MINUTES OF THE THIRD ANNUAL MEETING

-OF THE-

Amateur Athletic Association of Canada,

Held in Montreal, 24th Sept., 1886.

The Third Annual Meeting of the Association took place on the evening of the 24th September, 1886, in the Windsor Hotel, Montreal, when were present the following officers and delegates:—

The President, Major Fred C. Henshaw, occupied the chair, and after calling the meeting to order, appointed Messrs. James Pearson and Geo. R. Starke, a Committee on Credentials.

Committee reported delegates present as above.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting were read and confirmed.

The Hon.-Secretary then read the Annual Report, which was adopted.

The Treasurer gave a brief synopsis of his statement, not having the accounts for Championship Meeting to hand.

The President announced that he would take up the amendments to the By-Laws proposed at last Annual Meeting.

The Hon.-Secretary read the articles with proposed amendments as follows:—

ARTICLE III.—CONSTITUTION.—After the word "failing," on fourth line, add "without good cause."

ARTICLE V.—After the word "Association," on fourth line, add "and shall vote as delegates by virtue of their office."

ARTICLE VI —After the word "members," on fifth line, add "together with membership fee to the Association.."

Add to this Article a third paragraph as follows: "Should the application be rejected, the fee shall be refunded."

ARTICLE VII.—Instead of the words "at the place," substitute "in the city;" after "delegates," in second paragraph of this Article, add "including members of the Executive Committee."

ARTICLE IX.—After "representation," on third line, add "and members of Executive Committee." In second paragraph, erase "150 and over 100," on third line, and substitute "over 100;" on fourth line, erase "150" and substitute "200."

ARTICLE XII.—On third line, erase "thirty" and substitute "fifteen."

ARTICLE I.—By-Laws.—On fifth line, after "Association," add "and be entitled to vote the same as delegates."

ARTICLE V .- Add "Running five miles" to programme of games.

Add a third paragraph to the Article, as follows: "The Executive Committee may, if it sees fit, grant the privilege to any Club or Clubs in good standing in the Association, to give such Championship event or events other than those named above."

ARTICLE VI.—In third paragraph, on second line, erase "twenty" and substitute "at least ten."

ARTICLE VII.—After "Meeting," on first line, add "collection of annual dues."

ARTICLE VIII. - To be altered so as to read exactly the same as Article XII of the Constitution.

All of the amendments as above read were carried.

The Committee appointed at last Annual Meeting to communicate with the American Association *re* changes in the Laws of Athletics reported, that copy of proposed changes had been forwarded to the Hon.-Secretary of that Association, but had not received an acknowledgement of the same.

The amendments, as proposed by the Committee, were then placed before the meeting as follows:—

Erase the words "and the best three have three more trials each" in laws regulating running broad jump, standing broad jump, putting the shot, throwing the hammer and 56 lbs. weight.

These amendments, on being put to the meeting, were carried.

Mr. Geo. R Starke then gave the following notice of motion:-

"That a "Record Keeper" be appointed, who may or may not be a member of the Executive Committee, whose duty it will be to keep a complete report of all athletic meetings held by the Clubs affiliated with the Association and of "records" made or broken at any time.

Mr. H. W. Becket was requested to act 'as " Record Keeper" till the next Annual Meeting.

Mr. J. A. Taylor, on behalf of the Montreal Amateur Athletic Association, requested permission to hold a cross country champion-ship steeplechase, should the Toronto Lacrosse Club not feel inclined to do so. It was resolved to allow the Toronto Lacrosse Club a week or ten days to consider the matter, when, should the Club decline, the Association would consider the request of the Montreal Amateur Athletic Association.

Your Committee has much pleasure in presenting its Annual Report for 1886, but regrets that while many Athletic Clubs have been formed during the year all over the Dominion, but 3 have thought it worth while to connect themselves with us, viz:

During the last Winter Season (1885-86) the local members of the Executive Committee met to consider the advisability of holding a Winter Championship Meeting, when it was decided to call a meeting of the Snow-Shoe Clubs affiliated with the Association to obtain their views on the subject. On its being held, and after some discussion, the meeting decided that it would be advisable to abolish the proposed Championship Meeting and to allow each Club to advertise on its programme a certain event as a Championship Race. The following Clubs had the privilege of giving such events, which events were drawn by ballot.

It was decided at the last Annual Meeting to amend such portions of the By Laws as might be deemed necessary and your Committee will lay before you this evening the proposed Amend ments. The proposed Amendments to the Laws of Athletics were forwarded to the N. A. A. of A. but as no answer has been returned they still remain in abeyance and your Committee would recommend the continuance of the services of the Committee. During the month of October 1885, the Association granted the M. A. A. A. the privilege of holding a Cross Country Sceeple Chase (on foot) from head of Durocher St., Montreal, to Peloquin's Hotel, Back River, a distance of about 6 miles, when Mr. J. W. Moffat, M. A. A. won in 38 minutes and 47 seconds with Mr. R. Larkin E. S. S. C. second in 38 minutes and 53 seconds, and Mr. J. G. Ross, M. A. A. A. third in 39 minutes and 3 séconds.

In response to a motion at last Annual Meeting a Record Book has been prepared, but as some of the performers have failed to furnish full particulars required for same, your Committee would request that it remain in hands of present Secretary till completed, which will be, it is hoped, before a month is passed.

The Annual Report of last Season has been sent to upwards of 50 Clubs and the Constitution and By-Laws to a number of such as

might claim affiliation with us. These Reports, with over 200 letters written upon matters relating to our Association and Athletics generally have been despatched during the year.

Your Committee has done its best with regard to the present Annual Championship Meeting and upwards of 800 Circulars were distributed to over 80 Clubs comprising all of any standing on this continent as well as England, Ireland and Scotland. Your Committee regrets that our Sister Association, the National Amateur Lacrosse Association of Canada did not take into consideration the fact that our Championship Meeting was to take place upon the 25th September, when it fixed which has proved to be the mest important match of the Season, upon date laid down by our By-Laws for the Meeting, thus forcing your Executive to alter date to one less likely to prove as successful in many ways as the original. It is to be hoped that we may be spared an occurrence of this in future years.
