VICTORIA PRICES CURRENT.

VICTORIA, V. I., JULY 7TH, 1860.

Business has not yet recovered from the depression mainly caused, as mentioned in our last, by the arrival of goods at the mines overland from Oregon, in greater quantities than was calculated upon; the consequent fall in prices, and temporary suspension of the receipts of orders for fresh supplies has been the result. Meanwhile, confidence was never more universally felt than it is at present. The news of new and rich discoveries being constantly made, the fact that miners are all settled down at work, satisfied with the yield of the mines, and the prospects of the country; and that the present interruption to trade is but transient, and will last but a few days, when trade will again revive and prices rally, encourage the business community, and tho' this order of things may be productive of inconvenience for the time to a few, still it is the precursor of an improved state of affairs, and the general disposition is to wait patiently the tide of events, conscious that relief is at hand, and that in a few days more, an impetus will be given to trade, that will relieve the market and reduce the stocks which have accumulated and been added to considerably in the last fortnight, by the arrival of three ships from China, one from the Sandwich Islands, and the cargoes of the Vickery, Jennette, and Sea Nymph, from San Francisco.

An auction sale of 900 mats China sugar, by P. M. Backus, realized \$6 75 to \$7 55 per mat, and 1,000 bags No. 1 China rice, brought 5 to 6 cents per lb.
