Messrs, Daniels and Roberts telegraphed to the Western roads from Montreal after they had had a conier-ence with the Canadian Pacific, and while the Western lines were in meeting in Chicago, stating that they had of thefr own motion concluded to recom-mend all concerned that all rates that had been disturbed in every direction be restored to tariff rates precedent to the meeting, and that a conference of all in-terested lines should then be held to see if any agreement could not be reached; if not the disputed questions should be arbitrated.
