# Annual Meeting of the Society.

The Twenty-Ninth Annual Meeting of the MISSIONARY SOCI-ETY of the W. M. CHURCH IN CANADA, was held in Kingston, on Tuesday, October 17th, 1854, the Rev. Anson Green, D.D., in the Chair. The Meeting was opened with singing and prayer, and the Report having been read by the General Superintendent of Missions, the following Resolutions were adopted:—

I. Moved by the Rev. J. GEMLEY, seconded by the REV. R. JONES,-

That the Report, an abstract of which has now been read, be adopted, printed, and widely circulated.

II: Moved by the Rev. J. CARROLL, seconded by the Rev. C. VANDUSEN,-

That the devout thanksgivings of this Meeting be offered to the God of mercy for the very cheering success he has graciously granted to the Wesleyan Missionary Society, and to all Christian and Protestant Missionary Associations, in their efforts to make known the glorious Gospel of Christ.

III. Moved by the Rev. J. BORLAND, seconded by the Rev. W. JEFFERS,

That having undiminished confidence in this Society, and believing in the immense importance of promptly-increased Missionary efforts at this eventful period, and in the necessity of Divine influence to give them efficiency, this Meeting considers it a Christian duty greatly to increase its liberality and prayers, for the more enlarged success of the Society in Canada, Hudson's Bay, and in every part of the world.

## REPORT.

The Committee of the Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada present their Twenty-Ninth Annual Report with gratitude and joy,—and, as is their agreeable duty, with particularity and fulness, for the satisfaction of the numerous, discerning, and benevolent friends of the Society.

The first and deepest concern of the Society is, to give publicity and effect to the incontrovertible command of Christ-"Preach the Gospel to every creature," which impels to evangelical activity, and is the authority of Christians of every name in seeking the salvation of the world, in all its generations, colours, and tongues. That command embodies Redeeming Love for all, and, therefore, has a universal application; while the allsufficiency of such Love makes it the one, simple, and mighty remedy for man in his ignorance, depravity, woes, and helplessness. The accumulating testimony to the potency of this remedy is believed by the great Protestant Missionary Societies of Christendom, and the belief is not mere theory, but power and conviction, constraining to acts which prove the existence of the conviction, and leading daily to achievements in destitute and heathen climes, which display the renovating force of Revealed Truth. The Committee pray that those invaluable Societies may proceed in their elevated career with unprecedented hopes; and though this Society may be less imposing than theirs, it will emulate their charity and zeal.

The Society, whose affairs the Committee have the honour to direct, is Auxiliary to the Wesleyan Methodist Missionary Society in Great Britain; and they greatly rejoice on account of the position and proceedings of that Society. The Methodism of Wesley has been Missionary in its principles and progress from the beginning, even when it had no specific development for Foreign operations; and since the era of its formal Missionary organization it has run a race of swiftness, and of triumph, to the glory of its Divine Originator, under British auspices, and protected by British power. Some of

the brightest Wesleyan names are associated with that era, allied to many more which other admired Missionary Associations think of with esteem and reverence; and the Society since then has been managed by a wisdom and fidelity, and sustained by a munificence, the final day can best declare.

The PARENT SOCIETY has 367 Central or Principal Stations in different parts of the globe, on a large number of which there are many salaried Agents employed in various departments; showing how the expenditure is great. It has 3,116 Chapels and other Preaching Places; and how gratifying, that in many a wilderness, and on many a far-off shore and island stands the house of God! It has 507 Ministers, and Assistant Missionaries; the pioneers and directors of the wide-spread work. It has 703 other paid Agents, as Catechists, Interpreters, and Day School Teachers. It has 110,228 Church Members, and 4,873 on Trial for Membership. In the Day Schools 78,811 Scholars. Printing Establishments on Missions 8, some of which are very extensive. Then there is a Missionary Ship, "The John Wesley," in the South Seas, which affords not a few facilities in carrying on the work with regularity and success. These men and means are sustained vigorously; besides the heavy cost of printing annually by hundreds of thousands various thrilling Missionary publications, which are sent uncharged to every Wesleyan Methodist Circuit and Mission in the world.

The sum yearly required by the Parent Society for the preservation of the work already done is immense. What a ceaseless outlay for the support of Ministers, Agents of every class, their Families, Building, Public Worship, Day Schools, Superior Native Institutions, Translations, Printing, Means of Civilization, the expense of the Home department of Management, Removal to Stations, Afflictions and Return of Missionaries, Preparation of other Missionaries, Outfits, and in sending God's servants to the ends of the earth! And the recent consolidation of the work in France, Australia, and Canada, likewise adds for the time being to the outlay. But the certain issue of these movements will be a large amount saved for expenditure on new fields of enterprise in Pagan lands. Thus a great Society, which raised more than £114,000 last year, will, with God's smile, cease not to extend the Redeemer's dominions. May He who "hath on his vesture and on his thigh a name written, King of Kings, and Lord of Lords," defend and bless the Parent Society!

The Committee have great pleasure in stating that the AUXILIARY SOCIETY IN CANADA last year supported 15 Indian Missions, 62 Domestic Missions, 21 Missionaries to Indians, 79 Ministers on the Domestic Missions, 16 Day School Teachers, 6 Interpreters, 15 Day Schools, two of which are large

RY SOCIETY tic Missions, ons, 16 Day h are large Industrial Institutions; and that there are on the different Missions 10,624 Members of the Church, 1,142 of that number Indians; and that the increase during the year is 1,330 Members. Such are the results, under the blessing of the Divine Spirit, of the application of the truths the Society's Agents inculcate, and of the uniformity on all the Missions of their instructions. An unlettered Namacqua forcibly said on a Wesleyan Missionary occasion in Africa, "All our Teachers preach the same Gospel: yes, though there are many Teachers, the word is the same, the prayer is the same, the school is the same."

This is a summary only, and the Committee invites the close and candid attention of the Supporters of the Society to every particular it contains,—to the character of the facts, and the bearing of them; the numerous and diversified agencies employed, and the talents called forth; the labours continually extending, and the toils endured; the families to be supported; the schools to be furnished; and the necessity for unfailing pecuniary means. It is a simple statement that a certain place is an Indian Mission; but at that Mission there are perhaps, two, three, or more ordained labourers, besides teachers and interpreters. Another place is spoken of as a Domestic Mission; yet two Ministers are employed among a people who would not have the truths and ordinances of religion but for them, and travel where travelling is almost impossible four, six, it may be ten townships. Indeed it is difficult to estimate the value of the ministerial acts performed, or the inconvenience, privation, and labour of the evangelists of this Society in serving those who need them most.

The Committee is gratified to know that a large number of the inhabitants of Canada, of every Christian Church, sincerely and highly appreciate such endurance and efforts, and their salutory and saving tendency, and freely, and with marked catholicity of tone, acknowledge the claims of the Society to their countenance and aid; and that among its increasing contributors are persons of every station, condition, and age. The Financial part of this Report, which has received much attention, gives information of an extraordinary increase of funds, while the Mission Stations now published shew that the monetary increase has encouraged the Society to select additional posts of labour, and add to the number of its labourers. There are no fixed boundaries to the settlements of this prosperous Country; and while the Society's Friends continue to abound in their liberality, the work of God will be without limitation.

It is very satisfactory to witness the almost universal favour with which has been received the Committee's Resolution of last year, relating to the smallest amount to be inserted in the Annual Report, and the cheering effect

of that resolution. Though it was with reluctance the half-dollar subscriptions were placed in the "small sums," because of the expense of publication, hundreds who gave that sum formerly have given five shillings this year. This fact, and another, that the Society has now a larger number of new subscribers, will still make the Report an expensive publication. This is said to the honour of the subscribers. It will be seen that a pleasing feature of the Report is, the growing assistance of Juvenile Friends,—indicative it is thought, of the solicitude of Christian parents, Ministers, and Sabbath School Teachers, in behalf of the Society's interests. To ensure a settled system on all the Circuits and Missions, and give greater efficiency to the benevolent efforts of the Collectors and Subscribers, there are being prepared a Collecting Book, an Address, and a new Juvenile Card, for gratuitous distribution, and immediate use of all the Branch Societies; and it is hoped that the Local Officers will faithfully secure their universal and constant adoption.

The Committee present their respectful and cordial acknowledgements to the numerous Contributors to the funds of the Society, for their hearty and generous patronage;—to the Collectors for their unwearied and valuable services; to the Ministers of other Churches, and of the Wesleyan, who—sometimes at much personal inconvenience—have sustained so ably the many Branch Society Anniversaries;—and to Committees, and many gentlemen, who have zealously contributed to the extension of the Society's influence during the year. They are assured of the gratification the Committee feel in presenting for their perusal the following official statements from the Society's Missionaries. The intelligence and pious efforts of its Supporters merit from the Committee the amplest report of their proceedings; and to the Father of Mercies is due the highest ascriptions of praise, for vouchsafing so many Canadian confirmations of the inspired avowal, "There shall be an handful of corn in the earth upon the top of the mountains; the fruit thereof shall shake like Lebanon."

When Solomon stood before the altar of the magnificent temple he had built for the worship of Jehovah, he in the spirit of a lofty philanthropy said, "Moreover concerning a stranger that is not of thy people Israel, but cometh out of a far country for thy name's sake; (for they shall hear of thy great name, and of thy strong hand, and of thy stretched out arm;) when he shall come and praytoward this house; hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place,

Let the Churches obtain the unction of a primitive Christianity, and their intercessions partake of the enlargement of Christian love,—and sustained by their zeal, the answer is not long delayed. The Methodist Church—and before the formation of her Missionary Society, called to God for the gathering and salvation of the Aborigines of Canada, and He graciously responded in his providence by sending forth holy men to them with the Gospel invitation; and the wanderers of the forest "heard," and "came" to Christ; and now, "strangers" as they were, they "know" the wonders of his "great Name."

If the Methodist Church in this Colony was ever influenced by favouritism, is has appeared in its hallowed yearnings for the moral and temporal welfare of the Red Tribes; and if a special approval from on high has been granted to any Church in attempting their Christianization it may be said without invidiousness, that it has been conferred on that Church. The fact is, more than half a century ago heroic Methodist Itinerants essayed the cultivation of the sterile, savage wilderness, and among the first fruits of their toil was a Native Princess; and that especially from the year 1822, when many Canadian Indians wept at the Cross, and a Torry, a Whitehead, and a Case rejoiced over them unto tears, the Missions of that Church among the Indians have not failed, but always been distinguished for speedy and established suc cess; and the most powerful reason assigned by many of the friends of the Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church for their liberality has been, and is, that success. The Society would be devoutly grateful to the Lord of the Vineyard, for the joy of many spiritual harvests reaped among Pagans in the wilds of Canada, and never forget the responsibilities which have been created by scenes so sacred and delightful.

The reports of the Missionaries to the Indians shew that the Agents do not labour, nor the Subscribers give, in vain; that the liberal should be prompted to greater liberality; and at a future period, when a history of Wesleyan operations is required, the facts now published will assist in its preparation. Next to Gospel ministrations, and Pastoral oversight, no means for the advancement of the Indians are more necessary or effectual than the two Industrial establishments, respectively under the principalship of the Rev. Messrs. Musgrove and Rose, Chairmen of Districts. The seasonable provisions now made by the Provincial Indian Department for young Natives, who have completed their education at Mount Elgin, is thankfully recorded by the Committee, in hopes that the Institution may long be in some degree worthy of the noble and honoured name it bears. The statement relative to the Aiderville Institution, that several of its students are now in service as Teachers

on Missions is very acceptable and important. This was ardently desired when the Institutions were established; and with various other advantages, they will reach a high point of utility, when they become sufficiently subsidiary to a large and gifted class of Native Agency, for spreading Christianity among the Aborigines of British North America, and the Territory of Hudson's Bay.

Without anticipating further the contents of the reports, attention is directed to what is said implying the efficiency of Native talent,—the earnest desire for the education of their children evinced by some Indians,—their improvement in agriculture and the arts,-the impositions to which they are still subject,—the loud call for vigilance in their protectors,—the visitations of affliction,—the different duties which a Missionary to Indians must discharge, the stern reality of labours among an untutored people; as it is to Moffatt in Africa, and Calvert in Feeige,-the conservation of the good done, and increase of it,—the conversion yet of Pagan Indians,—the ready attendance on Sabbath Schools,—the piety of some of the Scholars,—the great grace bestowed at Camp Meetings, and the heavenly expectations of dying Indians,

#### MOUNT ELGIN AND MUNCEY.

"Obeying the command of the Sovereign Proprietor, 'Go labour in my Vine yard, as indicated by His Church, and following the example of Him, who, to 'do his Father's will,' forsook his throne, vailed his God-head in humanity, entered a world lying in wickedness, to recover lost man from the ruins of the fall; and not for worldly riches, not for worldly honor, nor for present happiness-except the happiness of doing good—the fourth year's labour on this Mission, in connexion with brother Sunday, among the Ojibways; Sickles, among the Oneidas, and Halfmoon among the Munceys, has been unremittingly pursued to its close :- labours directed to the accomplishment of the one great and important evangelical end, "the turning," the benighted natives "from darkness to light; from the power of Satan to God; that they might enjoy an inheritance among them that are sanctified, through faith that is in Christ."

"Although much of human weakness has developed itself, in connexion with

these labours, yet we can say, "We have done what we could." "The attendance on the public ministrations of God's Word, among the several

bands, has been large, and the attention given, very satisfactory.

"The progress in religious knowledge, and the stability in religious practice and

enjoyment, among those previously converted to God, has been very gratifying. "Brother Sunday has at length succeeded, after many efforts, in enlisting the attention of many among the band, called the "Bear Creeks." in religious enquiry: several have given evidence of saving conversion to God. The work is still progressing, and strong hopes are entertained that the remainder of that

deeply degraded and wandering tribe, will yet be saved.

the Oneidas, nproved and commercially as well as religiously educated, or, besides occupying an inferior, despised and disadvastageous position among their white neighbours, for a while, be ultimately driven away, like the wild beasts they themselves have chased from their land; have earnestly solicited the establishment among them of an English Teacher, to educate their children and young people, exclusively in English. A school, of from 30 to 40 children, has been taught in their own language, by their faithful and laborious native missionary, the Rev. A. Sickles, and as the employment of another labourer would augment the missionary expenditure, besides paying into the Mission Fund during the past year £11.7s. 7¼d., they are erecting at their own expense, a comfortable house for the Teacher's residence; and have engaged to furnish, free of charge, firewood, pasturage for a horse and cow, and as much land as may be required by him to cultivate. A suitable teacher has been employed, who has commenced his labours under very encouraging prospects.

"The three Sabbath Schools, among the three Tribes, reported last year, have been successfully and encouragingly attended by over *eighty* native youths and others, and have communicated much scriptural knowledge, the fruits of which will be seen, when Heaven shall gather her children home.

"The Mount Elgin Industrial School, located on this Mission, and of which the fullest information has been given in former Reports, and which is now in its fifth year's course of operation, has received, as its importance demanded, every possible attention. Over 42 were maintained in the Institution during the past year, and over 107 have been received since its commencement, who were boarded and clothed during the period they continued with us; sixty of these have been taught reading, writing, geography and arithmetic, and 13 have made some considerable advancement in, to them, the difficult study of English grammar, while the remainder, owing to the limited time spent in the Institution, have not advanced beyond the primer. Those who have been longest in the Institution, have made very satisfactory improvement in their literary pursuits. But to break up their indolent, irregular, and vicious propensities, is an arduous task, a work of time and sovereign grace! To accomplish this, they have by every possible means, been taught the Holy Scriptures, led to the Cross, made to listen to the warning voice of God-laid under the strictest moral discipline, while the blessing of God, the renewing power of Heaven has been unceasingly implored, as without it, "the best concerted schemes are vain, and never can succeed." Deep concern in many has been awakened, and they have been led to pray, and for a season to afford hope of salvation; but alas, in too many, who had been left too long in the school of corruption, and whose corrupt passions had grown strong by indulgence, this "goodness" has been too much like "the morning cloud and early dew, which goeth away," and we have been compelled to begin with them again at the beginning. The young are the most hopeful, and should be taken while susceptible of good impressions. Those who can read, are required to commit to memory on the Sabbath, portions of the Holy Scriptures, and it is no uncommon thing to hear them repeat on the Sabbath evening, whole chapters, learned during the day. The portions of Scripture are then explained to them. Oh! that the seed may yet produce abundant fruit !

"In answer to former requests, the Head of the Indian Department has engaged that each youth, on completing the course of instruction given in the Institution, and maintaining a good character, may receive from £15 to £20 per annum to assist them in settling among their own people. This carried out, will do much toward completing the Manual School system.

"In addition to the number boarded and clothed in the Institution, from 38 to 40 day-scholars have received a meal a day in the Institution to enable them to

attend the school, several of these are now reading and writing. Thus every means is used, that could be devised, to elevate and save the remnant of the too long neglected, and rapidly decreasing original proprietors of the land we call our own.

"May those who have in any way, contributed to the support of this work, in the great decisive day receive the welcome, 'well done !"

#### ALDERVILLE.

"After the lapse of another twelve months, we feel grateful to God that we are able to report that the Alderville Mission continues to be sustained by the Great Head of the Church. Although conscious of many deficiencies in relation to our labours, and efforts which we have made for the spiritual and secular improvement of our charge here, we have nevertheless been favoured with some indications that 'our labours have not been in vain in the Lord.' We now number 118, 62 Indians and 56 whites, a small increase on the returns of last year. Our Indians with two exceptions, remain firm, and exemplary in their deportment. One we have had occasion to expel; the other, (a case of inebriation) we hope to be able to save. Several have died during the year; one an aged and infirm woman nearly one hundred years of age, who had been a member of the church for upwards of 20 years, was faithful and exemplary to the end. A young man and woman died in consumption, neither of them connected with the church. I visited them several times in their affliction; both sought for, and obtained salvation, and died happy. Our Quarterly Meetings have been times of refreshing from the presence of the Lord. The Mission Chapel on such occasions is by far too small to contain the congregation. Our work in the surrounding neighbourhoods, among the White population is constantly increasing; we have recently taken up a new appointment, and there are other places to be supplied. We shall soon have to obtain additional help, or detach the White appointments and form them into a separate Mission.

"There are at present 25 children in the Industrial School, 17 boys, and 8 girls. To provide for these and to superintend their labours on the Farm, take up/by far, the greater portion of my time. The boys and girls have as heretofore performed a good deal of labour in their different departments, in the field and in the house, and have made considerable improvement in their scholastic attainments, as well as in their personal appearance. Three of the Boys sent out from this Institution during the past two years, are now employed as Teachers on our Indian Missions.

"Through the antiring labours of our excellent Teacher, Mr. Cathey, who is the superintendent, we have been able to keep open the Sabbath School through the whole of the year, and to attend to the Bible Class also, in the afternoon. By the instruction thus imparted, in connection with other means, several of the Girls have been brought under the influence of Divine Truth and have given evidence (at least) of a desire to flee from the wrath to come. They are now regularly meeting in Class. May the period soon come when all shall know him 'from the least unto the greatest.'

#### GRAND RIVER.

Sympathy for the afflicted, and gratitude for mercies bestowed, will be excited by the following particulars from the Rev. William Ryerson, Chairman of the Brantford District. The death of the aged and christian Hess, sends the thoughts back into the past, when the Mohawk Indians were without Christ, and to the early period when the first triumphs of the Methodist Church among them were won with gladness. How touching the reminiscences of such a man, and how satisfactory that Gospel triumphs continue to this day on the Grand River!

"The unexpected removal of the Assistant from this Station at the Hamilton Conference, without providing any one to supply his place, created much uneasiness and dissatisfaction in the minds of many of our people, and operated greatly to the injury of the work of God, and altogether prevented the possibility of extending the work, by embracing any openings that might present themselves, or attending to any calls for help from the surrounding tribes; as my attendance was imperatively required every Sabbath at the Mission House. The result has been, that several left the Church and joined others last year, and one, an intelligent Local Preacher, has seceded since the Conference and taken with him a considerable part of a Class, how many I am not prepared to say, and therefore although several joined the Church during the year, we are compelled to report a small decrease in numbers. Our congregations continued large and attentive throughout the year; attendance on the various means of grace pretty good. Our Quarterly Meetings and Sacramental occasions were sometimes delightful seasons of refreshing from the presence of the Lord.

"The present season we have been visited with the severest and most universal sickness ever experienced on the River. It is doubtful whether a single family has secaped, and in many instances whole families were down at the same time. Several have died, and among others Sampson Hess, an influential Chief and one of our oldest and most intelligent and faithful Local Preachers. His loss is severely felt, but I am happy to say, our loss is his gain. I was with him a few hours before his departure, and had the last conversation with him before his mind became so deranged as to be unable to comprehend any thing said to him. On inquiring how he felt, if he had peace, he seized my hand and pressing it with surprising strength, said, with great energy, 'Peace, peace, eace; all in Jesus is peace!' Almost immediately he became insensible to all things below, and a few hours after he fell asleep in Jesus. This general sickness has greatly reduced our congregations, and has entirely suspended our school, as teachers and scholars have been nearly all of them down, so that our prospects at present are very discouraging. Our house is progressing very slowly; if I can possibly obtain lime and other material and find hands I hope to be able to commence plastering in about a fortnight."

NEW CREDIT.

"Though the locality is new, this Mission is one of the oldest Indian missions in its converts, in Canada, although it has suffered greatly from the unsettled state of the Tribe, in regard to the title of their lands, the want of roads to get

to mill, market &c.: the unhealthy location, bad water, &c.,; the want of some suitable person on the Mission, to act as magistrate, to protect them from the abuse they receive from unprincipled white men, who settle on their lands, steal their timber, sell and give them strong drink; and use every means possible to lead them astray.

"There have been several admittled on trial during the year. The Church is composed of five Classes numbering 83 Indians and 15 White persons; there was one expelled and seven were dropped for neglect; three marriages, 8 Births, 4 Removals, 2 were received from a distance; Deaths, 1 man, 6 women and 13 children. Although there has been no particular visitation of sickness, yet the bill of mortality has been fearfully heavy owing, I believe, principally to night exposure and want of proper protection from wet and cold; all the adults died of consumption and all the children from some complaint in the head. It was to me a very great comfort to be present to minister the holy Sacrament to our dear Christian friends when they were about leaving: all died well. Bless the Lord O my soul, Amen.

"The Lord is with the people in truth. We never have had a barren meeting while I have been with them; I would like to stay longer on the Mission if health and other circumstances would admit, but I must leave them forever. The school was continued six months and some of the children did well for the time they had:

Brother Peter Jones has often visited us during our stay on the Mission, and was always made a blessing to the mission family as well as to all our people. My hearts desire and prayer to God is that all the dear Indians at New Credit and elsewhere may be found prepared when called for: Amen."

#### RAMA.

"Yesterday, (21st May,) we held our last Quarterly meeting on this misssion for this Conference year, and if the Spirit that pervaded the entire services of the day, the hallowed fire that burned in many hearts, the tears of joy that streamed down many a swarthy cheek, are a fair index of the religious state of this Mission, we have reason to thank God and take courage.

"The past year has been one of severe affliction to your Missionary. During the whole year I have had to struggle with a painful disease, and when (as has been frequently the case) unable to walk from the Mission House to the chapel, the Indians would come and take me in a canoe, and when there I was very often unable to stand during the service, and so would take my seat on a chair, and with my feet lying on another instruct the people; but I thank God that in the midst of all, I could say, it was good for me to be afflicted.

"We have lost but one member by death during the year; but our loss is undoubtedly her eternal gain. Our numbers are the same as last year. I was compelled early in the year to give up teaching the school, but employed a female teacher. The additional expense to the Society will not be much; not exceeding what the Indians appropriate yearly to aid in teaching their children. On the whole I think that the Mission is in a prosperous state in reference to morals and piety.

#### ST. CLAIR.

"Though much has been done effectually on this Mission, and on all the Missions in care of the Canada Conference, much remains to be done, while the Indians are at all addicted to roving and hunting habits, which is too much the case here. We cannot concede the opinion of certain enemies of Indian improvement, who say that they will never become a settled and farming people. They have roamed unchecked for ages. What if it should take an age to make them staid, and satisfied on farms, like White men! Will nothing have been accomplished? The surprise ought to be, that so many already have shown respect to the requirements of civilization, even of the first generation. It is not unfair to postpone a full judgment till the second generation shall have reached maturity. The Indian's friend has not been disappointed, and will not be.

The progress in agriculture of the St. Clair Mission is slow but sure. By the blessing of God on Mrs. Brooking's efforts, the advancement of the females is seen with pleasure. The public services have a cheering and controlling influence upon the people. The Day School and Sabbath School are useful. There are 18t Indians, and 2 Whites in Church fellowship, and the piety of some is exemplary, and by its simplicity, earnestness and uniformity would not suffer in comparison with that of Chistians in more favoured circumstances. Much money has been spent on this old mission, but not too much for the benefits conferred upon it by the Gospel. What object on the beautiful river St. Clair, is more humane and affecting than this Indian settlement, where Christ is made known! Much of the moral glory of Canada is derived from the Missions for Indians. There has an answer been given to the prayer,

". The dark Americans convert; And shine in every Pagan Heart."

#### RICE LAKE.

"This Mission was begun when some faint-hearted men said, 'The conversion of the Indians is an experiment.' Not that we approved of the term used in such a connection, never believing that to preach the Gospel is an experiment. It is a certain good, and the proper preaching of it a certain blessing. The Christian loveliness of hundreds of Aboriginal Missions in the world tells of a success which the mere command of civil power, and the appliances of art and science never yet secured. They have their high place among men, and deserve it; but the Christianization of mankind is beyond their jurisdiction.

"The Rice Lake Mission is inferior to none for solid attainments. Farming is the settled calling of some, and others are approaching the true standard. Certain arts are growing in the estimation of the people; and the handicraft of many is not the handy dandyism of the trifler. Young people are advancing very creditably in knowledge, experience and manners. And what one of the aged, pious Chiefs once said at a native, Christian festival is not the exaggeration of a bravado. 'We are getting nearly equal to the white people, and this the Gospel has done for us.'

"The religious profession of our members here is consistent and steady, without display, but not without sincerity. Attendance on the ordinances regular and profitable, and the joy of the Lord is sometimes loudly expressed. The School

is attended with advantages to the children and the tribe. The number in the Church is 54 Indians besides 15 Whites. Since the formation of this Society, many of its members have gone to glory. From it worthy men and women have been sent into the Mission work; and the Judgement day must come before it can be said, how great was the good done at, and by the old Rice Lake Indian Mission."

#### SAUGEEN.

"When I first came to the Mission it was rather in a deranged state! but I am happy to say that it is somewhat better. This Mission is situated about one mile and a half from the village of Southampton, on the bank of the river Saugeen.

"On the 25th of August 1853, we had a Camp Meeting: during the time several were hopefully converted to God, and backsliders reclaimed: it was a season long to be remembered by the Indians: it was a glorious season truly.

"The Indians composing this band are Ojebway and Pottawahtamies: the Ojebways, are the original owners of the soil, the others were admitted into the Tribe from other parts.

"Some improvement has been made by these Indians in agricultural pursuits. We have used our best endeavours to cultivate in them habits of industry and frugality, and they begin to see the necessity of cultivating the soil.

"During the year our Sabbath services have been well attended by old and young, most making it a point of duty to be in their place in the house of God, on the Lord's day, if within a reasonable distance. The attendance in general on the means of grace is good. The members in Society are about the same as last year. I cannot but believe that some of the Indians are truly pious; but not so happy in their piety as they might be, owing to their natural indolence. The Indians are desirous of having an Industrial School established somewhere in their Reserve.

"Since brother George Blaker taught the School some improvement has been made. The Sabbath School has been very well attended. There are no pagans connected with this band. We are sorry to say that our careless young people are in the habit of taking the fire water. All are at least in some degree, under the influence of Christianity; during the year several have died, some in the triumphs of faith. Upon the whole, we consider the Mission in a healthy and somewhat prosperous condition."

## NEWASH.

"In looking back upon the past, we see many manifestations of God's mercy to record. This band of Indians was once composed of almost habitual drunkards, but the Gospel has produced on them a great change—only two cases of intemperance have occurred during the year.

"The means of grace have been regularly attended except when the Indians were absent from the mission, on their periodical hunting and fishing excursions. These circumstances too often occur and very materially interrupt our operations, both in our Sabbath, and common week day Schools.

n the Indians ag excursions. ur operations, "We have endeavoured to influence the Indians, as far as possible, to turn their attention to agricultural pursuits, and to cultivate habits of industry (a lesson hard for them to learn.) Several families have recently settled on farms near the Mission and have commenced to clear and cultivate their land.

"During the past year three of our members—(one sister and two of our brethren) have been removed by the hand of death. They all evinced unshaken confidence, and faith in Christ, and died in great peace. The religion they embraced and professed to enjoy in life was to them a source of comfort and support in the hour of death.

"These are considerations that are calculated to inspire the Missionary, and the contributor to the Missionary Gause, with fresh zeal, and increased liberality in the great work in which they are engaged. Our labours may be abundant, and our discouragements varied and numerous, but to the faithful success is certain, and our reward will be illustrious."

#### BEAUSOLIEL AND FRENCH RIVER.

"We had many trials and difficulties to contend with in order to bring and lead our brothers and sisters to Ishpeming (Heaven.) And by the blessing and care of our Divine Master we have thus far been enabled to go on our way rejoicing. And for the present fair prospects of this Mission, to God be all the praise.

"The members of our Mission have been faithful to the Service of God\*during the year; and could I be able to tell you of the delightful and soul reviving seasons we had at our last Quarterly Meeting they would plainly indicate that God was still with us.

"The total number of our members is 49; we have been on the increase this year, 6 have been added to our Church and 2 on trial, 2 have died in the Lord and 3 removed."

"French River—During my last visit to this interesting Mission I am happy to state that I found all our brothers and sisters still firm in God and onward, notwithstanding the very limited advantages which have been extended to them. The number of members on that Mission is 14 and one has been added to our Church.

"The School I am happy to state has been well kept and attended and the teacher has given general satisfaction. The number of children that attend the school is 26. May the Good Spirit attend his servants, and crown their labours with success, until the solitary places be glad and blossom as the rose."

#### GARDEN RIVER.

"This Missionis beautifully situated on the borders of the St. Mary's River. At present no less than nine steamers ply to and from the Sault every week. Another year and the highway to Lake Superior (the St. Marie's Canal) will

be thrown open. The vast mineral wealth of the North West will be developed, and the poor Indian who now wraps himself in his rabbit skin garb and wastes his day of probation in poverty and indescribable wretchedness, will then become a citizen of the civilized world, 'exposed to all the temptations peculiar to a mining and fishing locality.

"During the past year this Mission has enjoyed a good degree of prosperity: the fire-water has been banished from our village; many of our people have grown in grace, some have died in faith and are now in paradise. Quite a number from other bands have been converted.

"In our local improvements we have made some advancement. We have now a comfortable chapel 25 by 35, and a new school house 20 feet square. In the erection of these buildings valuable assistance has been received from Christian friends, members of other Churches. A gentleman deeply interested in Indian Missions has authorized me to draw on him to the amount of 150 dollars for the purpose of employing a female teacher for the coming year.

"Our village bears the marks of industry. Last winter more than 1500 cords of wood were cut and drawn to the docks by the Indians, while more than \$2000 have been received from the Canal Company for work."

# DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

The Committee now send forth a larger number of local reports from these Missions than at any former period, full of fact, interest, and promise; which cannot fail to inform and stimulate the respected sustainers of the Society

When the late Rev. Samuel Leigh, the successful pioneer of Wesleyan Missions in Australasia and Polynesia, concluded, with a declaration of his intentions, his first interwiew with the Governor of New South Wales, His Excellency said, "If those be your objects, they are certainly of the first importance; and, if you will endeavour to compass them by the means you have now specified, I cannot but wish you all the success you can reasonably expect or desire." Similar language has been frequently uttered by the revised Representative of Royalty in Canada,—silencing gainsayers by its truth, and cheering the Society by its Christian and British liberality.

An observer will be struck by the breadth, solidity, permanence, and progress of the Domestic work. The respective narratives of the Missionaries,

by their brevity, occasional abruptness, and lack of adornment, but not of facts and force, convince the reader that they were written by men busy for God. They influence the judgment, raise admiration, stir thoughts, purposes, passions, and all in favour of the work carried on; and the spirit of intercession for souls, and of generosity for the cause, is excited by the victorious voice of the conquerors, and their cry—"Onward, still, to victory!"

The anxiety of the Society from the first has been, to keep her labours up to the ever-urgent requirements of the New Settlements, whatever the effort might cost of men and means; and much it has cost. The most distant dwelling has often been discovered, perchance inhabited by children of Christian parents living in another part of the colony. In the nearest "shanty," it is likely, children are found entering upon life, accompanied by parents poor, aged, and helpless, beginning life afresh. In another direction a habitation is reached, and the inmates are of the Episcopal, Presbyterian, Baptist, or some other profession, and they receive cordial attentions. In many a lowly habitation of Canada is the domestic band just "from Home," the perils of water over, the perils of the wilderness commencing. And still, no Atlantic sail reaches the British shores of the new world, but others arrive, and seek a place in this vast territory. The Missionary meets them with a smile, and boldly stands between them and barbarism.

The members and adherents of every Church are sedulously and disinterestedly cared for by all the Society's Missionaries; but, very naturally, the family feeling is revived within when they find in solitude—as some have been greeted at the strange wharf on their first landing—Wesleyars from other lands, British, Continental, or American; the usefulness, and fraternal love of Colonial Methodism are then made apparent; and the prayers put up for the Emigrants, at their never-forgotten happy birth-places, afar off, are answered in their preservation from the world, and their continuance in the good old way of their fathers.

These Missions are of "the first importance." The Local Agency, fitted to its duties, the District Chairmanship, ever vigilant, and the General Superintendency, far-seeing and influential, important. The doctrines proclaimed, the sacraments administered, the system pursued, the discipline applied, the means brought into operation, important. The anti-sectarian Itinerancy, with its bible, adaptability, enterprise, sympathies, self-denial, practicality, vigour, indefatigableness, faith, love, and power, important. To care for every child of man, regardless of nationality, profession, condition, and bring the largest number of souls to Christ and heaven, is most important.

The Society rejoices in the success God has granted. Congregations, Societies, and Sabbath Schools are increased. Circuits and Districts are in-

creased. Missionaries are increased. Churches, Parsonages, and School Houses are increased. The transformation of Missions into Circuits is neverending. The wider establishment of the Institutions of the Christian Religion in the country is a constant employment. Moral and benevolent Associations are enlarging their useful sphere. Wesleyan and other scriptural Literature is spreading rapidly. Intelligence, industry, sobriety, order, are more prevalent. The Scriptures and the Sabbath are more respected. In every direction the desert is blossoming. From the far east to the far west many souls are saved. "The Lord God Omnipotent reigneth!" By the Missionary efforts of Christian and Protestant Churches Canada has been lifted to her present religious, civil, educational, commercial, and scientific elevation; and their sanctified patriotism and services cannot be over-estimated. This Society is one with them in Gospel ardour and expectations, and a co-helper, purposed to promote incessantly, the happiness and greatness of Canada.

#### BARRIE.

"The past year has been graciously marked with an encouraging amount of prosperity in every department of the work of God. Several very interesting cases of conversion and of entire sanctification, have occurred, chiefly in the town of Barrie, by which the members have increased on the Mission from 230 to 273. The congregations in most parts of the Mission have been large and attentive, new places have been opened, classes formed, in one of 10 members, and there is a prospect of a good class in the other. The crowded state of the church in Barrie led to an effort for enlargement, which will be completed during the coming July. Fundsf or this purpose have been already secured by subscription and a bazaar amounting to about one hundred and twenty pounds.

"All the funds are in advance. The income of the Mission during the past year has risen from fifty seven pounds to one hundred and twenty two pounds, and the Missionary Subscriptions and Collections from forty two pounds to eighty-five pounds. To God be all the praise: we thank God and take courage."

"All the funds, local and connexional are greatly in advance. The missionary and has a rise of about 100 per cent., and the three other connexional funds together of nearly 150 per cent."

"The work of God on this Mission, during the past year, has been gradually progressing. Our Church would be greatly benefited if the houses of worship already commenced on this Mission were completed, and some more erected in other localities."

#### PORT SARNIA.

"The review of the past year, awakens emotions of thankfulness to the Great Head of the Church for his blessing and protection vouchsafed to us, on this Mission. We have enjoyed peace and prosperity in all our borders. Several during the year have been converted to God, and added to the Church. After supplying the deficiencies occasioned by 2 deaths, 4 withdrawals, 3 dropped and 1 removed; we report an increase of 15 members. To God be all the praise.

"Our financial department is prosperous. For the claims of the missions, and connexional funds we have raised about £42 wore than last year. Our people are now engaged in building a parsonage in Port Sarnia, 34 by 24 feet, two stories high. The house and lot will cost £300. They are also building a small church 36 by 26 feet, in Corunna, which will cost about £175. These are very much required, but considering the newness of the Mission, and the smallness of our numbers they will be a heavy financial burden upon them; but we have a willing and liberal people, and they ought to be encouraged.

"The greater part of this Mission is truly missionary ground. Your Missionary experiences some of the hardships incident upon such a life. Had we an assistant it would be very gratifying to the people and greatly relieve us. The work requires two labourers, and the Stewards promise to pay liberally for their support. They promise more I fear, than they can accomplish. However, it is very cheering and encouraging to labour with such a liberal and willing people. May Almighty God succeed all our efforts."

#### LOCHABER.

"In laying before our Missionary Committee a statement of this Mission, we have nothing peculiar to communicate; yet it is due to the great Head of the Church, to say that we have had a year of great peace, and of some prosperity.

"We came to the Mission under a consciousness of a want of ministerial qualifications, as also of the extent of the work in the Mission; and in our individual capacity strove during the first quarter of the year, to work a circuit of some sixty miles in length, and varying from eight to twenty in breadth, and all to be gone over in two weeks. Feeling the force of the maxim, that 'what is worth doing at all, is worth doing well,' and that it was impossible to accomplish this maxim without aid, I applied to the Chairman of our District for an assistant, who cordially acquiesing in the demand for such aid, sent me brother Richard Wilson as colleague, during the remainder of the year. We have had a harmonious and somewhat prosperous year together, the Lord adding to our Church some thirty members, the most of whom, we trust, are truly converted to God.

"The prospects of the Mission are greatly improved, the membership greatly quickened, and the whole aspect more Methodistic than when we came to it. Having increased help, we multiplied our appointments, and think that at each of them there are the buddings of hope. The population of the Mission are from different countries, sparse, and made up of a variety of religious creeds, and some of no creed at all. Yet, diversified as it is, Methodism has nothing to fear from a comparison either of Ministers, members, means, or doctrines. Praying for the prosperity of this Mission as also for the general work of our Zion; I have the honour of being a fellow labourer in the Vineyard of our common Lord."

#### PEEL.

We are thankful however, to the great Head of the Church, who enables us to tell of progress, in increased contributions to all our funds; and also, in the conversion of about twenty persons, who professed to be the subjects of saving grace, in connexion with protracted efforts during the winter season. We have been favoured with the valuable assistance of a most devoted and zealous band of Local Preachers and Exhorters, with whom we have been labouring in much peace. The Mission is included in the townships of Peel and Maryboro' and part of Wallace."

#### METCALFE.

"This is a most important as well as interesting field of labour, though in Metcalfe village there are but few members, but they are strongly attached to the Methodist Church. We have succeeded in getting commenced a comfortable parsonage 21 by 36 feet, with a back kitchen 12 by 14, 2 stories high, which according to contract is to be completed by the first of July; the house will be pleasantly situated in the village of Metcalfe, nearly in the centre of the Circuit We have but one Chapel, 126 members, and seven appointments, with two others occasionally visited. It is not for want of liberality on the part of the largest number of our members that we are under the necessity of receiving aid out of the funds of the society; but for want of numerical strength. No doubt in a few years this Circuit will take its stand by the side of, and rank with the best Circuits. We have not had as much prosperity as we could have wished for, but we have the satisfaction of knowing that there have been some converted, and others reclaimed from a backsliding state. We hope the Lord will still carry on his work in the conversion of souls."

## ELORA.

"In reviewing the results of this ecclesiastical year, on this Mission, we have reason to thank the great Head of the Church that we have not 'laboured in vain, nor spent our strength for naught.' In the Circuit book left us we found 196 names, in which there was a mistake of 4 or 5. We admitted during the year 25, took up two new appointments, formed one Society, which is prospering, dropt 4 or 5, received from other Circuits 4, removed to other Circuits 20; one peaceful death; and we have on our Circuit book the names of 201 members, many of whom we have reason to believe, are 'walking in the fear of God, and in the comforts of the Holy Ghost,' while the religion of others, it is to be feared, is more in form than in power.

"All dur connexional funds are in advance of the preceding year; our missionary fund about 130 per cent., so, a small debt on the Fergus Church has been cancelled. The interior of the Elora Church we have got lathed, plastered, and paid for, which is now rather small for the congregation.

"We have in existence subscription lists, and engagements for building a church in Troy; one in Upper Woolwich of brick, and a brick parsonage in Elora, of which we are greatly in want, having to pay a very hight rent: all to be proceeded with immediately.

"Although labouring under a considerable deficiency, in having to pay a larger amount of house rent; yet, the contributions to our connexional funds from this mission this year, being some 8 or 10 pounds more than its receipts from the missionary fund, gives us reason to believe, that in a few years, Elora will rank amongst our respectable self supporting Circuits."

#### BROCK.

"The Brock Mission is situated between Port Whitby and Lake Simcoe, embracing the township of Brock and a part of Georgiana; settled principally by persons from Ireland and Scotland, and of sober and industrious habits, which, with the blessing of Heaven, have contributed to the improvement of their circumstances.

"Brock is amongst the best of the rear townships for agricultural purposes. Most of the members of our Society are now comfortable, and our leading or official brethren, have attained a respectable and beneficial share of influence in the community.

"The greatest apparent impediment to progress in the encouragement and accommodation of the people at large throughout the mission, is the lack of suitable and sufficient places for Divine Worship, on the holy Sabbath days. The erection of two such is in contemplation, and as far as subscriptions together with lots, for building purposes are concerned, in encouraging progress. Industry with good economy for the coming year, may, by the Divine blessing, result in the accomplishment of this good and very desirable work. Most of the membership, and some not in Society, have contributed liberally to the cause of God, and have done so cheerfully. 'The Lord loveth a cheerful giver'. £40 have been raised to aid the connexional work, above the amount toward the Missionaries' salary and family allowance &c.

"There is not the improvement desirable in the Society and in the spirituality of the work, but there are some praying, with Habbakuk, O Lord revive thy work!"

#### BATH AND AMHERST ISLAND.

The Societies are generally in a good spiritual state. The attendance on Class-meetings is regular, and this means of grace is becoming increasingly interesting and profitable. The brethren have purchased a new and neat house and premises in the village of Bath, for a Parsonage; and have thus provided for the increased comfort of the minister, who may from henceforth be sent to labour among them. Upon the whole in reviewing the labours and successes of the past year, we have reason to thank God, and take courage."

#### BLENHEIM.

The hand that wrote the following correct report, will never again take the pen to place before the Committee and their friends unostentatious labours so truly evangelical and Methodistical, as those in which the Society's esteemed Missionary, the Rev. John Williams, ever delighted to be found. These last statements, so replete with information, and hallowed sentiment and feeling, are interesting and affecting. He was a useful man in maintaining the primitive spirit and principles of Wesleyan Methodism, and was lately summoned by his Master from the work he loved; dying so as to give solemn effect to the prayer closing his first paragraph; "May the people be kept firm and faithful to the end of life!"

"The past year has been a time of peace and uninterrupted prosperity to our beloved Methodism, within the bounds of the Mission. It has never fallen to my lot to labour among a people more peaceful, kind, and generous; and more devoted to the principles and polity of our Church, than the members of Blenheim. May this attachment continue unabated and the people be kept firm and faithful to the end of life!

"The means of grace have been well attended, at all the appointments, and the word preached has proved unspeakably profitable and refreshing to the people of God, who are hungering and thirsting after righteousness. O that they may be filled with all the fulness of God! The standard of the Gospel is 'Holiness to the Lord,' 'perfect love which casteth out feat,' 'sanctification throughout soul, body and spirit." This is Methodism; and to this standard some of the members here have attained, while others are aspiring after it. They talk, think, and pray more on this delightful theme, holiness and devotedness to God. This no doubt will tend to prevent a retrograde movement, and keep them one in Christ Jesus their living Head.

"Sabbath and week-day prayer meetings have been remarkably well attended; they have been held in different private houses, and have proved seasons of conviction and conversion to many happy souls. The utmost feeling of unity and cordiality has prevailed, and therefore there has been no backwardness in coming up to the help of the Lord ; even very young persons are known to take an active part at these prayer meetings; thus preparing themselves for usefulness in subsequent years.

"An interest has also been exhibited for the comfort and wellfare of the preacher, and considerable expense and labour have been incurred to furnished the parsonage and otherwise render it comfortable. Much kindness has been shown the minister during personal and family affliction; in this, I hope, that they may be abundantly rewarded.

"A spirit of liberality prevails; considerable amounts have been raised for different purposes; over £40 for the missionary fund; over £80, for the support of the preacher, besides the general funds, chapels, and Sabbath Schools. Altogether the Circuit has done well, and no doubt each succeeding year will a present pleasing improvement."

#### PERCY.

In submitting the report of the religious state of this mission, we look back upon the year now closing with gratitude to Almighty God for the mercies which he has bestowed upon us. The year began with severe trials, arising from causes which it is not necessary now to state; its progress has been characterized by incessant toils and labours, and its close has been marked by signal blessings.

During the two last quarters of the year God has given power to his own truth, and as the result many sinners have been awakened and converted, and added to the Christian Church. The members of the church have been greatly quickened, and a more elevated tone of piety is observable among them. In the ordinary meetings for prayer, sinners are not unfrequently awakened and brought to God, and the church is aspiring after the blessing of entire holiness. The places which have been most favoured by the outpourings of the Spirit, are the Oak Hills, and Percy Mills. At the latter place we have succeeded during the year, in finishing our new church, which has already proved a great blessing to us. In it a goodly number of souls have been converted, and our third and fourth Quarterly Meetings which were held in it were two of the most hallowed services we ever attended. Many will look back to these seasons with delight to the end of life, and count them as among the happiest moments of their existence

The mission we consider to be in a prosperous condition, (though there are many places which much need a revival of the work of God,) and promises fair after a while to become a pretty good circuit. During the year we have had an encouraging increase in all the Connexional Funds, and also an increase in the membership. The annual schedule gives the following results in regard to members for the present year. After deducting removals, deaths, expulsions and withdrawals there are 143. Last year there were 103: leaving an increase of 40.

#### RAWDON.

"The Rawdon Mission includes the Township of Rawdon, and parts of the Townships of Huntingdon, Marmora, and Belmont. The present report is for the last two years.

"Rawpox.—In this township there are five appointments. One of them is in the Village of Stirling; a thriving place in respect to trade, but of little account in 'regard to religion. I endeavoured to excite a better attention to personal godliness by holding special services each winter, but the prevalent indifference could not be overcome, and no special good was the result. Still, the attendance on public worship was usually encouraging,—and a neat and comfortable Chapel has been erected, at the cost of above £200. It was opened last autumn, and is the first building erected here for divine worship.—At another appointment I held a protracted meeting for above two weeks; and the presence and the power of the Lord were strikingly manifested in the large congregations. A number were added to the society; but some have shown since, the common inconstancy. Their goodness is 'as the morning cloud, and as the early dew that passeth away.' In the other appointments are some scattered members, but no classes, yet attentive congregations.

"Huntingdon.—There are two appointments in the west part of this Township. At one of them, the congregation is large, and the class in a more prosperous state than two years ago.—In the other appointment; there are a few good members; yet in regard to religion generally, the 'day of small and feeble things' yet exists.

"Marnora.—Thirty years ago the gospel was carried back into this rocky, iron outskirt of Canadian settlements by Bro. David Wright. For some years a prosperous class existed; and a faithful young man was taken from it to preach the gospel. He is still a member of our conference, and a faithful worker in the vineyard of the Lord. For many years past, but little encouragement has been felt by the Missionary travelling the rugged, solitary, and dangerous road. Our members are reduced to a few, and Christ's flock here is 'little' indeed. Still some of the people show their appreciation of the services of the missionary by yearly contributions to the missionary fund; and welcome him on his periodical visits; and hear the word of God with deep attention and profit.

"Belmont.—This township is nearly in its wild and natural state; only about 60 families (all Protestants) having encroached on this domain of the forest, and made little isolated clearings and habitations. The land has been usually condemned as worthless, but good lots have been found out, and settlers are now going in. It is a rocky Township, and like Marmora, rich in some kinds of metal: fish abound in the lakes, and deer stalk fearlessly in the woods. I have ocasionally visited the east part of the township, where there are about 20 families; have preached in a little shanty to persons living from a mile to four miles

"In regard to numbers, the Mission in 1852 returned 63; in 1854, the members are 112, a part of which is however by accession from an adjoining circuit. After making up for backslidings, removals, and deaths, the increase is really but 25. A little increase is discernable in each of the collections for the connexional funds;—and while there is room for the growth of liberality in the membership, in supporting the gospel, a few abound in this excellent grace; and as they willingly sow, so the Lord will graciously cause them to reap. Many of the members are truly devoted to God, and some are seeking for the entire 'sanctification of the Spirit.' Thus the lights and shadows of this part of the Lord's vineyard may be discerned and known."

#### SHERBROOKE.

"On this Mission several appointments have been broken up, owing to the friends removing to the West, chiefly because of the sterility of the soil; but doubtless what we lose here, we gain elsewhere: they are not lost to the church. During the year, there has been laid out upwards of eighteen pounds in repairing and finishing the Hoptown Church, where more than a hundred persons can be conveniently seated to hear the word of life; and it is now comfortable for divine worship. We have had some prosperity, though not so much as we have wished; for after all deductions and removals, there is an increase of twenty-two members on the Mission; mostly the fruits of a protracted meeting held at Bro. White's school-house last fall, where the Lord was pleased to pour out his spirit on the people, and to bless his word in the conviction and conversion of precious souls to God. From these tokens of the divine favour, we thank God and take encouragement to go forward in the work of the Lord; trusting that he will still revive his work, and more powerfully bless his word, and add to the church those who shall be saved."

#### WARDSVILLE.

"It affords us much pleasure in presenting our report of this Mission to be able to refer to some evidences of advancement. In the membership there is a nett increase of fourteen whites and six Indians. We have taken up an appointment at the Village of Newtown; a place which has sprung up in consequence of one of the Great Western Railroad Depots being located there. All our connexional funds are from fifty to eighty per cent in advance of any previous year. And such has been the liberality of the friends, that we have taken eight pounds less from the Missionary Fund than at the commencement of the year was considered really necessary to meet the wants of the Mission. A neat New Church has been built in the Moorhouse neighbourhood, and the Church in Wardsville is nearly finished. The congregations in all parts of the Mission are good. The Indian appointment at Fairfield is doing well. On the whole we are encouraged to believe, 'that the Lord of hosts is with us, that the God of Jacob is our refuge.'"

Though we have had toils and suffering through the year, yet we have realized much comfort and satisfaction with many of these servants of the Lord Jesus.

#### DUNNVILLE.

"In reporting the religious state of this Mission, I would observe that there has been no dimunition in the encouraging tokens of the Divine favour. Our hold upon the affections of the different communities amongst whom we have laboured, seems to grow stronger. The respect for our institutions seems to be on the increase. And the interest of our own people, especially our official members, in matters affecting the prosperity of the church, manifests considerable growth. There has been advance in the contributions to all our funds: and God has been with us by His Spirit in the ordinances of his worship; comforting the hearts of his people, and adding some to us by conversion.

"In my report of last year, I mentioned the existence of a feeling in favour of Church-building: that feeling still lives and is acting. We have at this time five Churches in progress, some near completion, and two others in contemplation, and I think they will 'go up.' And it appears to me, that if these Churches were finished and paid for, (which I hope will soon be,) the Mission will be prepared to take its place among the self-sustaining circuits.

As one of your humble agents I must be allowed to observe, that I record the above-mentioned notes of success with a heart-felt gratitude to God, through whom comes all prosperity; and I desire to ascribe to Him 'all the glory.'"

#### DURHAM.

This Mission lies chiefly west of Durham, and includes the township of Glenelg, Bentinck, Brant, and part of Carrick. It is an extensive field of labour: there are at present 11 appointments, where we have preaching every two weeks. Having no local help, and the roads bad, we found it a hard mission. Last year Normanby was set apart from Durham, and it is found highly necessary that it should be again divided, as the townships are settling very fast; and a thriving village was

lately commenced about fifteen miles from Durham. As regards the spiritual state of the Mission much cannot be said. The Missionary who was appointed last Conference, being sent to another Mission, this has not (all the year) had regular preaching, but I doubt not, if a zealous Missionary could be sent, much good might be done, and things would present a more pleasing aspect.

#### SHEFFIELD.

"This Mission, we think on the whole, to be improving. It has been till this year, embarrassed by an old debt on the chapel. This with another smaller, and of later date being skaken off, the friends, we believe will be able to do more to advance the interests of the mission in various ways: such as repairing the church, and building a Parsonage, and increasing the Connexional Funds, and making their preachers more comfortable in future, which their generosity and kindness inclines them to do according to their ability.

#### KINCARDINE.

"While the Wesleyan Missionary Society is pursuing its objects, among the natives of our forests, it has not been unmindful of those destitute places within the bounds of the white population, which so greatly needs the blessings of the gospel.

"The above Mission was formded in the fall of 1850, and embraces part of the townships of Kincardine, Huron, Kinlos, Kurlos, Grenock and Bruce. The cause of religion is prospering, within the bounds of this interesting and important field of labour. We cannot indeed, tell of large numbers, won to the obedience of Christ, through the powerful influences of gospel truth, yet, a few, during the past year have been added to the Church, who profess to have obtained the Pearl of great price. Our numbers have increased to 100, and there are good prospects that Societies will soon be formed in other parts that have only been recently settled. In the very village of Penetangore, where we have preaching every Sabbath, the congregation is large and attentive, and the friends are resolved on making an immediate effort to erect a suitable place of worship. The members of our own communion, and others not united with us in church fellowship evince, by their liberality an anxious desire for the continuation of their present privileges; and to the credit of the people on this Mission, we must add, that your Missionary has ever been treated with kindness and respect, while labouring among them.

"From many encouraging circumstances we are called to give thanks to God, for his providence, and grace in behalf of this Mission; indeed, the Missions in general in this newly organized District, are in a prosperous condition. The forests are becoming fruitful fields; the forests of the western country are blooming as the best."

#### CARTWRIGHT.

"This year has been one of peace and prosperity. The Methodist Church is steadily advancing in temporal and spiritual things. All our connexional funds are in advance of last year. The New Church of which I gave you an account last year, as being in course of erection, has been completed at a cost of \$500; and the friends intend to paint it, and fence the lot, and erect comfortable sheds.

"A parsonage-house is much needed on this Mission; and I am glad that the members of society and others favourable to Methodism see and feel this want. In the east of Manvers our church members and friends are 'devising liberal things;' a subscription is in circulation, and they confidently hope to be able to realize an amount sufficient to enable them to erect a comfortable church, at a cost of about \$400. The ground has been procured, being the gift of Brother J. Gardner."

#### STRATHROY.

"We feel thankful to God for as much of his presence as has been granted to us in this field of labour: through his mercy we have not been compelled by sickness to dissappoint a single congregation.

"Although we have some discouragements in our work, arising from the fact, that we cannot give to the several localities the amount of labour which the nature of the work and the people require. In most places, except we can go to them on the Sabbath day, we can do little or nothing among them, through worldly mindedness; or in some cases, if we do not go to them on the Sabbath, others will, so that when we do go, our time is nearly thrown away. Now, several of those places, it is impossible for one man to attend on Sabbath oftener than once a menth, which is doing little for them, and some we cannot go to at all on the Lord's day. The friends generally, are desirous of having two preachers on the Mission;—but then where is the support to come from?

"We have, notwithstanding, some things of a cheering nature to communicate:—a few have been converted to God during the year, 17 have been admitted on trial, and 9 by letter; yet the annual schedule will show a decrease of 24, owing principally to the following causes, viz., 20 were transferred to the Warwick Mission in the early part of the year, the unusual number of 22 have been dropped and expelled, and 8 have removed. A deed has been obtained for our chapel property in the Village of Strathroy, and measures taken to secure a site for a parsonage. The receipts for the year are all in advance of any previous year. For the Missionary cause, we have double the amount paid by the Mission last year:—could we have labourers here in proportion to the wants of the country around, much more might be done by the blessing of God.

Could we, by the aid of Bro. S., have preaching twice each Sabbath in the Village, it would be no more than we ought to have, as we are the only denomination now regularly occupying the ground. The ministers of another church have preached there, and may do so again.

#### WESTMEATH.

The sympathy of the Committee has been awakened, by the afflictions, trials, and toils of the respected writer of the subjoined statements; and their prayer is that the all-wise Being who has suspended his discharge of missionary duties, may soon restore him from his painful retirement, to labours, which though arduous, have, for many years, been performed unremittingly, and always with success.

"The past has been a year of great affliction. During the Summer and commencement of the Autumn, our prospects were brightening and some were enquiring, what must we do to be saved? Two had just joined Society on trial, when in the Providence of God, afflictions were permitted to come upon us. I received a kick from my horse which left me senseless for some time; I have not been able to attend regularly to the mission, since the first of November last.

This closes the twenty-sixth year of my Itinerancy; six years of which have been spent on this Mission. They have been years of toil and sacrifice. On removing from it, such is the state of my health, I find that I must now retire from the active work. There are friends on this Mission, who will retain a prominent place in my affections while reason holds her sway,—friends, who have endeared themselves to us in my great affliction,—friends, with whom I anticipate a re-union where affliction will never come.

"The last of December brother Kilgour from Clarendon was sent to assist me. Through absence and Sickness he has missed several appointments. But on the whole I think he has given pretty general satisfaction. Here is a field large enough for two healthy men, and if our Conference do not occupy it others will: our chapel at Pembrook is comfortable, though not quite finished. We want a Chapel in Westmeath. 'O Lord revive thy Work!"

## ERIN.

"The past year has been one of peace, and in some measure prosperous, although we commenced under rather unfavourable circumstances; as this Mission had two Missionaries for the greater part of last year. Hence this year all the appointments could not be supplied with Sabbath labour, which caused some

unpleasant feelings, there having been but one Missionary to labour on the same field, with the exception of Orangeville, and the Centre Road, which were added to the Mono Mission at the last annual Conference. We are also deprived of the labours and usefulness of that worthy class of brethren 'Local Preachers', which are rendered so very efficient to our Church in other parts of our Lord's Vineyard, but we have none on this Mission.

"Yet, thank God, the Lord of the Vineyard, has graciously blest our feeble efforts in the conversion of Sinners, and the reviving of His work generally We have an increase of forty Church members, thirteen have removed by letter, three have died, a few have been laid aside for non-attendance, eleven were transferred to the Mono Mission. We have organized four new classes, we have now 8 classes, numbering 85 members in all. The work is extensive and laborious for one Missionary. There are many places within our bounds and in the surrounding vicinities, which would much prefer the labours of the Wesleyan Methodist if they could be supplied forthwith; if not others will, and are making zealous efforts to occupy the field that now calls upon the Wesleyan Church.

"This Mission is considered in a healthy state; the spirit of revival is evidently manifesting itself everywhere. There is probability of two new Churches being built next year, subscription lists are in circulation, our congregations are tolerably good, and the brethren, are warm and kind-hearted and liberal in accordance with their means. The Missionary department of our work has been well sustained: we are far in advance of last year—to God be all the glory."

#### STRATFORD.

"Though there have not been large ingatherings, yet, by Divine mercy some have participated in pardon. A spirit of enquiry is now being waked up, and enlarged desire for salvation. In many instances your Missionary received great kindnesse from the Presbyterian and Episcopal friends; by them cordially received and welcomed, also encouraged to continuous exertion, by their uniting their influence with ours for good, on the side of piety.

"Our people are in rather straitened circumstances, neither are they numerically strong, but with all these disadvantages we are persuaded that a great wokr will be accomplished, if there is firm and unwearied exertion made in the work of faith and labour of love. If this work is not instrumentally accomplished by our agents it will be by some other. Already, in the parts to which we now refer, are there signs of ingathering. In the Townships of North East Hope and South East Hope, Ellice and Downie, there are open doors placed before us inviting to permanent occupancy. This whole country is densely populated; Stratford forms the nucleus of a large town, where will be the confluence of the riches of the county from all sides; your Missionary deems this section of work to be of no minor importance, and this will appear from this one fact, that three railroads intersect each other in this rising town, the Grand Trunk, Buffalo and Goderich, and Port Dover and Saugeen."

Our accessions during the year number 16.

Generally speaking, the features of the Mission are encouraging to the labourer. There are many pious, self-denying people among us, who are anxious that the banners of the Lord should float untarnished above us, and they love the battle shout. The Missionary is kindly attended, and liberally supported as far as limited means allow. A little more of the harmonizing, long-suffering, amalgamating charity, and the Proton Church would stand pre-eminent in the northern wilderness, and be a beacon and a blessing to the multitude that are settling around.

"There are three organized Sabbath Schools in operation, having an average attendance of 90 scholars, with libraries containing 340 volumes: I believe, through grace, these are exercising a very salutary influence on the minds of the youth."

contract for the erection of a New Church has been let during the last year. And as practical attention is about to be paid to the counsel given in Hag. i. 3, we hope that ere long God will be glorified in the conversion of sinners in 'Mount Pleasant Church.'—May it be so.

"Your Missionary regrets that the extensive character of his charge prevented him from holding extra meetings, or engaging in those protracted efforts for the extension of the Redeemer's kingdom, which he saw to be necessary. But notwithstanding those things, God has been with us in the ordinary means, and seasons of refreshment have been realized from the Divine presence.

"The increasing liberality of our people, together with that of the Missionary Committee, has saved us this year from the painful emotions arising from the large deficiences of previous years."

# PENETANGUESHENE ROAD.

"In compliance with the usage of the Church, and the expectations of the 'Missionary Board'; I send you a Report of our operations on this Mission during the year. For most of the year I found the labours rather heavy, without the assistance of a Colleague; but the last quarter of the year, I was greatly relieved, in consequence of 'Orillia and Oro' being organized into a separate Mission.

"As the Mission now is, we have to travel 26 miles to the village of Penetanguishene. The Townships of 'Medonte and Flos' require the most of our labours, we have 10 appointments in the fortnight, and 102 miles travel; we have had a number of awakenings, and a few conversions during the year—the result of extra-efforts. The moral soil here is rather sterile, and very hard to work, in consequence of preconceived doctrinal views of a deleterious nature, which must be removed by dispassionate arguments, and Christian perseverance, before the word can take much effect. I have done what I could, but not as much as I desired. I may say, 'I have not laboured in vain, nor spent my strength in vain, or for nought.' I hope however, that my successors will be more successful than I have been, on this important Mission. I am thankful to say that our friends are all on the encrease; this is certainly an incouraging aspect."

# NORMANBY.

Through the mercy and grace of God I have been brought to the close of my second year's labour on this newly formed Mission. The work has been arduous, the difficulties, and opposition, numerous and painful; but our sufficiency has been of God.

"During the last year God has favoured us with his presence and blessing in connection with our various efforts, and several whom we found 'Dead in trespasses and in sins" are now the sons of God, and are seeking a meetness for the 'inheritance of the Saints in light.' Nearly all of them joined the Wesleyan Church, and are striving to gain the Kingdom. The members are also quickened. After deducting those who have died, removed and dropped, we have an increase of thirty over last year. The regular appointments have been faithfully sustained. The congregations are good and increasing; a visible improvement is manifest in the interest which is taken in the means of grace, and the strong desire evinced to hear the word of life. Our quarterly religious festivals have been signally owned and blessed to the comfort and edification of many.

"In reviewing the toils of another year, your Missionaries are thankful to be able to report, that in the midst of all their-opinary trials, an unusually large measure of affliction in the Mission family, the God of Hosts has been with us, the God of Jacob has been our refuge; and while the Mission increases in labour and interest every year, extending as it does over eight seignories and townships, it requires a larger share of attention than two Missionaries are able to bestow; and both ends of it might be profitably attached to parts of Lochaber and Rawdon, and made into new Missions.

"Our Church accommodations are increasing every year; and within the last seven years three new Churches and a parsonage have been built. The membership has steadily increased; the funds have been gradually improving; and peace and prosperity are still in the midst of us.

"In very few former years has there been greater prosperity than in the past. Our annual return presents the following results:—received on trial, 112; died, 3; removed, 7; dropped, 11; total, 445; increase, 97; to God be all the praise, and with results like these, shall we not thankfully labor, and pray, and give, for Christ more abundantly than ever."

Five new classes have been formed; our people though poor in general have nevertheless well sustained us in temporal supplies; and the Missionary contributions have been increased 150 per cent.; all

the other funds are in advance of the previous year. Without hesitation we pronounce the Mission in a good state. To God be all the praise."

#### DEVONSHIRE.

"Th Mission is very laborious. It extends into six townships; mostly well settled. This place during the last two or three years, has settled so rapidly, that it is impossible for one Minister to supply the spiritual wants of those desiring the labour of your Missionary. There are hundreds of persons in the back parts of these Townships, that have had no preaching of any kind since they settled in them. In consequence of this spiritual destitution, drunkenness, Sabbath breaking &c., are practiced in some places on a large scale. It is a great pity that every neighbourhood in the Province, cannot be regularly supplied with the preaching of the Gospel. During the past year we formed 2 new classes, and admitted on trial 32 members who are mostly heads of families. After making up for all deficiencies we have an increase of 22 in our membership.

"All our funds are far in advance of any former year. Whilst viewing the success with which the Lord has been pleased to crown the feeble labours of his servants, during the past year, we feel that it becomes us to humble ourselves before him, and give him all the glory; for we know that the 'good that is done on earth' is done by him alone."

# NORWOOD.

"The state of this Mission is very encouraging. While those portions of the work, which were last year visited with showers of blessings, have maintained their fertility and productiveness; we are happy to say that other appointments concerning which our expectations were anything but sanguine at the commencement of the year, have been the scenes of glorious and extensive revivals. These revivals have been anything but pleasing to that class of men who say 'The temple of the Lord are we, and heathens all beside,' but they have cheered the hearts of our best friends, and encouraged your Missionaries in their work of faith and labour of love.

"The number of members last year was 153. The present number is 307, just double that of last year's return. This increase has arisen partly from the restoration of those who in former years were connected with us, but principally from the conversion of those who were a year ago the subjects of the kingdom of darkness.

"Our connexional funds on this Circuit are in advance of last year; more especially the missionary fund, which has increased from £35 to nearly £58. Last year we raised as much as the missionary appropriation. This year our, appropriation was increased by the committee to £45; but we have much more than met this amount, in addition to the support of two preachers instead of one. Methodist publications have been circulated to the extent of about £20 or more. It would be desirable that greater facilities for the diffusion of *cheap* Methodist literature could be provided. Agents of the American Tract Societies and Sabbath School Unions are flooding this part of the country with publications which although religious and useful, are not we conceive, so useful, nor so well adapted to the tastes and wants of our people as the publications of our own church.

# ST. MARY'S

"During the year God has gracious favoured us with his presence and blessing. Our Quarterly-meetings especially, have been seasons of refreshing. 14 have been received on trial, but owing chiefly to removals, and persons dropped, we have a small number less to report this year than was reported last. There are 12 regular Appointments on the Mission, 10 classes, and 200 members. Our Congregations are generally large for so newly a settled place, and there is every prospect of this Mission in a few years becoming one of our best Circuits. The people are liberal according to their ability. We have an increase in all our funds; in the mission fund more than 130 per cent. We were favoured with a visit by our Chairman in February, when a vigorous effort was entered uponfor the erection of a parsonage and chapel in the village of St. Mary's, which has since resulted in a Subscription of some £250. The parsonage will, perhaps, in the course of a month, be ready to occupy."

"When we came to this Mission a year ago, our cause appeared in rather a low and disorganized state. But this will not be matter of surprise, when it is known that it had, for the last two years, been deficient one preacher, and the excellent brother who immediately preceded me was sick the greater part of the year. Myself and colleague have been blessed with good health and considerable success. After deducting 25 as removed, dropped, &c., we have an increase over last year, of 27. In all our Circuit and connexional funds there has been a large advance, as the various reports show. Our people on this Mission in proportion to their number and wealth, are the most liberal I have met with. If the Missionary board will have a little patience they will see that the money expended on this Mission will produce a noble harvest in pounds shillings and pence, not to mention the many souls who will be saved through the instrumentality of their Missionaries.

"This is a very important, but somewhat uncultivated field of labour. In some respects Sandwich and Windsor are old, but methodistically they are new, and judging from the past we should think the class of people with whom we are labouring can only be won gradually. We have now in our ranks one who was once the Roman Catholic priest of this place, and several others from the same church, who feel deeply anxious to rescue their fellow countrymen, who are still groping in the darkness of that monster superstition. May God shake terribly this strong hold of Satan—Amen."

#### ARRAN.

"When the Committee's Missionary entered upon his labours on this Mission at the commencement of the past year, his prospects were not very encouraging. One discouraging circumstance amongst others was the loss of 2 of the 3 classes returned in the report for 1853. One of these classes was lost to the Missionary by the influence of the spirit of Annexation, having been attached to another Mission, and the other by the ever fluctuating effects of the tide of emigration, which have flowed in this direction with great force for the past year, the members as well as most of the hearers having been (to use a phrase in common use in these remote regions) bought out twice by some enterprising German settlers: the worthy Leader of the class and his wife only remaining. Of course only one class of some eight or ten members remained, the foundation as it were, of a spiritual superstructure, subsequently to be erected.

"Since the period noticed it has pleased the Supreme Ruler of all to favour in some degree with his blessing the public instrumentality employed, as is evident from the following results, viz:—Three new classes have been formed, which with the one already in existence, contain between forty and fifty members; four new openings have been made for the introduction of the Word of Life; and nearly eighty dollars have been raised for Missionary and other connexional purposes. ## BRUCE MINES.

The name of this Mission is attractive for its daring love of country, and its promises of wealth; and it appears from the Missionaries' glowing testimony that the "Bruce" men are worthy of their designation. These tidings from one of the latest and most remote of the Missions are welcome indeed; it being undeniable, that while in toilsome explorations the industrious are seeking for "hid treasure", they are mindful of Him "in whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge." Prosperity to the Mines and the Mission!

"To all, who offer up the prayer of the prophet, 'Oh! Lord revive thy work,' it will afford heartfelt pleasure to know, that their petitions are being answered. In this section of the Lord's Vineyard, he has been with us, to bless the efforts put forth, in his name. Some precious souls have believed in the world's atonement, and being adopted into the family of God, on earth, manifest by their deportment, the reality of the change wrought. These are living epistles; may they abide in the Living Vine. Others are leaving the principles of the oracles of Christ, and are going on to know the Lord, more perfectly. The exhortation of St. John "Little children love one another," is, to an extent very encouraging, observed, and practised, by our little society here. This, may we not say, is one of the strongest evidences, of the Bible religion being possessed in the soul. We rejoice, and others will rejoice with us, to learn that a church is organized at the Bruce, though our position is isolated and northerly. Methodism has influence here, which we hope will increase, and be exerted for good on the entire 'community. Our prayer meetings three times a week, are greatly improving in attendance, and are seasons of comfort to believers; our congregations on the Lord's day, morning and evening, have occasionally, been very encouraging. The coldness of the chapel, very materially affected the attendance, during the long cold winter

This difficulty will be obviated prior to next winter; the Company, to whom we are deeply indebted for continued acts of kindness, are going to fit up a more commodious place to worship in, which will be free. There has been admitted during the year, on trial 9, fully admitted 5, from other classes 4, expelled or dropped 4, converted 3, removals 9, total number now in society 15. The Class is very goalens.

"There are both a Sabbath, and a day School here, which we hope, will he a blessing to the youth. There are some peculiarities connected with this Mission: the hours for mining operations, are from six o'clock in the morning to six in the evening; the giging-house requiring a considerable number of hands, who are engaged in putting the ore through a certain process, to fit it for market, continues its operations day and night, Saturday nights excepted, this renders proper pastoral visitation nearly impossible, the people's time being thus employed. We have here Irish, French and Dutch Roman Catholics, amounting to a very considerble number, also a certain number of Episcopalians, and Presbyterian, all thrown together, from the four winds, endeavouring to better their worldly circumstances. As it respects immorality, in the shape of drunkenness, and fighting the Bruce deserves credit, such rarely occurring. The population as reckoned January 1854, numbered 352 persons, 214 males, 74 of whom are boys, 138 females 67 of whom are girls; there is expected an influx to this Mine, and the Mines congtiuous, this summer, of from 100 to 150 hands.

"The Bruce can produce men of big souls—worthy men, whose liberality in sustaining the funds of our church, as well as contributing towards the support of the Missionary, evinces the truthfulness of the above assertion: may they long live to bless our benighted race. In reviewing the year now closed, we feel grief and joy commingled; grief that we have not been more successful in winning souls, joy that we have seen any prosperity, in reference to our beloved, Zion. There is no sufficient ground for discouragement, as it respects this field of moral culture. Since my acquaintance here, we have not as a church, stood fairer for usefulness, than at the present. Glory to God for what we have felt and seen. God bless the Bruce !

## COLLINGWOOD HARBOUR.

"In cultivating this newly formed Mission, we have to endure difficulties, afflictions, and privations incident to early settling in a new country. We have no well furnished parsonage provided; neither could a house, nor even part of a house be obtained for love or money. The Missionary has to take his axe, clear the woods, and knock up a shanty for himself. We have, however, to be thankful, to a gracious and allwise Providence that these trials have a sanctified effect and that our labours are owned of God.

"The country is at present but thinly settled, and appointments are far distant from each other, which cause much travelling over bad roads; yet the Lord has owned his words to the quickening and saving of precious souls; Societies have been formed in different localities, and an encouraging number added to the Church.

"At the Harbour we have a Class formed of steady members; and a good prospect of a Sabbath School. Two town lots are granted for church purposes, and ground can be obtained in other neighbourhoods for places of worship. The Mission is worthy the support and prayerful atention of our friends. It is

"The field is an interesting and important one. Many of our Wesleyan families from other parts are coming here; some setling in that part of Wawanosh adjoining Morris. I cordially, and earnestly recommend it to the sympathy and support of the Missionary Committee and friends of Missions; hoping and believing, it will repay the labour spent on it."

# WARWICK.

"The close of another ecclesiastical year reminds us of the duty of preparing a report of the year's labours. My record will be brief, and of the usual character. My labours during the last twelve months have been very severe, this Mission being altogether too large to be successfully worked by one Minister; and the difficulties which have lain in the way of an efficient prosecution of my labours, having been somewhat seriously increased by personal and domestic affliction. But my toils have not been in vain. A general glance at the spiritual statistics of this Mission show a gratifying increase in the number of members in Society. The number returned last year by my excellent predecessor was 84; the number now is 130: increase, 46; many of these are so scattered as to render it about impossible to get them thoroughly organized into classes. Yet they are earnestly attached to our beloved Church, and are assisting in supporting and extending our cause.

Three new and very interesting classes have been formed during the year. These are doing well; though one of them is so situated that I have not been able to bestow any pastoral labour upon it since its organization.

"The parsonage house, commenced during brother Webster's administration, has advanced nearly to completion. It will be ready for use immediately after the sitting of the Conference, and free from debt.

"The gatherings in behalf of the various benevolent institutions of our Church, show a handsome advance on the receipts of last year."

#### HUDSON'S BAY.

The following Letter from the indefatigable Deputation to the Bay, came to hand within a few hours of the completion of the Report, and though obliged to give it a place different from our choice, its great importance constitutes a claim for insertion at this time. The intelligence and suggestions it contains commend it to the best attention of the Society's friends. We rejoice in the plans, preservation, and success of our esteemed correspondent.

YORK, HUDSON'S BAY, September 12th, 1854.

"Rev. and Dear Sir,—In surveying the widely extended, and still extending trade of the Hudson's Bay Company, we perceive evidence of an industry and energy and perseverance, exceedingly creditable to the members of it, as men of enterprise and business. They have explored the Western wilds and planted numerous establishments over an immense tract of country, a tract of country thousands of miles in extent. They have made the wandering savages of the wilderness extensively tributary to the comforts and enjoyments of civilized Society in almost every part of the civilized world; and in thousands of instances have displayed amazing fortitude and courage in exposing themselves to, cheerfully enduring hardships and dangers. The souls of the Indians are of infinitely more value than their furs, and to raise the multitudes of this people in the scale of moral and intellectual existence, to surround them with the comforts of civilized life, to rescue them from the gloom of superstition, to mould their hearts to christian purity and kindness and to cheer their dying hours with a well grounded hope of eternal glory and blessedness; constitutes an amount of good one would suppose sufficient to call-forth very strenuous and untiring exertions for their relief. Should not Christian benevolence emulate the activity and perseverance which have so long been displayed in commercial enterprises and the pursuits of worldly gain? We hope the day is not distant when no country will be unexplored by the Heralds of Salvation, and the wandering tribes and benighted sons of our own almost interminable forests will not be overlooked.

"I have no fellowship with the opinion, and I am glad to know you have none, that is strongly entertained by some, that the Indian race is doomed to destruction. In proportion to the efforts which have been made, no missions to the heathen have been crowned with greater success, than those to the Aborigines of America. The Indian tribes of America have peculiar and strong claims on the millions of American Christians who live in freedom and have grown rich upon their soil; and to me it seems that no part of the extensive field to be

The Protestant mission in the country are few and far between, notwithstanding nineteen-twentieths of the natives are willing, thousands of them are anxious, to have missionaries sent to them, that they may be brought to the Christian religion. There are in this vast territory but reighteen protestant Ministers. Thirteen of these belong to the Episcopal Church, four are Wesleyan and one Presbyterian. Six of the Episcopal Clergy are confined to the Red River Settlement.

"The following places are inviting fields for Missionary labour, and by some Society these important posts should at once be occupied; Michipicoton, Fort William, Lach Lache, Grand Lac, Rupert's House, Albany, Knoemusico, Churchill, Trout Lake House, Nelson River House, Berins River, Swan River, Rocky\* Mountain House, Fort Chipewayan, Fort Alexander, Rat Portage and Edmonton, where there should be sent, at least two, or three Missionaries. The Wesleyan Missionary Society has a native teacher labouring in the neighborhood of Edmonton near the Rocky Mountains, with gratifying success; but one individual although, ever so well qualified for the Missionary work, could do comparatively little in a population of many thousands, the most of whom are anxious to receive religious instruction.

"Day and Sabbath Schools are indispensable adjuncts to the Missions among the Indians; well qualified teachers are therefore almost as necessary in carrying on missionary work as the Missionaries themselves. The schools are in the English language, but the teacher must understand the Indian also, and hence the great necessity of the Society more earnestly directing its attention to the educating and training suitable persons to be employed as teachers in the schools. I believe that a school on some such plan as the Industrial Schools at Muncey Town and Alderville should and might be successfully established in some central place in the territory. A school for the instruction of children both, male and female, in the arts of life and the rudiments of science, as well as in the principles of the Christian Religion, forms the basis of the most efficient Missionary exertions among the Indians; and if such a school was established at a convenient place in the country, it would be as the day spring from on high to a region now in a great degree, overspread by an intellectual and moral midnight. As the Hudson's Bay Company from motives of interest, as well as from more noble considerations, would doubtless contribute something to the support of such an institution, should it meet their approbation, the expense of it would be less to the Missionary Society than is commonly incurred in similar establishments. The children and youth mentioned above might be instructed in the arts of civilized life, in science, and in Christianity; and when so instructed they would be equally useful as the instruments of spreading civilization, and the religion of the Gospel, among the Indian tribes; such persons being familiarly acquainted with the manners and customs and feelings of their own people, and being able to speak the language correctly and fluently, as well as having Indian blood circulating in their veins, would have ready access to the natives, and would doutbless exert a most powerful influence over them.

"The aborigines of America are capable of being exalted in the scale of existence, and of arriving even at eminence in the arts and sciences. The eloquence and native oratory of some of these, is proverbial in civilized countries, and has caused them to be emolled among the sons of genius. Many of them afford abundant proof that they possess acute and comprehensive minds; and as a people their capacities are not inferior to the whites; and is there a people to be found on the earth, who are not raised above them by superior

cultivation and mental improvement, who possess greater elevation of feeling, and who appear more majestic in mind? Their virtues and their vices too are not those of an ignoble and mean mind. Let their condition be improved by the arts of civilized life, their minds enlightened and enlarged by science, and their hearts softened and renewed by the elevating influences of the glorious Gospel of Jesus Christ, and they will assume if not a high, at least, a respectable rank among the nations. Could we hear some of their cleverest men unfold to their countrymen the wonderful scheme of man's redemption through the sacrifice of the Redeemer, with a brilliancy and power which have distinguished some of their speeches delivered in behalf of their tribes, and that brilliancy and power rendered more effective by the tendering influences of religion, who would not listen to them with admiration, pleasure and profit? Could a number of the natives of Rupert's Land be brought to concert plans for the extension of the Gospel in the north western wilds with the skill, and to execute them with the fortitude and perseverance, which they display in hunting and warring with each other, the happiest result might be expected.

"I have now performed a duty which I have had much at heart for several years. I have passed through the territory, visited the most important points in it, made myself acquainted with many localities and with the character and circumstances of many of the Indian tribes: and the result of all is, on my own mind, a stronger impression than before, of the greatness and importance of the work which lies before the Church in this land.

"Whether the suggestions and observations here made deserve consideration or not I cheerfully submit to the judgement and piety of those friends of humanity for whom they were intended. Such are now my own views of the importance of the subject here referred to, that I should have felt myself guilty of most blameable neglect if I had failed to improve this opportunity to hold it up to the attraction of the numerous and devoted friends of the Missionary work.

# CONCLUSION.

Such are the religious, educational, and ecclesiastical details of the Society for the past year,—details agreeing in character with those of the most favoured modern Missionary Societies; with those contained in Mr. Wesley's invaluable Journal of the rise and spread of Methodism; and with the attractive and inspiring records of the Primitive Church of Christ, handed down by a wise Providence for the guidance and encouragement of all Christians who wish for the best system, and an invigorated spirit, in accomplishing the purpose of Him who has placed on their lips the sublime prayer, "Thy Kingdom come!"

The future now demands attention. What are its claims? Last year the Society sustained 77 Missions, 15 Day Schools, and 122 Missionaries of every degree. This year, a reference to the Mission Stations will show that the

Last year the aries of every

number of Missions, Schools, and Missionaries is considerably augmented. Old responsibilities remain without reduction. New responsibilities appear, and should be felt, and practically acknowledged. The augmentation arises from an extension of the work in Western Canada, and by the addition of many important Stations elsewhere. The Parent Society has with a praiseworthy cordiality transferred all its Missions in Eastern Canada to the Canada Conference, for future management and support,-thus greatly increasing its solicitude, and necessities financially. The transfer has been freely sanctioned as providential, and under the full conviction, that the Society's friends in Canada will gladly and generously accept the responsibility, in humble dependence upon Almighty God. This act of Methodistic amalgamation the Committee hail with joy; betokening, and securing, as it does, peaceful co-operation, and more certain spiritual advancement and perpetuity to the cause of God; and they have much pleasure in now placing on lasting record in he Society's Annual Report, as becomes them, sentiments officially expressed in the last Address of the Canadian to the British Conference relating to so laudable and connexional a movement. "This Wesleyan alliance is of God. While the unanimity of sentiment, and brotherly kindness which have distinguished the entire negotiations and intercourse of the Eastern Brethren, both ministerial and lay, necessary to such a consummation have been much admired by us, and have strengthened the holy bonds which make us one brotherhood, we give prominence to our conviction, that the happy and important consummation in which we exult is mainly to be attributed to our beloved President and Superintendent of Missions, the Rev. Enoch Wood, deputed by you for the purpose, in his exhibition of sound Wesleyan principles, matured judgment, impartiality, suavity of manner, and indefatigable devotedness to the object; and his reward, and our rejoicing now is, the existence of one harmonious Wesleyan family throughout United, Canada, whose sphere of activity is unspeakably important for its amplitude, and exhilarating in its prospects."

The responsibilities of the society are still further increased by another transfer made by the Parent Society. Its Missions in the Hudson's Bay Territory, established and maintained at no small expense for years, are now in the possession, and under the superintendence of the Canadian Auxiliary Society, whose facilities for that field of labour, and its contiguity to Canada have been deemed sufficient reasons for the change effected. At the request of the Conference and the Missionary Board, the Rev. John Ryerson, Co-Delegate, undertook the duties of a Deputation to that territory; and while the welcome communications since received from him are unusually cheering, his renunciation of the pleasures of home and of country for some months, and

his judicious and ardent dedication to the object of his perilous and protracted tour, bespeak the lofty, apostolical principles of his heart, and the wisdom of those who appointed him to duties so arduous, so Wesleyan, and honourable. The worthy Ministers, the Rev. Messrs. Thomas Hurlburt, Brooking, and Salt, with their devoted wives and children, whom the Co-Delegate has conducted to that distant part of the American continent, are followed by the regards and confidence, hopes and prayers of the Society, whose esteemed Agents they are; and they will not rest till every fort of the Honourable Hudson's Bay Company has a Protestant Christianity; and the Society will rejoice when the native's house of prayer is a common object on the banks of the Sacatchawin, the Unjiga, and Mackenzie rivers, and the domain of the buffalo has been transformed into a scene of agricultural fruitfulness, and domestic repose: the owners christianized Indians. The Bible shall be supreme throughout that unique region of moral wretchedness, and the voice of the Wesleyan Evangelist echo in the fastnesses of the Rocky Mountains, and the hymns of Charles Wesley rise and swell amidst the solitudes which have reigned on the long undisturbed coast of the Arctic Sea.

The realization of hope meets a leading principle of man's nature, and the liveliest feelings of a regenerated soul. The Missionary realization, however, as yet is but partial. Much might be said of the abundant gifts and wellwishes of the subscribers; but the present enterprises of the Society exceed in expense the present income of the Society. Ten thousand pounds should be the aim of their benevolence this year. Forget the past. Concentrate attention upon the future. In the holy exhilaration of past success, the full requirements of a present position may be overlooked. This now is the paramount question-not, how much has been done? but, how much remains to be done? The work accomplished must be vigilantly secured, other churches, school-houses, and parsonages built; implements of husbandry purchased, new schools opened, industrial institutions now asked allowed, additional Missionaries sent at once to Hudson's Bay, a Native College must be kept in mind, Missionaries for the Canadian Indian and Domestic Missions increased, and the Indian and White, Papal and destitute Protestant population of Eastern Canada supplied with gifted Agents. What is the intention of the Great Head of the Church in opening so many new doors of usefulness to the flourishing Wesleyan Missionary Society of Canada? Other Indians and destitute settlers are now soliciting Missionaries. Does God require services of a people incapable of rendering them? Never! His command creates the duty, and implies the capability of those to whom he speaks. The Parent Weslevan Missionary Society, in its Report for 1853, assumes an impregnable position when it says, "He who sends the heathen to us to ask for instruction

If the mind revolts from this conclusion, it is driven upon another, namely the Methodist Connexion is now competent to do all that in the course of Divine Providence it is now called to do. . . . All things are ready, if we are ready. The arm of Jehovah has awoke and put on strength; and now His voice is heard demanding the vigorous co-operation of his people."

The standard of benevolence in Scripture is high; the standard in christendom low. Shall the true standard be recognized, and its loftiness attempted? Is not the giving of some the mere indication of penuriousness? Is not wealth a talent? Does HE give much that man may give little? Should not generosity be proportioned to means? Is the unneeded overplus of the mechanic, the farmer, or the professional man a noble gift? What, then, constitutes the offering of a self-sacrificing, liberal contributor to Missions? Should there not be proportion between ability and acts? Should unnecessary purchases preclude the possibility of liberality? How ceaselessly are the mercies of God's hand bestowed upon all; how unexpected and prolific the sources of profit opened to the busy inhabitants of Canada; how precarious the wealth now being obtained, should evangelical interests, and enterprises be forgotten, or grudgingly upheld! The commercial and financial prosperity of Canada should, with prayer and effort, be made a fundamental, and unalterable preliminary to great and unexampled religious prosperity. Matters of duty and of personal obligation to Christ must be made to precede others. British North America cannot dispense with the inestimable services of the Wesleyan Missionary Society. But its income is insufficient for the entire discharge of all the present obligations investing its vocation. Give, old and young, rich and poor; give to glorify God, and He shall withdraw the covering from his glory, and all people behold it.

How cogent other reasons for greater efforts and generosity deducible from several considerations!—the imperativeness of the Divine authority—the nature of the religion professed—the advantages already conferred by Christian Missions—the honour put upon the Wesleyan Society—the vows made—the evils of retrogression—the vivid and prophetic aspect of national events—the immense number of human beings yet unsaved—the calls made on the Society—the final account to be rendered—the gaze of the country, the Churches, and of the Fathers in Britain, who watch not for the halting of the Society, but for its faithfulness, success and perseverance. These are moment ous considerations. May they arrest and absorb the thoughts and affections of ministers, members, and congregations; of parents, children and domestics; of officers, c. llectors, contributors, and all non-contributors!

To action, then—action immediate, commanding! The speed of the age rebukes indolence. The Methodism of Wesley in Canada has one creed, one system, one heart. Never had the Society so wide a field of operation. The prospect vivifies. Consecrate all to Christ. Study the commands and promises of Christ. Carry more frequently to the Throne an ignorant and sinful world redeemed by Christ. The nations are wonderously waking up to the excellence and claims of Christianity. The Holy Spirit postpones his best effusions till the Churches are prepared with more urgent intercessions, and a nobler energy and generosity. Act for the fulfillment of inspired millenial predictions. Christ will triumph. His own emphatic declaration is—and let the Churches hear it,—"From the rising of the sun even unto the going down of the same, my name shall be great among the gentiles; and in every place incerse shall be offered unto my name, and a pure offering: for my name shall be great among the heathen, saith the Lord of Hosts."
