Ottawa, Dec, 25 . - The first session of
ne new Dominion parliament, which has been summiond for the 6th of Feb. ruary next, promises to be a compara-
tively short one. Although the peculiar feature about the return to power of the Liberal ministry, under Sir Wi
frid Laurier, lies in the fact that it will meet parliament after an election campaign in which_ it has not been
called upon to lay down, in more than general terms, its future line of policy, the coming session, vevertheless, wil1
