



New York, Nov. 11. — Such conditions have been evolved in cotton, that consideration of the more fundamental aspects of the situation at large is deemed illogical, and the question whether prices will move higher or lower resolves itself into the ability of the strong bull clique to accomplish its announced intention to force the price to 18 or 20 cents. It is claimed by brokers allied with these interests, arrangements have been made to finance 500,000 bales of cotton on option deliveries. Just now the May option seems to be the medium of attaining the result sought by the bull party. It looks now as if a corner, or at least a squeeze in that option, is within the probabilities and certain big spot interests which until recently have been arrayed against the market appear to be getting in line for higher prices. Today's market was irregular, of course, opening from 5 to 10 points down, rising about 20 points, with final prices about 12 points lower. The bull interests, however, appeared to have the situation well in hand and according to report there are heavy supporting orders placed slightly under the market. If the clique has succeeded in financing deliveries on the December option, it seems entirely possible for it to push prices higher. Receipts are beginning to show sharp declines as compared with last year, both at the interior and at the ports.
