CELEBRATION AT CARLETON, QUE.

Monument Erected at First Canadian Priest at Carleton Last Week.

On July 18th and 19th Carleton, Que., was the scene of a great Roman Catholic celebration which will leave behind a permanent monument to the first Canadian priest at Carleton. The monument, which is a statue of Our Lord, stands upon a high pedestal and is the work of the late Rev. Joseph Mathurin Bourq, the first priest to settle in this part of the province.

At 8 p.m. a great banquet was served in the spacious hall of the convent where, bishop, priests, laymen and ladies enjoyed the delicious which the many good cooks of Carleton had carefully prepared to celebrate the feast. This enjoyable part of the program was followed at nine o'clock by a musical concert under the direction of Mr. Arthur LeBlanc, a young Acadian who gives promise of a brilliant career. His selection of the violin were exceptionally fine. Such distinct talent is a rarity in a person so young. Pleasant vocal selections were rendered by Mrs. A. Bernard, public Miss Bourq, the talented organist, contributed very appreciably to the pleasure of the evening. The feast was followed by a large supper, made Carleton appear to the surrounding places like a great greasy volcano of fire rising and falling against the background of the dark sky.

On Wednesday at 9 a.m. a Pontifical High Mass was celebrated by Bishop LeBlanc of St. John who was the first Acadian bishop. Rev. Fr. Melanson preached an eloquent sermon at this service and the church was crowded to the doors with the throng of listeners all eager to honor the memory of their benefactor and father.

From every angle the celebration was a memorable success and from all quarters came expressions of gratitude to the good pastor Rev. Fr. Chouinard and his assistant the Rev. Chas. LeBlanc who by their skill and careful preparation made the occasion such a success. Also, the host of visitors owe a debt of gratitude to Mayor Martin and others who greeted them with such hearty welcome and offered them unstinted hospitality.

Besides its significance as a memorial event the erection of this monument at Carleton, which not many decades ago was clothed in uninvited forest, proclaims the steady march of civilization. In 1755 when the Acadians were driven from their homes and taken prisoners by the English, Jon. Mathurin Bourq, then eleven years old (born at Riviere Aux Canards in June 9th, 1744), was taken to England with his parents who later sent him to France where he studied for the priesthood. Some years later he came out to Montreal and was ordained a priest and shortly afterwards was sent by the Bishop of Quebec as a missionary to the Bay de Chaleur district where a number of audacious Acadians had taken refuge. These hardy and enterprising pioneers had established rude huts for shelter from the elements and lived by hunting and fishing. Among these people Father Bourq labored for twenty-two years, travelling on foot and cheerfully sharing the misery and hardships of his parishioners, ever a friend in trouble and sickness and a counsellor in death. During his mission here Father Bourq made his home at Tracadie where Carleton now stands. On a little island above this point may still be seen the grave of early years a band of Acadians also buried near where Campbellton now stands and from these people the Sugarloaf mountain behind the town first got its name. 




