



Decrease of the Chinese Element

The last steamer from China brought only 69 Chinese. For some time past the depart ure of these people from this port have beer more than the arrivals. The number residen in this city is estimated to be less by 2,000 than it was a year sgo, and the number in the whele State is probably not over 37,000 where as a year or two ago, it was from 40,000 t 50,000. There has been an excess of arrival over departures for 1870, thus far, of about 7,000; but this excess has not been concentra ted in San Francisco, while death and immi gration to other States and Territories have reduced the total number in California con siderable. It is probable that there will be no material increase in our Chinese population hereafter. The grand straction of the surface hereafter.
