HALIFAX, MONCTON, FREDERICTON AND THE SHORT LINE.

It appears that the construction of the line from Harvey to Fredericton and Moncton, across the Province of New Brunswick, would save just 14 miles in the through route from Montreal to Halifax by the Short Line. From Harvey to Moncton via St. John the distance is 154 miles; from Harvey to Fredericton via Fredericton the distance is 140 miles, according to the survey of the engineers of the Canadian Pacific Railway. To build the 140 miles of railway across the Province from Harvey to Moncton will cost less than £2,000,000, and may be well cost £4,000,000, or even more. Yet the people of Fredericton, Moncton and Halifax insist that this line shall be built, and a few weeks ago delegates from these cities were in Ottawa for the purpose of bringing pressure on the government, so that they might secure the Canadian Pacific Railway Company into compliance with this demand.

It may be that the editor of the Telegraph, owing to the natural stupidity of the Dominion to help to no purpose, and the government organs, can only be characterized as an abortion and a fraud.

A SUGAR REFINERY FOR ST. JOHN.

A movement is now on foot for the establishment of a sugar refinery in this city, and we understand it is likely to be successful. The very large quantities of molasses and sugar, and especially sugar in Canada, show clearly enough that an industry that can be established in the Dominion is likely to be profitable. St. John, from its natural position, is at all places in the Dominion the place best adapted to the cheap manufacture of sugar. Montreal, where the largest refineries are situated, labors under the disadvantage of having to carry its raw material over hundreds of miles of railway, while the refined sugar, if intended for export, is carried in the lower part of the harbor on which so much money has already been expended to very little purpose.

Although very little has been written about it, it is generally considered that the upper portion of the harbor appears to be the natural outlet and inlet for the trade of the two cities and for the shipping of N. B. world produce (Wm. Lewis, Esq., of said work to represent in an epidemic, if the railway relative should be obliged to pay, and extra charge for a permit from the board of health).

To those who are wealthy this might be no objection, but to the poor man I think it would be a heavy burden. I am an oversight on the part of the board and I hope to see them speedily amend the law so that there is no charge imposed for the permits they furnish.

THE PROVINCIAL FRANCHISE BILL.

The Telegraph publishes in an editorial this morning, a summary of the franchise bill which was introduced into the House of Assembly today. The qualification of a voter, according to this measure, will hereafter be the ownership of \$100 worth of real estate, or of personal property, or real and personal property together to the value of \$400, or the enjoyment of an income of \$400 annually. Ministers of religion in charge of a congregation and licensed teachers will also have votes.

If this statement of the new franchise bill is correct, and we presume it is, for the editor of the Telegraph probably wrote with a copy of the bill before him, the proposed measure is an abortion and an absurdity. Why is it necessary to change the existing law for the purpose of merely admitting teachers and ministers, while the qualification of all other classes remains precisely as it was? The Telegraph, with a degree of impudence or ignorance bordering on the sublime,

says that this bill is "practically one of manhood suffrage." Every sensible man in this Province knows that it is nothing of the kind. How many working men in New Brunswick earn a clear income of \$400 a year? Not one in five! There are only about 300 working days in the year and a working man to earn \$400 would have to receive \$1.50 a day for every one of these working days, to come up to the required standard. The last sense of the bill contained a list of one-half of the tax-payers of St. Andrew, 250 names, and of these only 29 had incomes of \$400 or upwards. This fact will serve as an illustration, and no doubt a similar condition of things would be revealed all over the Province. Why, we may also fairly ask, should the possession of real estate be considered so important that \$100 worth of it will give a man a vote while it takes four times as much personal property to do so? The glaring absurdity of this provision is shown in the case of a man who qualifies on both real and personal property. If his real estate is worth only \$800 it will take the addition of \$10 worth of personal property to give him a vote, whereas \$10 more in real estate would do so.

Another notable omission is the lack of a franchise for farmers' sons. It frequently happens that the sons of the farmers in some decayed farmer who is past work, while the sons, who are the real workers and managers of the property, have no real estate, in their own names, and under the new bill would have no vote in the affairs of the province. In fact the only people who will benefit by the proposed change in the franchise are a few ministers and teachers, less probably than one hundred persons and this is the ridiculous scheme which, after so much labor, the government maintains has produced. The new law will not add one hundredth of a vote to the total of voters in the Province.
