Farm and Household. The Hay Crop.

Great waste and loss are caused every year in America by allowing the grass to become too ripe. Where the object of cultivating a crop is to obtain grain, as in the case of wheat, oats, &c., it is necessary to allow the strength of the plant to go into seed, and the leaves and stems are the chief or sole object for which the crop is grown they should be secured when the plant is fullest of sap, and that is just when it is in bloom or coming in bloom.

The fact is, a large proportion of what is called hay is not hay at all, but rather straw, and very little of the nutritious nourishment there is in straw for cattle.

There is another consideration of no small importance in favor of early cutting of hay. The ground is far less exhausted by the crop than when it is allowed to run to seed; grass is when cut early, a green crop which does not wither so much, but when cut late it is like a scorching grain crop, and hence the running down of meadows. Furthermore the earlier hay is cut the better will be the second crop, whether of grass or clover.
