome. You may lift up a father's voice or shed a mother's tears, but with the air of a martyr they will tell you they must obey God rather than man, and though it be with pain, will leave your communion for ever.

WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

I would again draw the attention of the Synod to this noble Association, and say that I cannot too highly recommend it to the cordial support and loving sympathy of the whole Diocese. And this I do, not merely because I note the enormous help the Auxiliary has been to the cause of Domestic and Foreign Missions, but because I see the great spiritual blessing it confers on those who are heartily engaged in its service. It is a blessing, not only to those who receive its benefactions, but also to those who work within its ranks. All honor, I say, to the women who expend their time, their labor, and their means on the extension of the blessed Redeemer's cause. And be assured, dear friends, the Women's Auxiliary will not deplete, but rather increase your financial strength; it will build up and not pull down the fabric of your prosperity; it will give aim and direction to the many consecrated women to be met with in your parishes; and while developing every spiritual work at home, will advance God's cause abroad to the joy of millions and the hastening the second advent of our risen Lord.

PRISON AID REFORM.

I have received a communication from the Prison Aid Reform Association of Canada, asking this Synod, as it has already asked all the other Synods and ecclesiastical bodies in the country, to give them their active sympathy and support. As the work of the Association is the noble and Christlike one of trying to reform those who as criminals have been brought under the punitive sentence of the law, I trust you will give it your support and accede to its earnest appeal that a committee should be appointed by this Synod to act in conjunction with them and to aid and assist them in all their deliberations. By doing this you will be advancing a noble and much-needed work.

Hoping that whatsoever is done may be for the glory of God, the exaltation of Jesus Christ and the welfare of His Church, I commend you now to the Word of God and the testimony of His Grace.

Receiving Memorials.

The following Memorials were read :—

1. From the Jubilee Committee of the Diocese of Toronto :

My Dear Lord Bishop :

St. Stephen's, Toronto, June 15, 1889.

This being the Jubilee year of the Diocese of Toronto, it has been decided by the Synod to celebrate the auspicious event by means of special services and meetings during the week, beginning on the first Sunday in October. I am instructed to communicate with your Lordship, in the first place, to request your Lordship's co-operation in this matter as presiding over a Diocese which formed part of the original Diocese of Toronto; and secondly, to ask that you would kindly lay before your Synod our respectful request that a committee be appointed by them to co-operate in carrying out the great object of this Jubilee Celebration.

Each Synod is also requested to appoint one or more representatives to meet with our special committee here on the 27th day of June.

I am further instructed to inform your Lordship, and the members of the Huron Synod, of the fact that it has been resolved to apply the offerings of the people throughout the Diocese of Toronto, on the Sunday above referred to, towards the Building Fund of St. Alban's Cathedral.

2. From the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada :

To the Venerable, the Synod of the Church of England, Canada :

REVEREND AND DEAR SIRS,—At a meeting of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, held in Halifax, in June, 1888, the following resolution was adopted in connection with the Report on Temperance :

“That the Assembly's Committee be instructed to take all proper measures to secure the co-operation of the other churches of the Dominion with a view of petitioning the Dominion Government in favor of entire prohibition at the earliest possible date; and such co-operation having been secured, to prepare forms of petition to be signed by our people.”

The Committee would now respectfully acquaint your Venerable Court with this resolution, hoping that the united action it contemplates may meet with your

approval, and that thus your powerful aid may be secured in promoting, among the Christian people of this Dominion, a simultaneous movement aiming at the total suppression of the Liquor Traffic.

Toronto, 18th June, 1889.

DEAR SIR,—We are directed to request that you will please lay before the Synod of the Diocese of Huron, now in session, the following resolution passed at the Synod of this Diocese at its session just concluded.

“That a memorial from this Synod be presented to the Provincial Synod, reciting (1) the great importance and necessity of Uniform Sunday School Lessons in the Church of England in Canada, and (2) the steps which, since the last meeting of that body, have been taken towards this end by representatives from the Synods of Huron, Niagara, Toronto, Ontario and Montreal; and asking (1) that the Provincial Synod may be pleased to approve and sanction for use in the Sunday Schools of this Ecclesiastical Province the three years' scheme of Lessons on the Bible and Prayer Book, prepared by the Inter-Diocesan Sunday School Conference at its meetings held in Toronto, in November, 1887, and in Montreal, in April, 1888, which is as follows :

PRAYER BOOK.

1888-9 Lessons on the Collects.
1889-90 Lessons on the Catechism.
1890-91 Lessons on the Prayer Book.

SCRIPTURE LESSONS.

Lessons on the Life of Our Lord.
Lessons on the Old Testament.
The Acts of the Apostles.

“The great Festivals to be marked by appropriate Lessons, and a portion of the Church Catechism to be recited every Sunday in addition to the above.

“(2) That the Provincial Synod may be pleased to approve of the series of Sunday School Lessons for 1888-9 adopted by this Synod, with such amendments as they may consider desirable.

“(3) That the said Provincial Synod may be pleased to appoint a committee of nine members who shall, with two delegates appointed by and from each Diocesan Synod of the Ecclesiastical Province, select the Sunday School Lessons for 1890-1, according to the above scheme, and also to prepare and publish a three years' scheme of Sunday School Lessons on the Bible and Prayer Book, to begin with Advent, 1891.

“(4) That a copy of this resolution be transmitted by the Honorary Secretaries to each Diocesan Synod, asking them to appoint delegates to the said Inter-Diocesan Sunday School Committee.”

 5. The promotion of Sunday-school work.
 6. The holding of services in places removed from regular Church services, where it is possible for five or six persons to meet together.
 7. The distribution of tracts in railway cars, and in such places as the members of each branch may deem advisable.
 8. To encourage systematic giving by all Christians, and to discourage, by all means possible, all objectionable means of raising money, such as lotteries, games of chance, and any schemes in which giving is not a direct, personal and free-will offering.
 9. The visitation of the destitute, and the providing for their spiritual needs.
 10. The holding of religious services in poor-houses and prisons.
 11. The reading of the daily lessons, with prayer for all members of the Association, specially for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on its work.
 12. The weekly meeting of the members of each branch for devotional and training purposes.
- That the annual meeting of this association be held during the first week in Advent, in such place as shall be determined upon by a majority of its members.

The Synod adjourned at 4.40 o'clock.

The Annual Report.

The Executive Committee herewith present their annual report :

The past year has been a fairly prosperous one, and the Committee are able to report an increase in nearly all the Diocesan collections, although the aggregate of the free-will contributions of the Diocese is considerably less than that of the previous year, being \$16,911.94, as compared with \$18,744.40 in 1888.

Special efforts made last year for the Synodical Jubilee Offertory, and for Mrs. Boomer's Jubilee Fund for Algoma, both of them exceptional in their character, will more than account for the difference in the total receipts, and, therefore, on a review of the whole year's work, the Executive Committee see good cause to congratulate the Diocese on the results.

CLERGY MAINTENANCE AND MISSIONS FUND.

It will be a source of great satisfaction to the Diocese at large to learn that the anticipations of last year's report with regard to this fund have been fully realized, for not only has the overdraft then due of \$535.08 been paid off, but the fund has now to its credit the sum of \$2,467.33; and this, too, after meeting all its ordinary claims, and paying in addition to the Widows and Orphans' Fund the sum of \$1,576, to restore that fund to its proper basis, and comply with the requirements of the W. & O. Fund Canon.

It must, however, be borne in mind that several Missions are now vacant, and that had they been filled as usual, the grants required for the support of their clergymen would more than have exhausted the balance now at the credit of the Mission Fund.

Moreover, the subdivision of existing large Missions, and the occupation of new territory are urgently required. The Committee therefore desire to remind every member of the church that the needs of the Diocese demand that renewed efforts ought to be made to strengthen the resources of this fund, and enable the Missionary work of the Diocese to be fully maintained.

DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN MISSIONS.

Notwithstanding the fact that fewer appeals on behalf of both Foreign and Domestic Missionary objects have been made this year, and that, therefore, the aggregate receipts are somewhat less, it is gratifying to note that the Diocesan collections have increased:

The Good Friday collections are \$21.50 less than last year, but the total when received will probably exceed that amount, as, owing to the lateness of Easter, only 130 collections had been received before closing the books, as compared with 145 in 1888.

The Women's Auxiliary also shows an increase of \$343.82, as compared with last year's returns (exclusive of Mrs. Boomer's Special Jubilee Appeal).

WIDOWS AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The number of pensioners on the list has been increased by one.

The pensions paid during the year amounted to \$5,220.

The half-yearly collections were \$1,205.73, being an increase of \$192.45 over the previous year.

The ordinary income of the year was enough to meet all the demands upon the Fund and leave some \$500 on hand, and this, with the restoration of the provisions of the Canon, which for some years had been suspended, enabled the Fund to augment its capital by some \$2,000, making a total capital at the end of the year of \$62,315.86.

The annual subscriptions have been fairly met, and the Fund may altogether be said to be in a thoroughly sound condition.

SUPERANNUATION.

Pensions amounting to \$5,216.16 were paid during the year.

Eleven annuitants are now on the list; one, the Rev. Dr. Tibbetts, having recently died.

THE SEE HOUSE.

The Debt now stands at \$14,276.05, \$193 having been received on the subscription account.

ACCOUNTS.

The printed audited accounts show the position of the various Funds.

With regard to the annual subscriptions, the Committee would recommend that these be made in due season, and not left, as they too often are, to be made at the last moment, and at the worst and most inclement season of the year, and when in the country, especially, Collectors find it almost impossible to visit every family and afford them the opportunity of contributing their gifts to the missionary work of the Diocese.

RATE OF CHARGES FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE DIFFERENT FUNDS.

The Committee would suggest to the Synod that they appoint a committee to consider the whole question and recommend to the Synod such alterations as may be deemed necessary in respect of the business matters of the Synod.

A corrected copy of the proceedings of the Synod held in December, 1888, printed under the direction of the Honorary Secretaries, was presented for the approval of the Synod, and such copy being approved by the Synod and the Bishop, and the seal of the Synod attached thereto, was then signed by the Bishop for preservation as the authentic minutes of the Synod for that session.

Fraternal Greetings.

The Bishop read the following reply from the Bishop of Niagara :—

The Bishop, Clergy and Laity of the Diocese of Niagara, now in session, gratefully receive and heartily return the fraternal greetings of the Diocese of Huron, in Synod assembled, and trust that their deliberations, by God's blessing, may be so guided as to promote the welfare of the Church.

Receiving Reports of Committees.

The report of the Sunday School Committee was presented by Mr. James Woods.

Report of Sunday School Committee.

The Committee on Sunday Schools beg to submit the following report :—

That a meeting at which all the members were present, was held in the Chapter House, London, on the 19th of February last, at which a number of resolutions were passed, which the Committee desire respectfully to place before the Synod. It is but fair to state, that the Committee at its next meeting, which was held at the Chapter House on June 18th inst., saw reason to modify some of the resolutions passed at the February meeting, but did not do so, preferring to leave them in the hands of the Synod to deal with them as its wisdom may direct.

The resolutions are as follows :—

1. That the Synod be requested to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$1,000 for the purpose of establishing in the Synod office a permanent depository, to supply the Sunday Schools of the Diocese, at the lowest possible prices, with library and prize books, maps, prayer and hymn books, and the publications of the "Sunday School Institute."
2. That a monthly magazine be established under the auspices of this Committee with the object of strengthening the work in our Sunday Schools and disseminating information relative to the general progress of the Diocese.
3. That a Diocesan Sunday School Superintendent be appointed, whose duties shall be to prepare examination papers; to arrange for the holding of examinations in the different Sunday Schools; to help to organize new schools, and to exercise supervision over Sunday School work in the Diocese.
4. That a definite portion of the Catechism, Prayer Book and Church History, be appointed as subjects for study and examination.
5. That an annual Sunday School Convention be held in each Rural Deanery in the Diocese in the month of October, for the purpose of infusing a deeper interest in Sunday School work; of gathering and imparting information, and cementing the bonds of Christian fellowship in the work.
6. That His Lordship, the Bishop, be requested to select a Sunday, to be known as "Sunday School Day," and to be marked by the preaching of special sermons to both parents and scholars.

The Secretary's Report, which has been printed, and will be placed in the hands of the Synod, will be as follows :—

statistics of the Sunday Schools of the Diocese, and, in reaching whom, they were greatly aided by the information contained in the Annual Diocesan Report.

There are in the Diocese 267 congregations; of these, as far as can be ascertained, about forty have no Sunday Schools, leaving 227 schools to be accounted for.

Reports have been received from clergymen representing 164 schools, leaving sixty-three schools not heard from, which can partly be accounted for by vacancies and changes of address.

Each clergyman in Brant, Bruce, Waterloo, Norfolk, Grey and Lambton, has sent his report; one is wanting from Elgin, Huron and Kent, two each from Oxford and Perth, and three each from Essex and Middlesex. In some cases reports were not sent in from every congregation under a clergyman's charge.

From the whole Diocese, 164 schools report 346 officers and teachers; 377 male and 1,120 female teachers; 6,587 male and 8,308 female scholars. Total officers and teachers 1,843, and 14,895 scholars. To which may be added from the Synod Journal forty-one schools, with 272 officers and teachers, and 2,200 scholars. Total, 2,110 officers and teachers, and 17,095 scholars.

Forty-five schools are superintended by the clergy, and ladies (who compose over three-fourths of our teachers) are superintendents to the number of eight.

Twenty-five schools are open for only a portion of the year, ranging from four to nine months. Sixty-two meet in the morning, and 102 in the afternoon.

Thirty-three schools have weekly or fortnightly teachers' meetings for the study of the lesson; thirty-eight schools hold from one to twelve business meetings annually, and eighty-four report no teachers' meetings. One school has meeting for prayer at close of session.

Only three schools report no prayer book lesson, thirteen not giving any returns; 122 schools memorize Scripture to the extent of one to six verses, and one going as high as fifteen; thirty-three schools give no answer, and nine say they memorize none. One clergyman writes that it is difficult to get it done, and another that the scholars won't do it.

In hymn books and liturgies the greatest diversity prevails. The Hymnal Companion and the Diocesan Liturgy being most generally in use, while in many schools the prayer book is used in preference to any liturgy.

Seventy-five schools are supported entirely by the Sunday School offertory; in forty-seven the offertory is supplemented by subscriptions or grants; thirty-one schools have apparently no offertory, and are supported by the congregation, of which they form a part. Several schools (probably six) give their entire collection to mission or outside work.

The expenses of 122 schools amounted to \$6,411.53. Forty-four schools contributed for missions, etc., \$1,161.59.

Twenty-four schools have separate buildings; ten meet in basement of the church. One hundred and thirteen schools have libraries containing 22,573 volumes; thirty-two schools say they have no library; eighteen make no return; and one school has discarded books for illustrated papers.

These are the facts gleaned from the reports sent in for the information of the Synod, and they are respectfully submitted.

The Secretary would urge the necessity of every school keeping accurate class and register books, as thereby more satisfactory statistics would be possible.

The whole report as amended and added to was put to the Synod by the Chairman, and declared adopted.

Report of Committee on Jesuit Aggression.

The report of the Committee appointed to consider the matter of Jesuit Aggression was read by the Dean.

Your Committee beg to report that after mature consideration they would present the following resolution for the consideration and adoption of this Synod:—

“That in the opinion of this Synod the Jesuit Order by its principles and constitution, and historically, has been proved to be dangerous to civil liberty and a menace to the rights of all classes of her Majesty's subjects, and that it is therefore most desirable that the legality of the incorporation of the Jesuit Order, and by consequence the action of the Quebec Legislature in the matter of the Jesuit Estates Act, be tested by the highest courts of the Dominion and the Empire, and that the members of Synod will support every effort to obtain such testing of the said incorporation, and should the Act ultimately be found to be legal, the members of the Synod will use all constitutional means towards obtaining the repeal of such incorporation.

“That this Synod, in accordance with the 37th Article of Religion, strongly affirms that ‘The Queen's Majesty hath the chief power in this realm of England and her dominions, unto whom the chief government of all estates of this realm, whether they be ecclesiastical or civil, in all cases doth appertain, and is not ought to be subject to any foreign jurisdiction.’”

The duty of such Committee shall be to apportion the amount which each parish or mission may be able to contribute to the various funds of the Diocese.

Notice of the apportionment shall be given to the Clergymen and Churchwardens of each parish or mission at least one month previous to the Easter Vestry meeting.

When the apportionment is accepted, the amount apportioned may be raised by one or more collections as shall be deemed most suitable to the circumstances of the several congregations — payments to the Secretary-Treasurer to be made at least half-yearly.

Proviso: That no clergyman at present on the list of superannuated clergymen shall have his annual allowance reduced, nor shall such change affect or apply to any clergyman doing duty in this Diocese, and who had served the full term of ten years at the time of the amendment of the Canon at last Synod (Dec. 6th, 1888).

[*Note.*—The said Clergymen shall be entitled to the former allowance of \$400 per annum, and \$10 for each year of active service over ten, the aggregate not to exceed \$600.]

Adjournment of the Synod.

Before dismissing the Synod His Lordship spoke expressing gratitude at the harmony and peace that had pervaded all their counsels. The delegates could feel that they could discuss the greatest and most burning questions, meeting together and expressing the most antagonistic thoughts on the subject, while at the same time preserving that order and peacefulness of demeanor that became them as children of God. He was glad of this, and it should encourage the members to bring forward their views in confidence of a respectful and tolerant hearing. A start had been made by this Synod in Sunday School work. There might be much yet to perfect in this respect, but it was gratifying to know that at last a good start was made, and he doubted not a progressive action would follow. The debate on the Diocesan collections must do good in awakening an interest amongst the people, and more uniform methods must result in increased receipts. He was pleased that no revolution of the rules of order had occurred at this session. He had been a little perplexed at times in their application, but on the whole he thought they added to the harmony of the debates, as they marked the divisions in the progress of a measure clearly, and confined the discussion in the first stage to the general principles of the document under consideration before the details were taken up in the committee of the whole. He would also express his gratitude for the definite action taken by the Synod on those other subjects that had been considered. Time would pass before the issue fully developed, but the weight of their influence was placed on the right side. Their labors had arrived at a happy period, and he hoped the brethren would return to their homes and parishes invigorated with new strength for the cause of Christ in this great Diocese—so great a Diocese that its greatness grew on one by degrees. Let us work for the advancement of God's cause from one end of it to the other, and may He pour out His grace and spirit on our efforts, and abundantly bless all our people.

The Synod rose, and the proceedings closed with the singing of the Doxology.

The Bishop pronounced the Benediction, and at 12.30 o'clock the Synod adjourned.
