We understand a very convenient site can be procured on reasonable terms immediately adjacent to Trinity Church, and we have no doubt that ample funds will be raised by voluntary subscription for erecting a suitable building thereon.—*Contrib.*

PREBTERY OF MIRAMICHI.—On Wednesday the 19th inst., the Presbytery of Miramichi, in connection with the Established Church of Scotland, met in Saint Andrew's Church, Chatham—present, the Rev. Mr. Steven, Moderator, Messrs. J. Souter, J. Hammy, R. Archibald, and Fraser, Ministers; James Gilmore, Samuel McKean, Esqrs. and Mr. Elliot, Elders. The Presbytery had under consideration various important matters connected with the body to which they belong. The reports from the different Churches already established, were satisfactory; and we understand, there is a prospect of further additions being made to their number. Two new Churches are in course of erection on this side of the Province; and the Members of the Presbytery, with the view of encouraging their Presbyterian brethren at Bathurst, in their exertions to erect a Church, have agreed to give them at least one Sabbath's service each, during the present year. The Rev. Mr. Henry was chosen Moderator for the current year, and the Presbytery adjourned, to meet at Richibucto on the third Wednesday of August next.—*Miramichi Glancer.*

QUEBEC, March 14.—The Timber Trade.—Whatever furnishes the inhabitants of the Canadas with the means of purchasing and paying for the articles of European merchandise, which are indispensable to their well-being and comfort, is of the first importance to them. In the present times, when agricultural produce is shipped at a profit from Europe to America, we cannot expect to pay for anything with agricultural produce. Pot and pearl shells, which formed a valuable article of export, has found a competitor in the markets of Europe by means of a chemical substitute manufactured there. Furs have ceased to be exported by the St. Lawrence; and Lower Canada particularly, from its long winters, can have very little of pork or beef to export. With nothing to sell, we purchase and pay for in Europe the articles we want. With produce of our forests, and nothing else. This produce has actually paid for about two-thirds of our purchases for several years past. Yet it is this trade that the hired Agent of the Assembly of Lower Canada has been endeavouring to destroy, in conjunction with some persons interested in the timber trade of the Baltic, and some political theorists who would die of hunger if they did not live by their impostures on the public and their dupery of practical men.
