Premier Foster, in his manifesto to the peoplo of New Brunswick, lays great srress upon the wonderful improvement that has been made in the system of keeping
the public accounts since the passing of the Audit Act in 1918. Under this system the puibic ascounts since the passing of the Aesposibed to be posible to ascertain the exact state of the provincial fmances at a glance, and any "juggling" with the figures is said to be impossible.

The accounts are prepared for audit by the Comptroller-General, and then submisted to a firm of chartered accountants, Price, Waterhouse \& Co . of Montreal, who

The expenses of the Adminisfiation of Justice, according to the balance sheet, were $\$ 29.654 .06$, while according 0, the Comptroller's report they were $\$ 29,776.83$. It is the same all through the piece; only in a few instances are the figures the same.

The balance sheet, according to Price, Waterhouse \& Co's statement, exhibits a true and correct view of the financial position of the Province. Then, if it does,
the statements contained in the Comptroller's report cannot be true and correct also. The Auditors' expression "a true and correct view" is a peculiar one to use under any circumstances. The people are not asking for any "view," they want a statement that cannot be controverted.
