Hon. Joseph Lavergne, puisne Judge of the Court of King's Bench, Province of Quebec, was born in St. Pierre, Montmagny, P. Q., on Oct. 29, 1847.

Hon. Esckiel McLeod, puisne Judge of the Supreme Court of New Brunswick since 1896, was born in Cardwell, N. B., seventy-three years ago today.

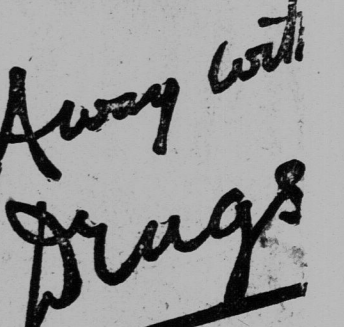
