INDEPENDENCE CONTEMPLATE NOTHING MORE NEARLY OR MORE DEFINITELY THAN.

Measure we feel quite sure that, taking things as they are, the independence of the two countries is, as a whole, more probable to the States than it is to Canada.

The question is now prominently before the people of the State of New York in connection with the election of important State officers (the Governor not included, however) which takes place next month. Quite recently there has been a movement on the part of the "Protestant League," having branches throughout the State, with the avowed purpose of bringing about such a change in the home laws as to prohibit the observance of the "American Sunday" from 2 o'clock in the afternoon until 12 o'clock at night.

Protestants and people of American birth are, as a rule, determinedly opposed to the change in the observance of the "American Sunday" and by the Germans most of all. The struggle will be in great part one between American and foreign; complicated, however, by many other issues mixed up in it. It is certain that the Personal Liberty League men have been promised concourse in their demands by the managers of the "Protestant League" and that the latter will be cast. Such being the case it would seem natural that the entire temperance and prohibition work would be done for the Republicans by the latter men.

The Republican managers favor the high license and the strictest enforcement of the law; but the extreme prohibition men will have prohibition or nothing.
