EXPLANATORY.



It is our intention to give in a convenient form, the GUNNING LAWS of the UNITED STATES AND CANADA. While necessarily a summary, this book contains the gist of all laws in force, affecting seasons, limitations as to number, transportation, and non-resident requirements.

To secure brevity, CATCH or KILL are used for the more extended terms of the Statute; *i. e.*, "Catch, kill, destroy, injure or pursue with such intent," etc.

Where no close season is specified, there is none.

Transportation, sale or possession of game at any time when it is unlawful to kill such game, is unlawful, except that various States allow from four days to three weeks, for the sale of game, after the expiration of the open season for killing.

Night shooting, and shooting of birds other than game birds and birds of prey, is forbidden.

Neats and eggs of all birds (except of prey) are always protected.

Snaring and netting game birds are forbidden; also killing in any other manner than with a shoulder gun.

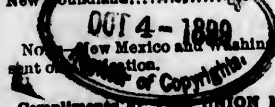

GAME LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA.

ALABAMA.

Hunting or Shooting on Sunday is Forbidden.
Hunting or shooting on Sunday is forbidden.

Birds Not Protected.

Song and insectivorous birds, their nests and eggs, are protected, and all wild birds, except as follows: English or European house sparrow, kingfisher, cooper's hawk, sharp-skinned hawk, duck hawk, pigeon hawk, great horned owl, barred owl, green heron and night heron are not included among the birds protected.

Game Birds.

It is unlawful to kill or have in possession, any wild turkey, pheasant, grouse, quail, partridge, woodcock, prairie chicken, English, Mongolian or Chinese pheasant, except from November 15 to March 1, inclusive; provided, that it shall be unlawful to hunt or kill any Mongolian, English or Chinese pheasant for a period of five years from the date of the approval of this act (1899); and provided, further, that it shall be lawful to kill wild turkey during the month of February of each and every year in addition to the time above specified.

Deer.

It is unlawful to kill, have in possession any deer or fawn, except during the months of September, October, November and December in each year; and it is unlawful to at any time kill or capture any deer in the waters of any stream, ponds or lakes within the State.

Sale.

It is unlawful to kill or have in possession any deer or or entrap any deer, fawn, wild turkey, pheasant, grouse, quail, partridge, woodcock or squirrel for the purpose of selling same.

Transportation.

No person, company or corporation, or the agent thereof, shall, at any time, catch, kill or have in possession any of the birds or game mammals of this State, the killing of which is prohibited, with intent to ship or remove the same beyond the limits of this State.

Possession.

Possession of the game birds and game mammals herein mentioned is permitted for a period of fifteen days after the time limited for killing the same has expired.

Method of Hunting.

It is unlawful to kill any of the game birds, song birds or game mammals, in any other manner than by shooting them with a gun; and it is unlawful to use any trap, net, artificial light, battery, or other deception or contrivance whatever.

Squirrels.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any black, gray or fox squirrel, except from July 1 to February 1, inclusive.

Counties Exempt.

Many counties are exempt from the provisions of the law.

ARIZONA.

Bobwhite, Partridge, Quail, Grouse, Wild Turkey, Wild Duck, Snipe or Rail.

Every person who, in the Territory of Arizona, between March 1 and October 15, shall hunt, pursue, kill or destroy, or have in possession, except for purpose of propagation, any quail, bobwhite, grouse, partridge or wild

ARIZONA

It is also unlawful to net, snare or trap any of them, or to expose them for sale, if netted, trapped or snared. It is also a misdemeanor to use a gun of larger calibre than No. 20 gauge in shooting any of the above, or to trespass upon the enclosed or cultivated ground or fields of private property, or where signs are displayed forbidding such shooting, without having obtained permit from the owner of the land. It is also a misdemeanor to destroy or disturb the nests or eggs of any of the above mentioned birds.

Doves.

It is a misdemeanor to kill or hunt any doves between March 1 and June 1.

Deer, Camel, Antelope, Elk, Sheep and Goats.

It is a misdemeanor to hunt or kill any male deer, antelope or buck between December 15 and August 1 of the year following. It is also unlawful at any time to hunt or kill any camels, goats, female deer, female antelope, or any elk, mountain sheep, doe or spotted fawn, except that bucks may be killed for camp or domestic purposes from October 1 to February 1.

Birds.

It is unlawful to take, kill or destroy any bird mentioned in this Act, unless the carcass is preserved or sold for food. It is a misdemeanor to sell or offer for sale the head or meat of any deer, elk, antelope, mountain sheep, mountain goat, or wild turkey.

Pheasant, Prairie Chicken, Bob White.

It is a misdemeanor to hunt, pursue, or have in possession, except for purposes of propagation, any of these birds within the next five years.

Unlawful Possession.

It is unlawful to have in possession or to give away, or offer for sale, any protected animals mentioned in this section, during the closed seasons specified, or receive same for transportation during close seasons.

Bounties.

Each County Board of Supervisors shall pay as rewards for their destruction, the following bounties: Lobos or timber wolves, \$5.00 each; mountain lions, pumas, panthers, \$20.00 each; bears, \$10.00 each.

Sex.

It is a misdemeanor to buy, sell, or have in possession the carcass or hide of any deer or antelope from which the evidence of sex has been removed.

Trespass.

It is a misdemeanor for any person to shoot game birds mentioned herein upon enclosed or cultivated ground or field which is private property, or where signs are displayed forbidding such shooting without permission first obtained from the owner or person in possession of such grounds.

ARKANSAS.**Deer.**

It is unlawful to kill, catch or pursue any wild buck, deer or fawn between February 1 and August 1. The chasing with dogs or hounds is forbidden in Mississippi, Crittenden, Cross, Poinsett and St. Francis counties. In these counties shooting after sundown, with intent to kill, injure or frighten any aquatic fowls, on the lakes or waters, is also forbidden.

Close Seasons.

Wild turkey between May 1 and September 1; quail or Virginia partridge, March 1 and October 1.

Prairie Chickens.

Close season: February 1 to September 1 following.

Non-resident tax for hunting, \$10.

CALIFORNIA.**General Game Law.**

Every person who between the first day of March and the first day of October in each year, shall hunt, pursue, take, kill or destroy, or have in his possession, any valley quail, bobwhite, partridge or any kind of wild duck or rail; every person who, between the fifteenth day of February and the first day of September in each year, shall hunt, pursue, take, kill or destroy, or have in his possession any mountain quail or grouse; every person who, between the fifteenth day of February and the fifteenth day of July in each year, shall hunt, pursue, take, kill or destroy, or have in his possession any dove or doves; every person who shall take, gather or destroy the eggs or nest of any quail, bobwhite, partridge, pheasant, grouse, dove, robin, or any kind of wild duck or rail; every person who shall at any time hunt, shoot, shoot at, take, kill or destroy, buy, sell, give away, or have in his possession, except for the purpose of propagation, or for educational or scientific purposes, any English skylark, robin, canary, humming-bird, thrush or mocking-bird, or any part of the skin, skins, or plumage thereof, or who shall rob the nests, or take or destroy, or offer for sale, the eggs of any of the said birds; every person who, before the first day of March, 1899, shall hunt, pursue, take, kill or destroy, or have in his possession, any pheasant;

every cold-storage company, person keeping a cold-storage warehouse, tavern or hotel keeper, restaurant or eating-house keeper, marketman, or other person, who shall buy, sell, expose or offer for sale, or give away, or have in his possession any quail, bobwhite, partridge, robin, grouse, dove, pheasant, wild duck, or rail, during the time it shall be unlawful to kill such birds; every person who shall hunt, pursue, take, kill, or have in his possession, or destroy any male deer between the fifteenth day of October and the fifteenth day of July of the following year; every person who shall at any time hunt, pursue, take, kill or destroy, or have in his possession, any female deer, or spotted fawn, or any antelope, elk, or mountain sheep; every person who shall at any time buy, sell, or offer for sale, the hide or meat of any deer, elk, antelope, or mountain sheep; every person who shall buy, sell, offer or expose for sale, transport or carry, or have in his possession the skin, hide or pelt of any deer, from which the evidence of sex has been removed, is guilty of a misdemeanor; provided, however, that the right of possession for the purpose of propagation shall first be obtained by a permit, in writing, from the Board of Fish Commissioners of the State of California.

Hunting Methods.

It is unlawful to use a shotgun of larger calibre than No. 10 gauge.

Trespass.

It is unlawful to shoot upon any enclosed or cultivated grounds which are private property, where signs are displayed forbidding shooting.

Transportation.

Any railroad company, express or transportation company or common carrier, or any person who shall transport or take out of this State, or receive for this purpose any deer, deer skin, buck, doe, fawn, or any quail, part-

COLORADO.

General Regulations.

It is unlawful to at any time or in any manner hunt or
kill any bison, buffalo, elk, deer, antelope, mountain
sheep or beaver, or any of the following wild birds, viz.:
Turkey, prairie chicken, sage chicken, grouse, quail,
pheasant, partridge, ptarmigan, duck, goose, brant, swan,
waterfowl, pigeon, dove, snipe or curlew; or to sell, offer
for sale or have the same in possession, except as per-
mitted by this act; Provided, the prohibition in this sec-
tion as to beaver shall not extend to such beaver as inter-
fere with the operation or maintenance of any canal,
ditch or lawful dam.

Hunting on Land of Another.

No person shall shoot from a public highway at game,
or hunt game in any enclosure not public land, without
the consent of the owner or person in charge of the
same, or hunt in any park or preserve licensed under this
act without the consent of the proprietor or person in
charge of the same.

Sex.

No person shall have in possession or transport the
carcass of any game quadruped or any considerable por-
tion of such carcass unless the same has thereon the
natural evidence of its sex sufficient to enable such sex
to be readily determined by ordinary inspection.

Baiting with Game.

It shall be unlawful to use any wild game mentioned
in this act for the purpose of baiting any trap.

Deer, Antelope.

Open season for deer having horns and antelopes having
horns is from August 15 to November 5.

Elk.

Open season for elk having horns is from October 25 to November 5.

Wild Turkeys, Prairie Chickens, Sage Chickens, Grouse.

Open season for wild turkeys, prairie chickens, sage chickens and grouse is from August 15 to October 31.

Water Fowl.

Open season for wild ducks, geese, snipes, curlews, brants, swans, cranes and water fowls is from September 1 to April 15, except in altitudes exceeding 7,000 feet above sea level, where the open season shall begin September 15.

Wild Pigeons, Doves.

Open season for wild pigeons and doves is from July 15 to September 30.

Method of Hunting.

No game shall be hunted or killed in the night, nor with a steel or hard pointed bullet, nor with any weapon other than an ordinary shoulder gun or pistol. Provided, That dogs, blinds, sinks and decoys may be used for hunting birds, and that the provisions of this section in relation to game quadrupeds shall not apply to those in parks licensed for the keeping and propagation of the same.

Export of Game requires permit.

No railroad company, express company, or other public carrier, nor any agent, shall receive or store for transportation, or transport into, or within this State any game, except when there is attached thereto a proper and valid certificate or permit signed by the commissioner, authorizing transportation.

Possession.

No game or fish shall be held in possession by any person for more than five days after the close of the season

for killing the same, except as in this act otherwise provided. (Commissioner may give permit to hold game for 90 days.)

Amounts.

The right given by this section to take or kill game is limited to food purposes, and to fifty ducks and twenty-five other birds, for each person in any one calendar day, and no person shall take, kill or have in possession in any one season more than one elk, and one deer and one antelope; or, instead of one deer and one antelope, he may have either two deer or two antelope. Nor shall any person have in possession at any one time more than one hundred ducks and fifty other birds.

CONNECTICUT.

Woodcock, Quail, Ruffed Grouse (called Partridge), Gray Squirrel.

It is unlawful to kill or have in possession any of the above between December 1 and October 1 of the following year, or for any person or persons to destroy or disturb eggs or nests of these birds.

Ruffed Grouse.

No person shall kill more than 5 of these birds in one day, or 36 in one year.

Hare, Rabbits.

It is unlawful to kill any hare or rabbit between December 15 and October 15. Use of ferrets on premises of another forbidden.

Rail, Sora.

It is unlawful to kill any sora (called rail) in the counties of Litchfield, Fairfield and New Haven between January 1 and August 20, and in all other counties between January 1 and September 1. Any person killing more than 75 of these birds in one day shall be fined.

Wild Fowl.

It is unlawful, and punishable by fine, to kill any wild duck, brant or goose in May, June, July or August, or to kill any of them except with an ordinary shoulder gun, or to shoot at any such fowl from a vessel propelled by steam or sails, or from any boat or structure attached thereto.

Exportation.

It is unlawful to kill at any time any ruffed grouse, woodcock or quail, for the purpose of conveying same beyond the limits of the State, or to convey same beyond said limits.

Mongolian Pheasant.

Killing forbidden until October 1, 1900.

Deer.

The killing of deer is prohibited until October 1, 1903.

DELAWARE.**Non-residents.**

It is unlawful for any non-resident to hunt or kill any quail, grouse, partridge, woodcock, rabbit or hare, ortolan, rail or reed bird without having a license from the Delaware Game Protective Association, Wilmington, Del. License fee for first year \$5.00 and \$2.00 per year thereafter.

Exportation.

It is unlawful for any one to ship or carry out of the State any partridge, quail, robin, woodcock or wild rabbit, dead or alive, for sale or for any other purpose, and it is unlawful for non-residents to carry out of the State, or from one county to another in the State, any Wilson or English snipe, quail, robin, woodcock, wild rabbit or any of these, dead or alive.

Wild Fowl Methods.

It is unlawful to kill any ducks on the marshes in the borders of the State at night (from one hour after sunset

Open Seasons.

Reed and rail birds, September 1 to February 1; partridge, quail, pheasant or rabbit, November 15 to December 31. Penalty for killing or having in possession outside of these dates, \$5 for each bird or rabbit. No close season on woodcock.

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

Game Birds.

It is unlawful to kill, expose for sale, or have in possession, any partridge, otherwise quail, between February 1 and November 1; woodcock, between January 15 and July 15; prairie chicken, otherwise pinnated grouse, between February 1 and September 1; ruffed grouse, otherwise known as pheasant, between December 26 and November 1, except the English ring neck pheasant, or other pheasants of foreign origin; wild turkey, between December 26 and November 1; rabbit except the species known as the English rabbit or squirrel, between February 1 and November 1; any snipe or plover, between May 1 and September 1; any wild duck, wild goose or brant, between May 1 and September 1; or any water rail or ortolan, reed bird or rice bird or marsh black-bird, between February 1 and August 20, or to shoot at or kill the same except on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, between August 21 and February 1.

Venison.

It is unlawful to expose for sale or have in possession any deer meat or venison between January 1 and September 1.

Birds not Game.

It is unlawful to expose for sale or have in possession,

dead, at any time, any turkey buzzard, wren, bluebird, humming bird, blue jay, robin or migrating thrush, wood or song bird, martin, mocking bird, swallow, oriole, red or cardinal bird, catbird, pewit, whippoorwill, goldfinch, sapsucker, hanging bird, woodpecker, crow, blackbird, or other insectivorous bird, save for scientific purposes upon permit from the superintendent of police of the District of Columbia, and excepting the English sparrow.

Wildfowling Methods.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any wild duck, wild goose, brant, or wild bird in the night time; nor kill or shoot at same with any other firearm, gun, or device than such as are habitually raised at arm's length and fired from the shoulder.

Sunday.

It is unlawful to hunt on Sunday.

FLORIDA.

Deer.

It is unlawful for any person or persons, except upon their own enclosed premises, to hunt or kill any wild deer except during the months of October, November, December and January of each year. The sale of wild deer or any part thereof is forbidden. Until January 1, 1905, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill more than five deer during any one year. Fire-hunting prohibited; also the use of artificial light.

Wild Turkey, Quail, Partridge.

It is unlawful for any person to hunt or kill, except on his own enclosed premises, any wild turkey, quail or partridge, except from November 1 to March 1 of any year. No person shall kill, except upon his own enclosed premises, more than four turkeys and no more than twenty-five quail, and no party shall kill more than

Transportation.

Shipment of game animals or birds outside the limits of the county in which they were killed is prohibited, except that hunting parties may take their own game home with them in the State, but not for sale.

License.

Non-residents wishing to hunt in any county in this State shall first obtain a license from the clerk of the circuit court of the county in which he wishes to hunt, said license fee being \$10. This license is not transferable, and permits the licensee to hunt only as provided for in this act.

Other Birds.

It is unlawful to kill for sale or commercial purposes any birds of plume, viz.: crane, heron, curlew, ibis or egret.

GEORGIA.

Game Birds, Insectivorous or Song Birds, Doves.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any wild turkey, pheasant, partridge, quail or any insectivorous or singing bird, except English sparrows, crows, larks, rice birds, night hawks, wheat birds and doves, between March 15 and November 1; or to hunt or kill any dove between March 15 and August 15.

Nests.

It is unlawful for any person to remove from the nests or destroy the eggs of any of the birds protected, during the periods they are so protected.

Deer.

It is unlawful to hunt, kill or capture any wild deer or fawn between January 1 and September 1.

Sale of Game.

It is unlawful to sell, offer for sale, or have in possession any game bird or animal, or any part of either, whether dead or alive, during the periods in which they are protected.

IDAHO.**Moose, Caribou.**

It is unlawful to kill or destroy any moose or caribou at any time during the period of five years from and after the passage of this act (1899).

Mountain Sheep, Mountain Goat, Deer, Antelope.

It is unlawful to kill, or destroy any deer, antelope, mountain sheep or mountain goat, between January 1 and September 1 of each year; or to take more than four of any such animals during the time they may lawfully be killed in any one year.

Elk.

It is unlawful to kill or destroy an elk, except between September 1 and December 1 of any year, or to take more than two elk between the dates mentioned.

Beaver.

It is unlawful to kill or trap beaver or kitten beaver for a period of five years from and after the approval of this act (1899).

Sale.

It is unlawful to buy or sell the hides of any of the animals mentioned in any of the preceding sections.

Dogs.

It is unlawful to hunt or chase with dogs any of the animals mentioned in the preceding section.

Quail.

It is unlawful to kill, trap or destroy any quail except between October 31 and December 1 of each year.

Birds.

It is unlawful to kill, trap or destroy any partridge, pheasant, grouse, prairie chicken, sage hen or fool hen except between August 15 and December 1 of each year: Provided, That no Mongolian pheasant shall be killed, ensnared, trapped or destroyed for a period of three years after the passage of this act (1899).

Water Fowl.

It is unlawful to kill or destroy any wild duck, goose or swan between March 1 and August 15 of each year.

Transportation.

It is unlawful for any railway, express company, or other public carrier, or any of their agents to receive or have in their possession for transportation any of the animals or birds, protected by the laws of this State, or to transport the same after the passage of this act; except that nothing in this act shall prevent shipping or transporting mounted heads or stuffed birds or animals to any point within the State, provided that such birds or animals were lawfully killed.

ILLINOIS.

Deer, Wild Turkey, Grouse, Prairie Chicken, Pheasant, Quail, Woodcock or Mourning Dove.

It is unlawful to kill or destroy any wild buck, doe or fawn, or wild turkey, between January 15 and September 1 of any year; or any pinnated or ruffed grouse, prairie chicken, pheasant or partridge, between October 1 and August 31 of the succeeding year; or any quail between December 20 and November 1 of the succeeding year; or any woodcock or mourning dove between December 1 and September 1 of the succeeding year.

Squirrel, Snipe, Plover.

It is unlawful to kill or destroy any grey, red, fox or black squirrel between December 15 and September 1 of each succeeding year; or any jack snipe, Wilson's snipe, sand snipe or any kind of snipe, or any golden plover, upland plover, yellow legged plover or any other kind of plover between April 25 and September 1 of each succeeding year.

Water Fowl.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any wild goose, duck, brant or other water fowl at any time between April 15 and September 1 of any year; or to hunt or kill any wild goose, brant, duck, rail or other water fowl between sunset of any day and sunrise of the next succeeding day; or to hunt water fowl from any fixed or artificial ambush beyond a natural covering of reeds, canes, flags, wild rice or other vegetation above the water of any lake, river, bay or inlet or other water course. The use of any small boat, sink-box or other device for the purpose of concealment, or of any steamboat or sailboat in hunting wild fowl is forbidden, also any gun other than a common shoulder gun; and provided, that the animals, fowls and birds mentioned in the following section shall not be killed for a period of five years from and after the taking effect of this act.

It is unlawful, for a period of five years from and after the passing of this act (1899) to injure, take, kill, expose or offer for sale or have in possession, except for breeding purposes, any wild buck, doe or fawn, ring-neck, Mongolian pheasant, green Japanese pheasant, English pheasant, copper pheasant or Scholmeringom, Trogapan pheasant, silver pheasant or golden pheasant, any Cacubis, chucker partridge, sand grouse or black India partridge.

Wild Birds.

It is unlawful to kill any wild bird other than a game bird, English sparrow, crow, crow-blackbird or chicken

For the purposes of this act the following only are considered game birds: Swans, geese, brant, river and sea ducks, rails, coots, mud-hens and gallinules, shore birds, plovers, surf birds, snipe, woodcock, sand-pipers, tattlers and curlews, wild turkeys, grouse, prairie chickens, pheasants, partridges, quails and mourning doves.

Nests of Wild Birds.

It is unlawful within the State of Illinois to take or needlessly destroy, or have in possession, the nest or the eggs of any wild game birds; provided, this act shall not apply to any person holding a certificate giving the right to take birds, and their nests and eggs, for scientific purposes.

License.

No person not a resident of the State of Illinois shall at any time hunt or kill, with gun, any of the wild animals, fowls or birds that are protected, without first having procured a license.

Non-resident License.

Non-residents shall not hunt any of the wild animals, fowls or birds that are protected during any part of the year, without first obtaining license, license fee being \$10, and 50 cents fee to Secretary of State, and such licensee is authorized to take from the State twenty-five birds of all kinds killed by himself, and such license shall be void after the 1st day of June next succeeding its issuance.

Hunting on Lands of Another.

It is unlawful to hunt with gun, dog or net within or upon the land of another without first obtaining permission so to do.

Export, Sale, Possession.

It is unlawful to sell, buy or have in possession during the time when netting or trapping is forbidden, any animals or birds that have been netted or trapped in violation of these Acts. It is also unlawful to sell or expose for sale at any time, or transport out of the State for any purpose, or in the State for purposes of sale, any of the following animals killed or entrapped in this State: Pinnated grouse, prairie chicken, quail, pheasant or ruffed grouse, wild turkey, or red, gray, fox or black squirrel, except such person have a license from the State so to do.

INDIANA.**Deer.**

It is unlawful to hunt or kill deer between January 1 and October 1, in any year.

Quail, Wild Turkey, Pheasant.

Netting or trapping of quail is forbidden. It is unlawful to shoot or have in possession any quails or pheasants between January 1 and November 10; or to kill any wild turkey between February 1 and November 1 of any year.

Prairie Chickens.

It is unlawful to kill prairie hens or chickens, between February 1 and September 1 in each year, or to net or trap same at any time.

Woodcock, Wild Duck.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any woodcock between January 1 and July 1; or any wild duck between April 15 and September 1, in any year.

Hunting on Land of Another.

Hunting on lands of another, without written consent of the owner or occupant thereof, is forbidden.

Sale of Game.

INDIAN TERRITORY.

Any person other than an Indian, who, within the limits of any tribe with whom the United States has treaties in existence, hunts, traps, destroys or takes any game or peltries, except for subsistence in the Indian county, shall forfeit all ammunition, guns and traps in his possession, used or procured to be used for that purpose, and all skins or pelts so taken, and shall be liable in addition to a \$500 penalty.

IOWA.

Wild Turkey or Ruffed Grouse.

Killing prohibited until January 1, 1900.

Close Seasons.

Prairie chicken or pinnated grouse, December 1 to September 1, following. Ruffed grouse, pheasant and quail between January 1 and November 1. Woodcock between January 1 and July 10. Wild duck, brant or goose between April 15 and September 1. Gray timber or fox squirrel between the first day of January and the first day of June.

Trespass.

No person shall hunt with dog or gun upon the cultivated or enclosed lands of another without permission of owner, occupant or agent thereof.

Wild Fowl Methods.

The use of any but a common shoulder gun is forbidden.

Exportation.

It is unlawful for any corporation or any private person to ship or carry out of the State of Iowa any of the Compliments of THE UNION METALLIC CARTRIDGE CO.

protected animals mentioned above. Shipment to any person within the State is permitted, but no person must ship more than one dozen birds in one day, provided that he shall make an affidavit before some authorized person that said game birds have been lawfully killed, bought or sold, and are not being transported for profit or sale. He must also give the name and post office address of the person to whom goods are shipped, and the number thereof.

Lawful Number—Killing for Sale.

The killing for sale or traffic of any ruffed grouse or pheasant, pinnated grouse or prairie chicken, quail or woodcock is prohibited. It is also unlawful for any one person to kill in any one day more than twenty-five of either kind of said birds, or to have more than twenty-five of either kind in possession at any one time unless lawfully received for transportation.

Shooting or killing quail in the public highway is forbidden.

KANSAS.

Birds—Open Season.

Grouse, prairie chicken, quail, during October and November.

Other Birds.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill, or trap any pheasant, oriole, meadow lark, robin, thrush, red bird, mocking bird, blue jay, turtle dove, yellow hammer or blue bird, except that the owner of an orchard may shoot any blue jays, orioles or yellow hammers at any time.

Sale and Transportation.

The barter or sale of any protected bird or birds is prohibited; also the shipment of same.

KENTUCKY.

According to the law of 1894, the killing of the following animals is forbidden during the time specified below:

Deer: Buck, doe or fawn, between March 1 and September 1. Wild fowl: Wild goose, wild duck, teal or other wild goose, between April 1 and August 15. Squirrel: Black, gray or fox squirrel, between February 1 and June 15; gray squirrel may be killed for protection of crops. Wild turkey, between February 1 and September 1; woodcock, between February 1 and June 20; quail, partridge or pheasant, between January 1 and November 15; dove, between February 1 and August 1.

Other Birds.

Meadow larks, thrush, martin, finch, swallow, flicker, red bird, oriole, woodpecker, tanager, catbird or other song or insectivorous birds are protected at all times except when destroying crops.

LONG ISLAND.

These laws to apply to Kings, Queens, Nassau and Suffolk Counties on Long Island Sound only.

Wild Fowl.

Web-footed wild fowl shall not be killed or possessed from the first day of May to the thirtieth day of September, both inclusive; nor shall the same be killed between sunset and daylight; nor shall the same be killed or caught in any way, save with gun raised at arm's length and fired from the shoulder without other rest; nor from any boat other than a boat propelled by hand or floating device; such fowls caught or killed shall not be brought to the shore, sold or possessed. The use of floating devices in hunting web-footed wild fowl on Long Island and waters adjacent thereto is prohibited. Floating devices may be used for the purpose of shooting web-footed wild fowl therefrom in Long Island Sound, Great South Bay west of Smith's Point, Shinnecock and Peconic bays, and in any part of said counties said birds may be pursued and killed from boats propelled by hand, and from any sailboats in Long Island Sound, Gardiner and Peconic bays.

Plover and Other Birds.

Plover, curlew, jack snipe, bittern, Wilson's (commonly known as English) snipe, yellow legs, killdeer, willet snipe, dowitcher, short-necks, rail, sand-piper, bay snipe, surf snipe, winter snipe, ring-necks and oxeye: shall not be killed or possessed except from the first day of July to the thirty-first day of December, both inclusive.

Black and Gray Squirrels.

Black and gray squirrels shall not be killed or possessed, except from the first day of November to the thirty-first day of December, both inclusive.

Meadow Hens.

Meadow hens, mud hens, gallinule or water chicken or grebe shall not be killed or possessed from the thirty-first day of December to the fifteenth day of August, both inclusive.

Woodcock, Quail, Grouse.

Ruffed grouse, commonly known as partridge, or any member of the grouse family or quail shall not be hunted or killed from January 1 to October 31, both inclusive. Woodcock shall not be hunted or killed from January 1 to July 31, inclusive. Nor shall either of such birds be possessed, dead or alive, or sold after the fifth day of January, and possession thereof during the first five days of January is forbidden, unless it be proved by the possessor or seller that said birds were killed within the lawful period for killing the same on Long Island.

Hares and Rabbits.

Hares and rabbits shall not be shot at, hunted or killed, nor, except in that portion of Long Island which is embraced in the territory of the City of New York, shall they be possessed, except from November 1 to December 31, inclusive. The use of ferrets in the hunting of rabbits is hereby prohibited.

Deer.

Shooting at, hunting with dogs or otherwise, or killing deer is prohibited on Long Island, except during the first two Wednesdays and the first two Fridays in the month of November, in each year. Wild deer or venison shall not be possessed or sold except between August 15 and November 20; and possession thereof, between August 15 and the lawful day for killing deer in November, and between November 15 and November 20, is prohibited and shall be deemed a violation of this section unless it be proved by the possessor or seller that such deer or venison was killed within the lawful period for killing the same, or out of the State.

LOUISIANA.**Deer.**

It is unlawful to kill any wild deer or fawn between March 1 and October 1.

Quail, Partridge or Pheasant.

Close seasons between April 1 and October 1.

Wild Turkey.

Close seasons between April 15 and October 1.

MAINE.**Moose and Deer.**

It is unlawful at any time to hunt, kill or have in possession any cow or calf moose; and the term "calf moose" shall mean that these animals are calves until they are at least one year old, and have at least two prongs or tines to their horns. It is unlawful, between December 1 and October 15, to hunt or kill any bull moose, and no person shall, between October 15 and December 1, hunt or kill, or have in possession more than one bull moose or part thereof. No person shall, within six years from October 15, 1899, in any manner hunt or kill, or have in possession any caribou or parts thereof.

One Deer for Food in September.

It is lawful, from September 1 to October 1, of each year, to kill one deer, for food purposes only, to be consumed in the locality where taken, by the person taking the same, in either of the counties of Oxford, Franklin, Somerset, Piscataquis, Penobscot, Aroostook, Hancock or Washington, such person having first procured a license therefor, on payment of \$6 by a non-resident, and \$4 by a resident of this State; but it shall be unlawful for non-residents of the State to take a deer as provided in this section, or to enter upon the wild lands of this State with intent to camp and kindle fires thereon, while engaged in hunting or fishing, without being in charge of a registered guide, during the months of June, July, August, September and October; provided that the provisions of this section shall not apply to any person who while hunting or fishing, stop at any hunting or fishing camp, which is owned or under the control of any registered guide or registered camp owner.

Deer in Certain Counties.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any deer in either of the counties of York, Cumberland, Androscoggin or Sagadahoc, for four years from October 1, 1899, and it is unlawful to hunt or kill any deer in the counties of Knox, Lincoln, and Waldo, except during the month of October

Sunday is a close time, on which it is not lawful to hunt, kill or destroy game or birds of any kind.

Transportation.

No person or corporation shall carry or transport from place to place any moose or deer, or part thereof, in close time nor in open time unless open to view, tagged and plainly labeled with the name and residence of the owner thereof, and accompanied by him; but nothing herein shall apply to the transportation of moose or deer by any person or corporation when such game is lawfully tagged in accordance with the provisions of Section 26. Section 26. Any person who has lawfully killed a moose (or a deer, except in September as heretofore provided), may send the same to his home or to any hospital in the State, without accompanying the same, by purchasing of the duly constituted agent therefor a tag, paying for a moose \$5, for a deer \$2, and fifty cents for a pair of game birds. Whoever lawfully kills a bull moose shall, while the same or any part thereof is being transported, preserve and transport it with the evidence on the moose of the sex of the same.

Partridge, Woodcock, Ducks and Other Birds.

It shall be unlawful to hunt, kill or have in possession any wood duck, dusky duck, commonly called black duck, teal, and gray duck, between May 1 and September 1 of each year; or any ruffed grouse, commonly called partridge, or woodcock, from December 1 to September 15; any quail from December 1 to October 1; any plover or snipe from May 1 to August 1. No person shall, in any one day, kill or have in possession more than 15 of each variety of the above named birds.

except plover and snipe, during the respective open season for each; nor shall any person, at any time, kill or have in possession any ruffed grouse commonly called partridge, except for his own consumption in this State, except as hereinafter provided; nor shall any person at any time sell, or offer for sale, any ruffed grouse, commonly called partridge; nor shall any person or corporation carry or transport at any one time more than 15 of any one variety of the birds above named as the property of one person; and it is unlawful for a term of ten years to hunt or kill the capercaillie, or cock of the woods, so called, black game, so called, or any species of the pheasant, except ruffed grouse or partridge. It is unlawful to kill or have in possession any birds commonly known as larks, robins, swallows, sparrows, woodpeckers, or orioles, or other insectivorous birds (crows, English sparrows, and hawks excepted). It is unlawful to take any wild duck of any variety, quail, ruffed grouse, or partridge, woodcock, or any bird, except by the usual method of sporting with fire arms. It is unlawful to kill in any manner any wild duck of any variety on the Kennebec River or on the shores thereof, south of the Gardiner and Randolph bridge, or on Merrymeeting Bay, or the shores thereof, between sunset and daylight of the following morning; and to hunt, kill, or destroy any wild duck, at any time, with the aid of jack-lights, or any artificial light.

Mink, Sable, Muskrat, Fisher and Beaver.

It is unlawful between May 1 and October 15 to hunt or kill any mink, sable, muskrat, or fisher, excepting, however, that it shall be lawful to kill muskrats in Lily pond in the towns of Rockport and Camden, and also such muskrats as interfere at any time with the operation and maintenance of any canal, ditch, lawful dam, or cranberry bog. Whoever at any time kills or destroys any beaver, except upon written permission of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, shall be fined.

No person shall kill or have in his possession, except alive, any bird commonly known as tern.

Deer.

Close time on deer on the island of Isle Au Haut for six years from October 1, 1899.

MARYLAND.**NUMEROUS LOCAL LAWS PREVAIL.****Game Birds, Rabbits—General Laws.**

It is unlawful to kill any quail or partridge, American, English or Mongolian pheasant, ruffed grouse or wild turkey in Garrett County between January 1 and November 1, or any rabbits from February 1 to November 1 in Garrett and Allegany counties. It is unlawful to kill any partridge, wild turkey or quail between January 1 and November 1, or any woodcock between January 1 and September 1. It is unlawful to kill any of the above named birds or game animals in the counties of Howard, Baltimore, Washington, Frederick, Montgomery, Calvert, Prince George's, Charles, Kent, Talbot and Caroline between the twenty-fourth day of December and the first of November, and in the counties of Harford, Montgomery, St. Mary's, Queen Anne's, Cecil and Anne Arundel, it is unlawful to kill any quail or partridge, pheasant or rabbit between December 24 and November 10 following. It is unlawful to kill any of the above mentioned birds or game animals in the counties of Dorchester, Wicomico, Somerset or Worcester between February 1 and November 10; provided, however, that it shall be lawful in all the counties of the State to shoot woodcock during the month of July.

Squirrels.

It is unlawful to kill any squirrels between December 1 and September 1 following. This does not apply to counties of Garrett and Allegany.

Wild Fowl.

It is unlawful to kill any wild ducks, except blackhead ducks, wild brant, wild swan, wild goose, between April 10 and November 1; provided that it shall not be lawful in Charles County to kill any acorn or summer duck between April 10 and October 1; and provided, further, that this section shall not apply to Worcester County, and that nothing contained in this act is intended to interfere with, or in any manner repeal the Public Local Laws of Cecil and Harford counties regulating the shooting of wildfowl in those parts of the waters of the Susquehanna River and Chesapeake Bay, commonly called the Susquehanna Flats.

Doves.

It is unlawful to kill any doves between December 24 and August 15 following.

Snipe, Plover.

It is unlawful to kill any snipe or plover between May 1 and August 15; provided, however, that this shall not apply to Worcester County.

Water Rail, Oortolan, Reed Bird, Rail Bird, Rice Bird.

It is unlawful to kill any water rail, ortolan, reed bird, rail bird or rice bird between November 1 and September 1 following.

Birds Not Game.

It is unlawful to kill, at any time, any wren, humming-bird, sparrow, turkey buzzard, blue bird, blue jay, migratory or other thrush, martin, wood robin, mocking bird, red-breasted robin, catbird, oriole, lark, swallows, red bird, pewit, indigo bird, chewink, sapsucker, gold finch, cedar bird, whip-poor-will, yellow-breasted chat, mackerel gull or herring gull, or gull of any description; provided, however, that it shall not be unlawful at any time to kill the hawk or other birds destructive to domestic poultry, or the English sparrow, crow or black-bird, and that this law shall not apply to St. Mary's and

Calvert counties, and that it shall be lawful to have mockingbirds or red birds, or other song birds, in cages, or stuffed specimens of any of these birds in educational institutions or public or private museums.

Shoulder Gun Only.

No person shall shoot at or kill any of the birds or game animals mentioned above, with any other kind of gun than that which is raised at arm's length from the shoulder, and it is unlawful to use, sell, or have in possession, any big or swivel gun, for the purpose of shooting at or killing any swan, wild brant, geese, wild ducks or other water fowl.

Night Shooting.

Night shooting of birds is prohibited.

Wild Fowl on Feeding Grounds.

It is unlawful, at any time, to shoot at or in any way disturb wild ducks, wild swan, wild brant, wild geese or other water fowl of any kind, while on their feeding or roosting grounds.

Weasel, Ferret.

The use of weasels or ferrets is forbidden.

Eggs.

It is unlawful, at any time, to molest or destroy the nests or eggs of any of the above mentioned birds, except those of hawks, crows, blackbirds, English sparrows or other birds destructive of domestic poultry and game birds.

Scientific Purposes.

Any person above the age of eighteen years shall be allowed, for scientific purposes only, to kill birds or mammals or collect eggs, provided said person shall have obtained a certificate in writing from the State Game Warden.

Local Laws.

And be it enacted that all acts or parts of acts, and all sections and parts of sections of the Code, both of General and Local Laws, now in force in the State of Maryland, inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed; provided nothing in this act shall in any manner affect the Public Local Laws for Kent, Talbot, St. Mary's, Calvert and Harford, also Allegany, Somerset, Worcester, Caroline, Prince George's, Cecil, Frederick, Charles, Dorchester, Montgomery, Queen Anne's, Carroll, Washington and Wicomico counties relating to game and wildfowl, but that the Local Laws shall remain in full force in said counties, respectively.

MASSACHUSETTS.

It is a misdemeanor to hunt or kill deer within this State prior to the first day of November, 1903.

Pinnated Grouse, Ruffed Grouse, Partridge, Quail, Woodcock, Wild Fowl.

It is a misdemeanor to kill a pinnated grouse at any time, or a woodcock or ruffed grouse (called partridge) between January 1 and September 15; quail, between January 1 and October 15; or wood or summer duck, black duck or teal, or any of the duck species, between April 15 and September 1. Punishable by fine of \$20.

Flover, Snipe, Sandpiper, Rail, Shore, Marsh or Beach Birds.

It is a misdemeanor to take or kill any of these birds between May 1 and July 15.

Wild or Passenger Pigeon, Gull or Tern.

It is a misdemeanor to kill or shoot any of these between May 1 and October 1. Fine, \$10.

Wild Fowl Methods.

It is a misdemeanor to pursue any wild fowl with any

vessel other than a boat propelled by means of sails, oars or paddles; also to kill wild fowl or any of the so-called shore, marsh or beach birds with a swivel or pivot gun, or by use of torch, jack or artificial light.

Export of Game.

It is a misdemeanor, punishable by fine, to take or send beyond the limits of this Commonwealth any woodcock, quail or ruffed grouse.

Gray Squirrel, Rabbit, Hare.

It is a misdemeanor to kill any of these between March 1 and September 15.

Mongolian, English or Golden Pheasant.

Unlawful to kill or take any of these except for propagation until 1900.

Sunday Close Time.

It is unlawful to kill, maim, or discharge and firearms at on Sunday.

MICHIGAN.

Partridge, Quail, Spruce Hen, Snipe, Woodcock, Plover.

Open season for partridge, quail, spruce hen, snipe, woodcock and plover, from October 20 to November 30, both inclusive, except in the Upper Peninsula, where the open season for hunting partridge is from October 1 to November 30, both inclusive.

Prairie Chickens.

Close season on prairie chickens until the year 1902.

Ducks, Geese, Brant and Other Wild Water Fowl.

Wild ducks, geese, brant and other wild water fowl may be killed from one-half hour before sunrise until one and one-half hours after sunset, from September 1 to January 31. Blue bill, canvas back, widgeon, pin-tail, whist-

ler, spoon-bill, butter ball, saw-bill ducks and wild geese may be killed from September 1 until May 1, following thereafter. The open season for killing wild ducks, wild geese, brant and other wild water fowl in the Upper Peninsula is from September until January 15, following thereafter.

Wild Pigeon, Mongolian and English Pheasants, Doves.

Wild pigeon, Mongolian and English pheasants are protected until the year 1905. It is unlawful to kill mourning doves at any time.

Song or Insectivorous Birds.

The killing of song or insectivorous birds of any kind is unlawful.

Sale of Game Birds.

The sale of partridges, quail or woodcock is prohibited absolutely.

Deer.

Open season for hunting deer in any portion of the State except Alcona, Lapeer, Huron, Sanilac, Tuscola, Macomb, Allegon, Ottawa and St. Clair counties, November 8 to November 30, both inclusive. All hunters must be provided with a license to hunt deer. The resident license fee is 75 cents. Non-residents must take out a non-resident license, the fee for which is \$25. It is unlawful to make use of dogs in hunting or pursuing deer, and the presence of a hound in a hunting camp or club house during the hunting season is made prima facie evidence of guilt. Five days are allowed hunters to get their deer out of the woods after the close of the hunting season, after which it is a violation for transportation companies to transport or have them in possession.

Moose, Elk, Caribou.

Are protected until 1909.

Wild Turkey.

Are protected until the year 1905.

Fox, Squirrel.

Open season for hunting fox, black and grey squirrels, October 1 to December 31, both inclusive.

MINNESOTA.**Elk, Deer.**

It is unlawful to kill any elk, fawn, deer, at any time, except that deer may be killed between November 1 and November 20; but no person shall kill more than five deer in any one season; provided, that deer lawfully killed may be had in possession five days after the time herein limited for killing the same. It is unlawful to ship any elk, moose, caribou, or deer, except the same is in the control of and accompanied by some person in charge thereof other than an employee of a common carrier. It is unlawful for any person to ship more than five of any such animals in any one year from and after November 5.

Moose, Caribou.

It is unlawful to hunt, catch, ship or have in possession or under control at any time, any moose or caribou, except that antlered moose and antlered caribou may be killed between November 5 and November 10 in the same year. It is unlawful to kill more than one moose and one caribou in any one season. When any male moose or male caribou have been lawfully killed they may be had in possession for five days after the time herein limited for killing the same.

Lawful Methods.

It is unlawful to kill any deer, moose or caribou in any other manner than by shooting them with a gun held to the shoulder; it is also unlawful to hunt them with dogs, or to set any snare, trap, contrivance or device what-

ever, or to make use of any artificial light or other deception.

Export.

It is unlawful to at any time catch, take, kill or have in possession or under control any elk, deer, moose or caribou, or any part thereof, with intent to ship the same beyond the limits of the State, or with intent to allow or aid in their shipment out of the State.

Trespass.

No person shall at any time enter into any growing or standing grain not his own with intent to catch, recover, take or kill any bird or animal, nor permit any dog with which he may be hunting to do so for such purpose without permission from the owner or person in charge thereof.

Birds.

It is unlawful to kill or have in possession at any time any whippoorwill, night-hawk, bluebird, finch, thrush, linnnet, lark, wren, martin, swallow, bobolink, robin, catbird or any other harmless bird, except blackbirds, crows, hawks and English sparrows, except as hereinafter allowed (but nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the keeping of songbirds as domestic pets).

Game Birds.

It is unlawful to kill any turtle dove, snipe, prairie chicken or pinnated grouse, white-breasted or sharp-tailed grouse, between November 1 and September 1, following; or any quail, partridge, ruffed grouse or pheasant, between December 1 and October 1, following; or woodcock, upland plover between October 31 and July 4 following; or any Mongolian, English or Chinese pheasant at any time prior to September 1, 1904.

Wild Fowl.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill wild ducks of any variety, or any variety of wild goose, brant, or any variety of aquatic fowl whatever, between January 1 and September 1 following. It is unlawful to sell, expose for sale or have in possession any of the said waterfowl between January 1 and April 15; except that when the birds mentioned have been lawfully caught or killed within the time herein allowed, they may be had in possession ten days after the time hereinbefore limited for use as herein specified and not otherwise.

Lawful Methods.

It is unlawful to at any time kill any of the birds mentioned in any other manner than by shooting them with a gun held to the shoulder; and it is unlawful to use any trap, snare, net, birdlime, swivel gun or any contrivance or device whatever, or to make use of any artificial light, battery or other deception, except that decoys and blinds may be used in hunting wild geese, ducks and brant, and it is unlawful to hunt or shoot from any boat, canoe or contrivance or device whatever on any waters in this State between dark and daylight, or to shoot from any floating battery, sink box or sunken tub, or any similar device.

Export Forbidden.

It is unlawful to kill or have in possession any of the birds mentioned, with intent to ship the same beyond the limits of the State or to allow or aid in their shipment.

License.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any deer, elk, caribou or moose without having in possession a license so to do. License fee for non-residents \$25. License fee for residents 25 cents. License to be good for one year from the date of issuance.

MISSISSIPPI.

Hunting on Lands of Another.

If any person shall knowingly hunt or fish on the lands of another, against the wish of the owner or occupant, he shall be fined.

The Boards of Supervisors have authority to regulate the times and the places in which and the circumstances under which game may be taken. There is no general State Law.

Sunday Shooting.

Hunting or killing any game or birds on Sunday is unlawful.

MISSOURI.

Deer.

It is unlawful to kill any deer under one year of age, or any deer of any age between January 1 and October 1, or any doe until 1900.

Wild, Song or Insectivorous Birds.

It is unlawful to kill any wild, song or insectivorous birds at any season of the year, or rob or destroy the nests, or take eggs therefrom.

Wild Turkey, Pinnated Grouse, Prairie Chicken, Ruffed Grouse.

It is unlawful to kill any of these or any quail between January 1 and November 1, or any woodcock, turtle dove, meadow lark or plover between January 1 and August 1, or to injure or destroy any of the above by means of traps, pens or pits.

Wild Duck.

Killing wild duck is forbidden between April 1 and October 1. Snaring, trapping or killing by means of any explosive any wild geese or ducks, or shooting or killing same between sunset and sunrise, is forbidden, providing that persons may trap, snare or net wild ducks or geese on their own premises for their own use.

Non-residents.

It is a misdemeanor for same to kill any deer, fawn, pinnated grouse, wild turkey, ruffed grouse, quail, woodcock, goose, brant, duck or snipe, coon, mink, otter, beaver, bear, muskrat, or other furred animal.

Shipping Game.

It is unlawful until 1900 to ship from the county where killed to any other counties in the State or to any point outside the State, any pinnated grouse, prairie chickens, quail, deer or turkey.

Imported Game.

The following game is protected until 1900: California, valley or mountain quail or partridge, Mexican or Texas quail or partridge, or any variety of Messena or Montezuma partridge.

MONTANA.**Elk, Buffalo, Quail, Chinese Pheasant, Beaver or Mountain Sheep.**

It is a misdemeanor, punishable by fine or imprisonment, to shoot or kill, at any time, these animals.

Moose, Elk.

It is a misdemeanor, punishable by fine or imprisonment, to shoot or kill, between November 15 and September 15 of the following year, any moose or elk, or, in a single season, to shoot or kill more than two moose or elk.

Deer, Antelope, Rocky Mountain Goat.

It is a misdemeanor, punishable by fine or imprisonment, to shoot or kill, between January 1 and September 1, these animals, or, in a single calendar year, to shoot or kill more than six of any of them. Hunting any of the above animals with dogs is punishable with fine or imprisonment.

Grouse, Prairie Chicken, Pool Hen, Sage Hen, Pheasant, Partridge.

It is a misdemeanor, punishable by fine or imprisonment, to shoot or kill, between December 15 and August 15 of

the following year, these birds, or to kill, in a single day, more than twenty of any or all of them.

Wild Geese, Wild Ducks, Brants or Swans.

It is a misdemeanor, punishable by fine or imprisonment, to shoot or kill these birds between May 1 and September 1 of the same year.

Meadow Lark, Robin, Blue Bird, Thrush, Oriole, Woodpecker, Mocking Bird, Goldfinch, Snow-Bird, Cedar Bird or Starling.

It is forbidden to shoot or kill any small singing birds such as the above.

Buffalo, Elk, Moose.

It is a misdemeanor, punishable by heavy fine and imprisonment, to catch or trap, for the purpose of sale, domestication or any other purpose, any of these animals.

Wild Fowls.

It is a misdemeanor, punishable by fine and imprisonment, to wilfully destroy the nests or remove the eggs from same, of any of the birds or wild fowls mentioned in any of these Acts.

Transportation and Sale of Game.

Railroad companies and their agents, and public carriers of all sorts, are forbidden to transport out of the State, game taken or killed contrary to the provisions of this Act, or at a time other than in open season. It is a misdemeanor to sell any such game during close season.

NEBRASKA.

Deer, Antelope, Elk.

It is unlawful to kill any deer, antelope or elk between January 1 and November 1, or to ensnare any of the above, except for purposes of domestication, at any time of the year.

Game Birds.

It is unlawful to kill any ruffed grouse or pinnated grouse, prairie chicken, sharp-tailed grouse, dusky grouse or

other grouse between January 1 and September 1, or to ensnare, net or trap same at any time of the year. It is unlawful to kill any quail or wild turkey between January 1 and November 1, or to net, ensnare or trap same at any time of the year.

Wild Fowl.

It is unlawful to kill any wild goose, brant, wild mallard duck, wood duck, teal duck, shoveller or spoon-bill duck, canvas-back duck, red-head duck, blue-bill or scaup duck, widgeon or bald-pate duck, gadwall or gray duck, dusky or black duck, buffle-headed or butter-ball duck, pin or sprig-tail duck, ruddy or turkey-tail duck, or any other wild duck, or any Wilson jack-snipe or woodcock between May 1 and September 1, or to net, snare or trap, or wade or use blinds to kill any of the above birds at any time of the year, or to kill same at night, or to use any but a common shoulder gun, or any punt or sneak boat. Eggs and nests protected.

Exportation.

It is unlawful for any person or transportation company to ship for sale, or ship any game that has been sold, any protected animal or part thereof in or out of the State.

NEVADA.

The shipment of game from the State of Nevada is prohibited. The close season for all game birds is from April 1 to September 1, with a few exceptions.

NEW HAMPSHIRE.

Moose, Caribou and Wild Deer.

If any person shall, between the date of the passage of this Act (February 16, 1897) and September 15, 1901, capture or destroy any moose or caribou within this State, or shall, within the above dates, capture or destroy any wild deer, except in Carroll and Coos Counties, and the eastern and western judicial districts of Grafton County,

Song and Insectivorous Birds.

The killing of the following birds is prohibited at all
times: robin, thrush, lark, blue-bird, sparrow (except
English sparrow), finch, bunting, martin, oriole, swallow,
flycatcher, warbler, nuthatch, or any other song or in-
sectivorous bird, or to remove or disturb the eggs or the
nests of same.

Other Birds—Close Season.

Plover, yellow-legs, sandpiper, duck (except shelldrake),
rail, February 1 to August 1; woodcock, ruffed grouse,
partridge or quail December 15 to September 15. It is a
misdemeanor to kill for the purpose of selling, or expos-
ing for sale any woodcock, ruffed grouse, or partridge
after September 15, or during the months of October,
November and December, or plover during the months
of August to January, inclusive, of the following year,
except for consumption as food in the State.

Beaver.

The killing of beaver is prohibited until January 1, 1902,
under fine of \$50 for each beaver taken or killed before
that time.

Sable, Otter or Fisher.

Close season April 1 to October 15.

Gray Squirrel and Raccoon.

Close season between January 1 and September 15.

Hares, Rabbits, Muskrats.

Close season April 1 and September 15. The use of ferrets in hunting these animals is forbidden.

Eagles.

It is unlawful, for a period of three years from and after the passage of this act (1899), to kill any American or bald eagle.

NEW JERSEY.**Lawful Method of Taking Game.**

It is a misdemeanor to hunt, either upon private or other grounds, any game of any kind, in any manner, except with dog and gun, the gun being such as may be held at arm's length and fired from the shoulder. Penalty \$50.00.

Deer.

It is unlawful to kill or have in possession any wild deer, buck, fawn or doe, except between October 25 and November 5, inclusive.

Hare, Rabbit, Quail.

It is unlawful to kill, injure or have in possession any of these except between November 10 and January 1, inclusive.

Game Birds—Open Season.

It is lawful to hunt or kill any woodcock in July, and also between October 1 and December 10; gray snipe, during March, April and September; ruffed grouse (called partridge), pheasant, European pheasant, European partridge and European grouse, between October 1 and December 10, inclusive; reed bird, rail bird or marsh hen, between August 25 and January 1.

Gray, Black or Fox Squirrel.

Open season is during September, and also between November 10 and December 10, inclusive.

Upland Plover, Dove.

It is unlawful to kill or injure, or have in possession, any grass or upland plover or dove, except during August and September.

Other Birds.

It is unlawful to kill, injure or catch, or have in possession, any night hawk, whip-poor-will, thrush, meadow-lark, finch, martin, barn-swallow, woodpecker, robin, oriole, red or cardinal bird, cedar bird, tanager or other insectivorous bird, except English sparrow, crane, hawk, crows, ravens, crow-blackbirds, kingfisher or redwinged blackbirds, which may be killed at any time.

Wild Fowl Methods.

It is unlawful for any person when hunting geese, duck, brant, or other web-footed wild fowl, to place the boat or sink-box, or other floating vessel, in which he lies in wait, at a distance of more than one hundred feet from ice, or from marsh or meadow, banked or heaped seaweed not covered with water at high tide; the said boat or float to be attached to marsh or meadow by a line. It is unlawful for any person to kill or catch any web-footed wild fowl between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, or to shoot or to pursue any of the same from any vessel propelled by any means other than oars or paddles. It is also unlawful to kill or have in possession any goose, duck, brant, or such other web-footed wild fowl between May 1 and September 30.

Sunday.

It is unlawful to hunt with a dog and gun, or with a firearm or other weapon, or to carry a gun, in the woods or fields on Sunday.

Export of Game.

It is unlawful to remove, or attempt to remove from this State, any of the birds or game whose capture is prohibited.

In all cases where a person shall be convicted a second time, double the penalty shall be imposed upon him.

Ring-necked Pheasant.

It is unlawful, for three years after the passage of this act (March, 1899), to hunt or kill any ring-necked pheasant; provided, that this act shall not apply to any preserves for pheasants already established.

Trapping and Snaring Forbidden.

It is unlawful to have in possession, sell or offer for sale, any rabbit, quail, ruffed grouse, English pheasant, English partridge, English grouse, woodcock, reed bird, rail bird, grass or upland plover, marsh hen, duck, or any other game birds or animals, after the same has been caught or trapped by means of any snare, snood, net or trap.

Deer.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any deer, buck, doe or fawn, for a period of three years from the passage of this act (March 24, 1899); provided, that this act shall not apply to any preserve for deer at present established.

Certificate for Collection of Eggs and Nests.

Certificates will be issued by the New Jersey Board of Fish and Game Commissioners, to properly accredited persons, permitting them to collect birds and their nests and eggs for strictly scientific purposes.

Nests.

It is unlawful to rob or destroy the eggs or nests of any wild bird whatever.

Hounding.

Deer shall not be hunted, pursued or killed with any dog or bitch in this State for the term of five years from the fifteenth day of August, 1897. Dogs of the breed commonly used for hunting deer shall not be permitted by the owner, or person harboring the same, to run at large for or during the said term of five years in the forest where deer inhabit. The provisions of this section as to the close season shall not apply to Long Island. If any dog or bitch of the breed used for hunting deer shall be found hunting, pursuing or killing any deer or running at large in the forests of this State where deer inhabit, it shall be deemed prima facie evidence of the violation of the foregoing section by the person or persons owning, using, having or harboring such dog or bitch. Dogs, while chasing deer in violation of law, or any dog or bitch that will hunt, chase or pursue deer, may be killed by any person when found running at large in the forest of this State where deer inhabit, and it is the duty of every game protector and forester to kill all dogs when found running at large in violation of this Act, and no action for damage shall lie or be maintained against any person for such killing.

Squirrels, Hares and Rabbits.

Black and gray squirrels shall not be killed or possessed, except from September 1 to December 15, inclusive. In the counties of Livingston, Wyoming, Erie, Sullivan, Oneida, Orange, Schoharie, Montgomery, Fulton and Hamilton, Albany, Greene, Ulster and Columbia, hares and rabbits shall not be killed or possessed except from September 1 to December 15, inclusive. The use of ferrets is prohibited. The provisions of this section shall not apply to Long Island.

Mink, Skunk, Muskrat, Fox.

No person shall catch or kill within the counties of Cat-

Quail shall not be sold or possessed except during the months of November and December, but possession thereof during the month of December after expiration of close season is forbidden and shall be deemed a violation of this section unless it be proved by the possessor that said birds were killed within the lawful periods for killing the same, or outside the State and in the counties of Genesee and Montgomery at no time prior to January 1, 1903. The provisions of this section shall not apply to Robin's Island and Gardiner's Island.

Woodcock, Grouse.

Woodcock, or ruffed grouse, commonly known as partridge, or any member of the grouse family, shall not be caught or killed from December 16 to August 31, inclusive; or in the County of Oneida from November 16 to August 31st, inclusive; or in the County of Ulster, from December 16 to September 30, inclusive. No person shall kill, catch, or take alive more than thirty-six woodcock or thirty-six grouse in any open season. The provisions of this section shall not apply to Long Island.

Grouse, Woodcock, Quail, in Rensselaer County.

Woodcock, ruffed grouse, commonly known as partridge, or any member of the grouse family, shall not be caught or killed from December 16 to August 31, inclusive; or in the County of Oneida from November 16 to August 31st, inclusive; or in the County of Ulster, from December 16 to September 30, inclusive. Web-footed wild fowl must not be killed or caught in any way except with a common shoulder gun, nor with any but a boat propelled by hand or floating device, nor by the use of any blind or bough house at more than fifty feet from either shore or a natural growth of flags or grass. On the Hudson River, below the dam at Troy, boats propelled by hand may be used for shooting wild fowl.

Meadow Larks.

Meadow larks shall not be shot at, killed or possessed after they are dead at any time.

Mongolian Ring-necked Pheasant.

No person shall kill, expose for sale, or have in possession after the same has been killed, any Mongolian ring-necked pheasant prior to the year 1905, except in the County of Suffolk. Mongolian ring-necked pheasants shall not be killed in the County of Suffolk, except from October 1 to January 31, inclusive.

Shooting Game in Westchester County.

In the County of Westchester, no game of any kind shall be shot at or killed from any public highway, or from the track or lands of any railway company or from the lands purchased or condemned for the Croton aqueduct.

Deer.

Wild deer shall not be caught, shot at, hunted or killed except from the fifteenth day of August to the fifteenth day of November, both inclusive. No person shall kill

Wild deer or venison shall not be possessed or sold, except from the fifteenth day of August to the twentieth day of November, both inclusive; and possession thereof from the fifteenth day of November to the twentieth day of November, inclusive, is forbidden, and shall be deemed a violation of this section, unless it be proved by the possessor or seller that such deer or venison was killed within the lawful period for killing, or out of the State.

Fawns Not to Be Killed.

No fawns shall be caught or killed at any time in this State.

Transportation.

Any venison or deer killed in New York State may be transported to any point in or out of the State only as follows: One carcass or any part thereof may be shipped from the county where killed when accompanied by the owner. No person shall ship or accompany more than two deer in one year. This does not apply to the skin, head or feet of deer severed from the body.

Crusting and Yarding.

Deer shall not be hunted, killed or captured by what is commonly known as crusting, nor while they are yarded.

Wild Moose, Elk, Caribou and Antelope.

Wild moose, elk, caribou or antelope shall not be hunted, killed, possessed or sold at any time in this State; provided, however, that moose, elk, caribou and antelope may be possessed and transported into this State for breeding purposes; and it is further provided that the meat of any moose, elk, caribou or antelope may be pos-

seized or sold during the season for the possession of venison, if it be proved by the possessor that such meat was killed outside of the State or by persons who own or are in charge of private parks and are the actual owners of said moose, elk, caribou or antelope.

Beaver Not to Be Killed.

No beaver shall be caught or killed at any time in this State.

Snipe, Plover and Other Birds.

Plover, rail, mud hen, Wilson's (English) snipe, grebe, gallinule, bittern, surf bird, curlew, water chicken, bay snipe or shore bird, must not be killed or possessed during May, June, July and August.

Wild Birds.

All wild birds except those protected at certain seasons of the year, and those following, must not be hunted or killed at any time, unless the person hunting holds a certificate for hunting same. The nests and eggs of such birds are also protected at all times. The exceptions are English sparrow, crow, hawk, raven, crane, crow-blackbird, common blackbird and kingfisher. Eggs and nests also not protected.

Certificates for Collecting Birds for Scientific Purposes.

Certificates may be granted by the Regents of the University of the State of New York, or by an incorporated society of natural history in the State, to any person over eighteen years of age who is properly accredited, permitting holder to collect birds, nests or eggs for scientific purposes only. Persons desiring certificate must pay \$1 and must file an executed bond for \$200, signed by two responsible citizens of New York State as sureties. This bond shall be forfeited to the State and the certificate become void upon proof that the holder has killed any bird, or taken the nests or eggs for any but scientific purposes. Certificates in force one year; not transferable.

NORTH CAROLINA.

Numerous local and county laws prevail, occasionally conflicting, and great care must be exercised.

Wild Fowl in Cartaret County.

It is unlawful to shoot wild fowl of any kind from any battery or sneak boat on Sundays, Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays of any week, or to shoot them in such manner before December 1; and it is also unlawful to hunt or shoot wild fowl with fire or light after the hour of sunset and before the hour of daylight, or to use any gun other than that fired from the shoulder.

Currituck.

It is unlawful for non-residents to hunt or shoot any wild fowl in the County of Currituck from any box, battery or float of any kind; or to take or capture any wild fowl in the County of Currituck between March 31 and November 10, or to ship out of the State between said dates, and it is unlawful to hunt, or kill any wild fowl on any Wednesday, Saturday or Sunday between November 10 and March 1, to disturb any raft of wild fowl or to leave any landing or anchorage before daylight in the morning for the purpose of hunting wild fowl or to continue to hunt after dark. It is unlawful to sail, row or propel a boat over Currituck Sound on the Lord's day for the purpose of locating wild fowl for a future day; or to lay around, sail around or stop anywhere near any citizen who may be gunning or fishing, for the purpose of keeping them from shooting or damage his shooting.

Deer.

Close season December 31 to October 1 following.

Game and Other Birds.

Quail, robins, partridge, mocking birds, larks and wild turkeys, close season March 15 to November 1. In Currituck.

Currituck County quail and partridge, close season between April 1 and December 1. Mocking birds, also their eggs and nests, always protected.

Shipment of Quail or Partridge, Dead or Alive, Prohibited.

Shipment of quail or partridge dead or alive prohibited.

Wild Fowl Methods.

Shooting on Sunday forbidden, also shooting between sunset and one hour before daylight. The use of any but a common shoulder gun prohibited, and no non-resident shall shoot in the waters of New Hanover, Brunswick, Dare and Currituck counties from any blind, box, battery or float which is not on land. In Currituck County the use of bushes or blinds on boats or skiffs, or any float of any description with the intent of decoying or pursuing ducks is forbidden. The use of decoys on the waters of Currituck County is forbidden between April 1 and November 10.

Killing for Sale or Exportation.

Wild fowl must not be killed for sale in the waters of Brunswick, Currituck and New Hanover counties between March 10 and November 10, and wild fowl must not be shipped out of the State between these dates if killed in the waters of the above counties.

NORTH DAKOTA.

Permits.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any of the wild animals or birds hereinafter mentioned without having first obtained a permit; provided, however, that nothing in this section shall prevent any resident of this State or member of his family living at home from hunting on lands owned or controlled by him during the open season as provided by law. The county auditor shall fill out and issue one of such permits to any person applying there-

for on payment of \$25, if the applicant is a non-resident of the State; and on payment of 75 cents, if the applicant is known to the auditor or satisfactorily proves him to be a resident of this State; provided, that any non-resident who may own cultivated lands, or be carrying on the cultivation of any lands in this State, not less than one-quarter section, for a period of not less than one year prior to the time of making application for such license, shall be entitled to take out a resident's permit, whether such non-resident is the owner of the land so cultivated in whole or in part; provided that such non-resident shall take out such permit in the county where such cultivation is carried on. Such permit shall authorize the holder to hunt throughout the State either with or without dogs. All permits shall expire on the 31st day of December next, after their issuance.

Prairie Chicken, Pinnated Grouse, Sharp-Tailed Grouse, Ruffed Grouse, Woodcock.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any prairie chicken, pinnated grouse, sharp-tailed grouse, ruffed grouse or woodcock between October 1 and August 20, following, or any song bird or insect-eating bird, except snipe or plover, at any time.

Quail, Pheasant, Swan.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any quail, English or Chinese pheasant or wild swan until after August 20, 1905, and after that time between October 1 and August 20, following.

Wild Duck.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any wild duck between January 1 and August 20.

Wild Goose, Crane, Brant.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any wild goose, crane or brant between May 1 and August 20.

Method of Hunting.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any wild duck, goose or brant with any swivel gun or other gun except such as is commonly shot from the shoulder, or to use any artificial light or battery, trap, snare, net or bird lime, medicated, drugged or poisoned grain or food to capture or kill any of the birds mentioned, or to wantonly destroy their nests or eggs.

Buffalo, Moose, Elk, Antelope, Caribou, Mountain Sheep.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any buffalo, moose, elk, antelope, caribou or mountain sheep at any time; or any deer between December 10 and October 10; or to use any hound or dog in running or driving any of the animals mentioned, or to trap or snare them.

Beaver, Otter.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any beaver or otter prior to November 10, 1905, or thereafter, between December 10 and November 10 following.

Lawful Number.

Whoever shoots or kills in any one day more than 25 of the game birds mentioned, or in any one season more than 5 of the animals mentioned is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Possession.

Every person who has in his possession any of the birds or animals mentioned after five days from the close of the respective seasons during which it shall be lawful to hunt or kill the same, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Transportation.

Every person who within this State ships or receives for shipment beyond the limits of this State any of the game birds or animals mentioned shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

OHIO.

Permits to Take Birds, Nests and Eggs for Scientific Purposes.

Permits may be granted by the President of the Fish and Game Commission to any properly accredited person, permitting the holder thereof to collect birds, their nests and eggs for strictly scientific purposes. The permits authorized shall be in force for two years from the date of their issue, and shall not be transferable.

Game Birds.

It is unlawful to kill any quail or wild turkey, except between the tenth day of November and the fifteenth day of December, inclusive; or any dove, woodcock or squirrel, except between the fourth day of July and the fifteenth day of December, inclusive; or any ruffed grouse, or pheasant or prairie chicken, except between the first day of September and the fifteenth day of December, inclusive; or any rail, snipe, killdeer or plover, except between the first day of September and the fifteenth day of May, inclusive; or any coot or mud hen, or wild duck, except between the first day of September and the fifteenth day of April, inclusive. No person shall, at any time, kill any wild duck or wild goose by the aid or use of any swivel or punt gun, or any other gun but a common shoulder gun; or with the aid of, or from any sink boat or battery, or by the use of any kind of boat whatsoever, except a common row boat propelled by oars. No person shall, at any time, kill any of the birds, game or animals above mentioned with or by the use of any trap, net or snare, or destroy any of the eggs or nests of any of the birds named above. No person shall kill any wild duck on Sunday or Monday of any week, on any of the reservoirs belonging to the State of Ohio, or upon the waters of Lake Erie and the estuaries and bays thereof, or on the rivers, creeks, ponds or other waters or bodies of water in this State. It is unlawful for any person, not the owner, to shoot or otherwise kill or maim any Antwerp or homing pigeon, commonly called "carrier" pigeon. It shall also be unlawful for any person not its owner, to entrap, catch or detain any such "carrier" pigeon, providing that such pigeon shall at the time have the name of the owner owner's name, initial or number on its leg. stamped upon its wing or tail, or have a band with the

Shooting or Hunting on Lands of Another Without Permission.

Whoever, without having first received verbal or written permission from the owner, his agent, or the person having control of any lands, pond, lake, or other private waters, except those waters claimed by riparian right of ownership or adjacent lands, hunts upon the same, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Pheasants, Deer.

The killing of any deer or any Mongolian, English, or ring-neck pheasants before November 10, 1900, or after said date, except between November 10 and December 15, inclusive, is forbidden. Domestication or propagation in private enclosures is permitted.

Song Birds.

It is unlawful to at any time kill, catch or injure any sparrow, nuthatch, warbler, flicker vireo, wren, robin, catbird, tanager, bobolink, blue jay, oriole, grosbeak, creeper, redstart, waxwing, woodpecker, humming bird, lark, cuckoo, thrush, swallow, blue bird, bunting, red wing, starling, purple martin, brown thrasher, American goldfinch, chewink or ground robin, pewee or Phoebe bird, chickadee, titmouse, or eagle, nor destroy the eggs, or nest of any such bird. Squirrels

May be killed by the owner or tenant of any premises where they are found destroying grain, fruit, vegetables or shrubbery.

Exportation.

No person shall kill any of the birds mentioned in any of these laws for the purpose of transportation beyond the limits of this State.

OKLAHOMA TERRITORY.

Game and Game Birds.

It is unlawful to kill, or trap any deer, buck, doe, fawn, antelope, prairie chicken, grouse, quail, wild turkey, wren, martin, swallow, robin, turkey buzzard, plover, dove or insectivorous birds, or to have the same in possession, except it shall be lawful to shoot prairie chickens and wild turkeys between September 1 and January 1, of the following year; and that it shall be lawful to shoot quail between October 15 and February 1, of the following year; and it shall be lawful to shoot plover and dove between August 1 and December 31, of each year; and provided that it shall be unlawful at any time to kill any wild turkey, quail, dove or prairie chicken: and, provided further, it shall be unlawful to have in possession any quail nets, or traps, or devices for the purpose of catching any of the game above mentioned.

Pheasant.

It is unlawful to hunt, kill or molest in any manner whatever any Mongolian pheasant or any other pheasant, in the Territory of Oklahoma until January 1, 1904.

Sale of Game.

Game lawfully taken, or lawfully had in possession, may be sold to persons living in the Territory of Oklahoma for consumption therein.

Export.

Beyond the limits of the State of protected game, is prohibited, except for scientific purposes, but no more than one pair of one variety of birds or animals to be shipped at one time.

OREGON.**Meadow Larks, Robins and Other Birds.**

It is a misdemeanor to kill, destroy or have in possession, except for breeding purposes, any nightingale, sky lark, black thrush, gray singing thrush, linnet, goldfinch, green finch, chaffinch, and bullfinch, redbreasted European robin, black starling, cross beak, Oregon robin, meadow lark or mocking bird, or to disturb or destroy the nests or remove therefrom the eggs of any of the above mentioned birds. It is also a misdemeanor to take, injure or destroy any sea gull.

Wild Fowl Methods.

It is a misdemeanor to hunt wild fowl from any sink-box on the Columbia River, or to use any batteries or swivel pivot guns, or any gun other than an ordinary shoulder gun, either from the shore, or on a boat, raft or other device on the Columbia River, or on any lake or river. It is a misdemeanor to use or build a blind or other structure in any public lake or river, or in the Columbia River more than one hundred feet out from the shore or margin of such lake or river, for the purpose of shooting any water fowl, at any time. Every person who shall build or use any such blinds in any lake not wholly owned by himself, his licensor or lessor, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. It is also a misdemeanor to fire off any gun between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, or to build any fire or flash any light or powder or

Expert.

It is a misdemeanor for any private person or any servant, employe or agent, any transportation company, whether railroad or steamboat, to carry out of the State any of the above mentioned birds, except for breeding or exhibition purposes, without written consent having been obtained on affidavit from the Fish or Game Protector.

Season for Wild Fowl.

Every person is guilty of a misdemeanor who between March 15 and September 1 of each year, kills or has in possession any wild swan, mallard duck, wood ducks, widgeon, teal, spoonbill, gray, black, sprig-tail or canvas-back duck.

Trespass.

No person shall at any time enter into any standing or growing grain not his own, with intent to catch, recover, take or kill any bird or animal, nor permit any dog with which he shall then be hunting, to do so, for such purpose, without permission from the owner or person in charge thereof. It shall be unlawful for any person to shoot upon or from the public highway.

Elk.

It is unlawful to kill, destroy or have in possession any elk between January 31, 1899, and December 1, 1910.

Deer, Moose, Mountain Sheep.

It is unlawful at any time between November 1 of each year and July 15, of the following year, to kill or destroy

any deer, moose or mountain sheep; or to hunt or kill any deer between one hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise of any day of the year, or to kill any deer at any time unless for food; and it is unlawful to hunt or pursue deer with dogs.

It is unlawful to kill any spotted fawn, or to kill any beaver for a period of twenty years; or any silver gray squirrel between January 1 and October 1; provided, that the provisions of this act shall not apply to any squirrel that burrows in the ground.

Grouse, Prairie Chicken, Quail, Pheasant.

It is unlawful, between December 1 and October 1, following, to kill or have in possession, except for breeding purposes, or sell or offer for sale any grouse, prairie chicken, pheasant, Mongolian pheasant, quail or part-ridge; provided that it shall be unlawful in that portion of the State of Oregon lying east of the Cascade mountains, to kill any grouse at any time, between November 1 and August 1, following, or to kill any prairie chicken at any time between November 15 and September 1, following, or when the ground is covered with snow sufficient for tracking; provided, that it shall be unlawful to kill or destroy any ring-neck or Mongolian pheasant, or any other pheasant, or any quail or bob-white, in that portion of the State of Oregon lying east of the Cascade mountains; provided, further, that it shall be unlawful to kill any Mongolian pheasant in the counties of Jackson, Josephine, Coos, Curry and Clatsop, for a period of three years after the passage of this act (1899); provided, that the county courts or boards of commissioners of the several counties may at their discretion shorten the open season in their respective counties for killing the game birds or wild fowl mentioned in this act.

English Sparrow, Kingfisher.

Cooper's hawk, sharp-skinned hawk, duck hawk, pigeon hawk, great horned owl, barred owl, green heron and night heron are not protected by this Act.

Elk, Deer, Fawn.

The killing of any of these animals is forbidden, except in November. Killing the same in water, or chasing with dogs is a misdemeanor. It is unlawful to kill or trap any deer, elk, fawn, wild turkey, pheasant, grouse, partridge, quail or woodcock for the purpose of sale. The sale of same is also unlawful.

Transportation.

It is a misdemeanor for any person or transportation company to ship beyond the limits of this State, at any time, any protected animals.

Hare, Rabbit.

Shooting these is permitted from November 1 to December 15.

Black, Gray or Fox Squirrel.

Shooting the same permitted from October 15 to December 15. The use of ferrets not permitted.

Number.

It is unlawful for any one person to kill in one day more than ten ruffed grouse or pheasant; more than fifteen quail or Virginia partridge; more than ten woodcock, or more than two wild turkeys; or to kill in one season more than two deer.

Rail and Reed Birds.

No person shall kill or catch any rail or reed bird, except in September, October and November.

Wild Fowl.

It is unlawful to kill web-footed wild fowl from May 1 to September 1, or to use in killing them any but a common shoulder gun, or from or by aid of a boat propelled with sails or steam.

Plover.

No person shall kill any grass or upland plover between January 1 and July 15.

English, Chinese or Mongolian Pheasant.

It is unlawful to catch or kill any of these until 1902.

RHODE ISLAND.

Wood Duck, Gray Duck, Black Duck, Grouse, Heath Hen.

It shall be unlawful to kill any wood duck, gray duck or black duck between February 1 and September 1; any heath hen or grouse, between January 1 and November 1; or any sandpiper, plover, snipe, curlew, tattler, greater and lesser yellow-legs, or any so-called shore birds, between January 1 and July 1.

Partridge, Quail, Ruffed Grouse, Wild Duck, Plover, Woodcock.

It shall be unlawful to take, kill, sell, buy, offer for sale, or have in possession, any woodcock, ruffed grouse or partridge or quail, from January 1 to October 1; any dusky or black duck, wood duck or summer duck, blue or green-winged teal, from March 1 to October 1; or any Bartram's tattler or upland plover, commonly known in Rhode Island as grass plover, from April 1 to August 1. Eggs and nests always protected. Use of battery, sink boat or float is prohibited; also killing with any but an ordinary shoulder gun.

All fresh-water ducks other than those mentioned before, all sea ducks, geese, crows, crow-blackbirds, herons, bittern, plover (except as mentioned above), curlew, rail, sandpiper, snipes, and all birds of prey, except fish hawks or ospreys, may be hunted at any time. Shooting on Saturdays unlawful.

Robin and Lark.

May be killed from September 1 to February 1. Encouraging or trapping game birds is prohibited except on one's own land, during open season.

Squirrel, Rabbit, Hare.

Open season October 1 to January 1. The use of ferrets or weasels is forbidden.

SOUTH CAROLINA.**Mongolian Pheasants.**

It is unlawful to kill or catch any Mongolian pheasant until January 1, 1905.

Deer.

It is illegal to kill or hunt deer, or chase them with dogs, between February 1 and September 1, except in the counties of Clarendon, Berkeley, Georgetown, Marion, Colleton, Darlington, Williamsburg, Horry, Marlboro, and Kershaw, in which counties it is not lawful between February 1 and August 1.

Other Birds—Open Season.

It is illegal, between April 1 and November 1, to hunt or kill any wild turkey, partridge, quail, woodcock or pheasant, or, between March 1 and August 1, any dove.

Non-residents may purchase a license for shooting game of any kind. Cost, \$25. This does not apply to persons hunting or killing game on their own land.

SOUTH DAKOTA.

Buffalo, Elk, Deer, Antelope, Mountain Sheep.

It is unlawful to kill any buffalo, elk, deer, antelope or mountain sheep, between January 1 and October 15. It is unlawful to sell at any time any carcasses or parts of carcasses of any of said animals, and it is unlawful for any railway company, express company, or other common carrier, to at any time ship or transport out of the State any carcass or carcasses of the above named animals.

Game Birds.

It is unlawful to kill any prairie chicken, pinnated grouse, sharp tailed grouse, ruffed grouse, woodcock or quail, between January 1 and September 1, following, or any song bird or insect eating bird, at any time, excepting crows, blackbirds and sparrows.

Water Fowl.

It is unlawful to kill any wild duck, wild goose, brant or wild crane between May 1 and September 1, following; or to kill any plover or curlew between May 15 and September 1, following; or to kill any wild duck, goose or brant with any swivel gun or other gun, except such as is commonly shot from the shoulder, or in hunting such birds to make use of any artificial light or battery or employ any trap, snare, net or bird lime, medicated, drugged or poisoned grain or food to capture or kill any of the birds mentioned, or to wantonly destroy their nests or eggs.

Beaver, Otter.

Close time on beaver and otter until January 15, 1911.

Trespass.

It is unlawful to hunt on lands of another without the consent of the owner or occupant.

Lawful Number.

Transportation.

It is lawful to take game during the open season, and three days thereafter, out of the State when shipped in open view, tagged and plainly labelled with the name of the owner thereof and accompanied by him, to be used for food only, and in no instance shall any person be permitted to take out of the State, at any one time, a greater number than twenty-five birds.

License.

Non-residents must obtain license to hunt from the county treasurer, such license to cost \$10, and shall not be transferable.

TENNESSEE.

The State Secretary advises us that there are special game laws in almost every county, and great care must therefore be exercised.

Quail and Partridge.

It is unlawful to kill quail or partridge for profit, except that persons may kill same for profit on their own lands, but only from November 1 to March 1.

Deer.

It is unlawful to kill deer for profit, except that citizens may do so for their own use from August 1 to January 1. Fire hunting prohibited.

Wild Turkey, Partridges, Big Game.

It is unlawful for anyone to kill wild deer in Cumberland,

It is unlawful at any time to kill any elk, deer, antelope, mountain sheep, buffalo or bison, otter or beaver, or any game animals or birds that may be brought or introduced into the State for the purpose of stocking the State with said animals or birds; provided, that deer may be lawfully killed in the State during the month of October of each year.

Dogs Prohibited.

It is unlawful to pursue with any dog or dogs any of the animals above mentioned.

Size of Fowling Piece.

It shall be unlawful for any person to use any gun larger
than ten gauge while hunting for fowl or birds.

Pheasants, Quail.

It is unlawful to kill, trap or shoot, or have in posses-
sion any Mongolian or Chinese pheasant, English
pheasant, pinnated grouse or quail; provided, it shall
be lawful to kill quail in the counties of Washington
and Kane between October 1 and March 1, following.
It shall be unlawful to ship or transport any quail out
of the above named counties at any time except for the
purpose of propagation.

Shipping Birds or Animals Forbidden.

It is unlawful at any time to ship or transport out of the
State any of the animals or birds mentioned in this act.

Game Birds.

It is unlawful to kill or catch any quail, wild duck, wild goose or plover between January 1 and September 1, or ruffed grouse (partridge) or woodcock, between January 1 and September 15, or pheasant between November 20 and October 1. It is unlawful to hunt wild ducks with jack or artificial light.

Exportation of Game for Sale.

No person shall kill any woodcock or ruffed grouse for the purpose of shipping, or in any manner disposing of same to parties outside the State for traffic or gain.

Imported Birds.

Any person who, before January 1, 1900, takes or kills a sharp-tailed or pinnated grouse, capercaillie, black game, ptarmigan or pheasant, shall be fined \$10 for each bird so taken or killed, but nothing in this section shall be held to prohibit the shooting of pheasants on enclosed and posted land by the owners of such lands, or their licensees, between October 10 and December 1st of any year providing the pheasants so shot have been actually bred on such lands in a state of captivity.

Deer.

Deer having horns may be hunted during the month of October each year, but it is unlawful to pursue them with dogs, or to use jack or artificial lights, or snare, trap or salt lick. No person shall kill or have in his possession more than two deer during the open season. Deer shall not be transported from the State by any person or corporation, except that the carcass of one deer lawfully killed in the State may be transported in the open season, and for ten days thereafter, when open to view, tagged and plainly labeled with the name of the owner thereof and accompanied by him.

It is unlawful to at any time kill or have in possession any of the birds, or their kindred or allied species, in this section hereinafter mentioned, and it is also unlawful to disturb or destroy their eggs or nest; that is to say: turkey buzzard, the family of pingillidae or sparrows, except English sparrows, robin, blue bird, martin, thrush, mocking bird, swallow, oriole, catbird, chewink, wren, cuckoo, indigo bird, nuthatch, yellow hammer or flicker warbler or finch, red start, dummock, nightingale, cross bill, Hungarian robin, titmouse, tit or tomtit, woodpecker or purple grackle, red wing, black bird, blue jay, phoebe bird or pewee, red bird or cardinal grosbeak, humming bird, dove or whippoorwill.

Export.

It is unlawful to at any time kill or have in possession any deer, wild turkey, quail, pheasant or ruffed grouse, or any part of the same, with intention of transporting the same beyond the limits of this State.

Non-resident License.

It is unlawful for non-residents to hunt in any of the counties of this State without having first obtained a license from the clerk of the county court of the county wherein he desires to hunt. License fee is \$25. (Clerk's fee, \$1).

WISCONSIN.**Non-Resident License for Deer; Other Game.**

Every person who has not resided in this State for one year previous to the time of applying for a license to hunt deer in the season as fixed by law, which said license shall include permission to hunt any and all kinds of game protected, twenty-five dollars; for the hunting of all kinds of game protected, with the exception of deer, ten dollars.

Resident License for Deer.

Every person who has resided in this State for one year previous to applying for a license to hunt game and who desires to hunt the same must first obtain a license for the sum of one dollar. The license so issued to any resident of this State shall have attached two coupons for the shipment of deer.

Non-Resident Transportation of Game.

It is unlawful for any person holding a non-resident license to take out of the State more than fifty birds, fowls or animals protected by the laws of this State, in any one year. Provided, that this section shall be construed to mean that when fifty birds, fowls or animals of any kind or variety have been taken from the State by holder of a non-resident license further right to take any kind of birds, fowls or animals by the holder of the said license shall cease. No transportation company or common carrier shall receive for transportation or shipment out of the State any birds, fowl or animals protected by the laws of the State, except when the same shall be in the personal possession of, or carried as baggage or express by the owner thereof, and such owner shall have in his possession at the time of such taking out of the State a non-resident license.

Resident Transportation of Game.

It is unlawful for any person a resident of this State to ship within or without this State any birds, fowls or animals protected, except such owner shall have in his possession a resident license, and shall accompany the said birds, fowls or animals.

Possession of Venison by Residents.

Any person residing in this State who shall lawfully kill any deer may keep and consume the meat thereof in his own family by serving a written notice on the game warden or deputy warden on or before the last day of the open season for killing of deer, which notice shall state

as near as may be when and where said deer was killed and the number of pounds of venison then in his possession, and that the same is to be kept and used for his own family.

Deer: Close Season.

It is unlawful to kill any deer, buck, doe or fawn between November 20 and November 1, in the year following; or to hunt deer with dogs or in the night time, or in either of the counties of Sheboygan and Fond du Lac, until after April 10, 1902; or to kill or capture any deer, buck, doe or fawn in the waters or on the ice of any of the streams, lakes or ponds, or to take or kill any deer, buck, doe or fawn by means of any pit, pitfall or trap, or use any artificial light in hunting deer; or have in possession the skin of any deer when it is in its red coat, or of any fawn when it is in its spotted coat; or kill more than two deer in any one year.

Woodcock.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any woodcock, partridge, pheasant, prairie chicken or prairie hen, grouse of any variety, plover or snipe between December 1 and September 1, of the succeeding year.

Duck, Swan, Geese, Snipe.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any wild duck, brant, or any aquatic fowl, including snipe, excepting wild geese, between January 1 and September 1, or to take or kill any swan at any time; provided, that it shall be unlawful to hunt or kill wild geese between May 1 and September 1, following.

Aquatic Birds and Fowl.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any wild duck, wild goose, brant or other aquatic bird or fowl between sunset and the following sunrise; and it is unlawful to use, in the pursuit of any of these birds or fowls, upon the waters of this State, any sneak boat, or boat propelled by an

tember 1, 1901.

Fire-Arms.

It is unlawful to use in the pursuit of any animal, fowl
or bird, any pivot gun or swivel gun, or any other fire-
arm not habitually held at arm's length and discharged
from the shoulder.

Song and Insectivorous Birds.

It is unlawful to kill at any time, or for any purpose
whatever, except as authorized by law, any whippoor-
will, night hawk, blue bird, finch, thrush, robin, lark,
turtle dove, or any other harmless bird; provided, that
this section shall not apply to blackbirds, crows, English
sparrows or pigeons for trapshooting.

Taking of Birds' Eggs.

It is unlawful to take or destroy the eggs or nest of any
water-fowl or bird, except crows and English sparrows.

Carrier Pigeon.

It is unlawful to take, catch, kill, impede in its progress, or otherwise interfere with any carrier or homing pigeon.

Rabbits, Otter, Marten, Fisher, Muskrat.

It is unlawful to use ferrets to hunt rabbits, or to hunt or kill any otter, marten or fisher, between May 1 and October 1, or to destroy or molest muskrat houses at any time.

Hunting on Lands of Another.

Hunting on land of another without permission from the owner or the occupant thereof is forbidden.

Buying, Selling or Transportation of Deer.

It is unlawful to buy, sell or transport any carcass or part of a carcass of a deer, buck, doe or fawn, until November 6, in each year; and it shall be lawful to sell or transport the carcasses of deer under the conditions provided by law relative to the transportation of the same, up to and including the 25th day of November, succeeding the end of the open season. Any person who shall buy, sell or transport before November 6 in each year, any carcass or part of a carcass of a deer, buck, doe or fawn, or attempt to do the same, shall be punished by a fine.

WYOMING.**Destruction of Game Prohibited.**

The wanton destruction or wasting of the game of this State, during any period when the taking or capture of such game is permitted, is hereby prohibited, and any person taking, or destroying any game in excess of the number as hereinafter provided, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

Ducks and Geese.

It is unlawful to ensnare, net or trap any wild duck, wild goose, or wild swan at any time. There shall be an open season from September 1 until May 1, in which ducks, brant or geese may be killed, but nothing but shoulder guns may be used at any time; provided, that on and after the passage of this act it shall be unlawful to kill any wild swan.

Moose, Deer, Elk, Goat, Antelope.

It is unlawful to kill moose until September 1, 1902, after which date only one male moose may be killed during the hunting season of each year. It is unlawful to hunt or kill any deer, elk, mountain sheep, mountain goat or antelope except from September 1 to December 1, of each year. It is unlawful to take any of the above mentioned animals by means of any pit, pitfall, trap or snare.

Unlawful to Sell Game Animals.

It is unlawful to capture any moose, deer, elk, mountain sheep, mountain goat or antelope, of whatever age, for the purpose of selling or disposing of the same, or for shipping the same out of the State.

Beaver.

It is unlawful to kill, or trap any beaver, or kitten beaver, for a period of ten years from and after the approval of this act (1899).

Unlawful to Buy or Sell Hides or Horns.

It shall be unlawful to purchase, or obtain by barter, any green, tanned or untanned hide or hides, or horns of any moose, deer, elk, mountain sheep, mountain goat or antelope.

Shipment of Stuffed Game.

Shipment of mounted heads, or stuffed birds or animals to any point in or out of the State is permitted, provided that such birds or animals were not killed in violation of law, or that heads or horns were not taken from animals killed illegally.

Dogs.

It is unlawful to use dogs for the purpose of running or coursing deer, antelope, elk or mountain sheep.

Gun License.

Any bona fide citizen of the State of Wyoming shall, upon the payment of one dollar to any Justice of the Peace of the county in which he resides, be entitled to receive from said Justice of the Peace, a gun license which shall permit such person to hunt and kill any of the animals mentioned in this section, during the time allowed therefor, of the current year in any of the counties of this State. But no person shall be required to take out such gun license in order to hunt and kill any of the animals mentioned in this section, during the time allowed therefor in the county in which he actually resides. Any person who is not a resident of the State of Wyoming, shall upon the payment to any Justice of the Peace of this State, of the sum of forty dollars be entitled to receive from such Justice of the Peace a license, which license shall permit such person to pursue, hunt and kill any of the animals mentioned in this section, during the time allowed therefor of the current year.

kill more than two elk, two deer, three antelope, one mountain sheep and one mountain goat. Every person who shall have procured and paid for a license shall be entitled to the use and possession of the whole, or any part, of any animal killed.

Non-resident Must Have Guide.

It shall be unlawful for any non-resident person to kill any of the animals mentioned in this section, unless accompanied by a qualified guide.

Game May Be Shipped.

Every person who may wish to transport beyond the limits of this State, any carcasses, heads, horns, scalps or skins of any animals killed in accordance with the provisions of this section, shall first procure from a Justice of the Peace of this State, a certificate stating that said parts were taken from animals which were killed legally.

YELLOWSTONE PARK.

Hunting.

Capturing or killing any bird or animal within the Park is prohibited, and outfits of parties so doing are subject to seizure and confiscation. Fires may be lighted only when necessary, and then completely extinguished when no longer required. Great care must be exercised at all times to avoid setting fire to the grass or timber.

Camping Parties

Will be allowed to use dead or fallen timber for fuel, but are forbidden to injure or cut any growing timber, or to deface in any way the sediments or incrustations about the geysers, steam-vents or hot springs.

The Hunting, Killing, Wounding

Or taking at any time of any wild animal or bird, except dangerous animals, when it is necessary to prevent them from destroying human life or inflicting injury, is prohibited within the limits of Yellowstone Park.

THE BRITISH PROVINCES.

Canadian Duty on Guns and Hunting Implements.

Canadian duty on guns, hunting implements and fishing tackle refunded if exported in two (2) months, 90 per cent. refunded if exported within three (3) months.

BRITISH COLUMBIA.

Export.

It is unlawful to at any time export or cause to be exported out of this Province any or any portion of the animals or birds hereinafter mentioned, in their raw state. Provided, that it shall be lawful for any person having a license, to export or cause to be exported the heads, horns and skins of animals which have been legally killed by such license holder; provided that the provisions of this section shall not apply to bear or beaver, marten or land otter.

Mountain Sheep Heads, Swivel Gun.

It is unlawful to at any time kill any game bird or animal between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise; to buy or sell the heads of mountain sheep; to use for taking or killing wild ducks of any kind or geese, contrivances known as batteries, swivel guns or sunken punts in non-tidal waters; to expose for sale any deer without its head on, or any game bird without its plumage.

Seasons.

It is unlawful to kill any of the game birds or animals during the close season and prohibited times of sale set out in the following schedule, both dates inclusive:

Beaver, April 1-November 1; bittern, March 1-August 31; caribou, January 1-August 31 (cow or calf at any time); deer, buck or doe, December 15-August 31 (fawn any time); ducks of all kinds, March 1-August 31; elk, bull, January 1-August 31 (cow or calf under two years old at any time); grouse of all kinds, including prairie chicken, January 1-August 31; hare, January 1-August 31; heron, March 1-August 31; land otter and marten, April 1-November 1; meadow lark, March 1-August 31; moose, bull, January 1-August 31 (cow or calf under twelve months at any time); mountain goat, December 15-August 31; mountain sheep, ram, December 15-August 31 (ewe or lamb at any time); English partridge, pheasant, quail of all kinds, at any time; plover, March 1-August 31; robin, skylark, thrush, English blackbird, insectivorous birds, at any time. It is unlawful to take in one season more than 5 caribou, 10 deer, 250 ducks, 2 elk, 2 moose, 5 mountain goats, 3 mountain sheep.

Dogs.

It is unlawful to at any time hunt deer with dogs.

License.

No person who is not domiciled in the Province, other than officers and men in Her Majesty's service, shall at any time take any of the animals or game birds mentioned without being authorized thereto by license. Such license may, on payment of a fee of \$50, be granted by any Government agent in the Province, and shall be valid only for that shooting season for which the same has been issued.

CAPE BRETON.**Moose, Caribou.**

It is unlawful to hunt or kill moose or caribou in Cape Breton until October 1, 1899.

Transportation.

It is unlawful to export from Canada deer, wild turkey, quail, partridge, prairie fowl, woodcock.

MANITOBA.

Sunday hunting forbidden.

Game Birds—Close Seasons.

All varieties of grouse, including prairie chicken, pheasant and partridge, between November 15 and October 1; woodcock, plover (except upland and golden plover), snipe and sandpiper, between January 1 and August 1 upland plover, January 1 and July 15; wild duck, sea duck, widgeon and teal between May 1 and September 1. The use of batteries, awivel guns, sunken punts, poisonous substances, night lights or snares prohibited in hunting the above.

License.

Non-residents not permitted to hunt or kill any game without license from Minister of Agriculture and Immigration. Fee, \$50.00 for calendar year.

Export.

Killing any of the above for the purpose of export or exporting the same, except with special permit of the Minister of Agriculture, and then only for live animals or birds for purposes of domestication (but not more than two in any one case) is prohibited.

Lawful Number of Birds.

It is unlawful to kill more than 100 grouse, including prairie chickens, pheasants and partridges, in one season, or more than 20 of such birds in one day.

Deer, Antelope, Elk, Moose, Caribou.

The close time on all kinds of deer, including cabri, antelope, elk, wapiti, moose, reindeer, caribou, expired October 15, 1898. Close season thereafter December 15 to October 15. It is unlawful to take in one season more than 2 deer, elk, moose, caribou or reindeer.

Muskrat.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any muskrat from May 1 to December 1.

Beaver.

Beaver is protected at all times.

NEW BRUNSWICK.**Moose, Caribou, Deer.**

The close season for moose, caribou and deer is from the 31st of December to the 1st of September. Penalty, fine not exceeding \$200. No one person in any one year or season shall kill or take more than one moose, one caribou and two deer. Cow or female moose cannot be hunted at any time. Dogs may not be used in hunting moose, caribou or deer. Jack lights are prohibited. It is unlawful for a guide to accompany a party or person who has not a license, in hunting moose or caribou. Guides and camp help who are not residents of the Province must have a license when accompanying hunting parties or individuals. A close season of moose and caribou has been established for the section west of the River St. John for two years, from the first of September, 1898. A close season for moose, caribou and deer has been established for the county of Albert for five years, from the 1st of September, 1898. It is unlawful for any person to catch by means of trap or snares, or to set traps or snares for any moose, caribou or deer. No person shall be allowed to kill or pursue with intent to kill, any moose or caribou at any time of the year without first having obtained a license for the purpose, signed by the Chief Game Commissioner. Fee for said license to be \$2 for residents of the Province, and \$20 for non-residents. Penalty for hunting without license, \$80. Licenses may be obtained from the Chief Game Commissioner, any County Game Warden, or from the Crown Land Office. Every holder of a license

granted must produce the same when required by a justice of the peace, or any game warden. Refusal of same, penalty, \$20. Every non-resident applying for licenses is required to give a bond for \$100 with two sureties.

Game Birds—Close Seasons.

The close season for woodcock and snipe is from the 1st of December to the 1st of September. Penalty, from \$4 to \$10 for every bird killed. The close season for partridge is from the 30th of November to the 20th of September the following year. Nets, punt guns, swivels, and artificial lights are forbidden in hunting any kind of wild fowl or game. Wild geese, brant and black duck, may not be shot between the 1st of December and the 1st of September. It is unlawful to expose them for sale between the 1st of March and the 1st of September. No bird or animals of any kind can be taken alive and kept during the close season without a special permit from the Surveyor General. Hunting of any kind of game on Sunday is punishable by a fine of \$50.

Mink, Fisher, Sable.

Close season, May 1 to September 1.

Beaver.

Protected until March 20, 1899.

Muskrat.

In Kings and Sunbury counties close season between June 10 and March 10 following.

Sale.

Killing partridges until September 20, 1898, for purpose of sale is illegal.

Small Birds.

Killing small song and insectivorous birds is prohibited, except English sparrows.

NEWFOUNDLAND.

Caribou, Deer—Close Seasons.

No person shall hunt or kill caribou or deer from February 1 till July 15, inclusive, or from Oct. 7 until Oct. 20, in any year, nor expose for sale or have in possession any caribou, or part thereof, from February 20 until July 15 in any year. It is a misdemeanor to scaffold the carcass of any caribou for a period exceeding twenty days from date of its being killed.

Moose and Elk.

Close season until January 1, 1906.

Rabbits and Hares.

Close season, March 1 to September 15.

Migratory Birds.

Plover, curlew, snipe and other wild and migratory birds, except wild goose, must not be killed between January 12 and August 20.

Partridge, Ptarmigan and Grouse.

Close season, January 12 to September 15.

Non-resident License.

For caribou, \$100.

Exportation.

No person shall export or carry out of this colony with him any venison, or any of the hides or bones of the caribou, without clearing same at the Customs House.

NORTHWEST TERRITORIES.

Close Season.

Elk, moose, caribou, antelope, deer or fawn, mountain sheep or goat, February 1 to October 1. It is forbidden

to take more than six head of the above animals in any one season, except for food for hunter thereof, or family. The killing of buffalo forbidden at all times. Grouse, partridge, pheasant or prairie chicken, between December 15 and September 15. Wild duck of all varieties between May 15 and August 23. Sandpiper, plover and snipe, between January 1 and August 1.

Lawful Number.

One person may kill only twenty of these birds in a day.

Wild Fowling Methods.

The use of swivel guns, sunken tubs, punts, batteries or night lights is forbidden.

Export.

No person shall export out of the limits of the Territories any caribou, antelope or their fawn, moose, elk, prairie chicken, pheasant, grouse or partridge.

Non-resident License.

Non-residents shall not kill any of the above birds or animals without a license, issued on payment of \$5, which license expires on May 15, following its issue. License may be granted to a guest of a resident, free, for a term not exceeding five days.

NOVA SCOTIA.

Moose, Caribou.

It is unlawful to kill moose or caribou between January 15 and October 1; or to kill more than two moose and two caribou. Meat must be taken out within ten days from killing.

Possession.

No person shall have in possession any green hide or fresh meat from January 20 to October 1.

Trapping and Hunting with Dog.

No person shall set any snare or trap for moose or caribou. It is unlawful to hunt moose or caribou with

Elk, Deer.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill American elk or red deer until October 1, 1904.

Partridge.

Until October 1, 1901, no person shall hunt, kill, buy, sell or have in possession, any partridge, whether killed in this province or elsewhere.

Woodcock, Snipe, Teal, Blue-Winged Duck, Wood Duck.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any woodcock, snipe, teal, blue-winged duck, wood duck, from March 1 to September 1, save in Cape Breton, where close season for all birds, except partridge, is from March 1 to August 20. No person shall kill any game bird between sunset and sunrise.

Pheasants, Spruce Partridge, etc.

It is unlawful to hunt, kill, or have in possession, pheasants, spruce, partridge, blackcock, capercaillie, or sharp-tailed grouse.

Rabbits, Hares.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill rabbits or hares from February 1 to October 1, and no person shall have them in possession from February 5th to October 1.

Beaver.

No person shall hunt or kill any beaver until after November 1, 1900.

Other Fur-bearing Animals.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill mink from March 1 to November 1; all other fur-bearing animals, except bear, wolf, loup-cervier, wildcat, skunk, musquash, raccoon.

Licenses.

Resident's license to kill deer, \$2; non-resident's license to kill big game or any game animal, whether protected or not, \$25.

Game Birds.

It is unlawful to kill any pheasant, grouse, prairie fowl, woodcock, snipe, plover, rail or any water fowl or any game bird or animal (including gray and black squirrels and hares) not otherwise provided for, at any time between December 15 and September 15 following.

Wild Turkeys.

These may not be killed before October 15, 1900; prairie fowl or Mongolian pheasant before September 15, 1900.

Quail.

Close season between December 15 and October 15 following. Swans and geese, close season between May 1 and September 15. Ducks of all kinds, close season, December 15 and September 1 following. Cottontail hare or rabbit may be killed at any time.

Wild Fowl Methods.

The use of any but a common shoulder gun, batteries, sunken punts or any boat, except one propelled by oars, is forbidden. Also shooting in the night time.

Export.

Export of all game forbidden, except that non-resident

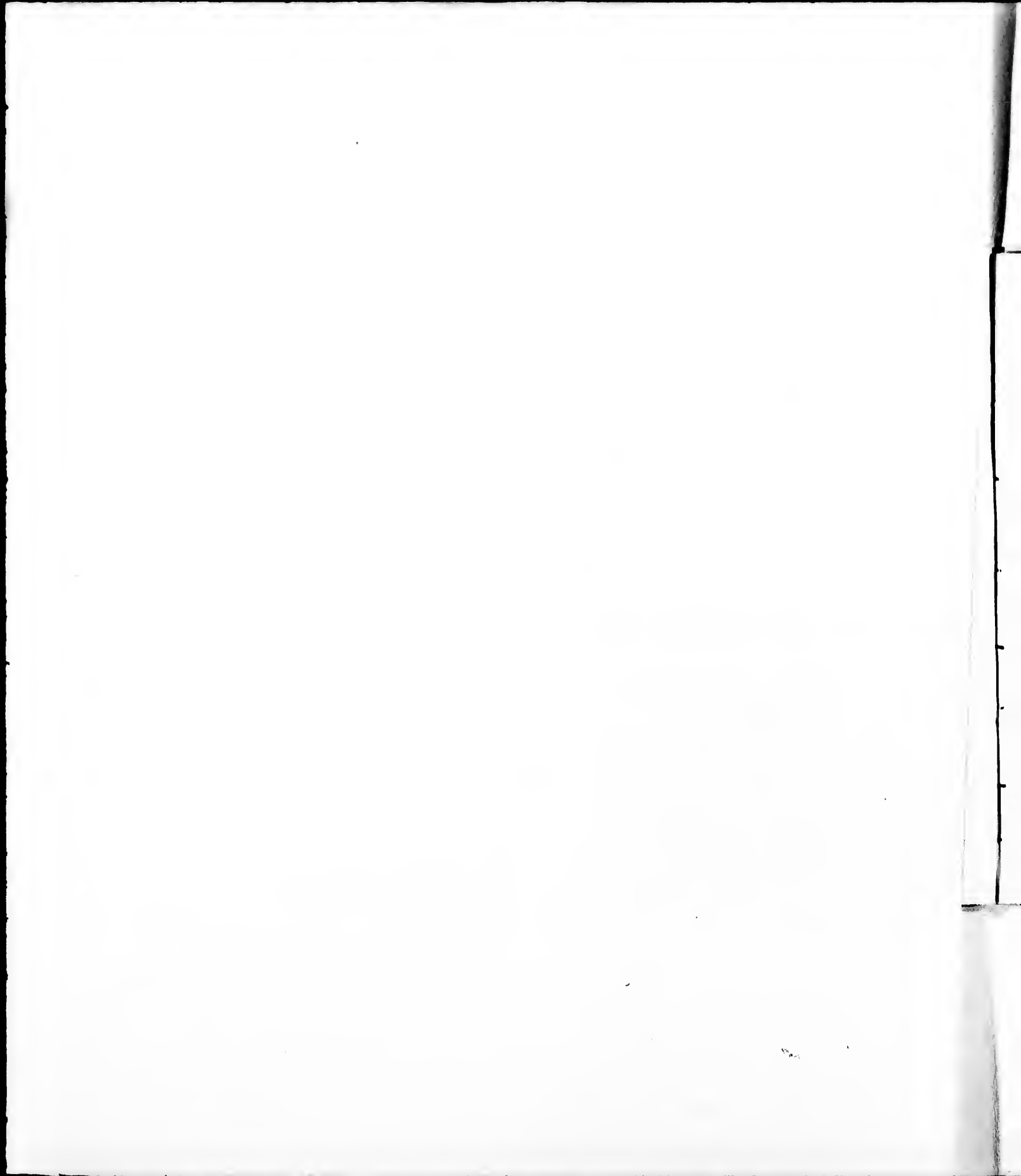

Beaver, Otter.

It is unlawful to hunt, kill or have in possession any beaver or otter before November 1, 1900; and thereafter no beaver or otter shall be hunted, killed or had in possession between April 1 and November 1.

Deer, Elk, Moose, Reindeer or Caribou.

It is unlawful to hunt or kill any deer, elk, moose, reindeer or caribou between November 15 and November 1 of the following year; but this shall not apply to moose, elk, reindeer or caribou before or until November 1, 1900. Hunting or killing deer by what is known as "crusting," or while they are "yarding," is hereby declared unlawful. In that portion of the County of Bruce known as the Indian Peninsula no person shall at any time hunt, or kill, any deer in the waters of any river or lake within the limits of the Province of Ontario.

PROVINCE OF QUEBEC.

The Province of Quebec is divided for hunting purposes into two zones, known respectively as Zone No. 1 and Zone No. 2.

Zone No. 1 comprises the whole Province, less that part of the counties of Chicoutimi and Saguenay, to the east and north of the river Saguenay.

Zone No. 2 comprises that part of the counties of Chicoutimi and Saguenay to the east and north of the river Saguenay.

PROHIBITION IN ZONE NO. 1.

Moose, Caribou, Deer.

It is forbidden to kill deer and moose between January 1 and September 1 of any year, except in the counties of Ottawa and Pontiac where it is forbidden to kill them

between December 1 and October 1, of each year; to hunt or kill caribou, between February 1 and September 1, of any year; to make use of dogs for hunting moose, caribou and deer; but red deer may be so hunted, between October 20 and November 1 of any year; to hunt or kill moose and deer while yarding or by what is known as "crusting;" to hunt, or kill, at any time, fawns up to the age of one year of any of the animals mentioned; to hunt or kill at any time, any cow-moose.

Transportation.

After the first fifteen days of the close season, all railway, steamboat and other companies, and public carriers, are forbidden to carry any moose, caribou or deer, or the green hide thereof. Nevertheless, it is lawful for the Commissioner, at any time, to grant transport permits. For such permits there may be exacted a fee, the amount whereof shall be fixed by the Commissioner, but which shall not exceed five dollars.

Number.

No person shall, in one season's hunting, kill or take alive more than two moose, three deer and two caribou. The Commissioner may, nevertheless, grant to any person domiciled in the Province, on payment of a fee of five dollars, a permit to hunt, or take alive not more than three additional caribou and three additional deer.

Beaver, Mink, Otter, Marten, Pekan, Bear, Muskrat.

It is forbidden to hunt or kill any beaver, at any time, up to the first day of November, 1902, and, after that date, between April 1 and November 1, of any year; any mink, otter, marten, pekan, fox or raccoon, between April 1 and November 1, in any year. Foxes known as yellow or red foxes may, however, at all times be hunted, killed or taken; any hare, between February 1 and November 1, in any year, or any bear, between July 1 and

It is forbidden to kill or take any woodcock, snipe,

**Insectivorous and Other Birds Beneficial to Agricul-
ture.**

It is forbidden at all times to shoot or kill, and between
March 1 and September 1, in each year, to take by
means of nets, traps or snares, or otherwise, any of the
birds known as perchers, such as swallows, king-birds,
warblers, flycatchers, woodpeckers, whippoorwills,
finches, song sparrows, red-birds, indigo birds, cow-
buntings, titmice, goldfinches, grives, robins, wood-
thrushes, kinglets, bobolinks, grackles, grosbeaks, hum-
ming-birds, cuckoos, etc., or to take their nest or eggs,
except eagles, falcons, hawks, and other birds of the
falconidae, owls, wild pigeons, kingfishers, crows,
ravens, waxwing (recollets), shrikes, jays, magpies, spar-
rows and starlings.

Saving when it is otherwise provided in this paragraph, all the provisions respecting hunting in Zone No. 1 apply to hunting in Zone No. 2.

Caribou.

It is forbidden to hunt or kill caribou between March 1 and September 1 in any year. No person shall, in one season's hunting, kill or take alive more than four caribou.

Otter, Hare, Muskrat.

It is forbidden to hunt or kill any otter between April 15 and October 15 in any year; any hare between March 1 and October 15 in any year; any muskrat between April 1 and November 1 in any year.

Partridge.

It is forbidden to hunt or kill any birch, or swamp-partridge between February 1 and September 15 in any year; any white partridge (ptarmigan) between March 1 and November 15 in any year.

Gun.

It is forbidden, in hunting any of the birds mentioned, to make use of any fire-arm of a calibre greater than 8.

Waste

No person who has killed or taken any bird or animal suitable for food, shall allow the flesh thereof to be destroyed or spoiled, and no person who has killed or taken a fur-bearing animal shall allow the skin thereof to be destroyed or spoiled.

License.

No person, not domiciled in the Province of Quebec, can hunt therein unless he holds one of the following licenses: Fee of \$25, for general permit; \$20 for fur animals; \$10 for birds for season, or \$1.50 per day for birds for short term.
