Russians Overwhelmed Seventy Miles From Port Arthur--Lose a Thousand Men and All Their Artillery.

London, June 16.—Bulletin—A despatch to the Daily Express from Tokio dated June 15, says news has been received there but has not yet been officially published, of a great Japanese victory near Fuchow, on the railway, 70 miles north of Port Arthur. The Russians, it is added, were overwhelmed and lost 1,000 men, left all their guns on the field and retired in disorder.
