But that rule was probably conceived at the time when most of the rules pertaining to the jury were conceived—before the newspapers took such pains to publish all the proceedings; and I can easily see that if I should enforce the rule in its old spirit, criminal trials and a great many civil cases could not be proceeded with—it would be impossible. That rule was wise in its time, and may be wise to some extent yet, but it cannot be possible to make it operate to prevent witnesses from testifying to offences, against the State or testifying to offences, against the State or testifying to matters of defence. 
