DEATH OF L. PASSATORE.—The celebrated bri-DEATH OF IL PASSATORE.—The celebrated brigand Passatore,—regarded however by many as a rebel to bad government rather than a robber,—has been killed at last. Passatore was the man, who, with his sixty fellowers, took possession of the theatre at Forlimpopoli, and forced the gensalarmes and the people to sit still, while they pillaged the honses. The man's end is sufficiently epic

"On the 22nd," says the Bologue Gezette, "a "On the 22nd," says the Bologue Gezette, "a seurs proceeded to the house of one Giacomo Strocchi, in the parish of San Lorenzo, (distinct force) seurs proceeded to the house of one Giacemoo Strocchi, in the parish of San Lorenzo, (district of Lugo Romagna,) in consequence of private information that the robbers had taken refuge there. But the latter, who had in their turn been informed of the movement of the troops, had abandoned it, and concealed themselves in its immediate vicinity. As soon as the troops arrived, the bandits fired upon them, killed two gens d'armes, and mortally wounded one. The troops returned the fire, but the darkness of the night enabled the assaitants, aided by the perfect knowledge of the locality, to make their eacape. Giacomo Strocchi was arrested and taken to the prison of Lugo. On the morning of the 23rd, the authorities of Ruspi were informed that two of the band were lurking in the neighborhood. As they had been seen taking refuge in a house near Muraglione, a brigadier of gens d'armerie immediately repaired thither with a few men. At their approach they were saluted with several shots; the brigadier was severely wounded. The two brigands then took to flight across the fields, hotly pursued by the gens d'armes, who fired upon them at intervals. At length the fugitives were wounded. One of them, however, succeeded in crossing a river and escaped; the other fought with desperation until he fell down dead. His body was taken to Lugo, and legally proved to be that of Stefano Pelloni, surnamed Il Passatore. Valuable articles, it is said, were found about him."

Notwithstanding this official establishment of the man's identity, we should only find it charactivistic of the manner in which such matters are managed in that country if we were to hear of the brigand chief being still alive and well, and startling the world with some new exploits in soone other district of the Peninsula.
