PARNELL SCORES A POINT.

He Compels the Government to Acknowledge and Keep a Bargain.

London, March 17.—In the common parlance, when the government call for a vote on the civil service supply, Mr. Parnell scores a point by demanding that the government keep their promise to introduce a bill for the redistribution of the Irish constituencies according to a pledge given to the Irish members last August.

Mr. Parnell declared that not only had such a pledge been given, but that the government had also guaranteed that the promised measure would be managed in the commonsense as to be non-contentious.

Mr. Bannerman, chief secretary for Ireland, said the government had not the same recollection of what was promised last August as indicated by Mr. Parnell, but as it appeared that the nationalistic party were sincere and possessed strong convictions that such a pledge had really been given, the government felt in honor bound to act upon the promise that the "Parnellites" were right.

Mr. Parnell accepted the statement as satisfactory.

The House adjourned at 5:20 a.m.
