## ECLIPSES.

IN the year 1843, there will be two Eclipses of the Sun and one of the Moon, viz :—

The First will be an Annular Eclipse of the Sun, on Tuesday, June 27th, visible only in the southern part of North America, and South Pacific Ocean.

The Second will be a partial Eclipse of the Moon, on Wednesday, December 6th, visible in Nova Scotia, as follows,—

Rather more than 2-10ths of the Moon's southern limb will be eclipsed.

The Third will be a total Eclipse of the Sun on Wednesday December 20th, visible only in the eastern hemisphere.

No Occultations of the Moon and Planets visible in Nova Scotia, during this year.

## THE PLANETS.

♀ Venus will be a Morning Star from January to July, and will be then with the Sun, but in the month of November will become an Evening Star.

♂ MARS will be a Morning Star from the beginning of the year till the middle of May, then an evening and morning star till July, and an Evening Star to the close of the year.

♃ JUPITER will be with the Sun till the middle of March, then he will be a Morning Star till the middle of August, and an Evening Star to the end of the year.

♄ SATURN will be with the Sun from January till March, then visible as a Morning Star till July, and an Evening Star for the rest of the year.

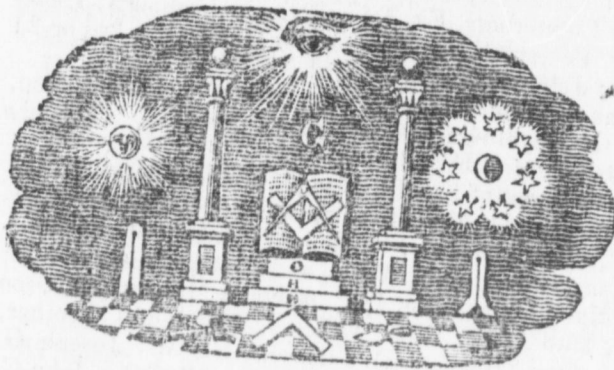

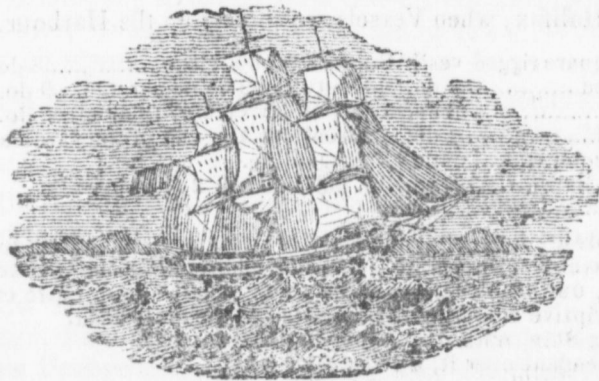

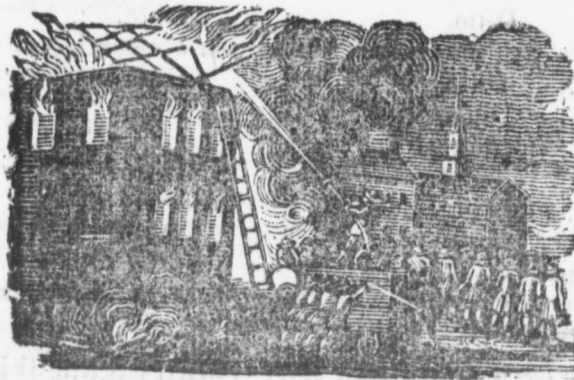

 Rafts of Logs and Spars ½d for each Stick per day.  
 Dockage of Vessels to be paid previous to their quitting the wharf.  
 Light Vessels to move for loaded ones.  
 Vessels which shall be obliged to take an outside Berth, to pay Half Dockage, excepting such as shall be receiving goods from on board another vessel.

No vessel to stop a Dock or extend Fast from one wharf to another, excepting in stress of weather, then to pay the same Dockage as at the wharf she may lay at, and Damages, should any accrue.

Vessels making fast to a wharf, to pay a day's Dockage, excepting it shall be for the purpose of warping from one wharf to another, and not remaining for the term of One Hour.
