CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

With navigation closed and the mills shut down, the lumber business is settling down to a winter basis, although there is still considerable activity on account of the large quantity of lumber that must be shipped by rail to fill orders. The demand during the first week of December was unusually large, many inquiries for stock being received from the United States. While the general price list is unchanged, it is quite usual to hear of sales of special stocks at extraordinary prices. A statement has been given out showing that the cut of logs this winter on the Georgian Bay district is likely to be greater than last season. The statement might be regarded as sufficient to cause weakness in lumber prices, but it seems that the demand for Canadian white pine has become too well established to be so affected. There is, also, the uncertainty that weather and labor conditions may restrict the estimated cut. The prevailing weather, however, is about what is desired and operations in the woods are progressing satisfactorily. Operators who are taking out logs for sale report a large number of prospective buyers.

Toronto dealers are now doing a fair trade in both pine and hardwoods, but are compelled to refuse orders for certain classes of the latter on account of the scarcity of stock. Shingles are moving freely for this season of the year, white cedars being particularly active and in good demand for the American trade.

Tenders have just been taken for the annual supply of pine and hemlock lumber

for the City of Toronto, and the result will probably be known this week.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The figures of lumber shipments from the port of Montreal for the past season have been published and show an increase of 13,000,000 feet over last year. In addition to the shipments from Montreal there were exported to Great Britain by way of Boston over 25,000,000 feet of Canadian pine and spruce. The total shipments are larger than was generally anticipated and must leave very light stocks on this side. Manufacturers in the Maritime Provinces are asking very high prices for their next season's production of spruce deals. It is said that offers of \$13.50 per thousand feet delivered on wharf have been refused, the manufacturers holding out for \$14. They contend that this figure does not represent more than a fair margin of profit, as the cost of logging and manufacturing promises to be excessively high. In view of the uncertainty as to the prices which will rule in Great Britain next year, buyers are not disposed to contract heavily at the prevailing market price. Very few operators in New Brunswick are taking out birch this winter owing to the difficulty of handling the stock at a profit.

UNITED STATES.

Our price list this week shows a few changes in quotations. At Albany No. 3 cuts have been marked down to \$25 to \$30, while 2-inch shanty clear stock has been advanced to \$45. In the Bay City and Saginaw markets 10-inch No. 1 barn boards have been reduced \$1 to \$24, 7 and 8-inch to \$23, 10-inch No. 3 to \$19, 9-inch to \$18.50, and 4-inch to \$16.50. Inch box lumber, 13 inches and up wide, has been reduced to \$17, and 1 1/4, 1 1/2 and 2-inch, 7-inches and up wide, to \$18. These reductions do not indicate a weak market, but rather a re-arrangement of prices to conform with the winter stock held at the particular points. From Buffalo, for instance, comes the report that box lumber is so scarce that it must soon be advanced and that such action is likely to be followed by higher prices for barn boards and such grades. The movement of lumber throughout the Eastern States is entirely satisfactory. Export trade has been quite active and sales to retail dealers have been in excess of that of several previous weeks. Buying by wholesale dealers is pretty well at a standstill. In some quarters the opinion is advanced that prices of pine may shrink a little during the holiday season and that there will then be opportunities for picking up stock to advantage. Soon after the turn of the

year, however, there will doubtless be active buying for next season's trade. The condition of the hardwood market is reported to be greatly in favor of the seller. If the dealer has the lumber he can get almost any price he may ask. Dealers at Buffalo and Tonawanda are very short of basswood and thick maple.

Lath prices are firmer. At Albany both pine and spruce lath are quoted 15 cents higher at \$3.40. Shingle prices are firm and expect to remain so throughout the winter.

GREAT BRITAIN.

While the British timber market is firm, it cannot be said that importers are showing much disposition to contract for next season's supply. In some quarters the prediction is made that there will be a further advance in the price of Canadian lumber; other members of the trade are equally certain that lower prices will be witnessed. The stock at the leading ports is sufficient for the requirements of the winter, and if the consumption should decline there would probably be some pressure to sell before the opening of navigation next year. Importers regard the prices asked by some shippers as excessive. This may result in postponing the placing of contracts until later than usual in order to determine to what extent present asking prices shall form the basis for first-open-water transactions. Spruce and pine in the better grades are decidedly firm, while the poorer qualities are scarcely steady. Two sales of St. John spruce, to go forward by the "Head" line of steamers to Dublin, Ireland, have been made at £8 10s c.i.f., including one-third 7-inch. Square and waney pine timber is firm. The stock of square pine at West Hartlepool is low.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

In the New York market spruce lath is extremely scarce and is quoted at \$3.50.

John McIver, of Cape Croker, Ont., proposes taking out 100,000 feet of maple logs this winter.

Montgomery Bros., of Buffalo, report a winter stock of about 15,000,000 feet, of which 1,000,000 feet is hardwood.

The Rathbun Company, of Deseronto, Ont., have five slanties operating on the line of the Central Ontario Railway.

Haines & Company, of Buffalo, have a cargo of pine en route from Little Current, Ont., to their yards. The freight rate on this cargo was \$2.25.

The Saginaw Lumber & Salt Company, of Sandwich, Ont., are this winter operating five camps on the Onaping river and one on the Vermillion river.

A.R. Mann is taking out 500,000 ties at Blais Pass, east of Fort Frances, Ont., for the Canadian Northern Railway. George Streyel, of Winnipeg, has a camp near Atikokan and will take out 300,000 ties.

D.E. Sprague, of Winnipeg, is this winter operating in the Lake of the Woods district. He will take out about 7,000,000 feet of logs, which will be transported to Winnipeg over the Canadian Northern Railway.

At a recent auction sale held by Churchill & Sim, London, England, a quantity of birch from Miramichi, N. B., sold at 8½d per cubic foot. Ten pieces of rock elm timber, 39-46 feet in length and 10½x12 inches in diameter, from Quebec, brought 95 shillings per load of 50 cubic feet.

From May 13th to September 14th of this year the Charlton Saw Mill Company, of Collingwood, Ont., manufactured 22,000,000 feet of lumber, 10,000,000 lath; 400,000 feet of tub bottoms, 50,000 feet of pail bottoms, and 150,000 sets of barrel heads.

Fire on November 29th in the yard of Smith, Fassett & Company, North Tonawanda, N. Y., destroyed nearly 300,000 feet of the better grades of white pine. The loss is estimated at \$14,000 and is fully covered by insurance.

About nine million feet of logs will be taken out this winter in the vicinity of St. Martin's, N.B. The largest operators are: The O'Neill Lumber Company, 3,500,000 feet; Fulmer & Co., 3,000,000 feet; J. P. Mosher & Co. and J. McDonogh, about 1,000,000 feet each.

The Great Northern Lumber Company, Limited, who own saw mills at Conception and Mount Tremblant, Que., intend cutting about 4,500,000 feet of lumber at their Mount Tremblant mill during the coming season. The managing director of this company is Solomon Cole.

The Nepigon Railway Company are prepared to let contracts for supply of 30,000 cedar and tamarac railway ties, half of which is to be delivered before the 1st of March, 1903, also for 1,000 feet of logs, pine, spruce, tamarac and cedar, delivered east end of Lake Jessie by May 15th. Particulars may be obtained from A. McComber, Port Arthur, Ont.

During the past season F. E. Neale, of Chatham, N.B., representing Frank Harrison & Company, of Liverpool, England, made the following shipments of lumber: From Miramichi, 41,190,385 superficial feet; from Campbellton, 14,955,127 feet; from Jacquet River, 1,214,812 feet; making a total of 57,360,324 feet, or 28,970 St. Petersburg standards. Mr. Neale's total shipments from Miramichi for the last four years have been 125,000,000 feet.

The British Columbia shingle manufacturers have officially announced an advance of 10 cents in the price of shingles, to take effect April 1st. The demand for shingles is so great that in spite of new mills having gone up the supply is insufficient for the market. Thus the advance in price. It is expected that there will be heavy orders for goods to be delivered before the first of April. The prices of shingles, f. o. b. on cars, are as follows: XXX 6 to 2 inches, 160 lbs., \$1.85; XXXX 6 to 2 3-16 inches, 170 lbs. \$2.00, 5 x 5 to 2 inches, 180 lbs., \$2.25; 2 x 6 to 2 inches, 160 lbs., \$1.35. For plain dimension shingles 50 cents is added to the above price, and for fancy butts \$1 per thousand is added to the above price.

A Cardiff correspondent of Timber, of Liverpool, Eng., says: "The most important arrival this week has been that of the "Prince Louis" with a valuable cargo of British Columbian pine timber. The whole of her cargo is for Messrs. Robinson, David & Co., Ltd., who are the sole importers of British Columbian pine in the Bristol Channel. The firm received an experimental cargo of this wood last year, and they have had no reason to regret their enterprise, the whole of the wood having been practically cleared out at satisfactory prices. The specification per the "Prince Louis" is exceptionally fine, and embraces 288 sawn logs and 6,012 sawn planks, or altogether 1,567 loads. The logs range from 40ft. to 105ft. in length, and vary from 12in. to 24in. square, whilst the planks are from 11in. to 25in. in width,

and up to 40ft. in length. The timber is clean sawn parallel throughout, and as it is not only free from sap, but a good deal of it does not contain a single knot, it is especially suitable for high-class work in which beams of exceptional length and size are required. It is also well adapted for deck planking, ship masts, spars, etc.

THE GLA GOW MARKET.

From the monthly report of Allison, Cousland & Co. we extract the following particulars regarding the Glasgow market:

Business during the past month has continued to be satisfactory. Imports, especially of white pine deals, have been very moderate. Yarded stocks have been largely drawn on, and stocks in public yards will probably be light by the end of the year. Prices all round have been very firm, with a gradual but steady advance. It must not, however, be overlooked that the general outlook is not overpromising. The shipbuilding and other allied timber consuming industries are now feeling the want of new orders. Merchants and saw millers hold fairly heavy stocks, and they complain that there is considerable difficulty in obtaining an adequate advance necessary for consumers.

WHITE PINE.—The stock of 1st class wood now in the market is very limited and prices are high. 2nd class wood is held firm at 2s. 6d. to 2s. 9d. per c. ft. Square.—Business is quiet. Prices remain unchanged.

RED PINE.—Stocks are light with a moderate consumption.

ELM.—There has been less inquiry. Prices for 1st class wood are easier. Holders seem more inclined to reduce stocks. Grey and soft are as unsaleable as ever.

OAK.—The demand keeps steady and prices are practically at last month's figures.

BIRCH.—The stock is small and prices are inclined to harden.

ASH.—Inquiries are few and the stock on hand is likely to meet all demands for some time to come. Prices keep low.

Seconds—Have not advanced much in price, good broad deals are wanted, but undersized are less asked for. Quotations—Regular and Broad, £19 5s. to £22; Undersized, £13 15s. to £15 16s. 3d. per St. Petersburg standard. Thirds—Are in fair request. Prices are somewhat firmer. Quotations—Regulars, £12 14s. 4d. to £13 15s. Undersized, £10 6s. 3d. to £11 per standard. Fourths—The stock must now be very light, and although prices are firm there is but a very moderate inquiry. Quotations—Regulars, £9 19s. 4d. to £11. Undersized, about £8 18s. 9d. per standard.

RED PINE.—The import has not been large and prices are firmer for all sizes.

SPRUCE.—Prices are well maintained at £7 4s. 4d. to £9 12s. 6d. per standard.

N. B. BIRCH.—The stock of logs is small. Planks are not heavy in stock, but there is no great demand and prices are if anything easier. Quotations—£7 4s. 4d. to £7 18s. 1d. per standard.

DEALS, BATTENS AND BOARDS.—Business is but moderate and prices are little changed.

SPRUCE.—A large and steady business has been done and prices are firm. 2nd quality average is quoted at £7 4s. 4d. to £9 12s. 6d. per standard.

TIMBER LIMIT TRANSFERS.

Brown & Howie, of Vancouver, B. C., have just disposed of six square miles of leasehold timber limits, situated on the Upper Squamish river in British Columbia, to H. McDougall, of Seattle, representing certain American lumbermen. The limits contain a quantity of pine, cedar and fir, estimated at 62,000,000 feet. The consideration is reported to be in the neighborhood of \$6,000.

THE DOOR TRADE.

In the Timber Trades Journal of November 29th we find the following reference to the British door trade:

We hear that a cablegram has been received from the Rathbun Company instructing their agents on this side to immediately withdraw all quotations for doors. Of late the demand for imported pine doors has been very brisk, and all the mills are months behind with orders. This, and the scarcity in the United States of pine in clear and other grades, has no doubt induced the Rathbun Company to stop selling for the present, although we imagine that this is merely preparatory to the issue of an advanced list. While readily admitting its merits, we hold no brief for the imported door, and, indeed, with the

generality of the trade, would prefer that our joinery was made by British labour in this country. Of course, with the 6 ft. 6 in. x 2 ft. 6 in. x 1 1/2 in. four panelled, squared-framed door in the neighborhood of 55 c.i.f., English manufacturers of steam made joinery have better chances of successful competition; but we have much to learn from the up-to-date methods of organization which prevail in the door factories of Canada and the United States. Our correspondent "Snicker," in last week's issue confirms our statement that Swedish doors had been sold at a discount of 55 per cent., but regards this rate as being due to financial exigencies, and that 47 1/2 per cent. would be the current discount, while next year this will probably be reduced to 45 per cent. With generally

higher prices for doors, both pine and Swedish, it is obvious that English manufacturers have a better chance of recapturing this trade.

ONTARIO LOG PRODUCTION.

Reports have been received at the Crown Lands Department, Toronto, showing the estimated production of pine saw logs and square timber in Northwestern Ontario this winter. The quantities given for the respective agencies are as follows, in feet board measure:—Sudbury, 121,000,000; Parry Sound, 171,000,000; Biscotasing, 40,000,000; Whitney, 50,500,000; Webbwood, 150,000,000; Sault Ste. Marie, 130,000,000; Port Arthur, 13,000,000; Amprior, 40,000,000; Pembroke, 100,000,000; Peterborough, 44,000,000;

Rat Portage, 25,000,000. Total, 884,500,000.

In addition there will be a large number of railway ties, probably 1,500,000, as well as quantities of telegraph poles and fence posts, hardwood, hemlock, etc.

The quantity of pine cut in the same districts during the winter of 1900-01 was 658,000,000 feet, and during the winter of 1901-02 850,000,000 feet. It is apparent from the reports of the timber agents that the chief difficulty the lumbering firms are experiencing is scarcity of labor. Men are hard to get and wages are high. Provisions and other supplies are also dear, and the expenses of operating correspondingly greater. These conditions may prevent lumbermen from getting out the estimated quantity.

Hemlock is easy in price, with only a quiet demand: Boards, 12, 14 and 16 feet stock, \$14.50 to \$15 for good eastern; Pennsylvania, No. 1, \$18 to \$19; No. 2, \$15 to \$16.

Western pine remains firm, with prices unchanged and a fair demand: Uppers, 1 to 2 in. \$82 to \$85; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$87 to \$88; 4-in. \$90; selects, 1 in. \$68; 1 1/4 to 1 3/4 in. \$70; 2-in. \$72; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$80; 4 in. \$82; fine common, 1-in. \$62

to \$63; 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 in. \$65; 2-in. \$67.50; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$72.50; 4-in. \$82.50; beam boards, \$23 to \$33; coffin boards, \$28 to \$32.

Hardwood lumber is steady: Quartered oak, \$63 to \$75; plain oak, \$42 to \$47; common and rejects, \$20 to \$25; red oak, plain, \$43; whitewood, \$45 to \$47; sap and common, \$30 to \$35; brown ash, \$41 to \$44; white ash, \$43 to \$46; maple, \$28 to \$30; end-dried white maple, \$38 to \$42; birch, \$27 to \$30; birch, 75 per cent. red, \$45 to \$50; elm, \$29 to \$31.

Shingles are still firm, with the demand steady: Extra cedar, \$3.50 to \$3.55; clear, \$3; second clear, \$2.50; extra No. 1, \$1.75 to \$1.80; British Columbia red cedar, 16-inch, five butts to 2 inches, \$3.50 to \$3.60; 18-inch, five butts to 2 inches, \$4.25; five butts to 2 1/2 inches, \$4.50.

Spruce clapboards are in small supply and prices hold very firm: Extra, \$42 to \$42.50; clear, \$40 to \$40.50; second clear, \$37 to \$38; extra No. 1, \$30 to \$32.

Laths are firm and unchanged: One and five-eighths inch, \$3.40 to \$3.45; 1 1/2 inch, \$3.25 to \$3.30.

SHIPPING MATTERS.

Deal freights from St. John, N. B., to Great Britain by the winter liners are quoted at 35s 9d.

The ship Creedmore has been chartered to load lumber at Ship Island, N. S., for Montevideo at \$10.

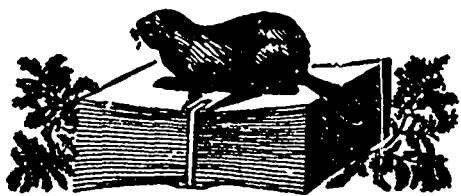
