### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

Our Ottawa correspondent tells of the feeling of confidence that is exhibited by the lumbermen of that district. It can truly be said that this optimism is not confined to the Ottawa valley, as the trade generally take a hopeful view of the outlook for pine lumber. The market is strong, although, as might be expected at this season of the year, the demand is not particularly active. There has been some searching around for twelve inch boards, which have been bought up for export, partly on account of an improved demand from South America. The buying of box lumber has also been more pronounced, but this has had no effect upon prices, as in this line there is no unusual scarcity of stock. The short supply exists in the upper grades.

Hardwoods are being bought by those who have studied the situation. Prices are now very low, as no advance of consequence has been made for some time. Lower prices, therefore, are not to be looked for, while an increase in consumption would have the effect of raising values. Stocks are not heavy excepting in the lower grades.

### QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Prices of square and waney timber are unchanged. It is reported that a Hamil-

ton firm have sold their coming winter's production of square pine, but prices have not transpired. The trade generally do not expect that higher prices for square and waney timber will rule in the near future. The market for spruce is quite firm, with many enquiries for the best quality. A very satisfactory trade in clapboards and other thin lumber has lately been done with the United States. The upward movement in shingles has continued during the past week, and on Boston rate of freight extra cedars are now quoted at \$3.15 to \$3.25; clears at \$2.85 to \$2.95; second clears at \$2.35 to \$2.45; saps at \$2.10 to \$2.20, and extra No. 1 at \$1.75 to \$1.80.

There were shipped from St. John up to the end of September of this year 146,166,604 feet, as compared with 214,648,565 feet for the corresponding period of 1900. This is a decrease for this year of over 68,000,000 feet. Of the above quantity 15,732,720 feet were shipped to Australia, France, Spain, Africa, Italy and Portugal, and the balance to Great Britain.

### UNITED STATES.

A slight falling off in demand is reported by wholesalers of northern pine, but when it is considered that the shipments from the Lake Superior district this year will show an increase of 15 per cent. over the previous year, it is not surprising that there should be a slackening up of business. Yet the pine market continues strong, with a probability of higher values for the better grades of pine, of which there is a decided scarcity. In Chicago, New York and other large cities the activity in building operations continues. Buffalo dealers report a very active trade. Our price list this week shows an advance of \$3 on uppers and \$1 on No. 1 cutting up stock, 1 1/4 and 1 1/2 inch thick. It has been found that there is a scarcity of both No. 1 and No. 2 cuts, and it is said that as high as \$36 and \$23 respectively has been offered. Box lumber is in fair demand. The firmness of spruce lumber is the feature of the eastern trade. It is scarce at producing points and manufacturers are finding difficulty in filling orders for immediate requirements. The hardwood trade is about as it has been throughout the fall, with a fair movement of stock but no particular snap to the demand. Common and cull white ash is a little higher in Buffalo. Maple flooring is much inquired for and scarce, and present conditions would warrant an advance in price. Shingles are in excellent request.

### GREAT BRITAIN.

The tone of the British timber market is distinctly better. More confidence is shown than for many months past. Although Canadian pine deals are still in heavy stock, a slight improvement in values is reported. For first quality pine deals in 9 and 11 inch, the market is quite firm, while third and fourth qualities are plentiful and somewhat easier. Considerably advanced prices are being asked for spruce deals. A cargo from Cape Tormentine, N.B., has been sold to a Liverpool firm at £7 10s, and still higher prices are looked for before the close of the season. Prices of spruce on the west coast have advanced at least 20s. per standard within the past six weeks, although in the London market and on the east coast the competition from other whitewood has kept prices from advancing in the same proportion. It is thought that next spring will find the market short of 9 and 11 inch spruce deals. In London sales of Quebec deals were made last week at £9 15s for second quality and £9 2s 6d for third quality, and £10 per standard is predicted for February and March, 1902.

The import of square and waney timber during the month of October was light, but in most classes the stock on hand is still heavy. Inferior wood is a drug on the market, while best quality is in fair demand. Birch logs and planks have strengthened of late, as deliveries have been on a moderate scale and consumption very satisfactory.

THE OTTAWA VALLEY.

(Correspondence of the CANADA LUMBERMAN.)

The lumber market here continues firm with no indication of weakening. On the contrary, reliable authorities predict an upward move. Dealers do not complain of difficulty in securing business. Owing to a continued shortage of cars, they find great trouble in filling orders. One leading mill firm is reported as being in need of 300 cars with which to ship stock orders for which were placed weeks ago. The western grain trade has the call on cars, and the lumbermen will have to "bide a wee."

This being the last month of navigation, a rush of lumber for Montreal was witnessed, but this is now over. Future shipments must be made by rail.

As an evidence of the firm tone of the market, it may be stated that a large quantity of prime s. c. strips was recently disposed of by a mill firm at \$15 per M. Local dealers who had large holdings in this line, and were feeling shaky, have taken heart. Mention in the same connection may also be made of the wholesale price of lath. Six weeks ago a large

quantity was secured by a well-known firm from the mill at \$1.75 per M. for No. 1, and \$1.25 per M. for No. 2. Today the lath could not be bought in the same way at less than \$2.10 for No. 1 and \$1.65 for No. 2. The lowest retail figure quoted is \$2.25 for No. 1 and \$2 for No. 2. In Cleveland, Ottawa high grade lath sold recently as high as \$4.00 per M. A considerable quantity has also been shipped by local firms to points in Pennsylvania. This outside demand, if it continues, will in itself have a strong tendency to maintain local prices. This fall Mr. J. R. Booth has made several good sized shipments to Chicago, all being good stock. The Windy City furnishes a comparatively unexplored field for the product of the Ottawa mills.

Speaking about the prospects recently, a local lumberman said: "There is every reason why present prices, if they change, should advance. Labor is much higher, supplies are dearer, and the cost of getting out the logs shows an advance all round. The mill men have to go farther from the mills, and hence have to make a greater financial allowance for bringing the logs to the mills. Ottawa shippers are finding new fields in the United States, and besides expect to cater to an increased local demand next year. Everything indicates that prices for 1902 will be higher than those of 1901."

If negotiations pending reach a satisfactory issue, a new saw mill will be erected this fall or early next spring at Deschenes, near Ottawa. The site spoken of is the one on which the Conroy mill, burned two years ago, stood. The new mill will be operated by steam, and fitted with machinery giving a yearly output of 50,000,000 feet. It is being planned by local limit holders, who at present have no mill at which to cut. Fraser & Company are in the syndicate. It is hoped to have the mill running early next July. As the river is already laid with booms, and the storing and shipping facilities in the yards provided for, there will be no delay in outside work.

J. R. Booth against the world. This apparently is the status in an interesting law suit involving large interests which will soon be fought out in the local courts. It all arises over the manipulation of the water power at the Chaudiere, Ottawa's industrial centre. Mr. Booth is building a new dam in the river, and doing work on the site of the old McKay mill which it is alleged will interfere with the rights of the other companies utilizing the water power below the Booth premises. The lumber king contends that he is well within his rights working on his own property, and interfering with no one else's rights. The companies arrayed against him include the Ottawa Electric Railway Company, Ottawa Electric Company, Ottawa Power Company and Ottawa Carbide Company. The case is looked forward to with great interest.

Davidson & Thackray, the well-known local lumber manufacturers, have again turned an eye on the South African market. A representative has been sent to the country of Boer and bullet to drum up trade. Offices will likely be opened at Cape Town and Johannesburg. Before the war this firm had quite a large trade with South Africa. They did a good business, shipping doors, sashes and interior fittings. Ottawa, November 11th, 1901.

A correspondent of Timber, of London, Eng., makes the following reference to the spruce market: "The only feature of interest in the trade of this port at the present time is the firmness of the spruce market. Quotations for this wood are advancing, owing, it is said, to the scarcity of certain sizes. The upward tendency has not affected any other branch, although, with the exception of pine, nearly all woods are steady. No large transactions are reported as taking place, and the orders that are coming to hand are all for small quantities. There appears to be no falling off in the actual number of orders, but they are certainly for much smaller quantities than they were a twelvemonth ago. This would seem to prove, if it proves anything, that country buyers are operating with extreme caution, and working from hand to mouth, with the object, no doubt, of being able to do better later on. But, as already stated in these notes, there are no indications that there will be a further all-round fall in values; on the contrary, a rise is far more probable. Stocks here of some classes of goods are certainly heavy, but they are strongly held, and are not likely to be sold at any great sacrifice. It certainly looks as if prices had now reached their lowest possible limit, so that buyers

will hardly improve their position by holding off their order."

**THE GLASGOW MARKET.**

Messrs. Edmiston & Mitchells, in their last monthly circular, thus review the Glasgow market: **WANEY BOARDWOOD AND SQUARE WHITE PINE.**—The import during the month has been small—about 300 loads. The enquiry during the month has been quiet, and, with the exception of a few retail sales, there has been no business passing. Prices are firm, and the stock is moderate. **RED PINE.**—There has been an import during the month of about 100 loads. The stock is low, but is ample for all requirements. **OAK.**—There has been no further import during the month, and general business has been quiet, though the railway companies have fixed a few lines of their special sizes. **ELM.**—The import during the month has been about 250 loads. The stock is heavy, and the demand during the month has been disappointing. Prices for good quality are firm, but are low for second quality or soft elm. **BIRCH.**—Quebec.—The import for October consists of about 200 loads, some of which were sold "ex quay" and the balance stored. One lot of indifferent quality 17-inch average was

sold at 16d. "ex quay." The demand is very languid, and only retail sales of a trifling description are being effected. In lower port birch there have been a few sales made at unsatisfactory prices, it is reported. There have been no transactions in planks during the month. **ASH.**—The import for October is comparatively trifling, and it is to be hoped that very little will come in this year, as the market is quite overstocked as it is, and very little is moving off, unfortunately. Until the cabinetmaking trade improves there is no chance of the stock being appreciably reduced. **DEALS, &c.**—A fairly active business has been transacted during the month, and deliveries from public yards are well maintained. First pine

deals, especially broads, are scarce, and prices are firm. Third and fourth qualities are plentiful and somewhat easier. Spruce has been in fair demand, and prices are improving. Current values are as follows: Broad First Pine Deals—£26 to £25; 11-inch, £23 to £25; ends and non-dimensions, £18 to £22. Second Pine deals—11-inch and up, £18 10s. to £21; non-dimensions, £2 10s. to £15. Third Pine Deals—11-inch and up, £11 7s. 6d. to £12; ends and narrows, £8 10s. to £10. Fourth Pine Deals—11-inch and up, £9 to £9 10s.; narrows, £7 15s. to £8 5s. Red Pine Deals—9 and 11 inch, £8 10s. to £9 10s.; narrows, £7 5s. to £7 15s.

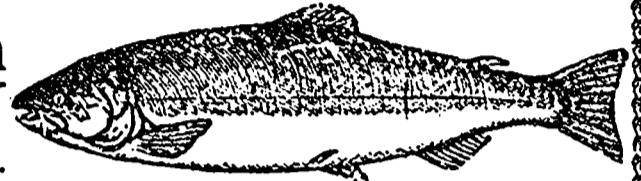

STOCKS AND PRICES.

In the Saginaw valley white pine 18 inch XXXX shingles are held at \$3.80; clear butts, \$2.60; 18 inch cedar XXXX, \$3.45; clear butts, \$2.35.

The Saginaw Lumber & Salt Company are this winter taking out square timber in the township of Levack, recently purchased from the Ontario Government.

The Nova Scotia Steel & Coal Company are about to build a large shipping pier at North Sydney, N.S., the construction of which will require 850,000 feet of hard pine, 21,000 lineal feet of crossoted piling and 300,000 feet of spruce planking. The pier, it is said, will cost \$100,000.

Receipts of lumber at Buffalo by vessel this season have been 167,258,000 feet, as against 133,320,000 feet last season. Shingles show a decrease, the amount being 87,497,000, as compared with 115,841,000 last year. Of lath 8,000,000 have been received, which is nearly double that of last year.

W. H. Murray, president of the Fredericton Boom Company, states that it has been decided not to endeavor to drive this fall the logs stranded above Grand Falls, N.B., but to concentrate all efforts to bring the logs below the falls into the boom. A despatch from Fredericton, dated October 25th, stated that the water was again falling, and that unless there was an immediate rise the chances of getting the 15,000,000 feet of logs into the booms were very poor.

Of the Barbadoes market the trade circular of Clairmonte, Man & Company

says: "There have been no arrivals with lumber during the fortnight ended October 26th and yards are bear of white pine and spruce, especially the former. We value the first arrival of white pine at from \$25 to \$26 for merchantable, and of spruce at \$19 to \$20. Long cedar Gaspe shingles are wanted. Last sales have been at \$4.05 to \$5.30 per M, according to quality. We note the arrival of the James W., from Puspebiac, Que., with 422,000 long and 346,000 dimension shingles. The last sale of cedar laying shingles was at \$1.75 and spruce laying at \$1.55."

Under date of October 19th, Messrs. S. P. Musson, Son & Company say of the Barbadoes lumber market: "A cargo of about 200,000 feet of white pine, principally second quality, has been contracted for at \$25 and \$20 respectively, and we have also sold a small cargo to arrive at similar rates. Some dealers are quite bare and first receipts should command about above prices. In spruce we have contracted for a cargo for the dealers, and from next month on there will be the demand setting in for crop requirement, although the quantity wanted will probably be less than last season. A small lot of dimension cedar shingles, ex Canadian steamer, is the only receipt. They brought \$4 for 4 inch, \$6.65 for 5 inch, \$7.15 for 6 inch, and \$8 for 7 inch. Some dealers are bare of laying cedar shingles, but others having stocks laid in at low rates, would preclude anything over our last quotation being paid. We have just placed a million to arrive at \$2.
