The Committee on Correspondence have received an application from the Grand Lodge of North Dakota soliciting recognition by this Grand Lodge.

The Grand Lodge of North Dakota was organized on the 13th of June, 1889, by the delegates from Lodges lately holding under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Dakota Territory, and situate north of the seventh standard parallel. The erection of the said Grand Lodge was occasioned by the dividing of that Territory and the creation of two States by the Federal Government of the United States of America. The organizing of the said Grand Lodge of North Dakota appearing to your Committee to be in every particular in accordance with the established rules and usages of Freemasonry, and having been recognized by the Grand Lodge of Dakota (South), the parent Grand Lodge, as an independent Masonic body within the limit of their territory, we beg to offer the following:

Resolved, That the Grand Lodge of Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons of Prince Edward Island hereby extend fraternal recognition to the Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of North Dakota, and solicits an exchange of representatives.

The Committee have also received minutes of proceedings of a Masonic Convention held in Wellington, New Zealand, in September last, accompanied with a request that the Grand Lodge of New Zealand then organized be recognized as the supreme Masonic authority in that colony by this Grand Lodge. We are of opinion that in cases where Lodges holding under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodges of England, Ireland and Scotland, form themselves into an Independent Grand Lodge, that the best interests of Freemasonry is served by waiting until action is taken by the mother Grand Lodges, and therefore recommend—

That the question of recognition of the Grand Lodge of New Zealand be deferred until the next annual communication.





Decisions Rendered by Grand Master.

PHYSICAL QUALIFICATION.—There is nothing in the constitution or landmarks for disqualifying a hunchback from being initiated into Masonry, provided he could comply with all the ceremonies of the initiated in the several degrees.—(Proceedings, May 1877).

LODGE BUSINESS.—It is not competent for a Subordinate Lodge at an emergent meeting to enter on any other business than that specified on the summons.—(Proceedings 1887).

RESTORATION.—A brother who has been indefinitely suspended, can be restored to membership by a majority vote of the Lodge at any regular communication, notice having been given at a previous regular communication, that a motion to that effect would be made.—(Proceedings, 1880).

MASONIC BURIAL.—The friends of a brother who died while under suspension for non-payment of dues, cannot by paying his dues, entitle him to Masonic burial.—(Proceedings, 1880).

Motions.—A brother who gives notice of motion to amend the Constitution cannot delegate another brother to move in the matter in his absence.—(Proceedings, 1880).

Demits cannot be granted to Entered Apprentices and Fellow Crafts, 1885.

Lodge working U. D. cannot affiliate brethren, 1885.

DEMIT.—A vote of the Lodge is the demit, the paper the evidence thereof.

ALTERATION OF THE CONSTITUTION.—Section 14 of the By-Laws as amended to read:

The Officers of a Subordinate Lodge shall be installed on the 27th day of December, or as soon thereafter as practicable, but not later than the Regular Communication in January.




