## ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1877.

The Trustees and Managers of the House of Industry beg to present, in accordance with the Act of Incorporation, their Annual Report. The amount of relief granted during the years 1875 and 1876 was exceptionally large, but the quantity thus far distributed this season is still more so. The increase may be attributed partly to the extreme commercial depression which has existed for some time past, and partly to an influx of applicants from the outlying municipalities and the neighbouring Republic.

Cities, like individuals, must pay the penalty of their prosperity ; if they do not directly generate poverty, they serve in a great measure to attract it. In the opinion of the Trustees, every municipality should be obliged by law to maintain its own poor. The enactment to this effect now on the Statute book is merely permissive ; to be of any avail it should be made compulsory. Poor houses, prisons, and penitentiaries seem to be indispensable concomitants of modern civilization ; our prisons and penitentiaries cannot be surpassed by those of any country ; our poor houses are yet to be developed. In these days of progress when "many run to and fro, and knowledge is multiplied," people have become, to a great extent, cosmopolitan. Canada must not be outstripped in the race of nations ; other countries make legal provision for the poor, and it really seems that we too will, from sheer necessity, soon be driven to adopt similar measures.

To obviate complaints that have sometimes been made of delay in the reception of relief, the number of visitors has

been increased to thirty and the city divided into as many districts; blank reference cards with lists of the visitors and their respective districts are furnished to subscribers, who have thus a guarantee that the case of any applicant for assistance referred by them to a visitor, will receive prompt and due attention. Many of the gentlemen who have kindly undertaken the duty of visitor have had no previous experience; most of them are not even members of the Board; the movement is altogether experimental, and its issue is awaited with much interest by the Trustees. That means of relief may be more readily accessible to the suffering portion of the community, arrangements are being effected for the distribution of bread at two centres, in addition to the House; one in the eastern, the other in the western section of the city. Provision has also been made for the temporary reception elsewhere, of such casuals as for want of room cannot be accommodated in the outbuilding. The soup kitchen has been in active operation since the 1st inst.; soup is distributed daily (Sundays excepted), free of charge, to all applicants, between the hours of twelve and one, the daily distribution thus far averaging 170 gallons.

To meet the increased demand upon their resources, which under existing pressure, must soon be exhausted, the Board decided to dispense temporarily with the services of a paid collector, and to make, for the first time within ten years, a personal appeal to the citizens. The amount collected last year in the usual manner was barely \$1,500, a sum utterly incommensurate with the work of the House and the wealth of the city. The managers confidently hope that this appeal will meet such a response as will enable them not only to continue their present measure of relief, but if necessary to enlarge it. The collectors wish to call upon every citizen,

but should any one be accidentally overlooked, his subscription will be thankfully received by the Treasurer, Mr. Henry Rowsell, 76 King Street East.

Every visitor of experience must occasionally have found families of small children, whose parents, from various causes, were undeserving relief. In such cases his position is painful; if he withhold assistance the children suffer; if he allow it, it will almost surely be misapplied. Could not some way be devised to separate such children from such parents? The latter are apparently irreclaimable, but the former, by judicious interference, might be saved. The question is a delicate one: who can solve it?

During the past year the Board have had to regret the loss by death of three very efficient members, the late Messrs. J. Thom, J. T. Smith, and J. McBean.

The Board have again to express their entire satisfaction with the management of the institution by the Superintendent and Matron, Mr. and Mrs. Duckett.

The accompanying reports from the Treasurer, Medical Officer, and Superintendent, give the usual statistics of the House. Any additional information that may be required will be cheerfully furnished.

### MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

I have met with no occurrence in my department during the past year of sufficient interest or importance to justify a lengthened report.

I have only 9 deaths to record: one child, aged  $7\frac{1}{2}$  years, and 8 adults, ranging from 58 to 83, but averaging 71 years each.

Only one has died since the 19th of June, and there has been no death from preventable diseases.

Several have been taking medicine every day for many years, and are alive yet. They would feel sadly neglected if it were not given them, and as it appears to afford them so much pleasure, they are not sent empty away.
