

The Board of Managers would earnestly impress on every member and adherent of the congregation the great importance of using our weekly (white) envelope system regularly this year. It is our only source of revenue. It is of the utmost importance that our revenue this year be large, and if all join it can be so. Those not yet using this envelope should join in this effort. It is the duty of every one to do so and thus become helpers.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Church depends entirely upon the voluntary contributions of the members and adherents. It is therefore the duty of every member and adherent to undertake to give a certain sum of money FACH SABBATH.

"Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him"—1st Cor. xvi. 2.

As envelopes will be issued to anyone contributing five cents and upward weekly, the system is within the reach of all.

It is to be hoped that every member and adherent of the Church, whether old or young, who has an income, will ask for envelopes and give according to his or her means.

Statements will be rendered quarterly showing with what regularity contributions have been made.

A committee of the Managers is in attendance at the close of the weekly prayer meeting to allocate sittings.

Envelopes can be obtained in the vestibule before or after any of the Sabbath services, from Mr. J. Bennett who is in attendance there.

The chair was occupied by Rev. A. Gilray who opened

the meeting with prayer.

It was moved by Mr. D. W. Clark and seconded by Mr. T. Henderson, that Mr. W. P. McCulloch be appointed secretary of the meeting. Carried.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting as printed in the

Year Book were accepted as read.

Mr. Robert Wilson here lodged an objection to the meeting being held on this date on account of notice of same not having been given from the pulpit on the two preceding Sabbaths instead of one only. The objection, however, was not held good and the meeting proceeded.

The report of the Session was read by Mr. Gilray, who

moved its reception.

The report of the Board of Managers was read by Mr. C. R. Peterkin, who moved its reception.

The Sabbath School report was read by Mr. J. Samuelson, who moved its reception.

The report of the Bible Class was read by Mr. Jas. Adamson, who moved its reception.

The report of the Auxiliary to Women's Foreign Mission Society was read by Mr. W. P. McCulloch, who moved its reception.

The report of the Senior Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor was read by Miss M. Havill, who moved its reception.

Mr. W. P. McCulloch, who moved its reception.

It was moved by Mr. D. Brown, (Jr.) and seconded by Mr. D. W. Clark, that the reports as read be adopted. Carried.

The resignations of Managers Mr. Wm. Bennett and Mr. C. G. Smith were read by the Secretary.

It was moved by Mr. R. Wilson and seconded by Mr. D. Brown (Jr.), that, as Mr. Bennett had indicated the probability of his withdrawing from the congregation, his resignation be accepted. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. D. W. Clark and seconded by Mr. J. Samuelson, that Mr. C. G. Smith be asked to withdraw his resignation, which Mr. Smith, who was present, consented to do.

It was moved by Mr. D. Urquhart and seconded by Mr. W. J. Parks, that hereafter the books of the different organizations of the church be closed on Dec. 31st, and that the Church Treasurer's Financial Statement be placed in the hands of the congregation at least one week before the Annual Meeting. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. D. W. Clark and seconded by Mr. R. E. Diehl, that the congregation take steps to have printed and distributed in the pews the weekly announcements, etc.,

instead of having same made from the pulpit. Motion was lost.

It was moved by Mr. D. Urquhart and seconded by Mr. C. H. C. Wright, that it be recommended to the Session that hereafter the choir render two special musical selections at each of the public services on Sabbath instead of one. Motion was lost.

It was moved by Mr. J. Bennett and seconded by Mr. T. P. Loblaw, Resolved that the congregation approves of the manner in which Mr. Hugh Kennedy has conducted the service of praise during the year 1899 Carried.

It was moved by Mr. D. W. Clark and seconded by Mr. J. Bennett that the salary of Mr. Hugh Kennedy as Leader

of Praise be \$600 for the year 1900 Carried.

SESSION REPORT.

The year 1899 has been saddened by the removal through death of two of our much respected elders, Mr. Alex. Findlay and Mr. Donald Cameron. At the time of their call from us, suitable expressions of sympathy were conveyed to the sorrowing families, and yet we could not make this brief statement without a reference to their work and worth as men and elders. May He who calls away His workmen to higher service also raise up in our midst able and faithful men to take their places in His work here. The following members and adherents were removed by death during the past year and all deeply and tenderly mourned; Mrs. Readman, Mrs. McKay, Mrs. Willmott (Sr.), Mrs. Willard, Mr. Paul Willard, Mr. Sturrock (Sr.), Mr. D. Rennie, Mr. John Lockhart, Mr. Williams (adherent), Mr. Williamson (adherent).

During the year 112 members were added to the Roll—by profession 41, and by certificate 71. On the Roll at present there are 868. The ordinance of Baptism was administered to 32 infants and one adult—33 in all.

What is our need as we are about to close the old century? More true waiting upon our God—more earnest and loving study in His word—more of Christ and less of self—yes, all of Christ and none of self.

REPORT OF BOARD OF MANAGERS.

In presenting the Annual Report for the year 1899 just closed, the Board of Managers are pleased to note that there has been quite an increase of revenue over 1898, although some of the departments have not reached the same amount as last year, yet the total amount raised this year for ordinary expenses and for reduction of floating debt, exceeds that of last year by \$1,208.70. The weekly offerings, as you will see by the printed statement in your hands, are, open \$1,052.33, and envelope \$3,972.78, or a total of \$5,022.11, being an increase of \$264.56 from the same source over the previous year.

While a large number of the Congregation have very faithfully and regularly kept up their weekly offerings, there are quite a number who, so far as known, have contributed nothing, and some have done very little for the support of ordinances among us. This should not be, for every one has a duty here to perform. In response to over 200 envelopes and circulars sent out last June, about 25 have availed themselves more or less regularly of this privilege and thus helped to carry on the work. Ere we pass from this part of our report, let us very kindly, but very urgently, press upon all to do what in them lies toward the weekly offerings and thereby enable us to meet all our current expenses, so that all we receive from other sources may go to reduce our floating debt.

FLOATING DEBT.

As stated in a circular issued to the congregation in April last, there was a demand made for the retiring of the overdraft from the Bank of \$6,025.00, which has been standing for a number of years, and that demand has been repeated several times since, as they are very desirous of being relieved from it. While pressing this matter very strongly and closely, they have always been very obliging and given us from time to time what we required, which has enabled us to keep our credit good.

Following up the issue of the circular in April last, the Managers visited the homes of the congregation throughout the several districts, with the result that so far \$1,393.80 has been paid to the Treasurer for the reduction of the over-draft

at the Bank. While not as successful as we had hoped to be, yet we take it as an earnest of the good things yet to come. We may add that there is still an amount of \$151 unpaid of the amount promised, the receipt of which the Managers hope soon to report.

As a very few of our members are held personally responsible for the re-payment of the floating debt to those who advanced the moneys, it is not desirable that this obligation should be borne by them any longer.

We would recommend that a monthly or quarterly collection be taken up for this special purpose, by envelope, similar to what has been in use the past nine months, and which seems to have worked in a very satisfactory manner.

The Managers wish to make special mention of the valuable services rendered by Mr. W. E. Raney, who has since removed from Toronto, in having the interest on the mortgage debt reduced from 5 to $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

We would also thank the members of the Junior Bible Class and their teacher, Mrs. Joss, for the very substantial assistance rendered this year, as the result of the Congregational Birthday Party held by them, also the Woman's Association and other departments, for their hearty co-operation in the work throughout the year just passed.

Your Board regrets to report the death of one of their number during the past year, in the person of Mr. Alexander Findlay, after a prolonged illness. He was always a cheerful and willing worker, and has been greatly missed.

Your Board has received during the year the resignations of Messrs. Sharpe, Urquhart, Wm. Bennett and C. G. Smith, but no action was taken by it in the matter, and the congregation is asked to deal with the resignations of those whose terms have not yet expired, namely, Messrs. Wm. Bennett and C. G. Smith, who have one and two years respectively, to run.

It is necessary to elect two members for one year, in place of the late Mr. Alexander Findlay and Mr. Raney, also six others for three years, whose term of office has expired.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

A very successful concert was held in behalf of the Library,

netting \$35.00.

The Sabbath School Committee of the Y. P. S. C. E. has rendered efficient service in supplying, to some extent, the

places of absent teachers.

On looking over the work for the year, while there is great reason for humility before God, on account of our shortcomings, yet we take courage for the future in the thought that we are co-workers with God in the conversion and the building up of our young people in the knowledge of Divine Truth.

In September a quantity of clothing, quilts, etc., also the sum of \$8.00, were sent to the Northwest Supply Fund.

At our Thank-Offering meeting in October, the offering amounted to \$33.20.

In presenting the annual report for 1899 the Missionary Association would respectfully direct the attention of the congregation to some changes which took place in connection with our Missionary work, during the year. After five years of

faithful and efficient service Mr. James Turnbull retired from the office of Secretary-Treasurer. On November 29th, a special Missionary meeting of the congregation was held, and after careful consideration it was unanimously decided, 1st to discontinue the free distribution of the Record among the families of the congregation at the end of the year; 2nd, to discontinue the visits of the lady collectors at the same time; 3rd, and from January 1st, 1900, to receive our missionary offerings by special red envelopes, on the first Sabbath of each month, along with the regular weekly offerings.

It was provided that those who wished to continue the Record could forward their subscriptions through the Secretary of the Missionary Association. The total amount received during the year was \$347.17; of this sum \$93.35 has been paid out, leaving a balance for Missionary purposes o \$253.82. Of this balance the sum of \$95 was paid over to Dr. Warden, \$7.00 in May for Aged and Infirm Ministers Fund, and \$88 in October on account missions, this latter amount to be allocated to the var-

ious funds at the annual meeting.

The lady collectors received the sum of \$325.52, an increase over 1898 of \$40.20, but our total contributions as compared with the previous year show a decrease of \$13.54. This decrease is accounted for in this way: in the receipts for 1898 there are two items, viz., a special contribution from the Y.P.S.C.E. of \$12.75 and a special collection from the congregation of \$45.97, and two other small items amounting to \$4.85, and the expendi-

ture for 1899 was \$5.50 in excess of 1898.

The twenty-four districts of the congregation gave an average of \$13.56 each. The largest amount from a single district was \$38.30, and the smallest \$2.63. Taking our membership on January 1st, 1899, at 840 the average contribution per member for missions last year was about 39c., or less than one cent per week from each member. The congregation as a whole will surely consider this a very small average, indeed it is almost a reproach on our profession as a Christian people. It is earnestly hoped that our missionary offerings for the year 1900 will show a substantial increase. The above is respectfully submitted.
