Apogee is that point in a planet's orbit in which it is farthest from the earth.

Perigee is that in which it is nearest to it.

Lunation the time from new moon to new moon again.

Penumbra, a partial shadow, resulting from the diminished light of the sun to the earth or moon, during a solar or lunar eclipse, appearing as partial.

Aphelion—That part of the planet's orbit farthest from the Sun.

Ecliptic is the plane of the earth's orbit extended to the starry sphere.

Perihelion is that part of the planet's orbit nearest the Sun.

Declination is the distance of a heavenly body from the Equinoctial line.

Elongation—Angular distance of a planet from the Sun, as seen from the earth.

ECLIPSES.

In the year 1866 there will be three Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I. Friday, March 16. A partial Eclipse of the Sun, *invisible* at Halifax; but seen in North-Eastern Asia, and in the Arctic and North Pacific Oceans. Begins 8h. 49m. Afternoon, (mean time at Greenwich) in Long. $141^{\circ} 34'$ E. of Greenwich, and Lat. $49^{\circ} 51'$ N. Ends 10h. 52m. Afternoon, in Long. $90^{\circ} 6'$ W. of Greenwich, and Lat. $85^{\circ} 21'$ N.

II. Friday, March 30. A total Eclipse of the Moon, *visible* at Halifax, and generally throughout North America.

First contact with the Penumbra, 9h. 14m., Afternoon, (mean time).

First contact with the Shadow, 10h. 24m., Afternoon.

Middle of the Eclipse, 12h. 19m., Afternoon.

Last contact with the Shadow, 2h. 14m., Morn.

Last contact with the Penumbra, 3h. 24m., Morn.

Magnitude of the Eclipse (Moon's diameter = 1) 1.520.

III. Saturday, April 6. A partial Eclipse of the Sun, *invisible* at Halifax; but seen in Australia and the Southern Ocean. Begin 5h. 11m. morn. (meantime at Greenwich) in Long. $33^{\circ} 30'$ E. of Greenwich, and Lat. $64^{\circ} 55'$ S. Ends 8h. 31m. morn. in Long. $135^{\circ} 25'$ E. of Greenwich, and Lat. $34^{\circ} 15'$ S.

IV. Monday, Sept. 24. A total Eclipse of the Moon, *invisible* at Halifax; but seen in Eastern Asia and the Pacific Ocean. First contact with the Penumbra, (mean time at Greenwich) 11h. 22m. morn. Last contact with the Penumbra, 4h. 37m. Afternoon.

V. Monday, Oct. 8. A partial Eclipse of the Sun, partly visible at Halifax. Begins 10h. 37m. morn. (mean time at Greenwich) in Long. $120^{\circ} 59'$ W. of Greenwich, and Lat. $68^{\circ} 15'$ N. Ends 2h. 24m. Afternoon, in Long. $16^{\circ} 25'$ W. of Greenwich, and Lat. $34^{\circ} 38'$ N.

MORNING AND EVENING STARS.

MERCURY will be Morning Star to Feby. 23; thence Evening Star to April 14; thence Morning Star to June 16; thence Evening Star to August 21; thence Morning Star to Oct. 6; thence Evening Star to Dec. 7; thence Morning Star to the end of the year.

VENUS will be Morning Star to Feby. 9; thence Evening Star to Dec. 11; thence Morning Star to the end of the year.

MARS will be Morning Star throughout the year.

JUPITER will be Morning Star to July 8; thence Evening Star to the end of the year.

SATURN will be Morning Star to April 15; thence Evening Star to Nov. 4; thence Morning Star to the end of the year.

WEATHER TABLE,

For foretelling the weather through all the lunations of each year.

By DR. HERSCHELL, IMPROVED BY DR. A. CLARKE.

This table is the result of many years' actual observation; and though not absolutely reliable in all cases, yet will be found tolerably correct, being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, showing what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of the quarters.

The nearer the moon's change to noon or midnight, the more nearly will the result be in accordance with this table.

Less dependence is to be placed on this table in winter than in summer.

The chopping or grinding of grain to be fed to stock operates as a saving of at least twenty-five per cent.

Young stock should be moderately fed with grain in winter, and receive generous supplies of long provender, it being essential to keep them in fair condition, in order that the formation of muscle, bones, etc., may be encouraged and continuously carried on.

Milch cows in winter should be kept in dry, moderately warm, but well-ventilated quarters; fed and watered three times a day; salted twice or thrice a week; have clean beds; be curried daily; and in addition to their long provender should receive succulent food morning and evening.

Full complements of tools and implements of husbandry are intimately connected with the success of the husbandman.

We firmly disbelieve in farmers that will not improve, in farms that grow poorer every year, in starved cattle, in farmers' boys turning into clerks and merchants, in farmers' daughters unwilling to work, and in all farmers who are ashamed of their honorable vocation.

A FEW MAXIMS FOR FARMERS.—I. The farmer who does not return to his fields a dressing more than equivalent to the crops gathered therefrom, is as unwise and thoughtless as he who would neglect to feed the horse that was to carry him on a journey.

II. The husbandman who obtains from a field not properly manured, a small yield of grain, when by sufficient manuring he might have obtained a large one, is selling his labour at half its value.

Farmers will find the following profitable for house or fence paint: Skim milk, 2 quarts; fresh slaked lime 8 ounces; linseed oil, 6 ounces; white Burgundy pitch, 2 ounces; Spanish white, 3 pounds. The lime to be slaked in water, exposed to the air, and then mixed with one-fourth of the milk; the oil in which the pitch is dissolved to be added, a little at a time, then the rest of the milk, and afterwards the Spanish white. This is sufficient for twenty seven yards, two coats. This is for a white paint. If desirable, any color may be produced; thus, if a green color is desired, in place of part of Spanish white, use the ochre,

TURKEYS.—As the best plan to raise turkeys, procure black turkeys, and teach them to be gentle before they commence laying. As soon as they begin to lay, take away their eggs; let their nest-egg be a hen's egg. When they have laid out their litter destroy the nest, feed them well, and in ten days or less they will generally commence laying again. Turn those they have laid once or twice a week. When they have laid the second lot, and want to set, let them have what eggs they can well cover, and put the balance of the first litter under a hen at the same time, or as near as may be, so that they will hatch nearly together. Take the young chicks from the hen and put them all with the old turkey, she will brood them all.

Save your suds for the garden and plants, or to harden yards when sandy.

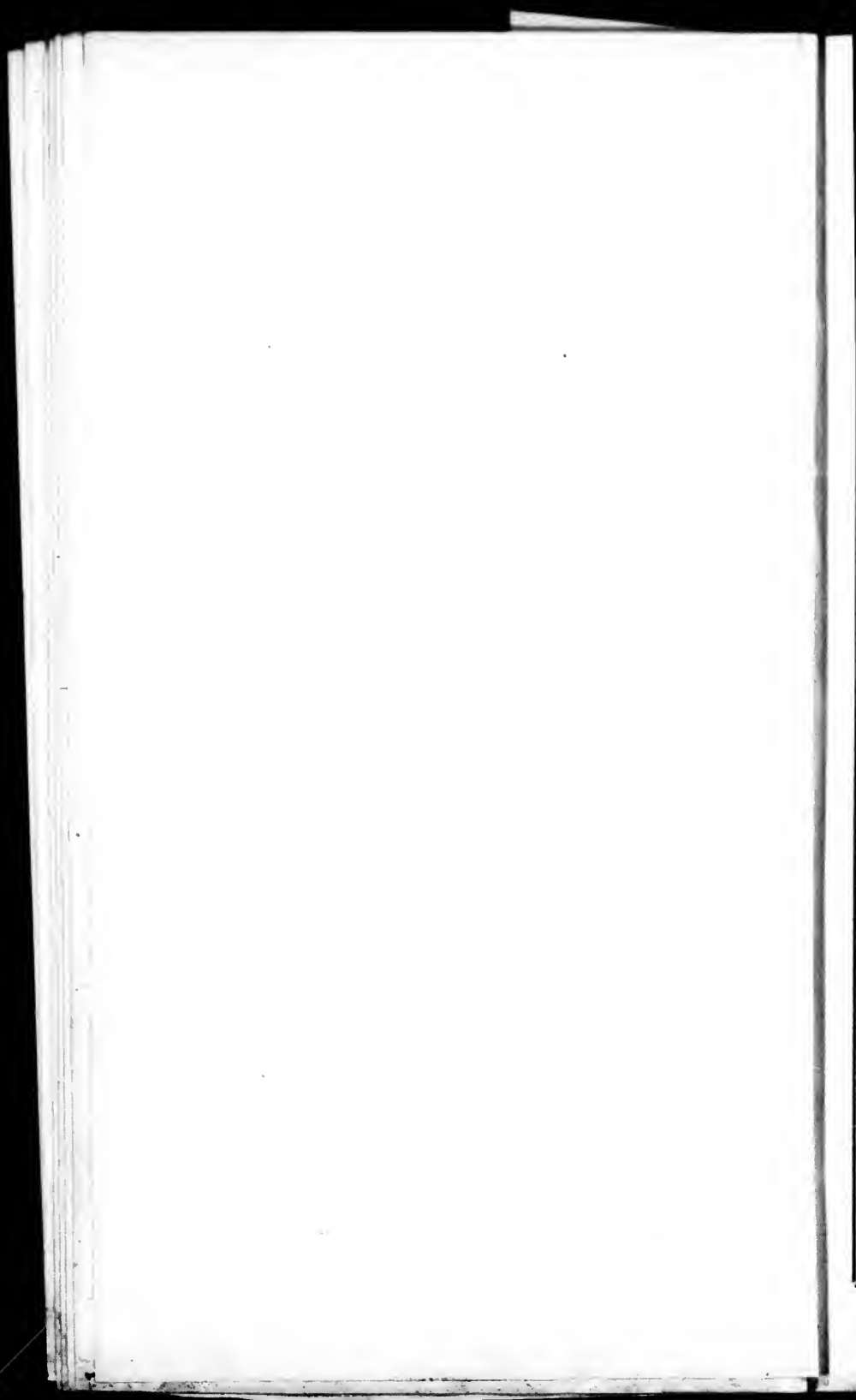

HORSES.—Do not over-drive in hot weather. Never allow a horse to drink when warm, unless he is to be kept moving as usual. Where they are stabled during hot weather, clean the stables often, litter well, and allow each animal to have a breathing hole in the window or wall before him, if possible. Some horses gall very easily beneath the collar and harness, during hot weather, where the parts do not fit well. Wash the wounds with clean water, and apply a paste made of white lead and linseed oil. Then provide a collar or harness that will not chafe.

POULTRY.—Drive turkeys, ducks and chickens to the meadows and wheat stubbles, that they may eat grasshoppers and caterpillars. A mixture of lopped milk and Indian meal is excellent to poultry grow and hens lay.

HARROWS.—Clean the points of the teeth, and if they must be left out of doors, let them stand on strips of boards, as rust often corrodes them nearly as much as usage wears them out.

APPLES, quartered and cored, sprinkled with sugar, and cooked in a close dish, in the oven, require less sweetening, and are preferable to those stewed in the ordinary way.

HORN PITHS.—Collect them at tanneries, and plow them in whole, where there is no mill to crush them. They are valuable fertilizers for any purpose.

SEPTEMBER 30 Days.

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CHARCOAL FOR HOGS.—Hogs, when put to fatten, should be supplied with plenty of fresh earth. Their nature is to wallow. Pounded charcoal, if fed twice or three times a week, will be eaten freely. It corrects the stomach, and combines with the digestible properties of the food, and is deposited with it. Thus it adds to the weight and greatly to the solidity and flavour of the meat.

WAGGONS.—Keep all wheel vehicles in the shade during hot weather. If a tire is very loose, reset it. If loose but little, the fellos of nice wheels may be saturated with linseed oil, and wheels of ox carts and lumber waggons soaked in coal tar.

ORCHARDS. When the ground is not covered with a smooth turf, remove all brush and sticks, level with hoes, harrow thoroughly, put all the stones in close heaps, where apples will not fall on them and be bruised.

A VERY handsome climbing plant for the inside of a window may be grown from the English Ivy. Set a slip of the ivy in a pot of rich loam, and it will form a most delicate drapery of beautifully veined leaves all over the window-sash and casement.

A MINIATURE wheat field may be raised in doors by placing a flock of cotton batting upon a large tumbler or wide-mouthed jar filled with water, and scattering grains of wheat upon the batting. In a week the grains will germinate and shoot up their green spikes, making a beautiful crown of delicate foliage over the tiny field.

CURING MEAT.—One gallon water, 1½ lbs. salt, 6 oz. sugar, ½ oz. saltpetre, ½ oz. soda or potash. Boil well and skim. When cold pour over your beef or pork. Meat should stand for two days after killing before being cured—and when put away should be well covered with pickle.

PREPARATION FOR PRESERVING LEATHER.—Durability is ensured to harness and shoes by the following :—Twenty one parts of tallow, to which add three parts of rosin, and when melted mix well ; in another vessel seven parts of good soap dissolved in seventy parts rain water. When dissolved and heated to the boiling point, add to the other, and boil the whole gently, when it is ready for use.

SHEEP SKINS FOR MATS. Steep the skins in water, wash till they are soft and clean, scrape well the flesh side, lay in fermented bran for a few days, wash again, rub the flesh side repeatedly with a solution of salt and alum until well bleached, after which make a paste of salt, alum, wheat flour, and yolks of eggs, which spread on flesh side, stretch, dry, and rub with pumice stone.

A yellow carrot, scraped or grated, and applied as a poultice, will cure erysipelas, and will also cure croup. As the poultice becomes dry it should be changed.

By stabling and shedding stock through the winter a saving of one fourth the food may be effected; that is, one fourth less food will answer than when such stock may be exposed to the inclemencies of the weather.

HORSES.—Corn meal, and about ten pounds of hay daily, with moderate exercise and proper grooming, will keep horses in good condition. Their stables should be light, clean, and moderately warm. Blanket a horse when he is standing out of the stable, or when he first comes in, and at night; too much blanketing is injurious.

TO PREVENT HORSES PULLING THE HALTER.—Tie a rope around the neck, put it through a hole in the edge of the manger, and tie it around the fore leg below the knee, and when the horse pulls, the rope will slip through the hole and pull up the fore leg, and he will give it up.

Wood ashes and common salt wet with water, will stop the cracks of the stove, and prevent the smoke from escaping.

LIGHT HOUSES.

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BATTERY POINT—Entrance to Lunenburg Harbor.—A fixed white light

IRON-BOUND ISLAND LIGHT.—Off the entrance of Lallave River. A bright flash light, of ten seconds duration, followed by an eclipse of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square wooden tower, painted white on the southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation seventy-five feet above sea level.

PORT MEDWAY.—A fixed, white light, on Admiralty Head, W. side of the entrance of the port. Building square, painted white with black square in the centre of seaward sides, forty feet above sea level, and stands within thirty fathoms of the shore.

LIVERPOOL.—South end of Coffin's Island. A plain, revolving light.

FORT POINT Harbor Light, at the head of Liverpool harbor, southern entrance of the river. A bright, fixed light, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbor.

RAGGED ISLAND Harbor Light—On Gull Rock, off the entrance of the harbor. Building square, and painted white, exhibiting a clear, white light, at an elevation of fifty-one feet above the sea level, and is situated in lat. 43° 39' N. and long. 64° 66' W.

SHELBURNE—McNutt's Island. Two fixed lights, one above the other.

BARRINGTON—Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. A flash light of fifteen seconds.

CAPE SABLE ISLAND—On Cape Sable in the county of Shelburne. A red, fixed light. The building is an octagon, and is painted white.

SEAL ISLAND—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the south point of Seal Island. A plain white light, elevated about eighty feet above high water mark, and may be seen on approaching the Island from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, about three and one-third miles S. by W. by compass from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers: the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

PUBNICO HARBOR LIGHT.—A Beacon Light on the S. E. side of the entrance to Pubnico Harbor, situate on the E. side of the entrance of the Bay of Fundy, about thirteen miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted white. A fixed white light, twenty-eight feet above high water level, (rise and fall 12 feet,) and stands fifteen fathoms from low water mark. The point of beach is bold.

YARMOUTH.—West side of the harbor. A plain revolving light.

A Fog Bell has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth harbor, a few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and a quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes seven times per minute. But not in operation at night.

BRIAR ISLAND.—A plain white light, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT—Peter's Island, at the South entrance of the Grand Passage. Two white lights, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Briar Island Light, at an elevation of forty feet above high water mark.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On the W. side of Digby Gut, from Briar Island north-eastward. A fixed white light.

LARD, CHEESE, BUTTER.

BOARS HEAD, Petite Passage—Exhibits *red and white flashes* at intervals of 60 seconds.

PORT WILLIAMS, (late Marshall's Cove)—*Two vertical white lights*, visible from all points of approach. Building square, painted *white*. Port Williams is distant from Digby Light House East 25 miles, and from Black Rock Light House West 17 miles.

MARGARETVILLE RED LIGHT—Building square and painted *white and black horizontal bands*. The Light is visible from all points of approach. Margaretville is distant East thirty-seven miles from Digby Light House, and West 15 miles from Black Rock Light House.

The lights in the above Beacon Lights distinguish them from other lights in their vicinity.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—On the southern shore of the Bay of Fundy. *A fixed white light*.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto, or Cumberland Bay. *Two fixed lights*, placed horizontally.

PATRIDGE ISLAND RIVER—An octagonal light beacon, on the W. side of the entrance to Patridge Island River, Parrsborough, on the N. side of the Basin of Minas, and exhibits a *plain white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high water; rise and fall about forty-five feet. The tower is *white*, and stands close to high water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbor at high water, and must lie aground on the soft bottom when the tide is low.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—In the Basin of Minas, ninety-five feet above sea level, high water; rise and fall forty or forty-five feet. Building square, painted *white*, stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen in clear weather over the greatest part of the Basin of Minas, (after passing Cape Blomedon,) and above the Five Islands, and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

BURNCOAT HEAD LIGHT, Basin of Minas—The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building, and shows a *plain white light*, about 75 feet above high water level, and visible from all points of approach. Tower and building painted *white*. Bearings and distances: Cape Blomedon N. 70°, W. 26° 5', 10 miles. Brick Kiln Ledges N. 52°, W. 7° 5', 10 miles. Economy Point N. 36°, W. 3° 9', 10 miles.

DEVIL'S ISLAND—An octagonal building on the S. W. point of Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax harbor, and exhibits a *red light*, on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach light; stands forty-five feet above high water mark; rise and fall six feet. The tower painted *dark brown*, with a *white belt* between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in the day time.

EASTERN BEAVER, OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND—*A white revolving light*.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, stands seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal iron lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high water; rise and fall six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes* of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND—*Two fixed lights*, one above the other.

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LIGHT HOUSES.

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GUYSHORO' HARBOR BEACON LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to the harbor, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed light.*

ARICHAU BEACON—A light on Point Morichu, on the south-east side of the southern entrance to the harbor. Building square, painted *white*. *A white light*, thirty-four feet above the sea level.

EDDY, or SAND POINT LIGHT—On Eddy, or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canso, distinguished by *two white lights* placed horizontally, twenty-five feet above sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a *black diamond* on the seaward side.

WEST SIDE OF NORTH ENTRANCE TO THE GUT OF CANSO—*A fixed white light.*

CAPE ST. GEORGE LIGHT, Antigonishe County—Building square, and painted *white*. *A revolving white light* at intervals of 30 seconds.

PICTOU HARBOR LIGHT—On the south-east side of the entrance to the harbor. *Two fixed lights*, vertical—upper one *white*, lower one *red*.

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the south-east point of the Island. Building square, and painted *white*. *A white fixed light*, fifty two feet above high water mark.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—Changed from *white* to *red*, when seen from the northern entrance, to distinguish it from Margaree and North Canso Lights.

SEA WOLF, or MARGAREE ISLAND LIGHT—Situate on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Port Hood and Cheticamp Harbors, and distant from Cape Breton two and a half miles. *A plain white light*. The lantern is placed on a square wooden tower, painted *white*, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 298 feet above sea level—visible from all points of approach. To vessels in proximity to the Island the light may become obscured by the abrupt cliffs or sides of the Island, which may serve as a guide to tack or anchor by, as hundreds of vessels find anchorage on the south-east side. The chief building is near the south-east end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND—*A fixed light* on the north-east end, and a *flash light* on the south-west end. Both *white lights*.

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney, C. B. Harbor. *A fixed white light.*

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, on the eastern coast of Cape Breton, lat. $46^{\circ} 11' 5''$ N., and lon. $50^{\circ} 45' 20''$ W., and exhibits a *bright flash light*, every fifteen seconds, visible from all points of the compass. The light is sixty-five feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of twelve miles.

SCATARIE ISLAND—*A white revolving light* at the east end of the Island.

LOUISBURG—On the east side of the entrance to the harbor. *A fixed light.*

GANNET ROCK LIGHT—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands of Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. *A white flash light*, twenty seconds dark, and forty seconds light, in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, *black and white*. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them *almost* above water, and extend eastward from the Light House about four miles. From this range further *southeardly*, about six miles

from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull—this may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHT—Two *fixed white lights*, upon the Machias Seal Islands, forty-five feet above high water, and bearing from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, British or American. Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be then not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if not more than five miles to the east of the light.

SWALLOW TAIL POINT—Grand Manan Island.—A *fixed white light*, at an elevation of about 150 feet above high water, may be seen from 17 miles. Pyramidal tower painted *white*. Lat $44^{\circ} 45' 52''$ N., long. $66^{\circ} 44' 4''$ West of Greenwich.

HEAD HARBOR LIGHT—Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain white light (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Cumpo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also at all times to enter Head Harbor. A *fixed white light*. Building painted *white*, with a *red cross* on it.

POINT LE PREAU LIGHT—Upon this projecting head-land two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant twenty-eight feet. Both lights are seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful. Both are *fixed and white*. Building painted *white* and *red*, in stripes, five feet broad each, horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT—At the entrance of the river and harbor of St. John, N. B. A *fixed white light*. The building painted *red* and *white*, in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile south of Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. A *fixed white light*. Building painted *white* and *black* in stripes vertically.

QUACO LIGHT—A *revolving white light*, placed on a small rock, off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white* and *red*, in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT—On a point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbor, N. S. Building painted *white*, and about 120 feet above the tide mark. A *plain white light*.

WEST QUODDY LIGHT—This is an American light, placed on the west side of the entrance in the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

A Light House has been erected on **CAPE RACE**, Newfoundland. A *fixed white light* from sunset to sunrise. The light is visible to seaward from N. E. by E. round by the S. E. and S. to W., and is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The tower is striped *red* and *white* vertically. It stands close to the location of the old beacon, which has been cut down. The Lighthouse is in lat. $46^{\circ} 39' 19''$ N., long. $53^{\circ} 2' 28''$ W. Bearings magnetic. Var. 24° W.

LIGHT HOUSES.

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OUTER BIRD ISLAND LIGHT—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or and St. Ann's, on the east coast of Cape Breton Island, lat. $46^{\circ} 25' N.$, long. $60^{\circ} 25' 30'' W.$, exhibits alternate *flashes of red and white* at intervals of 60 seconds. An Octagon building, at an elevation of 85 feet above sea level, and is visible from all points of approach.

ENTRANCE TO GREAT BRAS D'OR AND ST. ANN'S, East Coast Cape Breton. *Flash light, red and white*, at intervals of 60 seconds.

FISH ISLAND—Entrance to Fasket River. *Two clear fixed lights*, horizontally, seaward.

SPENCER'S POINT—North shore of Cobequid Bay, near head of Minas Basin. *Clear fixed light*.

ST. PIERRE AND MIQUELON ISLANDS—Gallantry Point. *Revolving light*, making a revolution every 20 seconds, *one red flash following two white ones*. Lat. $46^{\circ} 45' 30''$, long. $53^{\circ} 57'$. Elevation above level of high tides 198 feet; range of light 18 miles; covered on north side by highlands of St. Pierre. The south-east channel entrance to St. Pierre Bay, indicated by two small lighthouses with *fixed lights*, one a *white light* at Canon Point; the other *red*, at the north end of the toyn.

In the Gulf of St. Lawrence and Strait of Belle Isle.

BELLE ISLE LIGHT—An island at the eastern entrance of the Strait of Belle Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme south-west point of the island. *A single white fixed light*. Building circular stone tower, faced externally with fire-brick of a light color. Lat. $N. 51^{\circ} 53'$; long. $W. 25^{\circ} 26'$. Whole horizon lighted, and seen in fair weather $28\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $32\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles.

POINTE AMOUR LIGHT, Labrador Coast, Strait of Belle Isle, at the south-east point of Forteau Bay, lat. $N. 57^{\circ} 27' 30''$; long. $W. 56^{\circ} 53' 40''$. *A single fixed white light*, two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather $18\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $21\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles. Building, a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light color.

ANTICOSTI LIGHT, at the extreme west end of the Island of Anticosti, Lat. $N. 49^{\circ} 52' 30''$; long. $W. 64^{\circ} 35'$. *A single fixed white light*, two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 15 nautical or 18 statute miles. Building, a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light color.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT—East coast of Gaspé, at the extreme point of the Cape. Lat. $N. 48^{\circ} 51'$; long. $W. 64^{\circ} 35'$. *A single fixed white light*, two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather $16\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $19\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles. Building, a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light color.

Signals will be given at or near each of the above four light houses by means of an air or fog whistle, sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a nine pounder gun, fired every hour, in case of the whistle being out of order.

The above balls, &c. are hoisted on the east or west yard arm, according to the *quarter* the vessel first appears in.

When vessels are reported from an outpost, the following signals are shown under the yard arm as repeats.

For a square rigged vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.

A ship or a Barque, a large ball at the end of the yard, with a small one at the inner halliard.

A Brig, a small ball at the end of the yard, with a large one at the inner halliard.

A Brigantine, a cross close up to the outer halliard.

Two or more Brigantines, a cross half hoisted.

An upper yard having been added to the Ship Staff, it will be used exclusively to designate Steam Vessels, thus:

One ball East or West indicates a Steam Vessel repeated in that quarter.

A small ball out and a large one in, a Branch Packet or a Merchant Vessel.

A large ball out and a small one in, a Man-of-War Steamer, or Royal Mail Steamer.

Numbers will be indicated as directed from the lower yard.

The lower yard is now used for sailing vessels only.

When the description of vessel in sight is ascertained from the Citadel, the following descriptive colors will be hoisted at the mast head:

A Union Jack, Flag Ship.

Do. with a red Pendant over it, a two decker.

Do. with a blue Pendant over it, a Frigate.

Do. with a blue and white Pendant over it, a Ship or Barque rigged Sloop-of-War.

Do. with a white Pendant over it, a Brig-rigged Sloop-of-War.

Do. with a red and white Pendant over it, a Schooner or Cutter-of-War.

A white Pendant, with two blue crosses, a Transport or a vessel with troops on board—if a Man-of-War, the Union under.

A white Pendant with a blue ball, a steamer—if a Man-of-War, the Union under.

A blue and red flag crossed white, do. from Boston.

A white and blue Pendant, do. from Newfoundland.

PARCEL POST.

Parcels closed at the ends and sides may be posted at any Post Office in Nova Scotia, at a rate of postage subject to the following conditions ;

1. No letter or letters shall be enclosed.
2. The parcel shall not contain any explosive substance, glass, liquids, or other matter likely to injure the ordinary contents of the mail, under penalty of the forfeiture of the parcel.
3. The weight of the parcel shall not exceed 3 lbs., nor the size exceed one foot in length or breadth, or six inches in thickness.
4. Parcels must be prepaid at the following rates, and by postage stamps (not by money) :

If weighing less than $\frac{1}{2}$ lb.....	12½ cts.
Over $\frac{1}{2}$ and less than 1 lb.....	25 "
More than 1 lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs.....	50 "

5. The parcel may be registered, on prepayment, also by stamp, of a registration fee of 10c., in addition to the above rate.

6. The parcel shall have the words "*By Parcel Post*," plainly written over the address.

7. If insufficiently prepaid a fine of 10c. in addition to the deficiency.

PROHIBITORY CLAUSES.

No written communication shall be enclosed in any circular, periodical, pamphlet, book, book parcel, or parcel for the Parcel Post ; and no communication shall be written upon any circular, periodical, pamphlet, book, book package, or parcel.
