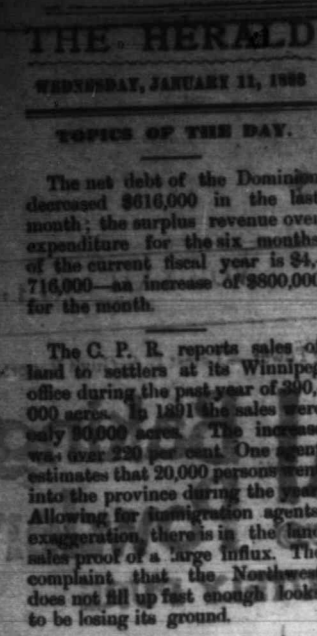


Illustration of a steamship at sea.

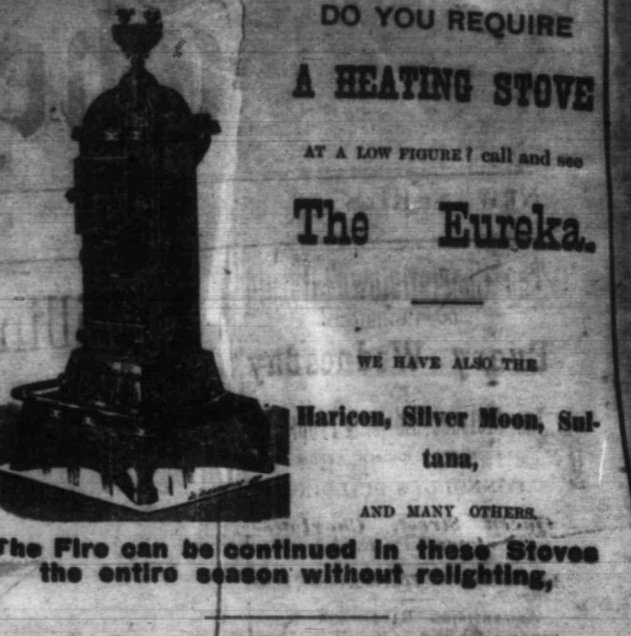


Illustration of a heating stove.
