Greece, in order to avoid an anti-Christian uprising among the Moslems generally, which might be excited by the powers opening despoiling the Sultan of the island. Lord Salisbury and one or two others of the actors in the piece may be playing with their tongues in their cheeks, but the German Empertor is not. He is terribly in earnest. 


