The President derives great satisfaction from the information conveyed by Mr. Fox is note, that with reference to the reported movements of British troops within the territory in dispute, no actual change has taken place in the attitude of Her Majesty's authorities to the territory since the arrangements entered into by the two Governments at the commencement of last year for the preservation of tranquility within its limits; and from his assurances that there exists no intention on the part of Her Majesty's authorities to infringe the terms of those arrangements, so long as they are faithfully observed on the side of the Heitel Struck. The President
