

Paris, Aug. 4.—The French have captured the entire village of Fleury in the Verdun sector, according to an official announcement issued by the French War Office. A number of prisoners were taken.

Attacking simultaneously from the northwest and from the southeast, French troops yesterday stormed the village of Fleury, three miles north of Verdun, and captured several hundred Germans. In the evening, however, the Germans issunched a furious counter-attack, and after several violent attempts,


