Winnipeg, Sept. 22 .- The first regular train for the west on the National Trantontinental Railway, left Winnipeg this morning, thus inaugurating a new service, which will be gradually extended as successive sections of the line, now under construction, are completed.

Within three years the railway will be carrying passengers, both ways, across the continent, between Prince Rupert on the Pacific, and Halifax and St. John on the Atlantic, to say nothing of the local and through freight that may offer for transportation.

The track will be for all practical purposes level through the whole of its length, nearly 4,000 miles.
