WHOLE TRIBES PERISHING.

APPALLING EFFECTS OF THE SNOW-STORM IN AFRICA.

A Renewal of the Frost Threatened in Paris—An Appeal to the Churches to Keep Their Doors Open All Night to Shelter the Poor Measures of Relief Elsewhere.

LONDON, Jan. 21.—Shocking accounts of the misery caused by the cold and snow have been received from the south-western and inland parts of the continent. It is not doubted that many have perished who did not have time to reach the coast.

Two alpheris who were out with their flocks in the hills near Casars and Andalus had barely time to reach the coast before the storm broke. They were nearly frozen with cold when they reached the coast. Here they remained until food or other covering than their scanty attire for three days, until rescued yesterday by a searching party. One died as a result of the exposure. It is not clear how many survive through it is doubtful.
