An Act Respecting the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors and the Issue of Licenses Thereon.

This Act, passed by the Dominion Legislature at its last session, will be known and cited as "The Liquor License Act 1882." It comes into force on the first of January next, though the House will be issued under it will not be operative until the first of May, and until then all the laws of the Provincial Legislatures for regulating or restricting the traffic in liquors are made valid and effective by it.

The great aim of the new Act is obviously to bring the whole subject under direct and strict control, an admittedly very difficult matter. Still, we think, a careful perusal of the Act will satisfy any one that its provisions are well devised to make a great improvement in this respect. It makes the Commissioner and the Chief Inspector and Inspectors to be appointed under the Act, see full and complete details of the provisions of the Act as amended, and as the Statute in force as (supposed to be) in force, as to those Counties which still grant licenses for the general sale. It also makes, however, repeal or impair any of the provisions of any Statute in force, passed by the Board of Commissioners and the Inspectors which shall be issued in any place where the second part of that Statute has been brought into force or within which any provision for prohibiting the sale of liquor under "The Temperance Act of 1864" or any other Act in force, but the Board of Commissioners and the Inspectors to be appointed as hereinafter mentioned under this Act, (section 148) shall have, discharge and execute all the powers and duties respectively for the said Statute as if they respectively "had been" so appointed or performed.

(143) The Board of Commissioners must exercise all the powers for the enforcement of the provisions of "The Canada Temperance Act 1878," as well as the provisions of "The Temperance Act of 1864," as well as the provisions of any Statute in force, within the limits of any place in which the first mentioned Act or any by-law under the second mentioned Act is in force.

ALL LICENSES MUST BE UNDER THIS ACT.

(144) But a wholesale license must be obtained under and subject to the provisions of the new Act to purchase or make lawful any sale of liquor in the quantities allowed under the provisions of "The Canada Temperance Act 1878," and the sale of liquor without license in any Municipality where "The Canada Temperance Act 1878" is in force, shall nevertheless be a continuation of the provisions, in force, in and of the said Act in regard to the selling without license, etc.

To avoid any misunderstanding, we give these provisions verbatim (S) "no person shall sell by wholesale or by retail any liquor without having first obtained a license under this Act," and a person who gives the public cause to believe that he is licensed, and the use of any sign or notice for such purpose is hereby prohibited.

NO SALE TO BE MADE WITHOUT LICENSE.

(145) "No person shall keep, or have in any house, building, shop, establishment, saloon, or house of public entertainment or in any room or place whatsoever, any liquor for the purpose of selling, bartering or trading thereon, unless duly licensed thereunto under the provisions of this Act."

(146) And it is further provided that the several provisions of the new Act shall have full force and effect in every such Municipality except in so far as such provisions relate to granting licenses the sale of liquor by retail.

THE BOARD.

The composition of "The Board" will be 3 persons for each County district, and so far as New Brunswick is concerned will be as follows: - The County Judge in the several counties will be ex officio, one, and the chairman of the Board, the second will be the Warden of the County and the third a person appointed by the Governor in Council.

The Chief Inspector shall be appointed by the Board and shall give sufficient bonds for the performance of his duties and the properly paying over of monies coming to his hands. He will be the Secretary-Treasurer of the Board, and all monies payable to the Board will be paid to him. The Board will fix his salary, subject to the approval of the Governor-in-Council.

FIVE DUTIES OF THE BOARD.

It will be the duty of the several Boards to meet in February next to "make regulations for defining the conditions and qualifications requisite to obtain the several licenses, etc.; for limiting the number of hotels, saloons and shop licenses respectively within the maximum provided by the Act and for defining the "respective localities within which and the persons to whom such limited number may be issued during the year;" and also to report on the 31st day of March in each year, the time and place to be advertised by the Chief Inspector at least 3 times in a newspaper published in the district, or if there be none then in one published near thereto. And also by advertisement.
