A NUT FOR TARTE TO CRACK

In Connection With the Drummond Deal.

HON. SENATOR THIBAUDEAU

Denies the Accuracy of Some of the Minister's Statements.

Mr. Armstrong Did Not Ask the Government to Buy the Dale des Chaleurs Mine, but the Proposal to Purchase Came from the Present Premier—Not True That Armstrong Lusted Two Millions of Bonds and Pledged Them for \$600,000 in London.

Montreal, June 29.—(Special.)—In conversation today with Senator Thibaudefeu, president of the Atlantic & Lake Superior Railway, that gentleman referred to Hon. Thibaudefeu's statement in the Commons as follows: "I think that in justice I should deny the accuracy of some of the statements made by Mr. Tarte. Mr. Armstrong did not at any time ask the Government to buy the Dale des Chaleurs mine. All negotiations with the present Government were conducted on behalf of the company by Mr. Armstrong, president of the company, and myself, as president of the company. We never asked the Government to buy the mine, and, on the contrary, both verbally and in writing, advised the Government to carry out the guarantee agreement made with the previous Government, and it was the Hon. Mr. Laurier himself, who proposed purchasing the mine instead. The company consented to a sale only if the Government would not carry out the guarantee agreement. It is not true that Mr. Armstrong lusted two millions of bonds and pledged them for \$600,000 in London. Mr. Armstrong is a victim of misplaced confidence in the Government."

EAST YORK CONSERVATIVES

Who Will Contest the Riding for the Local House?—Several Nominations—Mr. Whitney's Policy Endorsed.

East York Conservatives have not yet placed a man in the field to contest the riding for the local House. With this apparent indecision, however, the elements of a party are being organized. A number of prominent gentlemen were combined at a meeting held at the residence of Mr. Whitney, and although they did not yet have a candidate in the field, yet there is a very strong feeling in favor of presenting a man in the riding. The advisability of bearing the party standard is being discussed. Mr. Whitney's policy is being endorsed. The following nominations were then made: Mr. Ryckman, by F. Delavigne and W. H. H. Ryckman; Mr. Richardson, by Alex. Baird, by Tom Jackson and Dr. Walters; John Fogg, by W. J. A. Carnahan and Dr. Walters; George May, by John Fogg; H. Hall, by William Stiver and Mr. Morrison; John W. Moore, by F. Stobo and David Brown.

A HORROR OF THE SEA.

Continued from Page 1.
include 25 passengers, 20 European officers and 53 natives of the Aden's crew.

THE DETAILS TOLD.
A Monsoon struck the vessel and drove her on a hazardous reef.

London, June 30.—A despatch to The Daily Mail from Aden, Arabia, says: "Two days after leaving Colombo, the Aden was struck by a severe monsoon with squalls, violent and incessant."

"On June 9 the vessel struck upon the Rasmussen reef, on the eastern coast of the island of Socotra. It was seen that the ship could not survive the shock and that the only chance for safety lay in the boats. Life belts were distributed, distress signals given, and the boats on the lee side prepared for launching. These latter were already being washed away."

"A life boat was lowered, only to be swept away immediately with the lascar and the first officer, Mr. Carden. The ship was despatched to the rescue, with Mr. Miller in command, and owing to the despair of all, both boats were rapidly swept away."

"The only remaining lifeboat was then lowered amid a scene of intense emotion. A cry of anguish broke from the lips even of the men, when this half-captain, throwing the anchors and the stores into the sea. After great efforts the boat was sighted and the women and children were lowered into it, with the exception of Messames Gillett, Pearce and Sirain, who heroically decided to share the fate of their husbands and the Misses Lloyd and Weller, who remained on board. The boat, manned by a European crew left in a tremendous sea and drifted rapidly out of sight."

"Fast waves still swept the wreck, and, one by one, women and children, grown too weak to withstand the repeated buffetings, were washed overboard in sight of those who were momentarily expecting the same fate."

"All day the victims were picked off one by one, until 5 o'clock in the afternoon, when those who still survived retreated below in suspense. Day after day the desperate men kept their lookout, but no vessel was sighted until the 13th, and even then the distress signal was not seen. On the 17th and on the 20th other vessels were sighted, but the signals either were not seen or were ignored."
