

DISTRESS IN ENGLAND

Appalling Destitution in the English Collieries.

25,000 MINERS RETURN TO WORK.

An Anarchist Paper in London Suppressed.

Severe Storms in Italy and France—Flood and Drought in Egypt—Spanish Troops Attacked and Defeated by Moroccan Forces in the Mountains.

Anti-Farrellite Convention in Dublin—More Dynamite in Spain—Work for England's Unemployed—Evictions in Scotland.

London, Oct. 2.—Among the many manufacturing towns that have lately felt the shortage of coal caused by the great strike of the miners are Sheffield, Leeds, Bradford, Nottingham and Derby. Notwithstanding the failure thus far of efforts to bring about a general settlement of the dispute, the mayors of these towns decided that something should be done to help the interests of the businesses that are threatened with heavy losses to bring the fight to an end. A meeting of the mayors was held to-day, and it was decided that they should invite delegates of local mine owners and the Miners' Federation to meet them on Monday next and attempt to reach some settlement of the trouble so that the strikers may return to work.

The mayors had in view, too, the terrible suffering that is now everywhere accompanying the strike. The men have been out of work for over two months and hundreds of those who have families have sold or pawned everything of value they possessed in order to obtain food for their wives and children. It is a common occurrence for the children of provincial parents to report deaths of miners, little children who have died from actual starvation. Relief committees have been appointed to alleviate as far as possible the prevailing distress. Part of the work of these committees is the feeding of children. Thousands of women apply daily for the only food it is possible for them to obtain. With this condition of things, the mayors think they may be able to bring some understanding between the masters and men, and to prevent the further loss of work that will furnish mills, factories, etc., and the planting of the seeds of social and political unrest. They should the coal famine continue and the industry of the several towns be forced to suspend their operations. The mayors and artisans and their families would be greatly benefited by a solution of the problem which would bring about a return to the normal state of affairs, so that the price of coal will reach its nominal level. It is believed by some persons that the return of the strikers to their districts and in Yorkshire will tend to induce the men still out to reconsider their determination not to resume work until their full demands are granted.

THE STRIKE IS OVER.

25,000 English coal miners have returned to work. It is estimated that 25,000 coal miners, who have been on strike, returned to work to-day.

London, Oct. 2.—The English Government has at last determined to deal with the more or less vital question of the unemployed. Sir John Lubbock has proposed himself in favor of a plan for dealing with the question in the rural districts, which has received the approval of the Home Secretary. The proposal is to empower the local authorities to buy or lease the waste or unoccupied land in the district, and at the same time an effective check would be put upon the migration of the unemployed from rural labor to the town, an evil which is the despair of many economists.

EVICTIONS IN SCOTLAND.

Crafters have learned a lesson from the Irish.

London, Oct. 2.—It is being proved at last that the rebellious spirit manifested in the evictions of the poor of the land laws in Ireland is not due to the peculiarities of the Irish people. The poor of Scotland have been evicted with desperation to the adoption of the same methods. The trouble is not due to the usual evictions to make room for the extension of deer forests, but to the harsher and more systematic evictions which are being carried out in the highlands and islands of Scotland in the south and west of Ireland.

THE ANARCHISTS OF LONDON.

Police Allow Them Full License in Public Speeches.
