CURAENT TRADB COMDITIONS. oñtario.
Our Ottawa correspondent tells of the feeling of confidence that is exhibited by the lumbermen of that district. It can truly be said that this optimism is not con--fined to the Ottawa valley, as the trade generally take a hopeful view of the outlook for pine lumber. Thés market is strong, : although, 35 might be expected" at this season of the year; the demand is not particularly active. There has been some searching around for twelveinch boards, which have been bought up for export, parly. on account of an improved demand from South America. The buying of box luniber bas also been more pronounced, but this has had no effect upon prices. as in this line there is no unusual scarcity o stock. The short supply exists in the upper grades.

Hardwoods are being bought by those who bave studied the situation. Prices are now very low as no advance of consequence bas bien made for some time. Lofier prices, therefore, are not to be looked for, while an increase in consump. gion soould have the effect of raising values. Stocles are not heavy excepting in the lower grades.

QURBEC AND.NEW BRUNSWICK.
Prices of square and waney timber are unchanged: It is reported, that a : Hamil-
ton firm have sold their coming winter's production of square pine, but prices have pot transpired. The trade generally do not expect that higher prices for square and waney umber will rule in the near future. The market for spruce is quite firm, with many enquiries for the best quality. A very satisfactory trade in clapboards and other thin lumber has lately,been done with the United States. The upward movement in shongles has continued during the past week, and on Boston rate of freight extra cedars are now quoted at $\$ 3.15$ to $\$ 3.25$; cleats at $\$ 2.8$ sito $\$ 2.95$; second clears at $\$ 2.35$, to $\$ 2.45$; saps at $\$ 2.10$ to $\$ 2.20$, and exira No. 1. at \$1.75 to \$1.80.

There were şbpped from St. John up to the end of September of this year 146,166,604 feet, as compared with 214,648 , 565 feet for the corresponding period of 1900. This is a decrease for this year of oyer 08,000,000 feet. Of the above quan. tity $25,732,720$ feet were shipned to Australia, France, Spain, Alrica, Italy and Portugal, and the balance to Great Bntain. United. States.
A slight falling off in' demand is reported by wholesalers of northern pine, but when it is constdered that the ship. ments from the Lake Superior district ehis year will show an increase of 15 per cent over the previous year, it is not surprising that there should be a slackening up of business. Yet the pine market continues strong, with a probability of higher values for the better grades of pine, of which there is a decided scarcity. In Chicago, New York and other large cities the activity in buiding operations continues. Buffalo dealers report a very active trade. Our price list this week shors an advance of $\$ 3$ on uppers and $\$ 1$ on Nio. 1 cuting up stock, $13 / 4$ and s $3 / 3$ inch thick. It has been found that there is a scarcity of both No. I and No. 2 culs, and it is said that as high $35 \$ 36$ and $\$ 23$ respectively has been offered. Box lumber is in fair demand. The firmness of spruce lumber is the feature of the eastern trade. It is scarce at producing points and man. ulacturers are finding difficulty in filling orders for immediate requirements The hardwood srade is about as it has been throughout the fall; with a fair movement ofstock but no particular snap to the demand. Common and cull white ash is a littic'higher in Buffalo Maple flooring is much inquired for and scarce, and present conditions would warrant an advance in price. Shiogles are in excellent request.

## great britaln.

The tone of the Braish timber market is distinctly better. More confidence is shown than far many months past. Although Canadian pine deals are still in heapy stock, a slight improvement in values is reported. For first quality pine deals in 9 and $n t$ inch, the market is quite firm, while third and fourth qualities are plentiful and somewhat easier. Considerably advanced prices are being asked for spruce deals. A cargo from Cape Tormentine, N.B., has been sold to a Liverpool firm at $\mathcal{f} 7$ 10s, and still higher prices are looked for before the close of the sca. som. Prices of spruce on the west coast have advanced at least 20s. per standard whthin the past six weeks, although in the London market and on the east coast the competition from other whitewood has kepi prices from advancing in the same proportion. It is thought that next spring will find the market short of 9 and it inch spruce deals: In London. sales of Quebec "deals wére matac last ryeek at 6915 s for second quality and $\mathcal{L} 9$ is $6 d$ for third quality, and £ıo per-standard is predicted for February and March, 1902.
The import of square and waney timber during the month of October was light, but in most classes the stock on hand is still heavy. Inferior wood is a drug on the marker, while best quality is in fair demand. Birch logs and planks have strengthened of late, as deliveries have been ona moderate scale and consumption very Sultisfactory.

The lowest retail figure quoted is $\$ 2.25$ for No. 1 and $\$ 2$ for No. 2 In Cleveland, Ottawa high grade lath sold recently as high as 54.00 per Mo A conl siderable quantity has also been shipped This outside demand, if it continues, will in itself have a strong tendericy to maintain local prices. This fall Mr. J. R. Booth has made several good sized shipments to Chicago, aill beling good stock. The Winds City furnishies a comparatively unt explored field for the product of the Ot tawa mills.
Speaking about the prospects recently, a local lumberman said: "Tthere is every reason why present prices, if they change, should advance. Labor is much higher, supplies are dearer, and the "cost of getting out the logs shows an adyance all round. The mill men have to go farther from the mills, and hence have to make a greater financial allowance for bringing the logs to the mills. Ottawa shippers are finding new ficlds in the United States, and besides expect to cater to an increased local demand next year. Stocks here of some classes of goods are certainly healy; but they are strongly held, and are not likely to be sold at any great sacrifice.
