THE FOREIGN MINISTER.

The second treaty with Japan directs attention once more to Lord Lansdowne's singularly successful career as secretary of state for foreign affairs.

Yet when the Marquis of Lansdowne left Canada, in 1888 he had hardly begun to win a statesman's reputation. He had been governor general, and before that appointment had risen as high as under-secretary.

The tradition grew up among Sir John A. Macdonald's closest friends that the Canadian premier had an exceedingly high opinion of Lord Lansdowne's gifts and capacity.
